## Report of Annual Meeting.

---

The eleventh annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of Duluth, was held in Trinity Pro-Cathedral, Duluth, June 20, 1907.

At 10 a. m. there was a celebration of the Holy Communion, at which the Bishop of the Diocese was Celebrant, the preacher being Rev. T. C. Thurston, of Minneapolis.

Noonday prayers were said by the Dean, who afterwards gave a few words of greeting to the Auxiliary.

The roll call showed a representation from eight parishes—with 30 members present.

The President's address followed, and a letter from Miss Emery, the General Secretary, was read.

Following this the minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The report of the Secretary was read and approved.

The meeting adjourned at 12:55 for lunch.

Luncheon was served in Trinity Hall to about 130, by the Brotherhood of St. Andrew's, assisted by several ladies of Trinity Parish.

The business meeting was resumed at 1:50, opening with hymn 253.

The report of Treasurer was read and referred to the committee on Finance.

Letters of acknowledgment and thanks were read by the Secretary from those to whom our branch had sent contribution during the past year.

The report of the Junior Auxiliary was read, and also a leaflet from Board of Missions about the Junior work, suggesting different objects which might claim our active interest.

The report of the Secretary-Treasurer of the Little Helpers in the absence of that officer, was read by Mrs. W. J. Suffel.

The correspondent of the Church Periodical club having been absent during the entire winter, there was no report.

The parishes represented and reporting were St. Paul's-Duluth. Trinity-Duluth. St. John's-Duluth, Leech Lake. White Earth. Willow River, St. John's-Red Lake. St. Antipas-Red Lake.

The subject of our giving to the work among the colored people was freely discussed.

Then followed the reports of the standing committees.

The report on plans of work being very helpful, it will be published in a future number of the Duluth Churchman.

The special committee on the disposition of the United Offering reported that it seemed to be the opinion of all the branches in our Diocese that a generous portion of the next United Offering should be given to the Board of Missions for Church Industrial Institutions among the Colored people.

Upon motion it was decided to instruct the delegates to the triennial meeting to ask that a generous

portion of our United Offering be given to the Board of Missions for industrial work among the Negroes.

Then followed a discussion of the disposition of the funds of the Junior Auxiliary, and it was decided upon motion to recommend that the money be used to support a child's bed in some foreign hospital, and that a box be sent as heretofore to one of our home missions.

The nominating committee reported the nomination of the officers as named on page 3. Upon motion it was decided to dispense with the ballot and elect all the officers as named.

The President was then authorized by vote to appoint if she so desired second vice-presidents for the coming year.

A rising vote of thanks was given to the Secretary-Treasurer, retiring, for her painstaking services during the past two years.

Upon motion it was decided that the auditing of the accounts be done at the close of the meeting, and the president empowered to approve the report.

The report of the Box Custodian was read and approved.

The following delegates were elected to represent the Duluth Auxiliary at the triennial meeting: Mrs. W. J. Suffel, Mrs. W. H. Stultz, Mrs. Page Morris, Mrs. W. E. Jones, Mrs. Henry Taylor, Mrs. Geo. St. Clair, Miss Rachel Hunter, Mrs. A. W. Ryan.

Upon motion the president was empowered to fill the vacant places of any of the above delegates who might be unable to attend the meeting.

Upon motion it was decided to ask each of the first

vice-presidents to be responsible for a certain portion of the district box.

It was also decided to appoint the second vice-presidents as a standing committee on subscriptions to the Spirit of Missions.

On motion it was decided to have the President's address printed in the August number of the Duluth Churchman if there is no room for it in the July number.

Upon the statement that the treasury contained a balance on hand of \$33.45, it was decided upon motion to place this amount in the United Offering.

It was announced that the morning's offering amounted to \$15.92, and it was decided upon motion that \$5 of this fund should be put into the Central Expense Fund, and the remainder be given to Bishop Morrison for Diocesan Missions.

A design for a badge was submitted by a local firm and accepted by the Auxiliary, the design being a gold maltese cross within a circle, with the words "Love and Service" and "Duluth" in blue enamel upon the circle. Mrs. Berry and Miss Redman were appointed

a committee to confer with different manufacturers as to price.

The business of the day being finished the Bishop gave a short address, full of appreciation of the work of the Woman's Auxiliary, and closed the eleventh annual meeting with the benediction.

#### SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Madam President and members of the Auxiliary:

This year we come together for the eleventh annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Duluth. We have the pleasure as well as the inspiration this time which comes from being in a real church edifice, and one which marks the beginning of great things in this city.

During the past year the Secretary has sent out over one hundred Annual Reports of our work, a few being sent to other branches of the Auxiliary. Miss Emery's annual report as well as leaflets and report blanks from her were distributed throughout the district. The business correspondence amounted to about 80 communications sent, and 60 received. It was asked last year that the report blanks and money be sent in promptly at the close of the year. The compliance with this request aided the Secretary greatly.

On May 31st the President called a meeting of Diocesan officers at her home, to discuss plans for the annual meeting. Four were present.

The past year our roll call has numbered twenty-three, but only sixteens branches have sent reports. No new branches have been formed, while four were organized the preceding year. In looking over past reports it seems many names have en-

tirely dropped from our list. This is partly due to transient residence, but mainly to lack of interest and enthusiasm some where. Our growth depends to a large extent upon the knowledge we have of the great work we are helping. Do we realize the battle being waged at the front by courageous, unselfish persons, against ignorance, superstition and sin in its many ghastly forms? If so those courageous, unselfish persons should be supported and strengthened by our earnest prayers. They should feel the strength come to them through those at home. Prayer means hard work, real service. Let us strive more earnestly to live up to our motto "Love and Service" and as our love increases so will our service. When we have attained this knowledge and a more intelligent understanding of the work and needs in the various fields the enthusiasm necessary to make our district a strong power in this onward movement will come as a consequent result. In all our efforts let us remember with Browning that,

"All service ranks the same with God,  
Each only as God wills can work.  
There is no last nor first."

Madam President and Members of the Auxiliary:

The report for this year is on the whole encouraging, but there is opportunity for renewed effort in the different departments and different branches. The Central Expense Fund is in better condition than last

year, but still has not increased sufficiently to cover cost of printing of Annual Reports. The United Offering is smaller, a fact to be regretted when one realizes that this is the year it is to be gathered in from all parts of the country. Although the gifts for Foreign, Domestic and Diocesan Missions are much reduced, those for General Missions have grown proportionately, and we can now more than keep our pledge of \$100 to the Board. The Indian record shows more interest as well as growth over work of preceding year, warning us to take heed that we fail not in our duty. The acknowledgements of money sent by our Branch show with what grateful hearts the gifts were received.
