## REPORT OF EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY

The Educational Department of the Woman's Auxiliary has shown a gratifying increase of activity and efficiency during the year. This is largely owing to the labors of the Committee called together by the Secretary, consisting of Mrs. Wm. F. Bowen, Mrs. D. N. Carpenter, Mrs. J. T. Featherstone, and Mrs. J. J. T. Graham, each one of whom was given definite duties.

Mrs. Featherstone most generously took charge of Room 25 kindly provided by the authorities of Epiphany Parish, in its commodious House. She was present every Friday and supplemented her wise advice to all inquirers with the books provided by our Missions House. A grant of \$25.00 from the Diocesan Treasury established our business and we soon turned over about \$100.00 in books, leaflets and calendars.

In this same Headquarters Mrs. Bowen held the Diocesan Mission study class for six weeks on "China's Real Revolution". This was enthusiastically taught and well attended and even if fewer classes in parishes resulted than we had hoped for general intelligence was greatly increased.

To Mrs. Carpenter and Mrs. Graham was given the work of answering calls for help in parish branch meetings and we are glad to say that every request was filled, and the visited groups expressed great satisfaction in the help given.

The best work of the year is not to be tabulated in statistics however. The beginning of what we hope, before long, may be a real Headquarters open all year for our Auxiliary activities is a truly forward step. And many branches, intimidated by the word "study" have nevertheless established discussion classes and at the same time we have more regular study classes than ever before—So we take courage and look ahead in hope, toward the ideal which is to bring home to every intelligent church woman her opportunity in setting forward the Church's Mission. To reach this end perhaps no one effort can be more valuable than for each Parish Branch to send one, at least, of its members to a Summer School. Wherever this is done a great increase in interest is at once manifest.

### REPORT OF CHURCH PERIODICAL CLUB

The Church Periodical Club is still striving to bring together those who have and those who have not, by persuading the former to share their books and magazines with the latter.

In this Diocese twenty-five parishes have C. P. C. libraries but with all their enthusiastic efforts these Librarians have been able to enlist only about five hundred persons in the work.

Surely a greater number of unselfish readers should be found who, the more they enjoy book or magazine, the more they long to have their neighbor enjoy it, too.

Magazines through the C. P. C. are sent to the lonely in all parts of our country and to our Missionaries in foreign lands.

To those who love to read, the C. P. C. should be a joy, for what is more thrilling than to share with others what one enjoys oneself.

The following are some of the items taken from the Annual Report:

"During the year 1924 from this Diocese were sent 548 current periodicals by 287 donors. 1709 books of all sorts. 7783 old magazines, 3754 Christmas and Easter cards and pictures; 184 games and scrap books.

The amount of money expended was \$344.56. Of this The Woman's Auxiliary, by its annual dues of \$2.00 from each parish contributed \$50.00."
