PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As we approach the beginning of a new year it is not an unusual thing to look with regret upon our failures while recording with satisfaction our accomplishments of the past twelve months.

As a whole, our work has been encouragingly satisfactory. Our new Cathedral branch has been formed and in most particulars there has been a slight increase in membership and interest. Our stated meetings, Epiphany, May, and October, have all been well attended, and appeals generously responded to.

Quiet Days have been observed in each County and were periods of spiritual refreshment.

The customary County Auxiliary Days have been of deep interest and we regard these group meetings as of great help in keeping all Parishes of the Diocese informed of the work before us and the proposed method of its accomplishment.

I refer you to the personal reports of the different Secretaries and Chairmen here printed for information of the results achieved in each department.

The Social Service Department which was inaugurated in October, 1936, will, we hope, be instrumental in drawing in to active service an interested group of young women of the Church.

The Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council is the organized power of the Church, and rightfully all departments of the women's work of the Church should be under that organization. This may readily be accomplished through the Social Service Department which covers all Guilds, welfare, and civic work, and may include all ages and groups without affecting their identity or close association.

EXTRACTS FROM THE MINUTES

Epiphany meeting, January 14, 1938, at St. Anne's, Middletown, ninety members present. Speaker was Dr. John Chapman, for many years missionary in Alaska, who told of work with Indians and the mission at Anvik.

Annual meeting, held at Immanuel Church, Wilmington, on May 11 and 12, with 209 present the first day and 169 the second. Speakers were Miss Lillian H. Harper, of New York, who told of a visit to Alaska and the splendid work done by Mr. and Mrs. Grafton Burke; and Rev. Brooks Stabler, President of the Church Society for College Work, who told of work of that Society. Pledges from the floor for General Missions, to be applied to the Diocesan Expectancy, if necessary, amounted to \$242.00. It was voted to add fifty cents to the pledge cards of each branch for the library fund. Appointed officers were announced as follows:

Mrs. John MacLulich, Corresponding Secretary; Mrs. Richard S. Rodney, Chairman of Knitting; Miss Adeline Cook, Social Service Secretary; Miss Mary Littell, Assistant Secretary.

The Fall meeting was held November 3rd at St. Andrew's Church, Wilmington, with 276 members present. Speakers were Rt. Rev. Shirley H. Nichols, Bishop of Tokio; Rev. William Goodman, of Point Hope, Alaska, and Mrs. Edward Ingersoll, Associate Member of the Forward Movement Commission, who gave a report of the findings of the Triennial Meeting. A report of the Triennial Meeting, with emphasis on the opening service and the United Thank Offering Corporate Communion Service, was given by Mrs. Ernest May. The amount of the offering was \$861,030.53. Notice was given of the appointment of a Publicity Committee, Miss Mary Littell, chairman, Mrs. William E. Linton, and Mrs. John MacLulich.

REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL DEPARTMENT**January 1 to December 31, 1937**

The Educational Secretary reports continued interest in missionary education in the Woman's Auxiliary. This does not mean that we are doing all we can in this appointed task of learning about the work our Church is doing to spread the Gospel through all the world. But it does mean that real effort and interest is being shown in a majority of our branches, and there is an encouraging recognition of the need for such knowledge even on the part of those branches which are not yet very active in this line. Though seven branches sent no report and four reported nothing done, nineteen have had some sort of missionary instruction, and most of them show real accomplishment. Some branches had regular weekly sessions with a different leader for each session, with much discussion and active interest. A few report passing books around to be read. Nearly all the branches had at least one speaker on Negro America or Africa; a number had the Rev. Mr. Henry to tell about his work; several individuals went to hear the daughter of Bishop Gardner of Liberia. One branch had a six-session class on General Missions and a twelve-session week-day Bible Class, both well attended; another had a most intensive and successful study class. They worked out a Summary of Attitudes Resulting from the Study, and they made such concrete applications as contributions to the work of our own Negro priest and to Bishop Demby of Arkansas, a native of Delaware; and a letter was sent to each of the two houses of the State Legislature urging the passing of a bill providing an appropriation for new buildings and equipment for the Edgewood Sanitarium for Negro tubercular patients, the present plant being inadequate and unsafe.

A G. F. S. Branch entertained their parish branch of the Woman's Auxiliary at an African Palaver with a most naturalistic jungle setting.

"The Church and Rural America" has been chosen by most of the branches for study during the season just begun.

The following books have been added to the Diocesan Library this year: "Understanding Negro-Americans" (a Leader's Handbook), "Liberia" (a Church Missions Handbook), "Aggrey of Africa," "Christ in the Dark Forest," "Twelve Negro Americans," "The Life of Temple Gairdner of Cairo," "Consider Africa" (cloth bound), "Preface to Racial Understanding" (cloth bound), "The Story of the American Negro."

REPORT OF THE DIOCESAN SOCIAL SERVICE DEPARTMENT

The Secretary of this Department has emphasized Juvenile Court probation work in Kent and Sussex Counties as a demonstration to the State of the great need for this work.

During the past year ninety children have been through the courts; five were sent to the school, the rest are on probation. Three hundred and twelve home visits have been made in Sussex, 336 visits in Kent, 240 visits to schools, 96 to the courts; many conferences held with other social agencies, and 10,100 miles covered; twenty-four towns and environs visited each month.

It was hoped that the Legislature would realize the State's responsibility for the children of Delaware. A probation officer with a workable budget would cost \$2,500, and many children would be given a fresh start; the State would be saved the cost of keeping many children in the Industrial Schools.

The work in New Castle County continued with the girls in the Girls' Friendly Society under the leadership of Miss Anne Bell.

Clinical work for the children of the Court has gone ahead. Ninety-six visits were made to the Court, 304 visits to homes, 150 to clinics.

In my work in Rural Delaware I see the need for some kind of Community House that will serve as a recreational center for the boys and girls as well as their parents. This work ought not be undertaken without consulting other agencies, such as the Children's Bureau and the Mother's Pension. This would seem to be our next step forward.

SUMMARY OF THE REPORT OF THE FIRST WOMAN'S AUXILIARY SOCIAL SERVICE SECRETARY IN DELAWARE

First, I wish to emphasize that Social Service work is not new to any Woman's Auxiliary member. It is the basic work of the Auxiliary at large.

The department was formed to enable us through an organized plan to render helpful service to the needy.

This service has been given during part of the year through a group of young women who have worked with juvenile court children; have formed a motor corps for the Family Society and Relief Commission; have worked with needy families connected with our Church whenever the Woman's Auxiliary has been notified of the need. All this has been done with the help of Miss Wagner and several social service workers in Wilmington who have talked to the group on their particular fields of work, and several women in various Auxiliaries who assisted with individual cases.

The plan is to have a social service department in every branch in the Diocese eventually, and this group has shown some of the lines along which the department can work.
