

MINUTES OF THE NINETEENTH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY

Following the precedent of last year, the President, Mrs. B. B. Ramage, called a conference of the Diocesan officers Tuesday afternoon, when plans were discussed and presented to the Auxiliary the following day.

At ten o'clock on Wednesday morning, the Annual United Offering Service was held in the Chapel of St. Mary's College, being well attended, at which time the Reverend Mr. Ellis gave a beautiful and forceful address, emphasizing the wonderful power of woman in her home, for the good of present and future generations—hence the great responsibility laid upon her.

Dean Carrington was the celebrant, assisted by the Rev. Mr. Ellis. The United Offering placed on the altar being \$505.62, a considerable increase over last year, which was most gratifying to all. The Minutes of the previous meeting were read, and seventeen branches responded to roll call—Trinity Mission of Cleburne being the one new branch reported. At twelve o'clock noon day prayers were said.

At 12:30 the Auxiliary adjourned for luncheon, and at 2 o'clock the President called the meeting to order, and work was resumed. The President, in her address, lamented the absence of our beloved Secretary, and the earnest hope of her good husband's speedy recovery was warmly expressed. She reminded us that this meeting is to the Auxiliary what stir-up Sunday is to the church, and that we must keep our lamps burning, and do all we can to redeem the time; for unless heroic effort is made, owing to the dreadful bank failure, we shall fall behind in our United Offering in October. Mrs. Ramage urged that we make All Saints' Hospital, now fifteen years old, and the needs of it, known. Linen showers are earnestly requested for it.

There are pressing needs in our own Diocese, and urgent calls have come from abroad from St. Mary's Hall, at Shanghai, and from St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo, where Dr. Teusler is doing a wonderful work. A committee was formed to draw up resolutions on the deaths of our beloved Educational Secretary, Mrs. S. H. Watson, of Waxahachie; Mrs. Perry of Oak Cliff; Mrs. Wilbor and Mrs. Ulmer, who have passed away during the last year. It was voted that the Auxiliary make Bishop Garrett's scholarship at St. Mary's, the Alexander C. Garrett scholarship, in the Theological

Department of the University of the South, Sewanee, and the Alaskan Scholarship, all to come under Diocesan work, each parish branch giving to the three scholarships. The various branches contributed most largely to the above, and the full amount was pledged to the two latter, and considerably over half to Bishop Garrett's Scholarship at St. Mary's.

The pledges made were most generous, and great encouragement and enthusiasm prevailed throughout the meeting.

The President earnestly asks that the Auxiliary leaders lay more stress upon prayer, and that each branch have prayer periods. Also that the delegates learn from the convention how to pray; she also asks to name the three ways in which the Auxiliary helps most, and the three needs which require most help, and to send all the answers to her.

She also urged that we, as Auxiliary members, make it known to young women, the need of workers in the Mission field; also for United Offering Missionaries, and explain to them where and how the training is secured. These women are supported, and go into the work for a number of years, but not necessarily for life. There are leaflets published at the Church Mission's House in New York, which are sent free to all upon request; and every officer and leader should have the Woman's Auxiliary Hand Book, which costs only ten cents.

Mrs. W. J. Lawther was appointed Educational Secretary, to fill the unexpired term of Mrs. Watson, and Mrs. Wallace, was added to the Committee on Printing. With these two changes all committees will remain the same as last year.

The delegates to the General Convention were elected
as follows: Mrs. Ramage, Mrs. McCurry, Mrs. Atwill, Mrs.
Herring, and Mrs. W. J. Lawther; and the Alternates: Mrs.
Hennessey, Miss Rice, Mrs. Robinson, Miss Russ and Mrs.
W. J. Miller.

It was suggested that each parish appoint a librarian of
the Church Periodical Club, and every member of the Auxil-
iary take the Spirit of Missions, and follow carefully the
course of study contained therein.

Instead of reading the Minutes of the Recording Secre-
tary at the meeting, it was voted that they be read and ap-
proved by the Diocesan Officers; and owing to the press of
business and short working hours the Parish reports were
not read.

Mrs. Atwill, the First Vice-President, who has charge of
the Junior Auxiliary, gave a very encouraging verbal report,
both as regards work and money. One new branch being
established at Texarkana, which she hopes will follow in
the wake of its mother branch, which is doing splendid work.

At the Annual Meeting last year there were ten branches
represented, and the meeting was most encouraging and
enthusiastic; and nearly all the junior branches have sent
boxes.

Mrs. Atwill announced that this year the Annual Meet-
ing will be held at Denison, and urged all who could, to
attend. She wants to retire next year, and hopes to do so
with a good report.

The Treasurer, Mrs. McCurry, reported total receipts of
\$1,498.82, being a large increase over last year. This amount
has actually passed through her hands, and although other
branches reported still other gifts and moneys, of course
they did not get credit for the same. She earnestly asks
that all money be sent to her, and the value and address of
the boxes. She sends thanks for pledges paid promptly, and
also for the marked increase in them.

The United Offering Treasurer, Miss Rice, was most happy
to announce a great increase in our offering this year; and
200 boxes distributed; and plead that we try to make up the
amount lost in the bank failure, and to use every effort to
complete the \$1,500.00 by September. May offering \$514.19,
total offering \$732.66.

The Librarian of the Church Periodical Club, Mrs. Allen, of Corsicana, made a satisfactory report covering two years—being absent last year. She reported \$7.75 received, and the regular sending of twelve periodicals, 50 tracts, and considerable other literature besides 3 boxes; and requests that all branches send magazines to others, and report same to her. She also reported the sending of magazines to a "shut in" in Tennessee and cards and other literature to Alaska.

The Dioceesan Secretary of the Spirit of Missions, Mrs. McCutcheon, reported from Greenville two new subscriptions and from the Church of the Incarnation three new subscriptions and seven renewals; and was greatly commended by the President for her work and influence.

A report from All Saints Hospital, Ft. Worth, stated total received from Auxiliaries and Guilds, \$65.00, and total received from Auxiliaries, Guilds and Churches, \$218.85 for the year, and an urgent appeal for linen and linen showers was again made.

The President requested that the delegates take home this message—as soon as delegates are elected to annual meeting next year, to write to Mrs. Blocker, 5608 Junius street, Dallas, giving names and addresses of the delegates to the Auxiliary, so she can see that they are all placed.

The President read an interesting letter from Miss Emery stating that the Triennial is the weighing time, and gave comparisons of the material and spiritual wars, which are both now waging, and the comparison was a most startling one. She urges that the delegates sent be prepared and that at least one be a Junior.

Dean Carrington made an urgent and interesting appeal for St. Mary's, stating that it has no endowments of any kind, and recited a number of instances in which the daughters of Clergymen have been greatly aided there; also of the great and lasting influence felt by the students of St. Mary's even after many years.

After many expressions of the delightful day spent at the College, and of the many courtesies extended there, and by the Dallas branches, the Auxiliary adjourned.

**MINUTES OF FOURTEENTH ANNUAL MEETING,
JUNIOR AUXILIARY, DIOCESE OF DALLAS.**

The Fourteenth Annual meeting of the Junior Auxiliary was held in St. Luke's Church, Denison, June 6, 1916. After Communion Service the business session adjourned to the guild hall.

While waiting for some of the delegates to arrive, Archdeacon Ellis demonstrated his picture machine by showing a number of views of Sewanee besides portraits of several of the Bishops and other workers of the church.

Eight branches responded to roll call. The minutes of the previous meeting (1915) were read and approved.

The President, Mrs. Atwill, addressed the meeting, and urged that the motto of each member for 1916 be "faithfulness." She told of her great desire to carry \$100 with her to the convention at St. Louis in October and asked that each branch of the Junior Auxiliary make an extra effort to raise their part of this fund.

About 12:30 the meeting adjourned for lunch at the Katy dining station. About thirty-five people enjoyed the social hour at the lunch.

The meeting was again called to order at 2:30. Miss Martha S. Russ, treasurer, read her report.

The treasurer of the United Offering, Miss Royer, also made her report.

The corresponding secretary's report showed that she had spent one dollar for stamps, etc., the past year. It was moved that this bill be paid by the Juniors. Motion carried.

St. Matthew's Sunday School reported the greatest amount of money given per capita during Lent, and again received the banner.

The reports of the various branches of the Junior Auxiliary were read and approved. The reports in nearly every case were very gratifying to all members.

The Sewanee Scholarship report showed that \$25.00 had been given by the Juniors.

Archdeacon Ellis reported on the lantern which had been purchased by the Juniors. The report showed a small balance on hand with which to purchase other slides. It was moved and seconded that the Juniors donate \$10.00 to purchase extra slides. Motion carried.

Archdeacon Ellis addressed the meeting about the weak auxiliaries and impressed the need of a visitor to the weaker parishes for the purpose of organizing and encouraging the work among the Juniors. He suggested that a fund, the extension fund, be raised to pay the expenses of this representative.

The report on the value of the hospital box to Monterey, Tenn. was read and the total value was estimated at \$53.45.

Miss Coombs, of Ft. Worth, urged that the 1917 box be sent to All Saints' Hospital, Ft. Worth. Mrs. Hennessey made a motion to that effect and motion carried.

A letter from Miss Lindley was read and discussed. It was the unanimous opinion of the body that the main defect of the Junior Auxiliary was a lack of understanding on the part of the people.

Some discussion as to the time of the annual meeting was held. Mr. Hennessey urged that in the future, one and a half days be given to the meeting. All action was deferred until next year.

The question "What would you like to have discussed at St. Louis?" was asked. The answer was "Boys—how to interest them in the Junior Auxiliary."

Mrs. Atwill expressed a wish that this coming year Section 3 of the Junior Auxiliaries might be established in each parish.

A letter from the Junior Auxiliary at Waxahachie inviting the Juniors of the diocese to hold their 1917 meeting at

Waxahachie was read. The motion was made and unanimously carried that the meeting of 1917 be at Waxahachie.

Mrs. Atwill appointed Mrs. Ellis Educational Secretary for the ensuing year.

It was moved that a vote of thanks be given Rev. and Mrs. Hennessey and St. Luke's parish for their courtesies to the Juniors. Mrs. Atwill suggested that this be a rising vote, and all present arose.

The meeting adjourned at 3:40 and the guests were taken for an auto ride around Denison.
