THE PRESIDENT OF EACH BRANCH WILL
PLEASE READ THIS REPORT ALOUD AT THE
FIRST AUTUMN MEETING.

PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

After welcoming the members of the Auxiliary to the Annual Meeting, and expressing her thankfulness at the steadily growing sense of responsibility for their task, shown of late by the leaders, the President gave a condensed report of her own work during the past year.

Prominent among her activities was the organization of five branches of the Junior Auxiliary, with repeated visitations of the newly formed organizations. Four outside towns were visited, and addresses made to both young and old upon the work, and methods of the Auxiliary. Three board meetings were held at the home of the President, and a special meeting to arrange for a School of Missions; and also a parlor meeting with Miss Tillottson as speaker. "The School of Missions" was held under the direction of the president, led by Miss Tillottson of New York. The president had attended the Provincial meeting held in Minneapolis, and assisted in organization of the Woman's Department, being one of a committee of three to outline and prepare its constitution.

While in Minneapolis the president attended the School of Missions conducted in connection with the Provincial meeting. In February she presented the Missionary Pageant "Daybreak in the West," with five of the Junior Branches in the city of Duluth, assisted by a few of the older Sunday School leaders.

Through correspondence mostly, arrangements were made by the president for a contest for a pennant, to be awarded to the Junior Branch sending in the best Essay on Alaskan missionary work, and a map of Alaska, with marked missionary stations, schools and hospitals; and she had made arrangements for a series of Stereopticon lectures on Alaska to be given in the Diocese. This, besides attending regularly the parochial branch connected with Trinity Cathedral, and conducting a large correspondence relative to the educational, and progressive work of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese and the beginning of a small traveling Missionary Library.

A part of the address was devoted to a plea for united effort, and that in addition to the Diocesan Box, now sent, some other special work be undertaken by all the branches together. The president urged the women to arrange at an early date, for a complete "House to House" canvass for membership, in every parish represented. She told of a parish that had tried it; starting with 28 members, they succeeded in one week's time in making 250 calls, increasing their membership to 83.

In speaking of the first section of the Juniors, the president drew the attention of the women to the fact that the "Little Helpers" in the Diocese of Duluth, was not as flourishing as it should be, and she compared the branch to a nursery of trees, saying that if the nursery were not kept up in the Auxiliary, our full grown orchards would soon die out. The Little Helpers branch, she went on to say, is a real help to the mothers, for it gives to the mothers one definite way of leading their babies along the way of sacrifice,

and thus helps in the building of Christ's Kingdom. "Will not the auxiliary," the president said, "try to realize that this branch (No. 1) is trying to do what they long to do-reaching the mothers who cannot attend our meetings, and placing the little red boxes where they will bring the work into the home?" She closed with a request that at every meeting of the Auxiliary during the coming year, prayer should be offered for the growth of our youngest section, and that the older branches commend themselves to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, that He might put into our hearts "Right Desires" that we may think, as we plan, only of His glory whose servants we are.

DIOCESAN BOX COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

Thirty-four Auxiliaries and Guilds responded to the call for money for the Diocesan Box, with sums ranging from one to twelve dollars each, making a total of one hundred-fifteen dollars and fifteen cents.

Of this amount fifty-eight dollars was sent in checks to the clergyman receiving the box and the balance, with the exception of five dollars, which came after the account was closed, was used to purchase the clothing and other articles asked for. In the hands of the committee the balance of forty-two dollars and fifteen cents was made to cover the cost of goods amounting to nearly double that amount. With gifts contributed, express charges, etc., the total value of the Diocesan Box amounted to \$140.78.

Little Falls, Church of our Saviour, shows a great interest in their Junior Auxiliary with six members, under the leadership of Miss Lucy Warner. They sent two bags of Sunday School magazines to Williams, Minn., and a box of dolls and calendars to the Indians in this Diocese. Also money for a hospital for colored children in Charlotte, N. C., and St. Matthew's Hospital at Fairbanks, Alaska. Miss Warner says the girls are deeply interested in their work and regretted they could not do more.

At **Cloquet**, St. Andrew's, organized a branch a year ago last April and reports a membership of 22, with Mrs. Ward, the Rector's wife, as leader. They bought a new organ, painted the rectory and sent money towards the apportionment.

Duluth, Trinity Cathedral, reorganized its branch a little over a year ago under the direction of Miss Hunter, who was succeeded by Miss Ennockson, with a membership of 10. They have given an entertainment, a food and candy sale, and also sent a Christmas box to the Indian School at Vermillion Lake. The girls are much interested in their work and expect to do a great deal this coming year.

Duluth, St. Peter's Church, organized a branch a year ago, under the direction of Mrs. Wm. Lewis. They expect to make a report next year.

Duluth, St. Paul's Church. This branch had a very prosperous and interesting year, with an average of five members at each meeting, under the leadership, the first part of the year, of Mrs. Wanless, and later,

of Miss Dorothy Oleott. They sent a box to Rev. G. G. Ware in Western Nebraska. After Christmas they took a room in St. Luke's Hospital, Duluth, which they supply with linen, also making scrap books to place in the room to amuse the occupants. This spring they studied "The Lives of Great Missionaries," at each meeting, which proved interesting and instructive.

Lakeside, Duluth, St. John's Church, has a membership of nineteen under the leadership of Mrs. McKnight and have sent in money for Diocesan Missionary work.

Royalton, Grace Church. The report was incorporated in the report of the Ladies' Guild, by the Rev. Carswell and was presented by him at the annual meeting.

The Missionary Pageant, "Daybreak in the West," which was written and staged in Duluth by Mrs. J. D. Morrison, resulted in the organization of five new branches in the city, and shows what can be done by earnest and united effort. Each of the five Junior branches gave one or more scenes in the Pageant, the whole working out most admirably, and to the pleasure and edification of two large audiences.
