

**PRESIDENT'S REPORT****(May 8th 1929)***Greetings to My Fellow Workers of the Woman's Auxiliary!*

As we assemble for the 44th Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of Delaware, may I begin my second Annual Report by saying how much good it has done me to work with you. I thank you for the confidence and encouragement you have given me. I thank the members of the Executive Committee for their backing and sympathy and the Auxiliaries throughout the State for their steady, quiet work, without which I could have done nothing.

To keep in touch with your diocesan branch read your year book and study the copy of "The minutes of the Triennial", which each parish president may use as a guide through this Triennium.

Bishop Freeman calls the Woman's Auxiliary" a great Missionary body, second to none in the Church." Its work gives women a chance to live their religion and to make their lives "the best possible for God and the Church." I will not review the work of the past year in detail, but a few figures stand out in my mind. Our United Thank Offering for the last Triennium was the largest in our history—\$7,356.51—presented in Washington at the first service held in the new Cathedral. A tablet is to be placed in the Cathedral by the Woman's Auxiliary to commemorate this event and we are asked to contribute individually to it.

Our Corporate Gift was also the largest of the three we have taken part in—\$796. Our Supply work amounted in 1928 to over \$4,000, about \$900 of which was the value of knitted

articles sent to Alaska. Less second hand clothing was sent. Next year we must do better in that line tho Mrs. Wade tells us not to value it.

My greatest honor of the year was in being one of your five delegates to the Triennial in Washington, last October, where 477 delegates gathered from 110 Dioceses scattered all over the world. Representing 500,000 Woman's Auxiliary Members, assembled to learn how best to make Christ known. Never will I forget the opening service of the Convention, when President Coolidge made an address and Bishop Anderson of Chicago preached the sermon to thousand of people under a cloudless sky in the great open air amphitheatre! Two wonderful weeks followed of great services, huge mass meetings, daily Woman's Auxiliary meetings, receptions and missionary teas one in the Bishop's Garden.

Our own winter's work began with a fine meeting at the Church of the Ascension Claymont, November 8th. From the opening Service at 10, in a crowded church to the end of the afternoon meeting in the beautiful new parish house the day might be described in three words, worship, interest, hospitality. At this meeting a vivid account of the Triennial was given by Mrs. Linton.

On November 16th in Trinity Parish house, Miss Boyer had a mission study class on "The New Africa." Mr. Kirkus was the celebrant of the opening Communion Service. The offering formed the beginning of the Emily Tillotson Memorial pledge of \$50 which has since been completed. Each moment of the three-hour period was interesting, and Mrs. Linton was sorry that more did not make the effort to come.

Two new branches have been formed and we welcome them today into the Woman's Auxiliary family. They are at St. George's, Indian River, Sussex Co., and at Grace Church, Brandywine Hundred, New Castle County. Hillcrest has done splendidly.

Sussex County has responded to the energy of the new vice-president, Mrs. West as is shown by the following report: A conference of Parish Presidents held in Delmar at a luncheon; a Quiet Day and Officers' conference at Millsboro; a day devoted to a resume of "The New Africa" conducted by Rev. Paul Huntington and Mrs. Linton in Georgetown; a missionary tea in Millsboro for the St. Luke's Tokyo Fund and all pledges met.

The United Thank Offering is dear to our hearts and Mrs. Bradford wishes it to be one of thankful, joyful giving. May every woman in every parish have a blue box and use it. The United Thank Offering in Washington was the largest single contribution ever made to the church, \$1,101,450.40.

In becoming auxiliary to the National Council the Woman's Auxiliary pledged itself to stand back of the General Budget and every woman should understand about the quota in her parish and contribute to it.

This year we have been working for the biggest project in the Advance Work Program, the rebuilding of St. Luke's Medical Center Tokyo, Japan. Our pledge, a part of the Diocesan pledge, and the woman's million has been met and more. We pledged \$500 at the Epiphany Meeeting at Old Swedes, January 10th and raised, during the year, our \$1,800. Our share of the Corporate Gift has also been raised.

The Church Periodical goes quietly on its way doing good among the isolated. In some parts of this country it is the best known activity of the Woman's Auxiliary. We accept Mrs. Records's resignation as Director with regret. The resignation of Miss Lea as vice-president for New Castle County we accept most unwillingly. She became really intimate with her branches, which include 516 of the members of the Woman's Auxiliary in Delaware. We thank her for holding the officers Conference at her house February 19th and for arranging the

Quiet Day Service at Immanuel and for being the able Chairman of the St. Luke's Fund.

Mrs. Prettyman resigned as chairman of the Knitting Committee because she thought someone else should have the pleasure! We thank her for making her work the success it has been, amounting in six years to about 2,000 articles sent to Alaska, valued at \$5,000. She began with one knitter. During the year I have visited 17 branches in the State, regretting I could not accept all my invitations.

The three Quiet Days and Officers' Conferences were helpful, the meditations being conducted by Rev. Paul Huntington, Rev. W. B. Beach D. D., and Rev. J. S. Hinks.

I took eight children from Calvary in my car to the Presentation Service of the Lenten Offering at Immanuel, New Castle on April 21st and represented the Woman's Auxiliary on the World's Day of Prayer.

I suggest that each parish branch pay \$2 a year toward the expenses of a delegate to the Annual Meeting and Convention of the Diocese. I hope for a large attendance from Delaware at the Summer conference at Ocean City the last week of June.

I close my report by calling to your attention a resolution passed very earnestly by the delegates to the Triennial in Washington, in the name of the whole auxiliary.

"Be it resolved that we pray that all hesitation in witnessing for Christ may be taken from our hearts, and that we pray to have a fervent desire to share Him with others."

### **EXTRACTS FROM THE MINUTES OF THE AUTUMN MEETING**

The autumn meeting was held on November 8, 1928 in Claymont. After a Corporate Communion in the Church of The Ascension the meeting was called to order by the President in the newly finished Parish House.

After luncheon and roll call to which 210 members responded we were addressed by Bishop Mosher on his work in the Philippines.

### **EXTRACTS FROM THE MINUTES OF THE EPIPHANY MEETING**

The Epiphany Meeting was held in Old Swedes Church, Wilmington, on Thursday January 10th, 1929. Bishop Cook spoke on St. Luke's Hospital in Tokyo. He traced its history from a small beginning in a tiny paper house to its present position as a vital point of contact between East and West and showed how this had been accomplished in the lifetime of one man, as a result of Dr. Teusler's vision and consecration.

87 members responded to the roll call. The speakers were, Mrs. Henry Cook, Director of the Church Periodical Club, Mrs. James Craik Morris, wife of the Bishop of the Panama Canal Zone.

### **EXTRACTS FROM THE ANNUAL MEETING**

The Annual Meeting was held in Middletown on May 7th, 1929. The sessions opened in St. Anne's Church with a celebration of the Holy Communion, followed by the Bishop's Annual address.

Following luncheon the meetings of the Auxiliary were called to order by the President, Mrs. Higgins.

161 Members answered the roll call. Our speaker Dr. Mabel E. Elliott, of St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo was introduced by Mrs. Higgins. She told of the work being done by the Christian Hospital of which the Emperor of Japan is a patron.

Mrs. Pratt reported for Miss Jennie Lovett Lea, Chairman of St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo Fund that \$1,591.00 had been subscribed.

Mrs. Higgins Annual report followed:

250 members responded to the roll call the second day. The meeting was opened by Mrs. Bringhurst with a brief devotional service.

After the reading of reports from various officers we were addressed by Mrs. Robert Frazier on her work among the Indians of South Dakota.

**REPORT OF THE CORPORATE GIFT****1925-1928**

Our gift from Delaware amounted to \$796.00 toward the grand total of \$122,042.76. We have paid (1928 and 1929) on the new Corporate Gift our full quota \$317.

And now a word about the new Corporate Gift. The organization for the old Corporate Gift is being used for the new and work is already begun on raising the money which is set at \$50,000 to be completed by Epiphany, 1930. The first \$25,000 of this is to go for a church at Santo Domingo, City, Santo Domingo Republic and they hope to have most of it by Easter of this year. The other objects are \$10,000 for a water supply at Ethete, Wyoming; \$10,000 for a dormitory at Christ School, Arden, North Carolina; and \$5,000 for a church at Silver City, Panama Canal Zone. After the completion of this portion of the gift, we are to be ready to receive directions from the National Council as to our further advance work.

### REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY

The educational work of the year began with an Institute for Mission Study and Methods, which was held in Trinity Parish House, Wilmington, in November. The classes were conducted by Miss Laura F. Boyer, then acting educational secretary of the whole Woman's Auxiliary. The program included a celebration of Holy Communion, a conference on methods, a demonstration of class work on the subject, "Who Lives in Africa?", a box luncheon during which the ladies of Trinity served coffee, a summing up of method and a second demonstration on the subject, "What of the Future?"

About 60 people attended, and the interest and enthusiasm shown during the day over Miss Boyer's splendid talks resulted in greater activity in mission study throughout the year. 11 branches report study classes, 9 have not reported. Of these last, I know at least 3 had representatives at an all day meeting.

In March, the Woman's Auxiliary of St. Paul's Georgetown, invited all the branches of Sussex County to an "Intensive Day" for a review of the subject of Africa. St. Paul's Auxiliary prepared for the day by having a conference one evening, using the text questions and "Attitude Gauges" in the leader's hand book. The leader for the "Intensive Day" was Rev. Paul Huntington of Millsboro. The program included a devotional period, a talk by the leader followed by discussion. The leader's subject continued, luncheon served by the ladies of the Georgetown branch, a resume of the whole subject and discussion.

Our President, Mrs. Higgins, was at the meeting, and seven parishes were represented. About 50 people present.

We have sold this year;

71 copies of "The New Africa"

16 copies of "The Method of the Discussion Group"

33 copies supplementary books about Africa

50 copies of the Woman's Auxiliary Prayer.

Several maps and pamphlets (120) books and have distributed 100 copies of the Intercessions for Africa, and about 65 copies each of the pamphlets. The Discussion Group and the Program Meetings.

For these we paid the Book Store \$69.49 and kept a discount of \$14.44, making a total sales of \$83.93. Besides this we had the sum of \$.92 made up of extras in making change etc., making our cash amount to \$15.36.
