**Minutes of the fourth Annual Meeting of the Dallas Dio-
cesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to
the Board of Missions,**

**Held on Wednesday, May 14th, 1901, in St. Matthew's Cathedral,
Dallas, Texas.**

The Fourth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Dallas was held on Wednesday, morning, May 14, 1901, in St. Matthew's Cathedral, Dallas.

At 9 a. m. there was a special celebration of the Holy Communion, the Bishop being the celebrant. In his address to the Auxiliary, the Bishop laid down two lines of work for our Branch to follow. First, the education of a missionary's daughter in St. Mary's College; and second, the placing in our own diocesan field a Missionary supported by the sympathy, prayers and means of our Diocesan Branch. In addition to this he would have us keep our hearts ever open to hear and answer appeals for help from wheresoever they might come in the whole world.

At 10 o'clock, the President of the Diocesan Branch, Mrs. Wallace, called the meeting to order. After the prayers and collects of the Auxiliary the Diocesan Secretary called the roll and the following Parochial Branches responded: The Church of the Heavenly Rest, Abilene, Mrs. Fannie Joy; St. John's Corsicana, Mrs. Lizzie Allen and Mrs. Buck; The Church of the Holy Comforter, Mrs. J. R. Ransone, Jr.; St. Matthew's, Dallas, Mrs. J. S. Thacher and Mrs. Wm. B. Robinson; St. Luke's, Denison, Mrs. J. B. Gibble; St. Andrew's, Fort Worth, Mrs. B. D. Shropshire and Mrs. S. B. Haggart; Trinity, Fort Worth, Mrs. Cecil Galbraith and Mrs. George Beggs; St. Paul's, Greenville, Mrs. Harry Bulbrook; St. Peter's, McKinney, Mrs. Sedgwick White; St. Stephen's, Sherman, Mrs. B. S. McKenzie. In addition to the delegates from the Parochial Branches there were present all the Diocesan Officers.

The Junior Department responded as follows: The Church of the Heavenly Rest, Abilene, Miss Lucy Keeble; The Church of the Incarnation, Dallas, Mrs. Margaret Young; St. Stephen's, Sherman, Miss Balthrop.

The Minutes of the Third Quarterly Meeting were read and approved. The President read her address, followed by the reports of the Treasurer and Corresponding Secretary. The delegates present read their annual reports and paid their annual dues.

An offering amounting to three and a quarter dollars was made for the Church Missions Publishing Company.

An appeal from a Missionary in San Diego, Cal., was read, and the dollar asked for therein was voted to be sent to aid him in the building of a rectory.

The meeting adjourned till 3 o'clock in the afternoon.

Afternoon Session.

Pursuant to adjournment, after a delightful luncheon at the home of one of the members of St. Matthew's Branch, the delegates of the Auxiliary and those interested in the work, assembled in the Cathedral, Mrs. Wallace in the chair.

The United Offering for 1904 was discussed and it was moved by Mrs. Cotton, seconded by Mrs. Ramage, that our delegate to the triennial Meeting in San Francisco be intrusted to vote that the United Offering of 1904 be given to women workers in the mission field. The Treasurer reported \$101.27 on hand for the United Offering.

The President presented an appeal for the Aged and Infirm Clergy Fund and urged each member of the Auxiliary to see that an offering of ten cents be collected from each communicant of her respective Parish by All Saints' Day for this most worthy cause.

A paper on the United Offering by Mrs. B. D. Shropshire of St. Andrew's, Fort Worth, was read, followed by the singing of Fling Out the Banner. Mrs. Fannie Joy of The Church of the Heavenly Rest, Abilene, read a paper on Women Workers and Mrs. Harry P. Seymour of The Church of the Incarnation, Dallas, on Kindergarten Work.

Extracts from letters to Miss Emery from Missionaries in the field were then read by the Secretary.

A vote of thanks was tendered the Cathedral Branch for their delightful hospitality, and the meeting adjourned.

THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

Looking back over the three years since our first meeting here as a Diocesan Branch, it is gratifying to note the increasing interest in the work of the Woman's Auxiliary as is proved by the fact that at the first meeting there were only seven Parishes represented, now there are twelve Branches and four Juniors. Retrospection is rarely profitable or pleasant, but in this instance there is cause for congratulation, and I am happy to extend a hearty welcome and cordial greeting to the Delegates from the older Branches as well as to those from the new and younger. The future success of our work is greatly dependent on our Junior Auxiliaries everywhere. Through the kindness and courtesy of our local Branch I was able to attend both the Missionary Meetings held during the year, and at Sherman, at the request of the Rector, I organized a Branch of the Auxiliary with fourteen members. At Corsicana, although the attendance was small, the meeting was enthusiastic and good results are always reported from this Branch.

In turning towards the future I wish to urge upon the various Parish Branches, the Bishop's Auxiliary Fund. Let each appropriate a certain sum annually to be given to our Bishop to enable him to put a Missionary in his jurisdiction. Fort Worth inaugurated this plan last year and I commend it to your prayerful consideration. Several of the Branches have chosen St. Matthew's Home for children as special work and I would not have this discontinued, but we must not be satisfied with what we are doing or have done, but must do more and more each year and I urge this Fund as an object which should appeal to us all.

Do not forget the United Offering; only four months remain before the little blue boxes must be sent to the Diocesan Secretary. Let our offering be an expression of the growth of our interest in all missionary work dur-

ing the three years since the last triennial meeting and of our gratitude to God and His mercies and in every department may we by our energy and zeal, our increased activity in Auxiliary work, add jewels to our crown of loving service.

REPORT OF DIOCESAN CORRESPONDING SECRETARY.

My report is only partial as I was absent from the Diocese for six months during the past year. Since my return I have written more than 150 letters and postals to the Parishes and organized Missions in the Diocese, giving notices of meetings.

I also sent packages of Leaflets and other Literature regarding the work and plans of the Woman's Auxiliary and to those Parishes and Missions having no Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, I sent Literature showing the best way of organizing Branches and rules for their formation. More than 50 large packages were sent, always accompanied by a letter.

During the past year from May, 1900, to May, 1901, there have been held three Quarterly Meetings of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese, the midsummer one in 1900 having been omitted.

In October, 1900, one was held at St. John's Church, Corsicana. In February, 1901, at St. Stephen's Church, Sherman, and in May, 1901, at St. Matthew's Cathedral, Dallas, at the time of the Annual Council of the Diocese. At Corsicana and Sherman the Bishops and the Clergy met with the Woman's Auxiliary Branches, but at Dallas they were engaged at the Council, and the Woman's Auxiliary met alone.

At Corsicana, meetings were held on Wednesday and Thursday, October 24 and 25, 1900, at St. John's Church. At 3 p. m. the first meeting was taken up with addresses on the importance of sending Quarterly Reports and special stress was laid on systematic giving towards United Offering and a paper by Mrs. Soussat was read on Systematic Giving. At 8 p. m. a Missionary service was held and addresses made by the Bishop and the Rev. Messrs. Ramage, Wickens and Stuck and the Rev. Mr. Hillyar offered a resolution, which was adopted, of interest in and sympathy with the Missionary Council of the General Church now in session in Louisville, Ky. On Thursday, 25th, there was a celebration at 7:30 a. m. and at 9:30 a conference took place between the Bishop and Clergy and the Woman's Auxiliary. A letter from Miss Emery was read in regard to Misisonary Boxes to be supplied by various Branches. Two Boxes were undertaken. The meeting then adjourned.

The next Quarterly Meeting took place at Sherman, February 13, and 14, 1901. There was present at the gathering representatives of the Woman's Auxiliaries of—

The Bishop, the Rector of St. Stephen's and ten other Clergy.

The Bishop urged the Clergy to do Missionary work in outlying towns where the Church is not at present represented, and added that the Woman's Auxiliary could assist by furnishing the music and hearty responses. Reports were read of the work of the Woman's Auxiliaries in the different Parishes represented.

Brief addresses were given by the Clergy on various topics.

A letter from Miss Emery was read giving practical suggestions as to Auxiliary work.

At 7:30 p. m. addresses were given by Dean Stuck on Missions in China and Japan and by the Rev. Mr. Gibble on Missions in the United States. At 8 a. m. Thursday, February 14th, there was a Celebration and at 10 a. m. same day a Conference was held between the Clergy and the Woman's Auxiliary. The Meeting endorsed the Bishop's suggestion as to Mission work in outside towns.

The Secretary asked that one-half of the amounts collected by the Parish Branches be laid aside for Diocesan Missions. An offering of \$12.65 was given to the Diocesan Woman's Auxiliary.

The Meeting then adjourned, having previously given a hearty vote of thanks to the Rector and Parish for their gracious hospitality, and agreed to meet in May at Dallas.
