## MINUTES OF THE SIXTEENTH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

After the delegates had registered and paid their dues, the sixteenth annual meeting of the Dallas Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was called to order by the President, Mrs. Bartow B. Ramage, at 3 p. m. Tuesday, May 13th, in the Church of the Incarnation, Dallas.

Twelve Branches answered the roll call. The President, in her annual greeting, outlined the work for the following year, and as our triennial offering will be given in New York this October, urged each Branch to work hard this summer to have our offering a large one. Later it was voted that the offering be given to Women Workers, in the domestic and foreign fields, omitting the special appropriation for buildings.

The report of last year's committees was now given. Mrs. Chapman, chairman for the change of time and place of annual meeting, reported she did not have enough replies to her letter to positively decide, and after much discussion a motion was made and carried to have quarterly Auxiliary meetings with the annual meeting in Dallas in May. An invitation was extended by St. Andrew's Auxiliary to Miss Emery to have an Institute in Fort Worth in November, and it was decided to have the first quarterly meeting there at the same time. Mrs. Chapman's invitation to the Auxiliary for February to meet in St. Stephen's, Sherman, was accepted.

Mrs. Whaling of Oak Cliff, Mrs. Belsterling of Dallas and Mrs. Crittenton of Weatherford reported new branches in their respective cities.

The committee on annual reports asked to whom these reports should be sent, and by vote of delegates, they are to be sent to the Presidents of the Parish Branches.

The Babies' Branch report was read by Miss Rice. There are now seven Branches and the Secretary feels very hopeful for the future.



In the Parish Branch reports was noticed much increased interest and enthusiasm. The Treasurer complimented the Branches on the fact that the plan of pledges, arranged by her, had been followed so exactly that she was able to report all pledges paid promptly. The amount for the year was \$874.45, an increase over last year of \$146.70.

The United Offering Treasurer being absent, her report was read. On hand, \$458.11. We collected at our Corporate Communion Service on Wednesday, May 14th, \$320.70, and with \$26.12 just sent and 7 cents added, we have now \$805.00. It is our hope to raise this amount to \$1,000 to give as our offering in New York next October.

On Wednesday morning at 9:30, in the Church of the Incarnation, the Woman's Auxiliary met for their Corporate Communion Service. Rev. Mr. Whaling, of Christ Church, Oak Cliff, was the celebrant and made an uplifting and helpful address, taking "Woman" as his theme.

After this service the usual routine of business followed, and the delegates to the triennial meeting in New York were elected: Mrs. B. B. Ramage, Fort Worth; Mrs. Whaling, Oak Cliff, Dallas; Mrs. Miller, Sherman; Mrs. Atwill, Dallas; Miss Martha Russ, Dallas. The alternates are: Mrs. Beggs, Fort Worth; Mrs. Dirmeyer, Oak Cliff, Dallas; Mrs. Whitaker, Texarkana; Mrs. Frank Gray, Fort Worth; Miss Del Shropshire, Fort Worth.

During luncheon, which was served by the ladies of the Incarnation, the Rev. Mr. Booth told of his work in his various missions, especially of the long distances he had to walk, and how helpful a motorcycle would be to him. Later it was decided to help Mr. Booth get this motorcycle, the President urging each Branch to interest its members in this good cause.

A pledge for Rev. Mr. Betticher's school in Nenana, Alaska, was made.

The meeting having adjourned after luncheon to St. Mary's College, there the pledges for the following year were made. Mrs. Lampe, who was a delegate to the Institute in Kansas City, made such an interesting report that the Auxiliary asked to have it printed in St. Andrew's Call.

The President read Miss Emery's annual letter and asked that each branch write Miss Emery before sending



any boxes; also send to Rev. Arthur R. Gray for the books on China; the complete set cost \$2.00. It was decided to study the Bible and China for this year.

The President appointed the same committees to serve this year.

The President urged that we undertake to form new branches in nearby places. Oak Cliff took Hamilton. Waxahachie took Hico and Midlothian. Fort Worth took Dublin. Sherman took Tioga. Terrell took Kaufman. These are to be under their special care to arouse interest in Auxiliary work. The Educational Secretary, Mrs. Whaling, urges that each branch keep in touch with her.

St. Mary's College sent a gift of \$25.00, which by vote was given to Mr. Booth for his motorcycle. Mrs. Atkinson also sent an invitation asking the Auxiliary to adjourn for a musical tea to be given on the lawn. After accepting this kind invitation and thanking the ladies of Dallas for courtesies shown the Auxiliary and approving the minutes, the meeting adjourned.

At 9 o'clock Thursday morning the Woman's Auxiliary met in St. Matthew's Cathedral, and after sending a letter to the Council in session assembled, asking for a renewal of Quarterly Missionary meetings, and answering questions from Miss Emery's letter, the Woman's Auxiliary adjourned.
