

CONSTITUTION OF WOMAN'S AUXILIARY DIOCESE OF DALLAS.

1. This branch shall be known as the Dallas Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.
2. Its purpose shall be to forward in every possible way within the diocese the interests and plans of the Board of Missions.
3. Its membership shall be composed of the parish branches within the diocese.
4. Its officers shall be a president, first and second vice-presidents, corresponding and recording secretaries, treasurer, United Offering treasurer, educational secretary, librarian of Church Periodical Club, and secretary of the Spirit of Missions.
5. The president shall call meetings and preside over them, and with the other officers shall plan the affairs of the branch. She shall serve as Chairman of a Committee on the Devotional Life of the Branch.
6. The first vice-president, in the absence of the president, shall perform her duties, and shall act as chairman of a Committee on Section B of the Woman's Auxiliary.
7. The junior president, elected by the Junior Auxiliary, by virtue of her office, becomes second vice-president and in the absence of the president and first vice-president shall perform the duties of the president. She shall act as chairman of a Committee on Junior Work.
8. The Corresponding Secretary shall give notice of all meetings, and shall conduct the general correspondence of the branch. She shall serve as chairman of an Extension Committee.
9. The recording secretary shall keep the list of Parish Branches, the minutes of all meetings of the branch, and aid the corresponding secretary as such help may be needed.
10. The Treasurer shall receive all moneys for the expenses of the branch and pay such bills as are endorsed by the President. She shall receive and forward all moneys given to redeem pledges made by the diocesan branches, and shall present an itemized statement of receipts and disbursements at the annual meeting of the branch. She shall serve as chairman of a Committee on Finance.
11. The United Offering treasurer shall furnish the women of the parishes with United Offering boxes and leaflets, and bring to their attention in other ways the purposes of the United Offering. She shall keep a list of the contributors, and make semi-annual collections and put

these amounts at interest. Each year she shall render a report of the progress of the offering, and each third year make it ready, with its accumulated interest, for presentation at the Triennial Service of the Woman's Auxiliary. She shall serve as chairman of a Committee on the United Offering.

12. The educational secretary shall prepare herself for the training of parish leaders of study classes. She shall seek out one or more such leaders in every parish or mission, and personally, or by correspondence, train them for their work. She shall cooperate with the Educational Department of the Board of Missions; and each year follow, as far as she may be able, the study courses presented by them. She shall serve as chairman of a Committee on Missionary Information.

13. The librarian of the Church Periodical Club shall endeavor to interest all women in the distributing of literature in the Mission field. She shall keep a record of the magazines and periodicals sent out and report the same at the meeting of the branch.

14. The secretary of The Spirit of Missions shall keep a list of subscribers in the Diocese, shall receive reports from each parish and mission as to the number of their subscriptions annually, and shall use every possible effort to have the magazine placed in every home in the Diocese. She shall keep constantly before the church women especially the wonderful advantages this magazine affords in all departments of church work.

15. Annual dues of \$2.50 shall be collected from each Branch, and they are also expected to contribute annually to the Delegate's Expense Fund.

16. After each Triennial the Constitution shall be read and acted upon at the first annual meeting of the Branches and amendments and changes may be made by a two-thirds majority vote.

MINUTES OF THE TWENTIETH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

A conference of the Diocesan Officers of the Woman's Auxiliary was held at the residence of Mrs. Atwill, Tuesday afternoon, at 2:30, when plans to be presented to the Auxiliary on Wednesday were discussed.

After the business meeting, a most delightful hour was spent with the hostess, who entertained the Auxiliary officers and delegates at a most enjoyable tea.

At 9:30 Wednesday morning the Annual United Offering Service was held at St. Matthew's Cathedral, being well

attended, at which time the Rev. Mr. Powers, of Brownwood, gave us a most beautiful and helpful sermon.

Our dear Bishop was in the chancel, and Dean Moore and the Rev. Mr. Ellis were the celebrants.

After the service the Auxiliary repaired to St. Matthew's Parish House, where business was resumed.

The meeting opened with roll call, and seventeen branches responded.

The President, in her address, advised that the Diocese be divided into Circles, as in that way we could study the needs of the Auxiliary better, and get closer together in our Mission Study work. The study of "The New World" by Dr. Grey proved most helpful.

She also said that much remains to be done in the way of mission work in both the old and new worlds, and urged us to do all we can to further this work by our prayers, work and means, ever remembering that we should pray always.

There were crying needs for help from St. Agnes' School, Kyoto; hospital at Wuchang; Christ Church, Anvik, Alaska; and St. Matthew's Home for Children at Dallas.

Following the President's address, Rev. Mr. Ludlow, of Wuchang, China, was presented and made a most interesting address on "Chinese Women," whose pathetic subjection is beyond our comprehension. He made a strong plea for women helpers in his work; also for means for the completion of the hospital at Wuchang, \$70,000 being still needed for its completion, and asked for help of prayers, means and self, if possible.

A letter of regret at the removal of our beloved ex-President, Mrs. Ramage, to another diocese, was originated and presented by the Sherman Branch, and adopted by the entire diocese, and is as follows:

At the annual meeting of St. Stephen's Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, the following resolutions were adopted:

RESOLUTIONS.

Whereas, Mrs. B. B. Ramage, who for so many years was President of the Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of Dallas, will not be with us at our annual meeting this year by reason of her removal from the diocese.

Resolved, That we as members of St. Stephen's Branch, Sherman, place on record our sense of loss in Mrs. Ramage's absence from our annual Diocesan meeting. As we recall

our association with her in the work of the Auxiliary we cannot but feel that we shall greatly miss her charming and always gracious presence as well as her faithful, efficient and splendid work. Her zeal and fine leadership; her quiet, Christian influence has always been most helpful to us all, and we shall ever hold her in most loving remembrance as a cherished friend and faithful co-worker, wishing for her all health and happiness in her new home.

Resolved, That these resolutions be placed on record in the minutes of our meeting and that a copy be given to our delegates to be read before the Diocesan Branch at its annual meeting in Dallas on May 9th, 1917.

Sherman, Texas, April 23rd, 1917.

At twelve o'clock noonday prayers were said by Mr. Ludlow, and at 12:30 we adjourned to the Oriental for luncheon, and at 2 o'clock Mrs. Weary, the President, called the meeting to order, and work was resumed in St. Matthew's Parish House.

Mrs. Atwill, the First Vice-President, who has charge of the Junior Auxiliary, gave a most encouraging and satisfactory report as regards both work and money.

One new branch has been formed, and others are in prospect. The Juniors' annual meeting will take place in Waxahachie on June 12th. At the general convention in St. Louis came a request to combine the Sunday school classes and Junior Auxiliary branches, and have two meetings a week, if possible. This has been done most successfully in St. Matthew's, Dallas; St. Luke's, Denison; and St. James, Texarkana.

Miss Billingsley, the Second Vice-President, reported total amount received from the "Little Helpers" for the year \$24.96; of this amount the St. Matthew's Day offering was sent to the Diocesan Treasurer; and the Maunday Thursday offering is still on hand. A special offering of one dollar (\$1.00) was sent by St. Luke's, Denison, to St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo.

One new branch having been formed at St. Luke's, Denison.

The Educational Secretary, Mrs. W. J. Lawther, reported a letter sent to each branch asking what was being done in the way of mission study work; and requested that every branch have the new study book, by Bishop Rhinelander, which deals with missions in the Bible, called "Missionary Aspects of the Bible." After July it can be obtained from "The Educational Department," Church Mission House, No. 281 Fourth Avenue, New York.

The Treasurer, Mrs. McCurry, reported total receipts of \$1881.13, being a large increase over last year; and the branch having made the greatest increase being The Incarnation, Dallas.

The United Offering Treasurer, Miss Rice, reported a May Offering of \$341.49, and many boxes distributed.

The Librarian of the Church Periodical Club, Mrs. Allen, gave a most satisfactory report regarding the number of tracts, and new and old magazines sent.

During the meeting a collection of \$8.10 was taken up for this club.

The Diocesan Secretary of The Spirit of Missions, Mrs. McCutcheon, was ably represented by Mrs. Stevenson, who reported subscriptions as follows: St. Matthew's, 3; Incarnation, 8; Corsicana, 4; Mineral Wells, 8; and amount collected on subscriptions for United Offering, \$5.85; stamps, etc., bought, \$1.00, leaving a balance of \$4.85 for United Offering.

A report from All Saints' Hospital, Fort Worth, showed a great falling off throughout the Diocese, and a very small sum received from auxiliaries and guilds combined, but a beautiful and valuable box of linen from The Chapel of the Good Shepherd at Mineral Wells, which was greatly needed and appreciated.

The Committee on New Branches reported that efforts have been made to establish branches at Oak Cliff, McKinney, Hamilton and Bonham, but without success, and urges that all who know persons in any of these places will do all in their power to interest them in the auxiliary work so that at the next annual meeting the New Branch Committee will be saved the embarrassment which the present committee is now undergoing—of having nothing to report.

It was decided that the Woman's Auxiliary have their First and Second Vice-Presidents, and that the Juniors elect their entire corps of officers.

It was also decided that every auxiliary member give ten cents a year to the Finance Committee for the traveling

expenses of the President and Educational Seeretary, to extend auxiliary work.

The constitution and by-laws found in the hand book were read by Mrs. Lawther, and adopted with a few changes, copy to be found elsewhere in this journal.

Miss A. C. Nowlan made a strong plea for the Denton Mission, and we hope at least a part of the Denton Fund will be turned over by the Bishop for that work.
