TWENTY-FOURTH ANNUAL MEETING WOMAN'S
AUXILIARY, DIOCESE OF EASTON

October 17 and 18, 1917, St. Paul's Parish, Centreville, Md.—11.30 a. m., Registration; 12 m., Noonday Prayers; Address of Welcome by the Parish President, Mrs. Z. R. Collins; 2 p. m., Parish Church, Service of Intercession and an Address of Welcome by the Rector, the Rev. J. D. Cummins; 2.30 p. m., Parish House, Mission Study Class, led by Mrs. H. A. Pilsbry, Educational Secretary of the Diocese of Penn., subject, "The Gospel of the Kingdom," an outline for Missionary Study of the Bible by Bishop Rhinelander, of Pennsylvania.

WEDNESDAY EVENING.

Address by the Rev. W. M. M. Thomas, of Brazil.

THURSDAY 8 A. M.

Holy Communion, celebrant, the Rector of the Parish.

PARISH HOUSE 9.45 A. M.

Business Meeting opened with creed and prayers. Roll Call, present 11 Diocesan Officers; 30 delegates from the Woman's Branch; 17 Parishes represented; and 8 Junior delegates representing 6 parishes.

REPORTS OF DIOCESAN OFFICERS READ.

The Bishop's Box will be sent to Bishop Burleson, of South Dakota. St. Paul's, Centreville, is the sponsor for the Bishop's Box this year.

Mrs. A. H. Bayly, of Cambridge, resigned as vice-president in charge of Junior Auxiliary, Section III. It was accepted with regret. It was resolved to place the Junior work in the care of one officer as Director of the Junior Auxiliary and one officer as Director of the Little Helpers' Branch, Section III, and the office of Associate President was done away with by request of the Associate President.

A committee appointed to consider the question of a separate division of the Woman's Auxiliary for the younger women of the Diocese reported as follows: The members of your committee agree that the question of a separate division for girls and young women in the Woman's Auxiliary may best be left to the individual parish to de-

cide for itself. In cases where the older girls are not provided for by either the senior branch or the Sunday-school Auxiliary, a parish might well organize the girls in a Young Woman's Branch (or called by some other name) and this branch be encouraged to send a delegate to the annual meeting, such branch to be under the same Diocesan officers as the senior branch.

MINUTES**TWENTY-FIFTH ANNUAL MEETING WOMAN'S AUXILIARY, DIOCESE OF EASTON.**

Christ Church Parish, Cambridge, Md., May 6-8, 1919.

Owing to the epidemic of Spanish influenza, the annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, which was arranged to meet in Cambridge October 16-17, 1918, was indefinitely postponed. Because of a second epidemic it was not possible to hold the twenty-fifth annual meeting until May 6-8, 1919.

TUESDAY EVENING.

7.30, Registration, Christ Church Parish House; 8.15, short service, led by Rev. Mr. Nugent; address of welcome by the rector, the Rev. William Dunbar Gould. Miss Tillotson, Educational Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, New York City, by request, explained the meaning and scope of the proposed "Nation-Wide Campaign." It was only so recently proposed that but one diocese, Pennsylvania, had asked for a conference on this subject; Easton was second.

WEDNESDAY MORNING.

7.30, Holy Communion, Rev. W. D. Gould, celebrant; 9.30, the Auxiliary assembled in the Parish House. After prayer, the president called the meeting to order. Roll was called. Present 7 Diocesan officers; 36 members representing 15 Parish Branches, together with one Young Woman's Branch from St. Paul's, Centreville; 12 Junior Delegates representing 9 Branches.

Reports were made by each Diocesan officer. Miss Barroll, Secretary of the C. P. C., was unable to be present because of illness, the report was read by Mrs. Haddaway.

Reports of Inter-Parochial meetings held in Cecil, Kent, Queen Annes, Talbot, Worcester and Wicomico, were made. The Inter-parochial meetings in Kent and Queen Anne's were greatly helped by a visit from Mrs. Van Harlingen, of Bryn Mawr, and the meeting in Talbot by Mrs. Adam Ross, both of the Diocese of Pennsylvania. Miss Tillotson spoke again on the "Nation-wide Campaign."

Noon-day prayers were said by Rev. Dr. Cone, rector

of St. Peter's Parish, Salisbury.

At 12.30 the Auxiliary adjourned until 2 p. m.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON.

2.00, Miss Tillotson held the third and last class; all the classes were most helpful; 3.30, business resumed. Reports from the Young Woman's Branch of St. Paul's, Centreville, told of a most successful and interesting work. It is hoped God will put it into the hearts and minds of the young women in every parish to form such a branch.

The work of the Juniors and Little Helpers is very important and promising and their reports were listened to with interest. Mrs. Dudley Roe, of St. Andrew's, Sutersville, reported, the Diocesan Box, to be sent to Bishop Beecher, of Western Nebraska, valued at \$240.64.

Mrs. Keas reported for the Committee on the revision of the "Constitution and By-Laws" that they had held several meetings and had done some very painstaking and laborious work, but they were not ready to recommend its adoption at this meeting. She asked that the committee be continued and hoped they would be prepared to offer a more definite report at the next meeting in November. The committee was continued.

WEDNESDAY EVENING.

8.15, service in Christ Church, Bishop Hulse, of Cuba, the special preacher.

After service a very pleasant reception was given Bishop Hulse, the Auxiliary and others by the ladies of Christ Church in the Parish House.

THURSDAY MORNING.

7.30, Holy Communion, Rev. Hunter Davidson, rector of Christ Church, Stevensville, celebrant.

PARISH HOUSE.

9.30. At the opening of the meeting prayers were offered for the family of Mrs. James L. Bryan, whose sudden death had just been announced. Resolutions of sympathy were expressed and the Secretary instructed to send the same to the family. A resolution authorizing the Diocesan Treasurer to draw upon the Central Fund to make up any small deficiency in the Diocesan Pledges of \$50.00 each, to the American Church Institute for negroes, St. Andrew's

School, Porto Rica, or the Church General Hospital, Wu-chang, at the close of the fiscal year, was carried.

The Chairman of the Nominating Committee reported "after prayerful consideration, your committee recommends the re-election of the present board of Diocesan Officers." As there were no other nominations, it was moved the report be accepted and the Secretary be authorized to cast the ballot. The Secertary cast the ballot.

A Diocesan pledge of \$50.00, which was increased to \$100.00 by the Rev. Hunter Davidson, pledging another \$50.00 for Christ Church, Stevensville, was made in answer to Bishop Hulse's most telling appeal the evening before.

Because this is the year of General Convention, and pledges for some united work requiring large sums of money are always asked for at that time, it was agreed to wait for the meeting in November before announcing our Diocesan pledges, excepting the one pledged to Bishop Hulse for Cuba.

Mrs. Brooks, of I. U. Parish, presented a gift of \$50.00 from Kent County, to be used to send some young woman in the Diocese to a summer school for church workers, who on her return will serve as a Field Secretary in the Diocese. This gift is In Memoriam of devoted Auxiliary Women and others who, this year, have passed into Life Eternal, whose names are recorded in this annual report.

This gift came as a surprise and was gratefully accepted. Miss Keating, of St. Paul's, Centreville, was elected as Field Secretary.

The Diocesan President of the Woman's Auxiliary was elected the delegate to the General Convention and the Junior President the alternate. Other delegates and alternates will be appointed by the Diocesan President of the Woman's Auxiliary, and the Bishop of the Diocese.

The Secretary of the Little Helpers was given authority to draft upon the Diocesan Treasurer of the Woman's Auxiliary for as much as \$30.00 to help defray the expenses of the Junior Day Meetings.

All-day meetings for the Juniors will be held in Emmanuel Parish, Chestertown, Wednesday, June 25; in St. Peter's Parish, Easton, June 26; in St. Peter's Parish, Salisbury, June 27, 1919.

The speakers will be Miss Jennings, of the Diocese

of Bethlehem, and Rev. Mr. Stowell, of the Diocese of Washington.

An invitation to hold the next annual meeting in Christ Church, Easton, was accepted. This meeting will be held November 5 and 6, 1919.

Noon-day prayers were said by the Rev. Hunter Davidson.

Mrs. Collins reported that St. Paul's Parish, Centreville, had in hand the following articles they would give to any parish in the Diocese who could use them, viz.: 1 purple dorsal, 1 black dorsal, 1 green, 1 red, 1 white, 1 curved dorsal pole. A number of gas jet globes.

A resolution was offered to change the number of branches on the Nominating Committee from five to three. It was carried.

The Nominating Committee for 1919-1920 are: Emmanuel Branch, Chestertown; St. Mary's, Pocomoke City; and St. Andrew's, Sudlersville.

The meeting at Cambridge, though long deferred, was unanimously agreed to have been a great success, socially and spiritually. Words of appreciation of the kind and generous hospitality of the members of Christ Church Parish were heartily endorsed by a rising vote.

The Rev. Hunter Davidson and the rector of the Parish were asked to bring our meeting to a close with some last words, and a blessing that the delegates might take back to their Parishes as an inspiration to serve more faithfully than ever the coming year.

It was a coincidence that both clergymen were natives of the Eastern Shore and priests of the Diocese. Who better than they were fitted to lift up our hearts to the call of Mother Church in this, "our own, our native land"? Well did they plead that it was meet, right and our bounden duty to build again on the old foundations. Rev. Mr. Gould pleaded for a native ministry as the only way to reopen and keep open our silent churches.

He pleaded with mothers and sisters and teachers to set before sons and brothers and friends the dignity and honor of the sacred ministry. He told us that soon he would be the only clergymen in Dorchester County. That he was there because he craved the honor of serving the church in the land of his birth.

Let us pray that others may hear the call and that soon. Those were wonderful last words. They stirred our hearts and opened our eyes to visions of what might be done, if we train our boys to put "first things first."

MINUTES OF FOURTH INTER-PAROCHIAL MEETING.

The fourth Inter-Parochial meeting of Kent County was held in St. Paul's Parish May 29, 1918. After the corporate Communion, Dr. Dickinson officiating, the session was called to order by Mrs. Jas. M. Sutton, of Betterton, the presiding chairman. Five Auxiliary Branches answered to roll call, viz., Shrewsbury 6; Chestertown 5; Christ Church, I. U., 4; St. Paul's 8; Betterton 1. The reports were gratifying and notwithstanding the demands of the day, the work is going forward, the sum of \$561.08 having passed on to the mission field from the Auxiliary of Kent. Our President, Mrs. Keas, told us the war work of Auxiliary women was prayer or using spiritual force as faithful Christians. The first week of Advent is to be set aside as a prayer week. Mrs. Van Harlingen, of Bryn Mawr, began her address on Faith by calling attention to the tablet in the church as a "Glory to Christ and a background of the Faith of the organizers of the Parish of St. Paul's." Our lives being built on faith, so must we advance; illumination of our faith brings confidence. The Faith is going to be forced on us in the world crisis and the cohesive force of the common cause must hold for the boys at the front. We may be losing our sense of security, but we must co-operate, just as the nations do. We are inefficient by untidiness, therefore losing security. Church people are realizing danger. We are not going to be able to give to the boys who return what they are expecting, unless we give up our private opinions, which float on the top and get down deep to our belief, which is getting down to the background. A picture of The Angelus was used as descriptive of the background of faith. Being faithful is being brimful of faith, without which we plead ignorance and indifference. At the conclusion of this helpful talk, a bountiful luncheon was served under the trees, after which the two

speakers hurried away to take the train for their homes, taking many new thoughts away and leaving many for our reflection. The afternoon session being called to order, the minutes of previous meeting was read and approved. The different funds of the Auxiliary were ably explained by Mrs. Physick, also Miss Harrington's work in the mountains. Clothing bureaus were spoken of as being a means of making money by the missionary. They are a mutual benefit to the mountaineer and to the missionary. The collection amounted to \$5.34, out of which was taken \$2.41 for expenses of speakers, the balance, \$3.41, sent to Mrs. Collins for Central Fund. Shrewsbury reported an expenditure of \$278. Mrs. Pennington, with deep earnestness, spoke of the death of Mrs. Janvier, who assisted so ably in Shrewsbury Auxiliary work. Chestertown reported their total to be \$178.95. Betterton's total \$20.58. I. U.'s total \$65.00. St. Paul's total \$18.55. Christ Church, I. U. Parish, having lost a most valuable member in its Vice-President, Mrs. S. S. Hepburn, who was also President of the Betterton Branch, a most active worker in the parish and one who will be hard to replace.

Chestertown Juniors reported no regular meetings, but have clothed a child at the Easton Orphans' Home. An interesting report by Mrs. Sutton shows good work done by the Little Helpers of Betterton. A drive for new members was suggested and favorably received. The meeting adjourned to meet again in the spring of 1919, the invitation being extended to I. U. Parish.

MINUTES OF INTER-PAROCHIAL MEETING

Held May 28, 1918, at Christ Church, Stevensville, Md.,
Kent Island Parish.

The Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Easton held its fifth Inter-Parochial Meeting at Christ Church, Stevensville, Md., May 28, 1918. Program as follows: Corporate Communion, Celebrant, Rev. Hunter Davidson, rector of Christ Church; offering for Central Fund; address by Mrs. Van Harlinger, of Bryn Mayr, Philadelphia. Mrs. Van Harlinger's address was a resume of Bishop Rhinelander's wonderful book on God's plan of fellowship with His "Children of the Kingdom." The Golden thread running from

Genesis to Revelations. Mrs. Van Harlinger interpreted in the most unique and enthusiastic manner this subject of fellowship and clearly set forth in glowing words the blessedness of being in harmony with "God's Will" and plan concerning us. How one is "lifted up" out of bondage into freedom and through freedom into joy, in service. The entire address was an inspiration, and such a warm appeal must needs bring forth fruit to the Glory of God. Hymn No. 249 was sung, followed by cordial words of welcome from the president of Christ Church Auxiliary, Mrs. John R. Benton.

The business session was called to order by Mrs. Summerfield Tilghman. The Roll Call resulted in the following report: Church Hill 2 members present; Sudlersville 9 members present; St. Paul's, Centreville, 6 members present; St. Paul's Y.W. Branch 2 members present; St. Luke's Queenstown, 12 members present; Christ Church, Stevensville, 8 members present; and a large number of women serving as hostesses, making in all a gathering of about 50 persons.

At noon day, prayer. Mrs. Van Harlinger offered fervent intercessions for the work of the Woman's Auxiliary. Luncheon was served on the Rectory Lawn, giving all an opportunity to enjoy the privilege of meeting the Diocesan officers and members of the different branches, and of exchanging opinions and showing interest by social converse in all the various means and methods of work pursued by the Auxiliary for its advance and success. After luncheon work was resumed.

The afternoon session was opened with prayer by Rev. Mr. Cummins, of St. Paul's Church, Centreville; first, reports of Diocesan officers; second, minutes of previous meeting held at Queenstown May, 1917. Secretary, Miss Lutie Batte, Mrs. Herbert, Secretary of Christ Church Auxiliary, was appointed to take the minutes of the meeting. Mrs. James Merrick, Jr., of Sudlersville Branch, and Diocesan Treasurer of the United Offering, gave a full report of work done and the plan and purpose of the United Offering. Literature was distributed and the Blue Boxes and Pledge Envelopes given to the Secretary of Christ Church Auxiliary for distribution to members urging a generous offering at the Triennial of 1919.

A side issue from Mrs. Tilghman gave an incident from the experience of Miss Hart relative to the success of this branch of work. Mrs. Spencer Wright gave a very interesting and full report of the Junior Work, giving in detail the account of the monies appropriated to each mission. She reported also an advance in interest and offerings. Mrs. Keas, Diocesan President, instructed the officers and advised them relative to increasing interest and efficiency in work. A debate and talk on the subject of preparing for efficiency in religious work followed.

The general plan of the Board of Missions for training messengers in house to house evangelistic work was warmly discussed. Workers of St. Paul's branch discussed What is the Provincial Synod and Provincial Auxiliary? How to interest the Juniors, another vital topic, was talked over and the conclusion drawn that putting the Junior work in the Sunday School and making it a distinct part of that work, would solve the problem.

The appropriation of the Board to the Easton Diocese was talked on by Wye Branch.

Review of annual meeting was discussed by St. Paul's Branch. Report of Bishop's Box was made by its sponsor, St. Paul's Parish. Mrs. Tilghman spoke at length upon the work so dear to her heart, that of the Little Helpers, and said, as Christ Church was the only branch inactive, along this line, she would urge and exhort that a good report for the ensuing year be made. Mrs. Collins, Diocesan Treasurer, explained the plan and method of appropriating the money to the various funds and objects, emphasizing the fact that General Missions has of all the most important place. Earnestly reminding us that the Board of Missions waits for the money from all the different sources of supply, in order to give to all the different missions their relative portions. She also stated that the delegate fund is a special fund of a tax assessment on each member for that purpose. The meeting adjourned to be called at the discretion of the Committee on Arrangements. Prayer was offered by the rector, Rev. Hunter Davidson, followed by Hymn 203.
