**MINUTES OF THE SEVENTEENTH ANNUAL MEETING
OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY**

The Seventeenth Annual Meeting of the Dallas Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was called to order by the President, Mrs. B. B. Ramage, Tuesday, May 12th, at 2:30 P. M.

By invitation of the Bishop all meetings were held at St. Mary's College. Every branch, save one—Bonham, which has been disbanded—answered to roll call. Two new branches are organized: All Saints, Dallas and Forney, also one in process of organization at Gainesville. Instead of reading the usual Parish reports from secretaries answers were given to questions sent out by Miss Emery and the President reading various plans of the work. In the Treasurers' reports from various branches a great increase was shown. The President in her address emphasized the importance of prayer, saying that it was a mistake to think more of the getting of money, rather than, the Kingdom of God and His righteousness. She also spoke of the importance of bringing before our young women and men the work of the Missionary volunteers, and urging them to take up this line of work.

A discussion took place regarding our two united offering meetings, the meeting in September coming before most members had returned from summer trips, but after vote the two days remain the same. The President read a letter from the Church Missions House, asking that committees be appointed to assist the Rector in raising the Diocesan and Parochial appointments for general missions. The committee was appointed. Mrs. B. B. Ramage and Mrs. W. B. Robinson to present to the Council in session the need of a Diocesan Missionary Committee to co-operate with the Executive Committee of Diocesan Officers of the Woman's Auxiliary. The matter was presented to the Council, and while a vote of thanks was given the Woman's Auxiliary for good work done, no action was taken regarding our petition.

Reports were made by committees on "Quiet Day," printing, and the United Offering Service, and it was decided to begin all quarterly meetings with a "Quiet Hour."

Invitations for the next three quarterly meetings were received and accepted as follows:

The meeting adjourned at 5:00 P. M.

Wednesday morning at ten o'clock the Woman's Auxiliary had the Annual United Offering Service in St. Mary's Chapel. Archdeacon Crittenton held the service, assisted by the Rev. Mr. Carrington of All Saints. Mr. Crittenton made an excellent address on the Centrifugal and Centripetal Forces, his texts were "Go ye and come unto me." The service was largely attended and most helpful, and the United Offering showed a great increase, the amount being \$290.99. After service the meeting was called to order in the Recreation Room of St. Mary's College, the minutes of the previous day were read and approved. The Treasurer read her Annual Report, showing a great increase, which was most encouraging. The pledge of \$150.00 made at the Triennial in New York was paid in full; after reports from the Diocesan Officers the meeting adjourned for luncheon in the dining room of St. Mary's College.

At 3:00 P. M. the meeting was called to order by the President, and the election of Diocesan Officers for the next three years took place, resulting as follows:

It was moved that the President have power to appoint all officers, if necessary; which motion was carried.

Mrs. Wallace urged all Branches to subscribe for St. Andrews Call, as the Woman's Auxiliary have a Department and every Branch should use it.

Mrs. List read a report from All Saints Hospital, telling of the new buildings, and asking for financial help.

The First Vice-President will have charge of all Junior work, and the Second Vice-President will be in charge of the "Little Helpers" in the Dioceses.

The United Offering Treasurer in her report told us our part in the Triennial Offering was \$1,108.00.

Mrs. Whittaker, the retiring Treasurer, deserves great credit for constant zeal and labor in her work, and she urges us to carry at least \$3,000.00 to St. Louis, which can be done if each member gives systematically at least 5 cents a week and prays earnestly.

The Bishop sent a check for \$25.00 as a gift from St. Mary's College for Domestic Missions, and the Corresponding Secretary was instructed to express to the Bishop our united thanks.

The Auxiliary was most fortunate in hearing an address from Mrs. G. L. Burr on "After Mission Study, What?" It was so helpful that by request from members it will be printed in full in St. Andrews Call.

The Pledges were made for the following year, and the Mission at Denton was the special charge of the Auxiliary this year.

The pledge of \$100.00 to Alaska not having been paid in full, was, by extra assessment paid, so we start our new year with all old pledges paid. The meeting adjourned at 5:00 p. m. to meet with Mrs. Harry T. Moore, at 9:00 a. m. next morning, where Mrs. Ramage conducted a model study class to about 20 women. This closed the busiest and most successful annual meeting of the Auxiliary.
