Luncheon was served in the Parish House.

At two o'clock the Bishop opened the afternoon session and introduced as the first speaker, Mrs. John Ely of St. Mary's, Shanghai, China, who gave a most powerful and appealing address, and cry for help for the girls and women of China. The Rt. Rev. Benjamin Brewster, D. D. of Western Colorado, gave a review of his field of work where the largest city numbers only eight thousand inhabitants. He was followed by the Rev. S. D. Booth, who told of the work in Idaho, and the last speaker was Rev. G. W. Davenport — then Secretary for the First Province — who spoke of the work to be done in various fields, domestic and foreign, and charged all who could help to do so. The offerings for the day, which amounted to \$40.00 each were given, for their work, to Mrs. Ely, Bishop Brewster, and the Rev. Mr. Booth. Ninety-four delegates from thirty-nine parishes responded to the roll call.

Report of the Corresponding Secretary.

Again the Annual Meeting brings us together — the work of another year has closed — one more mile-stone has been passed by the Connecticut Branch, and we are here to consider what encouragements or lessons the statistics of our thirty-fifth year, carefully gathered, may offer.

During this year of most unfavorable conditions, with war clouds abroad, and business depression at home, our Church as well as our country, has shown its belief in large-hearted service for suffering nations. For this we are thankful, and happily it has not been the means, as many feared it might, of casting to one side the cause of missions.

The Church at large has heartily responded to the Emergency appeal, and though we have no means of knowing the exact share of the Connecticut Auxiliary in this effort, since

the gifts were sent direct and individually, still we may believe it was no inconsiderable sum. In addition, however, to these unknown contributions, we may state definitely that the sum given through the different departments of the Auxiliary for the Diocesan Apportionment was \$2,709.84, our Pledges amounting to \$2,950.00 were more than met, and \$2,494.87 were given to Specials — our total in money for all objects amounted to \$9,945.42. Our boxes numbering 277 were valued at \$11,672.18 — our grand total expressed in figures was \$21,617.60.

It is certainly gratifying to find that in this year of stress we have not fallen behind, but we cannot be content to merely hold our own — we *must* advance, and the problem that confronts us, and which demands our earnest consideration is how we can best accomplish this. One way, perhaps, is to increase the number of our branches, and secure a larger membership. Every large parish already has a branch, and the majority of the smaller ones, but can we not strengthen these by enlisting more active members? Can we not intensify our efforts to draw in the smaller parishes and missions that hold back because they feel their numbers are too small to make it worth while? It *certainly is worth while* — all great achievements have come from small beginnings, and there could surely be no more significant time than the present, for them to join with us, and help make known God's way upon earth, His saving health among all nations.

We had hoped this year there would be no necessity to record any changes in our Board, but even while writing this report it was regretfully learned that Miss Ferguson, our dear President, was obliged by advice of her physicians to resign her office — this loss means much to the Auxiliary. You all know her deep interest in the work, and her valued and loving service as an officer on the Board for more than twenty-two years — as Manager, Secretary and President. We shall miss her presence with us; we are grateful to her for the past; and we trust that rest and freedom from all care will soon restore her health, and even though we must relinquish her faithful leadership, we feel sure we may still count upon her sympathy and interest.

There remains one more subject that I must briefly call to your mind, though it is perhaps, hardly necessary as I know

it to be near to the hearts of very many of you. During this coming year the United Offering will be collected and presented at our Triennial Meeting in October; it has been rightly called the crown of three years' thankfulness. Let us see that the setting of this crown lacks not the precious stones of self-denial, generosity, gratitude and love.

On April 13th, a conference for librarians was held at Middletown for the purpose of discussing the problem of the Periodical Club and of bringing those connected with the work into closer touch.

Report of the Comfort Club Including Work for the Diocese

Parish Societies and individuals have most generously contributed to the work of the Comfort Club; a number of gifts coming from friends outside the Diocese. I wish to specially mention the boxes so carefully prepared by the parish societies for our clergymen's families, as well as the valuable boxes of clothing from individuals, and also the Christmas packages so daintily done up with their Christmas greeting. All have added much to their comfort and cheer.

A large number of both Theological works and standard novels have been received, and they too were greatly appreciated by the recipients.

Mrs. Peet of Bridgeport, one of our faithful contributors for years, we shall miss. For a number of years ill health has confined her to her couch, but she was able to prepare large boxes of Christmas gifts, dolls, needlebooks, and other articles. As soon as one box was finished another box was begun, and she continued her work until a very short time before her death. Truly an example of untiring love and helpfulness, and she never seemed too weary to do for others.

The boxes received for Diocesan and Domestic purposes, were valued at \$6,175.19. A large number of boxes and parcels came to us this year with a request that no value be placed upon them, so that this sum does not give the full value of the boxes, which have been sent to the Comfort Club.

We have received in money during the past year \$978.60 with the balance on hand June 1, 1914, \$24.76 made the resources \$1,003.36. Expenditures were \$970.45, leaving a balance of \$32.91 for the early fall boxes.

Value of boxes sent into the Diocese \$5,015.69, for Domestic missions \$602.00, making a total value of \$5,617.69.

We must call attention again to the importance of placing *within each box or parcel, a complete list of the articles it contains* and the *total value*, also the name and address of the Secretary or individual sending it. When the box is sent the Secretary should be notified by a letter addressed to *her residence*; this is very important.

The storeroom will be closed May 15th. Money and boxes received after that date *must go* into next year's report.

**Report of the Church Missions Publishing Company.
1914-15.**

During the year 1914-1915, the Church Missions Publishing Company has issued the following publications:

“David,” a sacred Drama in scripture language for the use of Sunday Schools and of the Jnuior Auxiliary.

“St. Martin of Tours,” by Dr. Samuel Hart, the devotional address to the Connecticut Branch of Women’s Auxiliary, delivered in Norwich, November 11, 1914.

“Swift Bird,” a biography of Bishop Hare by his life-long friend and fellow-worker, Miss Mary B. Peabody.

“The Wind River Reservation, Wyoming,” by Mrs. Baird S. Cooper.

“The Gift Prayer Book,” and other tales for our Juniors, by different authors.

“The Story of West Texas,” by Rev. A. W. S. Garden.

Of the sketch on his Indian work, Bishop Thomas wrote,

“It is best worth while of anything on missions I have seen in print. I am delighted with it, and want 1,000 copies for distribution.”

Bishop Capers is putting the same number of copies of the “Story of West Texas” to similar use, largely within his own diocese.

With so much that has been disheartening in this work of publishing and getting into general use these missionary publications, such appreciation of the practical assistance they are giving to our missionary leaders is most encouraging.

The Company has in press the long promised new hand-book on the Church’s work among the mountaineers. “The Southern Highlands and Highlanders,” by Dr. Whitaker of Knoxville, Tenn., and the seventh edition of the Series of lessons by Dr. Bradner, of the Board of Religious Education.

This book has been extensively revised and brought up to-date with the valuable assistance of the Educational Secre-

tary. There are also in press two smaller publications, namely; The 3rd edition of the always popular and practical assistant to leaders of Junior parish branches, "Suggestions to Juniors," and a new missionary play, "The Blue Cashmere Gown." So many are trying their hands at such dramatizations that the difficulty is to make wise selections from the numbers of mystery missionary plays offered for publication.

This Company has been engaged for twenty-four years in this work of providing printed information of the mission field.

It has issued material about all the parts of the Mission field. It published the first of the Church's courses of united missionary study and lessons for the Sunday Schools.

During that time it has issued more than 350 publications with many charts, maps and pictures. In this work it has expended in cash over \$18,000, of which nearly \$14,000 has been received from the sale of its publications. The balance paid out has come from gifts ranging from a few cents to the \$100 given annually for many years by this Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary and since 1910 from the \$200 dividend on the \$5,000 legacy of Mrs. Charles H. Smith of Buffalo, N. Y.

The Company's working capital, changed yearly into printed material and through its sales slowly back into cash for the next years' use, has only gradually reached its present amount. For instance, at the end of five years the gifts for the support of the work amounted only to about \$500 and the number of the publications on sale were few, the income from the sales correspondingly small and the work restricted.

This might have been very largely increased if every one interested in missions had realized that the sale of every five and ten cent pamphlet, and above all every \$1.00 annual subscription materially increases the ability of the Company to issue the best and most needed publications. The most discouraging part of the work is the quantity of unsold and now out of date material on hand which cost hundreds of dollars to print, and now it is only fit for the furnace. But there is much material on our office shelves which is as good as ever for use today yet is not having the sales and being put to the use it deserves. If sold, the Company could do the same for

Church extension in many other parts of the field as it did the past year for Wyoming and West Texas.

Will not everyone who hears or reads this report help us to sell and put into wider use these publications.

The Junior Department reports eight new branches, one of which is a branch of older girls. Twelve regular Mission Study Classes are reported and most of the branches report missionary instruction.

New Haven and Fairfield Archdeaconries held Inter-parochial Study Classes.

Hartford, New Haven, Fairfield and Middlesex Archdeaconries each had an exhibit of the work done by the Juniors for the Christmas Boxes, with a service and Missionary address.

Leaders' Conferences were held in New Haven, Middlesex, Hartford and Fairfield Archdeaconries. At the Missionary Institute at Bridgeport in March, a Junior Normal Study Class was conducted by Miss Lindley.

The sum of \$171.00 was reported as given to the Junior Pledge. This is \$21.00 more than the \$150.00 promised, but is considerably less than the amount given in 1914. At the time of writing the sum of \$73.18 has been received toward the Special asked us for the Children's Ward of St. Luke's International Hospital, Tokyo. As we were asked to try to give a sum equal to the amount of our Junior Pledge it is to be hoped that the remainder will be given before the first of January. At the semi-annual officers' meeting in May, the Junior Department obtained the consent of the Board to its having three central officers instead of one. These officers were to be a Chairman, a Treasurer and Box-Secretary, and an Educational

Secretary. We hope that with the appointment of these new officers great progress will be made in the Junior work.

Mrs. Sturdy of New London and Miss Kearny of New Haven Archdeaconries have resigned but Miss Kent of Norwich has consented to be Junior Assistant Manager for New London Archdeaconry and Mrs. Arthur Bradley has consented to be Junior Assistant for New Haven Archdeaconry.

In resigning my position as Junior Secretary I wish to thank most heartily the officers of the Woman's Auxiliary and its Junior Department for the great kindness they have showed me in this special work.

TWENTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT OF THE
LITTLE HELPERS OF CONNECTICUT.



TEXT.

Little children, love one another.



For the season of 1914-15, the Little Helpers of Connecticut, have collected \$242.25. This sum is from thirty-nine branches, six "In Memorian" offerings and two gifts from friends.

Of this amount, \$241 was distributed in gifts, \$1.25 being left in the bank for this coming season.

Forty dollars was sent as usual to Yasumi Kosugi, the little Japanese girl, whom we have been supporting and educating in Osaka. We think, however, that this is probably our last gift to her and that she is through with her schooling, although we cannot know definitely until we hear further from Miss Leila Bull.

Twenty-five dollars was sent for General Missions.

Fifteen dollars was sent towards the building of St. Mary's School, Shanghai, China. Mrs. Hoffman Miller writes that if the Little Helpers chose to furnish a room in the school giving the \$10 later and making the sum in all \$25, they would plan to have a tablet in the room saying by whom it was furnished. We have agreed to send the \$10 next spring.

Fifteen dollars was sent to the Gaylord Hart Mitchell Kindergarten at Akita, Japan, which is supported by the Little Helpers all over the United States.

One dollar was sent, as usual, towards a missionary font.


Twenty-five dollars was sent to Miss Mary Horner of the Valle Crucis Industrial School in North Carolina and she replies that it came as a direct answer to prayer, and to tell the Little Helpers that she is using their gift towards the support of Cordie Harmon, a little mountain child of eight years or so. The child was brought to the school by her father who was in great distress over the loss of his wife. He brought four little girls to Miss Horner to care for, three of whom she received temporarily until she could see her way to securing scholarships.

Mr. Harmon, the father, can only pay \$15 a month and Miss Horner is very anxious to have the Connecticut Little Helpers

undertake the support of little Cordie, whom, she says is a fair type of Saxon beauty, a healthy mountain child with blue eyes and flaxen hair. The entire amount for board and tuition for a child for one year is \$100 which is more than the Little Helpers can promise, but if the little Japanese girl is through with her schooling, we can take on the southern mountain child in her place.


Twenty-five dollars was sent to Archdeacon Stuck in Alaska towards equipping a childrens' ward in the native hospital at Fort Yukon. There has not been time to receive a reply from him as yet, but the \$25 which was sent last year was most gratefully acknowledged by him and was used for the same object, the childrens' hospital. This hospital is something *much* needed at Fort Yukon but Archdeacon Stuck says that the work must wait for further funds, as that time (this was in January, 1915) with the churches ringing with appeals for the Belgians and the Red Cross was not opportune for further asking of gifts for Alaska.

Twenty-five dollars was sent to Miss Eliza Thackara for the children in the Hospital of the Good Shepherd, Fort Defiance, Arizona, for which she warmly thanks the Little Helpers for helping the little Indian children, pictures of some of whom she sends, as you see them, on this and the next page.



Ten dollars was sent for the Little Helpers' cot in St. Agnes Hospital, Raleigh, North Carolina. A little girl, Lillie McClain, both of whose feet were amputated on account of tuberculosis, has been on this cot for two or three years, Mrs. Hunter writes.

Ten dollars was sent to the Rev. James Russell of St. Paul's School, Lawrenceville, Virginia, for which he sends thanks and says that he will use it to increase the kindergarten department.



Twenty-five dollars was sent to Bishop Biller of South Dakota, for his work among children, for which he thanks the Little Helpers and through his secretary sends this letter:

"June 19, 1915.

"To the dear Little Helpers of the Diocese of Connecticut.

"Bishop Biller has had to go off to the Yankton Indian country today, and asks me to write for him about what he will do with the \$25 which the Little Helpers of Connecticut have sent to him. He is going to use it for a well for St. Elizabeth's School for Indian children. You will see how much this well is needed when I tell you that all the water they have had at St. Elizabeth's has to be hauled in barrels four miles. That is a long way — a great deal farther than any Little Helper would like to walk in one day. Men are working in the well now. They are boring down, down into the ground. When they have gone down nearly half a mile, they hope water will come, rushing up and then there will always be plenty for all the things we use water for in a boarding school. When the well is finished the words, "O ye wells, bless ye the Lord," will be put in some way around it, so that the people who use it may know how glad they ought to be that kind friends, like the Little Helpers of Connecticut, gave the money to put the well there. Perhaps

some day some one of you will come out to South Dakota and have a drink from that very well. I think you will, because already men and women from Connecticut have come out here and are working in this big state.

"You would like to see the little Indian children play games — they play so well. You would like to see the fine baskets the boys make and the embroidery and sewing the girls do. The children in St. Elizabeth's are Juniors and love to send their gifts, as you have done to help others.

"Hoping you will be glad that your gift will make so many people happier and more comfortable, I am

Twenty-five dollars was sent to Bishop Brent of the Philippines for which we have his thanks. He writes that he is using it in the Girl's School at Sagada among the Igorots, whom the Bishop says are attractive and docile. Some of the Igorot children came to them when they were very small and there are those among them who have grown up and married and are employed by this Mission.

In conclusion the Bishop says: "Please tell the Little Helpers, who have given their money to us, how highly we value the gifts of little children."
