REPORT OF ANNUAL MEETING.

The Twenty-second Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Duluth was held in Trinity Cathedral June 4, 1918.

The business meeting was preceded by a celebration of the Holy Communion at 10 a. m., at which service Rev. E. W. Couper was celebrant, and the Bishop of the Diocese preached the sermon.

At 11:30 the meeting was called to order for business by the President, Mrs. J. D. Morrison.

Following a few words of greeting by the President, roll-call was responded to by delegates from the eight parishes represented: St. Andrew's, Cloquet, 4; Trinity Cathedral, Duluth, 9; St. Paul's, Duluth, 11; St. Peter's, Duluth, 1; St. James, Fergus Falls, 3; St. John's, Onigum, 3; St. John's, Red Lake, 1—one delegate from each parish branch answering to the questions as voted at the last annual meeting. Information thus furnished gave: Number belonging to each parish branch, number having United Offering boxes, number of home departments, and the number of subscriptions to "The Spirit of Missions."

Upon request, the President made explanation of the object of the Central Expense Fund.

The President read her annual address; in her review of the past year's work paying tribute to Miss Julia C. Emery, organizer of the Pilgrimage of Prayer.

In closing, Mrs. Morrison took for her subject "The

Vision of the Leader." She outlined the plan submitted by the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to enlist all women of our Church in a definite campaign to utilize our spiritual power for the work of reconstruction after the close of the great world war. To carry out this plan, leaders with a vision, she said, must be trained. She asked for volunteers who would consecrate themselves to this great work, and if possible attend one of the Summer Conferences for Church workers at which such training might be received.

A rising vote of thanks was given Mrs. Morrison for her twenty years of service as President of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Notice was given of special objects for which pledges would later be called.

Attention was called to the valuable information received from parishes through the response of the Woman's Auxiliary to questionnaires sent out by Mrs. F.W. Paine, officer in charge.

Speaking of the United Offering, the President expressed the hope that this year would find a blue box in every home. She asked that an effort be made for the accomplishment of that hope as a memorial to her twenty years service as President.

By vote, the minutes of the last annual meeting were accepted as printed in the Annual Report.

The Corresponding Secretary's Report was read and approved.

The Treasurer's Report was read and approved, subject to the report of the Finance Committee.

The United Offering Treasurer's Report was read and approved.

Luncheon, served in the Guild Hall by the ladies of St. Peter's, St. Andrew's by the Lake, and Holy Apostles, was followed by the afternoon session.

Reports of the Secretary and the Treasurer of the Junior Branch were read and approved.

The Secretary of the Little Helpers' Branch being absent, there was no report.

The President announced with expressions of regret the resignation of Mrs. James Wanless, Secretary of Little Helpers, and of Miss Frances Nesbitt, Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club. There was no report from the latter.

The Chairman of the Box Committee gave her report, with letters descriptive of the field and work of the missionary clergyman receiving the box.

Mrs. M. F. Jamar, Sr., gave her report as Chairman of the Committee on State of the Auxiliary at Large.

Miss Pauline Colby, for twenty-six years a worker among the Indians of the Diocese, gave a report of Auxiliary work of Indian women. She spoke with appreciation of the helpfulness of boxes received from Auxiliary branches. Mrs. Rosa Chatfield, secretary of a Junior Branch of 19 members, gave an outline of work done by young Indian girls.

By vote, the morning offering of \$7.80 was given to Central Expense account.

The Finance Committee reported the Treasurer's accounts correct.

With nominations from the floor, officers for next year were elected, and approved by Bishop Morrison as found on page 2.

The Round Table discussion on "The United Offering" was led by Mrs. O. S. Kempton, who introduced the subject with a talk on "The Aim of all Church Work."

Mrs. E. W. Couper spoke on "The Spiritual Element in all our Church Work." Mrs. A. B. Hilton, comparing our efforts to aerial flights, gave a talk supplementary to Mrs. Couper's.

Mrs. J. D. Morrison, speaking on the "Conservation of our Forces," called attention to the value of small amounts when multiplied, by stating that one cent a week for three years given through the blue boxes by each member of twenty of our parishes would result in a sum amounting to over \$2,000 for the Triennial.

To encourage systematic giving through the blue boxes, the following Central Committee was appointed by the President, to be enlarged if necessary: Mrs. O. S.

Kempton, Mrs. Robert Hannah, Mrs. W. E. A. Lequesne and Mrs. F. W. Paine.

Continuing the Round Table, "War Work for the Auxiliary" was discussed under the heads: "Enlistment or Conscription" (Mrs. Hannah) "Self-Sacrifice and Preparation for Battle" (Mrs. Brocklehurst), and "The Vision of the Leader," (Mrs. J. D. Morrison).

The meeting closed with prayer and was adjourned.

A Special Conference for Delegates from Indian Missions was held at 11:30 a. m., Wednesday, June 5, at St. Paul's Church.

The singing of familiar hymns translated into the Ojibwa language was a part of the service.

Talks given by Mrs. Morrison, by Miss Pauline Colby, and by Mrs. Lequesne, were interpreted by Mrs. Rosa Chatfield.

Through their interpreter, Mrs. Bonga of Onigum and Mrs. Frank English of Red Lake told of the Auxiliary work of their women and of their appreciation of what Christianity and the Church means for their people.

Prayers were asked for one of their members, 85 years old.

The meeting closed with singing from the Indian translation and was adjourned at 12:45.
