PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

Right Rev. Father in God and Friends of the Auxiliary:

Before reviewing the past season of the Woman's Auxiliary here in Delaware permit me to express, for myself and for the other delegates sent by you to represent the Delaware Branch at the great Triennial Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary held last October in St. Louis, Mo., our deep sense of gratitude and privilege, and also regret that all of you could not have shared with us the blessing and uplift of those wonderfully enthusiastic meetings.

We were glad, however, to have at our next diocesan meeting, held in November, in Trinity parish, Wilmington, three of the distinguished speakers of the Convention, Bishop Lucien Lee Kingsolving of Brazil, Miss May Forbes, who had been sent by the Woman's Committee of the S. P. G., and Mrs. Charles R. Pancoast of the special committee appointed to raise funds for St. Agnes' School, Kyoto, Japan.

At the Epiphany meeting, held in St. John's, Wilmington, reports of the fine things we had enjoyed at St. Louis were given by your Delaware delegates, and our good friend, Mrs. Thomas C. Whetmore, told of her work at Christ School, Arden, in the mountains of North Carolina. So much enthusiasm was aroused by Mrs. Whetmore that immediately upon conclusion of her talk about four hundred dollars was pledged, that Delaware might have a share in an endowed scholarship.

Our Pilgrimage of Prayer was the week following the Second Sunday in Lent. On Tuesday of that week our faithful Chief Shepherd, the Bishop, held at Christ Church, Dover, for the women of his own diocese and of the sister diocese of Easton, a Quiet Day, the blessings of which we shall always remember with loving gratitude. At noon, Archdeacon and Mrs. Thompson very kindly opened their rectory, where we were most hospitably entertained by our Bishop as his guests.

During this Lent we had with us two of our Western Bishops, Bishop Thurston of Eastern Oklahoma and Bishop Howden of New Mexico. To Bishop Thurston, one hundred dollars had been pledged at the General Convention, whilst to Bishop Howden, to whom nothing had been pledged, a check for one hundred dollars was given by one member of the Auxiliary in addition to the offering taken that day. Thus you will notice that a large proportion of our gifts in money, and of course all of our box work, have been for the home field. Shall we not also be able to respond

to Miss Helen Littell's earnest appeal for the sadly needed hospital at Wuchang, China? Between home and foreign missions we must keep the balance true, remembering always that the field is the whole world, and our especial interests only a portion thereof.

It has long been in the minds and hearts of many of us that the Mexican Scholarship so dear to us as the memorial to our first Bishop, should be a wholly endowed scholarship. In the present distracted state of Mexico is there not abundant proof of their crying need of missionary help? Might not this endowment be made one of our special pledges for next year? By this we would not only honor our first Bishop, but also, I feel sure, give great pleasure to our Honorary President, for whom we all entertain such deep and grateful affection.

Through the earnest efforts of Miss Bertha W. Giles, our Vice-President of Sussex County, we are enabled to welcome a new parish branch to the Delaware Auxiliary. St. Mary's, Bridgeville, has made an enthusiastic beginning, and please God, will continue to do good work.

One of the most encouraging features of the past season has been the increased interest in Mission Study. Upon Miss Beadenkopf's good foundation, our new Educational Secretary, Mrs. Beacom, has built splendidly, giving unsparingly of her time and of her talents.

More and more the church at large is realizing the great advantages of educational work and the value of a well-instructed laity. In the Auxiliary this is furthered by Mission Study, which not only instructs, but spiritualizes and vitalizes, so that in the days to come, and may they come speedily, we shall not be content with the oftentimes perfunctory prayer at the beginning and the ending of our Parish Auxiliary Meetings, but we shall wish for a really devotional prayer service, and some definite instruction, or news of the mission field, and a corporate Parish Auxiliary Communion at least once a year, and as much oftener as possible.

It was a keen regret to us that our valued and efficient Secretary, Mrs. Reinhardt, felt that she could no longer serve in that capacity. At an Executive Meeting held in the Autumn, Miss Beadenkopf was transferred from Education to General Secretary, and Mrs. Beacom with Mrs. E. H. J. Andrews as assistant, was appointed Educational Secretary. Miss Bertha W. Giles of Seaford was appointed by the Executive Committee to fill the post left vacant by our dearly loved and tenderly lamented, Mrs. Daniel W. Short.

For many, many years the office of Foreign Directress, which office has since been replaced by Educational Secretary, was

loyally filled by Mrs. Harriet L. Curtis of Newark. Until old age and failing health compelled her to cease from active work, she was never absent from our meetings; even after she could no longer attend, her interest remained unchanged. To her rest has come. May light perpetual shine upon her.

Women of the Auxiliary, our country is facing a fearful crisis in her history. As a Church, as a Nation, as individuals, surely we are called upon to avoid all unnecessary expense, but our Missions are vitally necessary, they must not suffer.

The women of the Church of England have set us a noble example; we women of the Church in America will not fall short of it, but will measure up to their standard—we cannot hope to go beyond what they have done and are doing. Remembering Miss Forbes' earnest words, her account of the English Pilgrimage of Prayer, shall we not petition our Heavenly Father to show us the way to greater usefulness and fuller service, not only to the bodily, but to the spiritual needs, of the men upon the field and their families watching and waiting at home. Just how we can best help will be made plain to us in answer to this prayer, but the need for a continuance of our present work is already understood, and God grant we may all heartily, gladly and gratefully respond.

Minutes of the Thirty-third Annual Meeting

The annual meeting of the Delaware Branch of the Women's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held at Old Swedes' Church, Wilmington, May 26, 1917, at 10.30 A. M. There was a celebration of the Holy Communion, Bishop Kinsman, celebrant, assisted by Archdeacon Benjamin F. Thompson of Dover, the Rev. Robert Bell, Vicar of Old Swedes', Rev. F. M. Kirkus, rector of Trinity Church, the Rev. W. H. Laird, rector of Immanuel.

After the celebration of the Holy Communion, the congregation which more than filled the church adjourned to the Parish House where they were addressed by the Bishop and Miss Helen Littell.

Miss Littell told of the work of the Church General Hospital at Wuchang, which was formerly an old mansion house. The floor is old and the walls are peeling. In the men's hospital, 150 are cared for. An effort to secure \$160,000 to build a new hospital is being made. Of that amount, \$105,000 has been raised, and \$55,000 is needed so that the buildings may be begun.

The speaker described other deplorable conditions existing in the hospital and made a strong plea for financial assistance. Miss Littell said "we wouldn't go on with conditions such as those." The workers there are willing to go on with the work, but they are asking for proper equipment with which to work.

Bishop Kinsman speaking on "Early Missions in Delaware," said, that the Octave of Pentecost was a most appropriate time for a missionary gathering and that there was no more appropriate place than Old Swedes', with her interesting history as a missionary church. He described in detail the early beginnings of the first missions in Delaware, in which he pointed out, that it would appear that the following churches and parishes have a history for more than two centuries: Old Swedes, Wilmington; Emanuel, New Castle; St. Anne's, Appoquinimink; St. Paul's or St. John's, Dover; St. Peter's, Lewes; St. James, Stanton. The year 1717 was rather notable in the history of the Diocese, for Mr. Ross of New Castle in company with the Governor visited Sussex County. Due to the interest aroused by this visit, St. Peter's, Lewes was supplied with the Rev. Wm. Becket in 1721. He also served St. Matthew's, Cedar Creek; St. George's, Indian River, and St. John the Baptist, in the Wilderness, afterward Milton. To about the same time must be ascribed the building of Prince George's,

Dagsboro. Almost all of our parishes in Kent and Sussex counties go back to the Eighteenth century. Modern parishes are almost all of them in and about Wilmington.

Bishop Kinsman gave some interesting traditional history of Old Swedes', the earliest knowledge of which dates back to 1638. After noonday prayers for Missions, the meeting adjourned for luncheon which was served in the Parish House.

The afternoon session opened at 2 o'clock, with the President, Mrs. Bringhurst in the chair. The roll call showed an attendance of 116. This did not include a number of the ladies from Old Swedes', who were still busily occupied. Since the Annual Minutes were already printed in the Year Book, a motion was carried to omit the reading of them again. The Treasurer, Mrs. Robt. B. Rayner then gave her report which showed that the receipts for the year 1916-'17 amounted to \$2,366.85; disbursements were \$2,311.72, leaving a balance of \$55.13. Ninety-two dollars have been sent to the treasurer since the books were closed. A letter was read from Mrs. Thomas C. Whetmore, thanking the Woman's Auxiliary of Delaware for the pledges which they made for her mountain school work in North Carolina.

Mrs. Bringhurst reported for Miss Giles that a new Branch had been formed at Bridgeville.

The usual order of business was waived in order that Mrs. Geo. C. Hall, President of the Junior Auxiliary might give her report. She said the Juniors had raised in various ways \$600; this included the box work. The Bishop having given the Juniors the use of Bishopstead on June 12th, it was planned to hold a Lawn Fete for the benefit of the Babies of France.

In the death of Mrs. H. L. Curtis, of Newark, during the past year, the Woman's Auxiliary has lost a valuable member and a memorial paper was read by Mrs. Geo. C. Hall.

Greetings were given by Mrs. T. Gardiner Littell, of Yonkers, N. Y., who was the first President of the Women's Auxiliary in Delaware. Mrs. Littell said that in June she will have rounded out fifty years as a member of the Woman's Auxiliary. Her wish for the Delaware Auxiliary was that they might enroll many more new members. Greetings and an invitation to attend their Fall meeting were given by Mrs. Brooks, Corresponding Secretary of the Women's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Easton.

The President then made her address in which she gave a resume of the year's work and urged that in view of the world crisis, the pledges for missions must not be neglected.

It was moved and carried that at this time pledges be made for the Church General Hospital in Wuchang, China. The following pledges were then made: Junior's, \$15; Little Helpers', \$5;

Mrs. F. G. Tallman, \$25; St. John's, \$150; Immanuel, \$25; Old Swedes', \$5; Calvary, \$5; Newark, \$5; Laurel, \$5; Smyrna, \$10; Camden and Wyoming, \$5; Stanton, \$5; Middletown, \$15; New Castle, \$10; Dover, \$15; Christiana, \$10; Mrs. Littell, \$25; St. Andrew's, \$40.

Greetings were given by the Honorary President, Mrs. C. L. McIlvaine, whose message to the Auxiliary was, "Pray without ceasing."

Reports were offered by the Directress of Missionary Box Work; Educational Secretary, Treasurer of the United Offering, Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, Treasurer of the Mexican Division, Treasurer of the Little Helpers.

These reports were accepted and ordered placed on file. Mrs. Noonan reported for the summer training school at Cambridge, Mass. Last summer there were two delegates from Wilmington.

The election of officers, during which Bishop Kinsman presided, resulted as follows: Mrs. Frederick Bringhurst, president; Mrs. F. William Curtis, vice-president for New Castle County; Mrs. Lindale, vice-president for Kent County; Miss Bertha Giles, vice-president for Sussex County; Miss Beadenkopf, recording secretary; Mrs. William H. Laird, assistant; Mrs. Robert B. Rayner, treasurer; Mrs. William D. Bradford, of Middletown, secretary of missionary box work; Mrs. William H. Beacom, educational secretary; Mrs. E. H. J. Andrews, of Milford, assistant; Mrs. F. G. Tallman, treasurer of United Offering; Mrs. Charles Marshall Barton, assistant; Miss Caroline F. Sharp, of Harrington, correspondent for the Church Periodical Club; Mrs. Murray Stewart, secretary for the "Little Helpers."

The following resolution was received for St. Andrew's Branch:

WILMINGTON, DEL., April 5, 1917.

At a stated meeting of St. Andrew's Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, held April 5, 1917.

The following Resolution was unanimously adopted, and the Secretary was directed to forward the same to the Executive Committee of the Diocesan Branch.

Resolved.—By St. Andrew's Branch of the Auxiliary that we recommend the following:

"That at the semi-annual luncheons of the Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, the Branch entertaining shall supply lunch tickets at twenty-five cents each, to defray the expense of the simple luncheon, which we hope will be customary in the future."

An invitation to hold the Fall Meeting at Emmanuel Church, New Castle, was accepted with gratitude. The Spring Meeting will probably be held in Lewes.

The meeting was closed with benediction by Bishop Kinsman.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Once more it is my privilege as Treasurer of the Delaware Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, to congratulate you upon the work accomplished the past year.

You have exceeded all previous gifts by several hundred dollars.

I am sorry that there are bound to be some disappointments because money reached your Treasurer after the books were closed, and too late to be included in the coming year book.

To one who has not handled accounts of this nature it may seem that she is unreasonably exacting.

This money comes to me in sums varying all the way from \$1.55 to \$190.00, and last year was distributed to thirty-six accounts.

With this large amount of money to receive and dispense in small checks (I say large amounts, for we are quite grown up now), one can readily see that it is quite necessary for the funds to be in hand early enough for the books to be balanced and the checks sent out some days before the end of the year, in order that receipts may be back to verify your Treasurer's accounts before the Auditors.

You have amply covered the apportionment, and have in some instances, more than met your special pledge.

I know you will all be disappointed however to learn that we have not quite supported our delegates to the General Convention in failing to complete the pledge made for Bishop Thurston's Hospital at McAllister, Eastern Oklahoma.

Comparative figures are usually meaningless and dry things, but I must ask you just to listen a few moments while I tell you of your growth financially.

In the year 1912-'13 the grand total was.....	\$1,309.61
In the year 1913-'14 the grand total was.....	1,504.63
In the year 1915-'16 the grand total was.....	1,602.28

and now you will see what I meant when I said, "We are quite grown up now" for during the year 1916-'17 we have raised \$2,366.85. Had the money which was received since the 16th of May been included, it would have been a splendid total of over two thousand four hundred and forty-eight dollars.

Scholarships may frequently be sent in such a way as to apply on the apportionment if properly "Designated." May I again request that, so far as possible, all money be in the hands of the Treasurer before the 1st of May, to facilitate the closing of the year's accounts.

DIRECTIONS FOR PARISH SECRETARIES

1. The Directress of Missionary Box Work of the Diocesan Branch has on hand letters sent from the Church Missions House, stating need of missionaries, hospitals and schools in the Mission field. When your branch is ready to start work, write to the Directress for Missionary Box Work for such letters.
2. When your branch has undertaken the work for which your selected letter calls, notify the Directress at once, sending her the name and address in such letter, and your own address and parish.
3. It is of the utmost importance that immediately after such decision all rejected letters be returned to the Directress.
4. Write to the missionary at once, stating when and from whom he may expect a box.
5. Write to the missionary as soon as the box has been dispatched, also to the Diocesan Directress for Missionary Box Work, Mrs. W. D. Bradford, Middletown, Delaware, with statement concerning value of box.

EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

In accepting the office of Educational Secretary, I warned you that I should need assistance, and a great deal of assistance, that only by united effort could we hope to make Mission Study a VITAL part of our religious life, and realize in Delaware a portion of the benefits and blessings that had attended this work in other places. So general has the response to this appeal been that I do not know how to express my appreciation and gratitude for the loyal support I have received from all over the Diocese, but after all, it is OUR work, YOURS and mine, and I have great pleasure in presenting this report for the season just ended, although I can give you only figures, which, they tell us, is never a fair way of estimating the value of missionary activity.

In order that there might be plenty of time in which to organize parish classes and to create a demand for mission study, the normal class was held in the Fall. I would like to say that much of the work for the year was planned by the former Educational Secretary, who not only made the plans, but has helped to carry them out. Having the Normal class early also enabled the leaders to do more collateral reading. Our subject for the year was

Latin America, the text-book, THE NEW WORLD, by Dr. Gray proved to be very popular and the collateral literature was especially rich and interesting. Unfortunately, just as the classes were organized and ready to begin, word came from the Board of Missions that the supply of books was entirely exhausted. In some parishes we waited three weeks; can you imagine the difficulty of discussing a book which perhaps not more than one of the class had ever seen? and of keeping the class interested while the books were printed and bound and distributed.

Reports have been received from twenty-three parishes;

Eleven had mission study classes;

One, St. John's, had two classes;

Including the Normal, there were thirteen mission study classes with one hundred and forty-six members registered and an average attendance of ninety-nine.

Five parishes reported special work along the line of Missionary education during Lent, such as readings from the Spirit of Missions, talks and papers on missionary topics at the regular meetings of the Auxiliary.

Seven of the twenty-three parishes reporting had nothing in the way of mission study.

The banner report for the year comes from St. James, Marshallton and Stanton, Mrs. Newlin, leader. Six sessions were held, nine members registered, and the average attendance was eight. St. James also reports a class on Manana, the Junior book for the year, and the only Manana class in the Diocese so far as I have been able to ascertain. Next on the honor roll is Old Swedes', Mrs. Bringhurst, leader; six sessions, fourteen registered and an average attendance of twelve.

Your Secretary has had the pleasure of visiting various branches of the Auxiliary throughout the Diocese and of conducting several Mission Study classes. As a matter of fact, an Educational Secretary finds so many interesting things to do that I wonder we do not adopt the suggestion of the Board of Missions and have an Educational Secretary in every Parish, just as we have a President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. I believe parochial secretaries would not only be valuable in their own Branches of the Auxiliary, but also to the Diocese and to the Board of Missions.
