REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT, 1914-1915

It is with a heart full of thanksgiving to Almighty God that we are able to say, as we review the work of the past year, that the result is progress.

There was a fear in our hearts, because of the many unusual calls for funds for the Red Cross work and the great world's needs, that the work of the Auxiliary would be neglected. But for the first time the Diocese of Easton has paid its apportionment, and the Auxiliary helped to do this.

The convention of the Diocese has kindly recognized us as an organized department of Diocesan work and generously given us space in the Journal.

We gratefully acknowledge the cordial response to our request, and we feel it has added dignity to the work we are trying to do. It becomes absolutely necessary to have all Parish Reports in the hands of the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary by the last of April that we may be ready to report to the Diocesan Convention the first of June. Blanks will be sent to each Parish Branch. Please show your respect for the "King's business" by filling out these blanks fully and returning promptly to Mrs. P. A. M. Brooks, Chestertown, Md. The United Offering now amounts to \$1,085.73. A number of branches have given more this year than ever before. But there are many women who have not yet found the joy of using a "Thank you" box. Mrs. Hines found it impossible to accept the Treasurership of the United Offering because of work already undertaken. So, for this year please send the United Offering to Mrs. John T. Keas, Berlin, Md., acting United Offering Treasurer.

The inter-parochial meetings held last spring were enthusiastically received and attended in the Northern Convocation. We hope for increased interest in these meetings in the Middle and Southern Convocations in 1916. Let us all learn this year more and more the value and pleasure of Study Classes. All, I trust, will use the "Spirit of Missions."

Lastly, let us pray for vision. In the words of another, "the vision of daily service may be with each of us as we rise in the morning to take up our appointed task, and is needful to keep us sweet in temper and sane in mind." Every day the vision will grow clearer until we will see beyond our own little corner of the vineyard to the faraway fields, where

the laborers are few and over-burdened. Some will send the laborers, and others will go themselves, seeing not only the vision but hearing the call—"Come over and help us."

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING.

The annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary was held in St. Peter's Parish, Salisbury, October 20th and 21st, 1915.

WEDNESDAY, 2.30 P. M.

The President called the meeting to order. Prayers were said by the Rev. Mr. Howard. A cordial welcome was extended the delegates and visitors by the Rector.

JUNIOR MEETING.

Mrs. Bayly, President of the Juniors, Mrs. Speers, President of Section II, Mrs. Tilghman, President of Little Helpers, Section III, presented their reports.

Junior Treasurer reported money received \$132.06.

Corresponding Secretary reported value of boxes \$134.75.

Nineteen Juniors and 6 secretaries of the Little Helpers enrolled.

4 P. M.—Address to the Juniors by Miss Grace Lindley, of New York.

8 P. M.—Service in the church, Rev. Dr. Howard and Rev. Dr. Gray in the chancel. Addresses were made by Miss Grace Lindley and by the Rev. Dr. Gray.

THURSDAY.

7.30 A. M.—Celebration of the Holy Communion by the Rev. David Howard, assisted by the Rev. Arthur Gray.

9.30 P. M.—A Service of Meditation, led by Dr. Gray. He chose the First Epistle to the Corinthians as a basis for this meditation, emphasizing the thought, "We are all called to be saints," saying in part—The materialism of this age is very like the commercialism of the Corinthians of St. Paul's time. Now, as these people are so prone to put their trust in riches. To worship the dollar and the things of this world that perish. Especially applicable to this day and time is

this First Epistle to the Corinthians. We are all called to service for Christ. We are not to shrink from it, nor to shirk it, excusing ourselves because of lack of knowledge, or ability to speak, because utterance and knowledge are the gifts of Jesus Christ (II Cor. I:5). That God is faithful who promised, and if we wait upon Him we shall come behind in no gift. Dr. Gray recommended for this year the intensive study of this Epistle or some other portion of the Bible rather than simply reading the Bible as a whole.

10.30 A. M.—Minutes read and approved. Report of the Associate President telling of the organization of two Branches of Section B.

The branches were requested to write Mrs. P. A. M. Brooks, Chestertown, concerning all box work proposed for the coming year. The Bishop's Box is to be sent to Bishop Tyler, of North Dakota. Trinity Cathedral Branch has kindly offered to receive and forward all articles that may be contributed to this box. Please write and send articles to Miss J. P. Dawson, Easton, Md., President of the Cathedral Branch. Each branch is asked to value the articles sent.

This resolution was offered and carried: Resolved, That the annual meeting of each Parish Branch be held in April. That all Parish Reports be sent to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary on or before the last day of April. That a full list of Parish officers elected for the ensuing year be included in this report.

Mrs. Brooks, of Oil City, Penn., spoke on the United Offering as a thank-offering.

The resignation of Mrs. Hooper, Mrs. Emory, Miss Schouler and Miss Hardcastle were accepted with regret.

The Correspondent of the C. P. C. reported 23 Librarians. Sixteen Branches, together with the "Little Helpers," had contributed \$20.72 to this work, and many books and magazines had been forwarded.

The Treasurer reported receipts for 1915 a slight increase over 1914; Diocesan pledges fully paid.

12 M.—Noon-day Prayers.

The report of the nominating committee was read and a motion offered and carried that this report be tabled.

Adjourned to meet at 2.30 P. M.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON.

2.30 P. M.—On roll call 8 Diocesan officers and 28 members, representing 14 Branches, responded. Five Branches

sent no delegate.

On motion the report of the nominating committee was taken from the table, and it was moved that this report be accepted as far as the offices were filled. The offices made vacant by resignations were then filled by nominations from the floor. Election was by ballot.

On motion it was resolved, That Article XV of the new constitution be referred to the Committee on Rules of Order and Revision of the Constitution with instruction that Article X of the old constitution be substituted for it.

The president appointed the nominating committee for 1916, who will act under Article X of the Constitution of 1914, viz: Centreville, chairman; Trinity Cathedral, Shrewsbury, Princess Anne, Cambridge.

Delegates elected to the Provincial Meeting in Richmond in November, 1915, were Mrs. John T. Keas, Mrs. Z. R. Collins, Mrs. R. J. Showell.

The thirty-third annual meeting will be held in Elkton November 8th and 9th, 1916.

Dr. Gray, by request, addressed the meeting on the "Why and How of Missions."

A vote of thanks was extended to the Rector and to the women of St. Peter's Parish for their gracious hospitality.

On motion, the meeting adjourned.

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR YEAR 1914-1915.

We have twenty-one contributing branches of the Woman's Auxiliary which have given the sum of \$691.24, \$42.75 more than was contributed last year.

OUR UNITED DIOCESAN PLEDGES have been more than paid. Sixteen branches contributed \$32.50 to the pledge to Bishop Funsten, which is \$7.50 more than was pledged. Fifteen branches contributed \$27.25 to St. Mary's School, Shanghai, which was \$2.25 more than was obligated. Sixteen branches contributed \$27.00 to Rev. Mr. Thomas, Brazil, making \$2.00 more than was pledged.

THE BISHOP'S FUND:—Sixteen branches have contributed \$76.00, for which I received letters of grateful thanks from the Bishop (which you will please read). This is one fund which has decreased from last year to the amount of \$7.30.

THE CHURCH PERIODICAL CLUB:—Seven branches sent me \$8.00, which is the same amount given as last year.

SPECIALS:—Five branches have contributed \$82.00, a gain in specials over last year of \$3.00.

THE CENTRAL FUND, including the balance from last year, the Juniors and seventeen branches, \$81.60 is the amount contributed.

This fund has fallen off \$23.89 from last year. I have a balance in bank for the Central Fund of \$10.71.

THE DELEGATE FUND:—Previously reported to you was \$34.72. \$35.98 has been contributed by sixteen branches this year, making a total in bank of \$70.70, and a gain over last year of \$1.26.

THE 1910 DELEGATE FUND:—Previously reported was \$49.41. I have a balance in bank of \$31.11 for the above fund.

GENERAL MISSIONS OR THE APPORTIONMENT:—This year twenty-one branches have contributed \$236.78; last year \$201.56, so you see we have a gain of \$35.22 over last year. Every branch contributed to this fund. Shrewsbury is still our "banner branch," this branch having contributed to every fund and obligation the splendid sum of \$130.80.

THE SEVENTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE LITTLE HELPERS, 1915-1916.

MADAM PRESIDENT AND MEMBERS OF THE AUXILIARY:

In making this report of the year's work, I would first like to draw your attention to the aim of the Little Helpers. So many seem to think that it is just another means of collecting money for missions, and count our success or failure by the amount of money given. But money is not the aim of the Little Helpers. The church calls it her kindergarten, and offers it to you as a help to train your own children in her ways. Day by day they learn that big little prayer that takes in all the world. Week by week they learn to give their pennies for her work of teaching her *other* little children about the Lord Jesus. Year by year you bring them to the service of offering that they may learn by its beautiful object lesson, that it is their church and that their pennies are really given to God for His work. Don't you think all this is worth while? Remember, you are training your own child to be a citizen of the kingdom of God. That kingdom, which not only is now, but which is to last for all eternity. I want you all to think of this side of the Little Helpers work, and to talk of it so that in the Diocese of Easton, the real aim of the Little Helpers, to train our children to be faithful citizens of God's kingdom, will be known in every parish. May I beg your loving care and interest in the work in your own parish. If there is a branch already organized, be interested in it and show your interest; there are so many ways you can do so, and it will be such an encouragement to the faithful women who have charge of the parish branch. If there is no parish branch in your parish won't you try and start one? that will be such a help and encouragement to me. And most of all, I beg your prayers for the Little Helpers, here in your own diocese and "everywhere."

Twenty branches out of twenty-three have sent reports and money this year. Three branches were silent, but two of these have re-organized under new leaders, and we hope for better things another year.

Two faithful parish leaders have resigned after years of service. Mrs. Sutton, of Shrewsbury, (her successor has

not yet been reported), and Miss Cruikshank, of Cecilton, who was married and moved to another parish, her sister taking her place.

There are nearly 400 Little Helpers in the Diocese; 11 branches held the little service and made their offering. Seventy-three new members have been added; 46 have been advanced to Section II of which 23 were Little Helpers of St. Paul's, Centreville.

Two names have been added to the Memorial circle; 8 branches increased their offering over last year, 9 gave less, and 3 gave just the same, 3 were silent. The Cathedral Branch has done some especial work this year in sending a fount given us by the Dean to the new church at Quantico. They have also sent a special box of clothing (the gift of a mother whose Little Helper had been advanced to the Memorial circle) to St. Mary's on the Mountain, Sewanee, Tenn.

The Cathedral Branch; Emmanuel, Chestertown; St. Andrews, Sudlersville; St. Paul's, Centreville; St. Luke's, Wye; Christ Church, Cambridge; St. Peter's, Salisbury; St. Paul's, Berlin, and St. Andrew's, Princess Anne, gave \$14 to our pledge of \$25 for the Akita building fund: the rest was made up from our Emergency Fund. We have paid \$81 on the Diocesan apportionment, given \$20 for use in the Diocese, and added \$23 to our United Offering, \$98 for specials and have \$16 for running expenses for the coming year, making a total of \$215.

Our Diocesan box this year goes to St. Mary's, Sewanee, Tenn., valued at \$25, and I am very proud of it. The Chestertown Little Helpers sent beautiful picture books for it— their own handy work. All the clothing is warm and comfortable as well as pretty.

The Little Helpers of the Cathedral Branch sent a special box to St. Mary's, Sewanee, Tenn., valued at \$5.
