MINUTES OF THE FIFTEENTH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

The fifteenth annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Dallas was called to order by the President, Mrs. B. B. Ramage, May 14th, at 3 p. m., in the Church of the Incarnation, Dallas.

After prayers, the roll was called and delegates responded from Corsicana, Dallas (St. Matthew's Cathedral and Church of the Incarnation, Denison, Fort Worth (St. Andrew's), Mineral Wells, Paris, Sherman, Terrell, Texarkana, and Waxahachie.

The President in her address now urged us to try and have a vision of the breadth of our work, and realize that *the* mission of the Church is the spread of the gospel.

Reports of committees then followed. The Committee on United Offering Service had made arrangements for annual service. Moved by Mrs. Miller of Sherman, and seconded by Mrs. Atwill of Dallas, that St. Matthew's Day, September 1st, and Maundy Thursday, be set apart as the two times in the year when the united offering will be presented, plainly marked, so Treasurer of United Offering may give due credit. These services to be held by all branches. Carried.

Report of Quiet Day—Mrs. Herring, chairman, reported having had all arrangements made with Bishop Garrett, but because of meningitis it had to be postponed indefinitely.

Report of New Branches—Mrs. Harry T. Moore, chairman. One new branch formed, with promise of several before next meeting.

Report of Parish Branches was now given, and showed an increase all along missionary work.

Report of Treasurer, Mrs. E. R. Atwill—Received \$811.23.

Mrs. Atwill suggested the following system for payment of pledges:

Bishop Garrett Scholarship—October 1.
Foreign Missions—December 1.
One-Half General Missions—December 1.
Diocesan Missions—February 1.
Domestic Missions—April 1.
One-Half General Missions—April 1.

She asks that each branch close its fiscal year April 30 and the treasurer's report be sent immediately to her.

Motion to adopt these suggestions was made by Mrs. Jinks, seconded by Mrs. Morris. Carried.

Corresponding Secretary reported having answered all letters and distributed all literature sent by Miss Emery.

The Librarian of Church Periodical Club, Mrs. Davis, sent no report and asked to be relieved of the office. The President appointed Mrs. Harry T. Moore in her place.

Educational Secretary, Mrs. Whaling, because of the death of her father, felt unable to take care of the work. Moved by Mrs. Miller to send Mrs. Whaling a note of sympathy and ask her to continue to be our Educational Secretary. Carried.

Miss Emery's letter was read, and it was moved that it be printed in the Call. Miss Emery asks that we assume a yearly pledge to help the Foreign Missionary Life Insurance fund. Moved by Mrs. Morris that we pay \$75, and on call of pledges from all branches it was found to amount to \$75. Carried.

A letter from Bishop Rowe was read, urging the women of our diocese to influence our representatives in Congress to favor the passage of a bill looking toward the betterment of the Indians in Alaska.

The President appointed committees for the following year.

Meeting adjourned.

The Woman's Auxiliary met for corporate Communion at the Church of the Incarnation, Wednesday, May 15th, at 10 a. m.

Rev. Percy Silver was the celebrant, assisted by Rev. Mr. Lodge.

The Rev. Mr. Silver gave an inspiring address.

At this service the United Offering amounted to \$279.25. Last year the Offering was \$60.

Minutes of day previous were read and approved.

The President introduced Mrs. George Haddaway, Recording Secretary of the Diocese of Eastin, who told us of plans followed in her diocese. One that interested us was the joint meeting of all auxiliaries in that department for a summer conference; also that her auxiliary met in different places.

A committee was appointed by the President to find out and report at next annual meeting the wish of the branches as to time and place for annual meeting. Mrs. L. C. Chapman, Sherman; Mrs. J. G. Warren, Terrell, and Mrs. J. L. Lodge, Dallas, were the committee appointed.

After an offering for Church Mission Publishing Society and Church Periodical Club, which amounted to \$10.00, the meeting adjourned for luncheon.

3 p. m.—The President introduced the Rev. Mr. Crittenton, Diocesan Missionary, who told us of his work in the missions, and asked for help for Decatur. Two hundred dollars is asked for Decatur from our diocese.

Mrs. Ramage asked that each branch send monthly reports to the Call.

Meeting adjourned for tea at St. Mary's College.

The Woman's Auxiliary met in St. Matthew's Cathedral, Thursday, at 9:30 a. m.

Minutes of previous day were read and approved.

The President urged us to do good work this year in our own Diocese, as well as abroad; taking Decatur as a special for summer work.

Mrs. Crittenton moved that a vote of thanks be given

the Dallas branches for entertainment of delegates.
Carried.
