Work for the year began as usual, with the opening service, held in the Church of the Ascension, November 3, 1896. The Bishop of the Diocese celebrated the Holy Communion and gave an address. At the meeting which followed, eighteen Parishes were represented, and a new Parish Branch, that of the Church of the Incarnation, was welcomed.

Regular meetings have been held monthly, with an increasing attendance. Twenty-seven Parishes now appear on our roll, but it is our earnest desire to include the name of every Parish and Mission in the Diocese. The roll is as follows: Ascension, Advent, Christ Church (Georgetown), Christ Church (Washington), Emmanuel (Anacostia), Epiphany, Incarnation, Our Saviour (Brookland), St. Andrew's, St. John's (Georgetown), St. John's (Washington), St. Luke's, St. Margaret's, St. Mark's, St. Mary's Chapel, St. Michael and All Angels', St. Paul's (Rock Creek), St. Paul's (Washington), St. Stephen's, St. Thomas', Trinity, Durham Church (Charles County), Holy Trinity (Collington), St. John's (Beltsville), St. John's (Chevy Chase), St. Luke's (Bladensburg), and St. Thomas' (Croom).

The work of individual Branches has been much the same as heretofore; the preparing and sending of boxes to Missionaries and Missions. We have twice as much work of this kind in our new Diocese, as fell to our share under the old Diocese of Maryland, but Missions *outside* of our borders have not been forgotten.

Our *united* work is the support of the Catherine E. Jones Memorial Scholarship in St. Mary's School, Shanghai, China; and the Christmas and Easter boxes. Three boxes were sent at Christmas, to Mission schools in South Dakota, North Carolina and Maryland; two at Easter, one to the Eye and Ear Hospital in our own city, the other to a Mission at Morganton, North Carolina. A general contribution was given towards the purchase of a horse for this Mission. No Missionary services have been held for the Auxiliary this year; but at a special meeting in November, a large gathering of women welcomed Miss Emery, and listened to her helpful words; and at other meetings we have had addresses from the Rev. Dr. Devries and from Miss Pendleton; and an interesting paper on Missions, prepared and read by a member of Epiphany Branch. "The Quiet Day for Women" has now become one of the regular privileges of the Lenten season. It was conducted this year by the Bishop of the Diocese, in the Pro-Cathedral, April 1st, and was well attended and gratefully appreciated. Our thanks are due to the Bishop, and also to the Clergy of the Diocese for kind coöperation. The report of Missionary Boxes is given herewith. It is encouraging to find an increase in value over the report of last year.
