President's Address

DEAR FELLOW MEMBERS OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY:

The time of our annual meeting having been changed from May to October, and on Triennial years to November, it has seemed a very long time since our last annual meeting was held in St. John's, Wilmington, May 1918, and during that time much has happened.

At our Spring meeting, the farewell message of our dearly loved Diocesan, Bishop Kinsman, filled all our hearts with sadness and regret too deep and tragic to be expressed in mere words. With tender affection our prayers continue to be poured forth for his guidance and spiritual peace.

We may lose our friends in many ways, but it is profoundly true that we can never really lose them through death. The memory of the late Dr. Wm. H. Laird, rector of Immanuel Church, Wilmington, is sacred, not only to his parish, but to our entire diocese. He is forever enshrined in our hearts as one to whom we can point with thankfulness for his splendid example of true Christian manhood, loyalty to his faith and devotion to his Church.

We are indebted to our neighboring diocese of Pennsylvania for the valued services of the Rev. Llewellyan Caley, who gave us deeply spiritual meditations for our Quiet Hours, and to the Rt. Rev. Thomas Garland, Suffragan Bishop of Pennsylvania, for his able address at our United Offering service, when the thank offerings of the women of Delaware were presented prior to their final presentation at the Great Triennial. The splendid effort of our United Offering treasurer, Mrs. Tallman, was rewarded when the amount proved to be over \$500.00 more than at the last Triennial.

There is also cause for rejoicing that our endowment fund of \$5,000 for the Bishop Lee Memorial Scholarship is now more than complete, and it was a very great pleasure and satisfaction

to have had with us last week the Rev. Ephraim Salinas, a native Mexican who had been educated for the priesthood through that Scholarship.

In view of the Nation-Wide Campaign, no other special fund was started by the Auxiliary at this Triennial, but some special offerings were given in response to appeals for the mission field.

Remembering that at our Spring meeting we had promised Bishop Hulse of Cuba that we should not be unmindful of the needs of his school, your president, assumed the responsibility of pledging \$100 from Delaware, and she begs you will sustain her action by adding this to your pledges for the coming year.

The Convention in Detroit was in many ways epoch-making, and in no way more so than in launching the Nation-Wide Campaign, assuredly one of the very greatest things the Church in the United States has ever undertaken. Glorious in its conception, wonderful in its preparation, it will be splendid in its accomplishment if our love and loyalty prove equal to the task. For those who took part in last year's Advent Call and realized its inspiration and results, this present plan will present few difficulties. We shall gladly and gratefully present ourselves, our souls and bodies, bending our best endeavor, our earnest prayers and our deepest devotion to this, the greatest cause of all causes—the spread of the Kingdom of our God.

May I say in conclusion that, of our Executive Committee, there are several who at this time had thought to complete their terms of office, by no means because they are weary of their service but because they feel the present-day plan of rotation in office is good and right, yet because of our diocese having no bishop they have consented to continue to serve if it should be your wish to have them do so, until the next annual meeting, at which time we shall undoubtedly have a new diocesan.

Minutes of the Thirth-Fourth Annual Meeting

May 30, 1918.

The Thirty-fourth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary was held in St. John's Church, Wilmington, on May 30th, 1918. After morning prayer and Litany the Bishop addressed the congregation. Holy Communion which followed was celebrated by Dr. Ritchie assisted by Rev. Robert Bell and the Rev. Vail Wingate.

At the close of the service the Auxiliary adjourned to the Parish House where we were welcomed by Dr. Ritchie, after a short address he asked the Bishop to preside at the morning meeting.

Mrs. Biller, widow of Bishop Biller of North Dakota, who is one of the Secretaries of the Church Missions House, spoke on the possibilities of the Woman's Auxiliary for service. She reviewed the growth of the Auxiliary and told of Miss Lindley's plan to reach the weak sections of the country.

Mrs. Biller's address being over, a box luncheon was served. At 1.30 P. M., the afternoon session was called to order by the President, Mrs. Bringhurst. The roll call showed an attendance of 58. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. The Treasurer, Mrs. Robert B. Rayner, then gave her report which showed the receipts to be \$2414.93, disbursements \$2167.68 leaving a balance of \$247.25. Mrs. MacIlvaine, our honorary President, greeted the Auxiliary, thanked St. John's for its hospitality and urged the women not to neglect the War Work, but to be sure to do the Missionary Work too. Christianity is the Red Cross of the World.

Mrs. MacIlvaine called the attention of the Auxiliary to the fact that it was the duty of every branch to send a representative whose expenses should be paid by the Branch.

A motion was made, seconded and carried, that a message of sympathy and condolence be sent Mr. L. W. Wells and his Parishioners in the loss of Mrs. L. W. Wells. A short address was given by Miss Clara Johnson Neeley who is home on leave of absence from Japan where she has been for 19 years, in the province of Kyoto. Her work has been evangelistic. She is a native of Portsmouth, Va., and a graduate of the Deaconess Training School of Philadelphia.

In her address the president, Mrs. Bringhurst, made an appeal for the continuing of the work as a war effort. One half of the \$5000 fund for Bishop Lee Memorial scholarship is raised and the other half will soon be in hand. Mrs. Bringhurst paid tribute to three members who have died since the last meeting—Mrs. Lammot duPont, Mrs. Elizabeth Clark Churchman and Mrs. L. W. Wells of Millsboro.

Reports were offered by the Directress of Missionary Box Work, Educational Sec., Treasurer of the United Offering, Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, Treasurer of the Mexican Division and Secretary of the Little Helpers. These reports were accepted and ordered placed on file. The election of officers, during which Mrs. C. R. Miller presided, resulted as follows: Mrs. Frederick Bringhurst, president; Mrs. F. Wm. Curtis, Vice-President for New Castle County; Mrs. Lindale Vice-President for Kent County; Miss Bertha Giles, Vice-President for Sussex County; Miss Beadenkopf, recording secretary; Mrs. Wm. H. Laird, assistant; Mrs. Robt. B. Rayner, treasurer; Mrs. Wm. D. Bradford, of Middletown, secretary of missionary box work; Mrs. Wm. H. Beacom, educational secretary; Mrs. F. G. Tallman, treasurer of United Offering; Miss Caroline F. Sharp, of Harrington, correspondent for the Church Periodical Club; Mrs. Murray Stewart, secretary for the "Little Helpers."

A letter was read from Miss Lindley in which she asked the careful consideration of the Women's War Work which is to be undertaken by the Auxiliary. This work is to be undertaken by carefully selected and trained workers in each parish who shall visit every woman in the parish urging greater zeal

in prayers and religious activities. After discussion it was moved, seconded, and carried that the Diocese undertake this work.

Before the members from down the State left for their trains a rising vote of thanks was given, the Rector, his wife and the ladies of St. John's for their generous hospitality.

Notice was given of the changing of the By-Laws in order that our Annual Meeting may be held in October instead of May.

The following resolution was passed: that we convey to Bishop Lloyd the affectionate greeting of the Delaware Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary assembled in Annual Meeting May 30, 1918. We send a message of gratitude for his safe return to his home after a perilous voyage undertaken at great personal risk, and we feel sure that the American Church will reward his self-sacrifice by considering seriously its neglected duty to the African Missions.

The Bishop Lee Memorial Fund was next discussed, as there is only \$2500 to be raised of this fund it was decided to appoint a committee to raise this balance this year. A motion was made seconded and carried that an offering be asked from each Parish according to the amount they can afford to give in order to finish out this fund. The chair appointed Mrs. John Bancroft, Chairman of the committee with Mrs. Robt. Rayner, and the three vice-presidents, Mrs. R. J. Lindale, Mrs. F. W. Curtis, Miss Giles, Assistants. Announcement was made of a Lawn Fete to be held at Bishopstead, for the benefit of the Belgian Relief for Children, about the 25th of June. It was announced that the Fall Meeting would be held in Dover and the Spring Meeting at St. Andrew's, Wilmington.

On motion the meeting adjourned.

ANNUAL MEETING.

November 13, 1919.

The 35th annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Delaware opened in St. John's Church, Wilmington, at 10.30 A. M. Bishop Roots of Hankow, China, was the speaker in the morning. He asked us to think of the Nation Wide Campaign not only in our parishes and Diocese but in the whole world. His text was "He poured His Blood for all."

Dr. Richey, rector of St. John's, celebrated the Holy Communion assisted by Archdeacon Thompson and the Rev. Mr. Adams.

Immediately after the service the congregation adjourned to the Parish House for luncheon.

As Bishop Rowe of Alaska had to take an early train he spoke at the opening of the meeting in the afternoon and told what the Nation Wide Campaign would mean to Alaska.

The minutes were read and approved.

This report was accepted subject to audit.

The Auditors appointed by the President were Mrs. Preston Lea and Mrs. F. W. Curtis. The President then gave her address.

The report of the Missionary box work was most encouraging.

The valuation of the boxes was \$2634.14.

The Educational Secretary, Mrs. Beacom, announced the following books for study during the year. "Neighbors," "Why and How" and "Then and Now," and urged that classes for Mission Study be formed and offered to supply leaders to those classes desiring them.

The receipts from the Lawn Fete held for the benefit of the work in the Soudan amounted to \$1068.65.

Mrs. Tallman Treasurer for the United Offering, reported \$3055 placed in the Alms Basin at the Thank Offering service held in Detroit in October.

Mrs. John Bancroft Chairman of the Committee to collect funds for the Child Welfare Commission reported that to date she had received only \$297.

Mrs. Bancroft also reported that the Memorial delivered by Judge Bradford on Bishop Lee had not yet been printed owing to the fact that Judge Bradford's illness had made it impossible for him to correct the proofs.

Mrs. Bringhurst announced a Mass Meeting to be held at the Garrick Théâtre, November 23, in the interest of the Nation Wide Campaign.

A motion was made and carried that a note of sympathy be sent Mrs. Bradford in her recent bereavement.

DIRECTIONS FOR PARISH SECRETARIES

1. The Directress of Missionary Box Work of the Diocesan Branch has on hand letters sent from the Church Missions House, stating need of missionaries, hospitals and schools in the Mission field. When your branch is ready to start work, write to the Directress for Missionary Box Work for such letters.
2. When your branch has undertaken the work for which your selected letter calls, notify the Directress at once, sending her the name and address in such letter, and your own address and parish.
3. It is of the utmost importance that immediately after such decision all rejected letters be returned to the Directress.
4. Write to the missionary at once, stating when and from whom he may expect a box.
5. Write to the missionary as soon as the box has been dispatched, also to the Diocesan Directress for Missionary Box Work, Mrs. W. D. Bradford, Middletown, Delaware, with statement concerning value of box.

REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY

In order to obtain definite information of the work of the Woman's Auxiliary, a questionnaire was sent out early in November. The questions asked were: how many women communicants in the parish, how many members in the Auxiliary, how often Auxiliary meetings are held, and how many usually attend these meetings. But fifteen replies have been received. These show a total of 1210 women communicants, about one-third of this number are members of the Auxiliary, and the total average attendance at meetings is 147. Nine Branches have program meetings, six report "no program."

An excellent suggestion comes from Georgetown where nearly every member has chosen a mission field and is supposed to report **current mission events** from her particular field

at each meeting. In this way the Auxiliary is kept informed as to the latest news from a large number of mission fields, and everyone is interested because everyone is doing something.

Fewer study classes were held last year, but very definite and excellent work was done through the "Advent Call", which was entered into enthusiastically by almost every Branch in the Diocese. The preceding June your secretary, together with the president, attended a conference on this work at The Church Missions House, New York City, and later led the training class for "Messengers" at St. Andrew's Parish House. During the year she has had the privilege also of visiting a number of Branches and speaking either on "The Call" or educational work.

After the Advent Call, the biggest undertaking was, perhaps, the lawn fete for the benefit of Dr. Kumm's work in the Sudan. Dr. Kumm has been in Wilmington several times, and on his last visit, at the meeting held at the residence of Mrs. Frank G. Tallman, and again at the evening meeting at St. John's Parish House, he spoke of the great need of hospitals in this land where there are none. Mrs. Irene duPont was chairman of the special committee in charge of the fete, which was given at her home in June, and it was largely due to her efforts that the affair was so successful. The amount required for one hospital is \$4000—they are very modest—and of this sum, \$1690.05 was received from the lawn fete, so that a most excellent beginning has been made, and it is earnestly hoped that Delaware can claim the honor of building the **first Christian hospital** in a territory as large as the whole United States.

Your secretary was present at the General Convention in Detroit and attended practically all the meetings of the Auxiliary, the study classes on the Nation Wide Campaign, and the three special conferences for educational secretaries.
