

Minutes  
OF THE  
Thirtieth Annual Meeting

---

The 30th Annual Meeting of the Delaware Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held at St. Paul's Chapel, Camden, May 28th, 1914.

At 10.30 A. M. there was a celebration of the Holy Communion by the Bishop of the Diocese, assisted by Archdeacon B. F. Thompson, rector of St. Paul's.

The Church was fairly crowded with interested women who listened intently and sympathetically to the Bishop's address on the life and good works of Mrs. Mary Killen Davis Eldridge who passed from this life last Easter-day. At the close of this service it was announced that luncheon would be served at the Grange Hall. About 150 persons including several of the clergy enjoyed the delicious and bountiful luncheon and all were impressed with the perfection of the plans of those who had the luncheon in charge. Although the day was excessively warm, all were refreshed and ready to assemble for business at half-past one.

Bishop Kinsman opened the meeting with prayers for Missions.

The President, Mrs. McIlvaine was in the chair.

At roll call 123 women responded from 21 parishes. Guests from Harrington, Felton and Magnolia were also present. Milford, the newest Branch, organized by Mrs. Eldridge, had 4 representatives.

The minutes of the Fall Meeting were accepted as read. Reports were offered by the Secretary, Treasurer, Treasurer of the United Offering, Educational Secretary, Directress for Mis-

sionary Box Work, Secretary of the Mexican Division, Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club and from the Junior Auxiliary and Little Helpers. The Treasurer requested that her accounts be audited, and Miss Virginia Reese and Mrs. Tallman were asked to do this.

The President in her address briefly reviewed the work of the Delaware Branch in the 27 years of her official connection with it and showed that all in all, the growth was very real:—in the *interest* manifested by the women, in their *number*, and in their work and gifts. She also noted the increase in offerings from the first printed report of 1886 of \$101.00 to the grand total of the last Report in 1913 of \$4,532.05. To our sorrow she announced her resignation final, tho' she declared,—“As long as I live Auxiliary work will be the dearest of all work to me.”

The following testimonial of love and respect to the memory of Mrs. M. K. D. Eldridge was offered on behalf of the Executive Committee and accepted by a rising vote.

“The Woman’s Auxiliary of the Diocese of Delaware wishes to put on record the sense of the loss which it has sustained in the death of Mrs. Mary Killen Davis Eldridge, of Smyrna.

She was a woman supremely devoted to her Church and she did her utmost to discharge every kind of responsibility. Gifted with rare executive ability Mrs. Eldridge gave herself, heart and soul in her young womanhood to the service of her Master, and until the end of her long life her greatest joy was in the furthering of Christ’s Kingdom on earth.”

A characteristic letter from Rev. Samuel Salinas of Mexico was enjoyed by all.

Miss Tillotson, the new Educational Secretary in New York City, announces three Conferences to be held this Summer for Mission study. Announcement was also made of a Conference to be held at Ocean City, Md. the week beginning June 16th. Pledges for the ensuing year were read and an effort was made to impress on the women’s minds the fact that all sums of money given for General Missions count on the apportionment of the parish from which they are sent.

Greetings from Mrs. T. Gardiner Littell were conveyed to us and it was stated that Mrs. Littell would give \$25 to General Missions to count on the apportionment of this diocese. After Mrs. C. L. McIlvaine had unanimously been proclaimed Honorary President for life, the usual annual election of officers took place, and resulted as follows: *President*, Mrs. Frederick Bringhurst; *Vice-Presidents*, Mrs. W. F. Curtis, New Castle, Mrs. R. J. Lindale, Kent Co., Mrs. Daniel Short, Sussex Co.; *Directress for Missionary Box Work*, Mrs. W. D. Bradford; *Educational Secretary*, Miss Grace Beadenkopf; *Secretary*, Miss Mary Lafferty; *Assistant Secretary*, Mrs. David J. Reinhardt; *Treasurer*, Mrs. W. C. Lodge; *Treasurer of the United Offering*, Mrs. F. G. Tallman; *Assistant*, Mrs. Marshall Barton; *Correspondent of Church Periodical Club*, Miss Caroline Sharp.

Officers elected by the Junior Auxiliary on May 23rd were confirmed as follows: *President*, Mrs. George C. Hall; *Vice-Presidents*, Mrs. F. M. Kirkus, Mrs. Julian Cochran, Miss Prettyman; *Secretary and Treasurer*, Miss Lucy Jackson, *Secretary and Treasurer of Little Helpers*, Mrs. Murray Stewart.

The morning offering amounted to \$28.10.

A rising vote of thanks was tendered the members of the Camden and Wyoming Branch for the beautiful service, their gracious hospitality, the conveyances to and from the station and all else that helped to make the day one that will remain in our memory always. At the close of this meeting, Bishop Kinsman read a part of Bishop Lloyd's address delivered at the close of the Triennial last Fall.

In it is emphasized the truth that peace makes for strength, while strife and haste tend toward weakness, and that the centre of our work is the Corporate Communion.

The Fall meeting will be held at St. Andrew's Church, Wilmington. The Annual Meeting in May will be held at Immanuel Church, Wilmington.

## Report of Secretary.

---

In making this the 30th Annual Report of the Delaware Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, I should like to remind you that the first year of the triennial has passed. Many women from Delaware attended those wonderful, inspiring meetings at New York in October last. Has it helped in the deepening of the spiritual life of this auxiliary and increased the material work done by the several branches?

We had a foretaste of the great United Offering Service, in the one held in St. John's Church, Wilmington, November 25th, when Delaware's Offering of \$2,350.00 was laid upon the altar, before presenting it at the Triennial Service in the Cathedral of St. John the Divine.

At the Fall Missionary Meeting held in Immanuel Church, New Castle on November 6th, the Rt. Rev. John McKim, Bishop of Tokyo, the Rt. Rev. Benjamin Brewster, Bishop of Western Colorado and the Rev. Samuel Salinas of Mexico were the speakers, and the delegates to the Triennial Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary made reports.

A conference of the members of the Auxiliary for informal discussion of matters of interest to the branches was held in St. Andrew's Church, Wilmington, in January, this taking the place of the Epiphany Meeting.

Owing to his absence from the diocese, the Bishop requested the Rev. Mr. Kirkus to arrange the special service for women. The service was conducted by the Rev. Clayton Mitchell, in Trinity Church, Wilmington, on Friday, March 6th.

One of the most gratifying features of our year's work has been the increased interest in the Study of Missions. The Normal class conducted by Miss West in December and the enthusiasm of our Educational Secretary have born abundant fruit.

The treasurer reports all pledges paid and our directress of Missionary Box Work, a small increase over last year. We ask for Miss Sharp, our new correspondent for the Church Periodical Club, your hearty co-operation. Every Branch should have a librarian. The sending of a book or magazine is such an easy way to brighten the lives of many who have not the abundance of reading matter we have in our homes.

At the last Annual meeting a special effort was made to increase our pledge to General Missions as we never have as a diocesan branch met our apportionment. The increase was from \$120.00 in 1912 to \$266.00 in 1913. The pledges for next year, however, have fallen below this high standard. This year we are asked to contribute to two specials indorsed by the Board of Missions, St. Mary's School, Shanghai, China, and St. Luke's International Hospital, Tokyo, Japan. These should not interfere with the raising of our apportionment for general missions.

Since our last meeting, two of our oldest members have fallen asleep, their work well done. In December, Miss Josephine Warner, for many years the beloved president of St. Andrew's Branch, Wilmington. The sweet memory of her life will always be an influence for good. At last Eastertide, Mrs. Eldridge, one of our Vice-Presidents entered into rest. We can never forget how she loved her privilege of helping to hasten the coming of the Kingdom. Her last service for the Auxiliary was to organize the new branch at Milford, her long desired wish accomplished.

## Report of the Educational Secretary.

---

1913—1914.

Mission Study work for the year 1913 to 1914 began with a Normal Study Class held December 1st, 2nd and 3rd at Trinity Parish House, Wilmington. It was hoped that delegates from every parish in New Castle County, at least, might be present; and the benefits realized by the group of enthusiastic, earnest women who so faithfully gathered together through the three days of the course, make us all the more regret the absence of those who were prevented from attending.

We wish to gratefully acknowledge our indebtedness to Miss Lydia West of Norristown, Pa. who, through missionary zeal and generosity of spirit, came to us from a sister Diocese and most graciously and efficiently led our Mission Study Class..

It has been the privilege of your Educational Secretary to visit the newly organized and very enthusiastic branch of the Auxiliary in Milford and the old and well established branch in Laurel, besides several of the Wilmington branches. Your Secretary desires to express her sincere appreciation of the kindness of her reception by these branches; as also of many other acts and words of encouragement so generously offered; and especially to record her gratitude for the willing work of her assistant, Miss Cora Tschudy of Smyrna.

It has been our aim to have, in each branch of the Woman's Auxiliary of Delaware, a parish Educational Secretary, who shall, if possible, lead a Study Class and generally foster the educational side of missionary work. This aim has been only partially realized, but where realized, has been so successful as to make us hope that next year it may be more fully carried out.

Successful Study Classes have been held at St. Andrew's and at Trinity, Wilmington; St. James', Stanton and Marshallton; St. Philip's, Laurel; and St. Peter's, Smyrna—this last having been led by the Rector. At Christ Church, Dover; Immanuel, New Castle; St. Peter's, Lewes; and St. Anne's, Middletown, there have been readings from the text book "The Emergency in China". At St. John's Wilmington, a mid-day Mission Service, followed by addresses by members of the Auxiliary, was held weekly during Lent; At St. Paul's, Georgetown, missionary addresses were given by the Rector; and at All Saint's, Delmar, missionary leaflets were distributed and read at home.

Mrs. Robert Rayner of Wilmington gave great help and pleasure by four talks to the G. F. S. of St. Andrew's, Wilmington; and three talks to the G. F. S. of Old Swedes, Wilmington; she also contributed a paper to the Study Class of Trinity, Wilmington.

### Report of Directress for Missionary Box Work.

---

In presenting my report this year there are several encouraging features of the work. Our new branch at Milford sent a good box and Calvary, Wilmington, which has not sent a box for a number of years, also sent a good box. We have made a gain of \$62.05 over last year; indeed we have made a steady gain every year, advancing from \$1503.85 in 1910-11 to \$1803.94 in 1913-14. This year half the branches went back more or less in their box work and half gained. I hope that this year just beginning will see a gain in every branch and that we will reach the two thousand dollar mark. Please send in your reports as early as possible in May.

## Report of the Mexican Division

By far the most delightful event that has happened to the Mexican Division in recent years has been the visit of the Rev. Samuel Salinas. The Rev. Mr. Salinas was the first youth to be educated through the Bishop Lee Scholarship, and we are proud and happy that, by reason of his character and of his work for the Church, he was deemed worthy to be sent to the General Convention which met last October in New York City. On his return he stopped over in Wilmington and the Mexican Division of St. Andrew's Church tendered him a formal reception, at which time he spoke most gratefully of what had been done for him by his friends in Delaware. The following day he spoke, as many of you may remember, at our Auxiliary meeting in New Castle, telling of Mexico and of his work there and deplored the condition of the country which, though sad enough then, has since become still more sad.

At the Annual Meeting of the Mexican Division held in Immanuel Church, Wilmington, the following resolution was offered by the Treasurer: "Resolved that the fund of the Alfred Lee Memorial Scholarship for Mexico be vested in the Trustees of the Diocese in such sums as the Society sees fit; to be by said Trustees invested after consultation with and consent of the President and Treasurer of the Mexican Division of the Woman's Auxiliary of Delaware, and the interest paid to the said Treasurer semi-annually or as otherwise requested."

The Recording Secretary gladdened our hearts by the announcement that a good friend of the Mexican Division had promised to give five hundred dollars to the Bishop Lee Scholarship Memorial Fund; paying sums of fifty dollars until the five hundred dollars should be completed, and if not completed at the time of her death, she had made provision that her executor make immediate payment.
