Minutes of the Fifth Annual Meeting

The Fifth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Dallas was held on Wednesday morning, May 14, 1902, in St. Matthew's Cathedral, Dallas.

At 9 a. m. there was a special celebration of the Holy Communion, the Bishop being the celebrant. The annual address to the members of the Auxiliary was made by the Bishop. At ten o'clock, the Diocesan President, Mrs. Wallace, called the meeting to order in the choir room. After prayer, the roll was called and all but two parish branches were represented:

The minutes of the third quarterly meeting held in Paris were read and approved. The President's address followed, after which were read the reports of parish branches and the Secretary and Treasurer's

reports. Pledges were made for Diocesan Missions, St. Mary's College, and Alaska, and the annual diocesan dues paid.

The meeting then adjourned for luncheon which was served at the home of one of the members of the Cathedral parish.

At three in the afternoon, the President called the meeting to order, and the diocesan officers were elected by ballot. Appeals were read for the Church Home and Hospital, Orlando, Florida; for the Church work in Mexico, and for All Saints' Hospital, Fort Worth. Miss Emery's Report on Reports was read, and after a vote of thanks from the delegates for the delightful hospitality of the Dallas branch, the meeting adjourned.
