## Address of the Bishop

### *Members of the Woman's Auxiliary:*

I have often spoken of the pleasure which it gives me to address you—a pleasure which is based upon common interest, a common desire to advance the Kingdom of God, and a common sympathy with all those who are earnestly seeking by the means at hand to carry God's word into places outside the ordinary avenues of traffic and commerce. You have done a great work. I say a great work, for whenever we help on eternal souls in their earthly pilgrimage to their eternal homes we are doing a great work. Not great, perhaps, in the sight of the world, but great in its results. Perhaps with the daily cares of a busy life it is difficult for most persons to look to the eternal beyond where there is peace and rest. Work, however, has its value according to its results, and work must be estimated by what it accomplishes. If the result end in a few short years, and has no bearing on the eternal abiding conditions of life, we have no right to call it great. But, however small and insignificant may be the appearance of an enterprise begun and carried on for the purpose of training and preparing an eternal soul for eternal things, it has in its nature an undying element, and when the changes of this world have wrought their destroying pleasure, the eternal will remain a monument of true effort in the presence of the Judge of all men.

The Diocese has been largely sustained by your self-sacrificing labor. The Woman's Auxiliary was organized by the late Bishop Young in the Diocese of Florida for the purpose of aiding in the support of the missionaries in the Diocese. You were organized before the General Society in the United States came into being. The advancement of the Church in Florida is largely due to your efforts. The State of Florida is about in the same condition it was in 1892, the year the Diocese was divided. We took upon us then the burden of maintaining the conditions in the northern half of the State, when everything seemed propitious. Bishop Gray entered upon his duties January, 1893. It seemed then as though we would be able to carry on the Diocese unaided by the General Board in five years, but how many things have happened! In December, 1894, a frost destroyed all the fruit on the orange trees. In February, 1895, a frost destroyed nearly all the trees. Many people left the State. In February, 1899, came another frost which destroyed the hopes of those who remained. Many places were depopulated and in the future there appeared but few rays of hope. In 1901 came the great fire which



denuded 140 acres in the heart of the city of Jacksonville of every building. During these eighteen years from 1892 to 1910, we have had an entire change of industry and a shifting of population which has destroyed some towns and built others up. They have been eighteen years of anxiety and worry. Throughout these eighteen years your aid and sympathy have been constant and unfaltering and I wish to express my gratitude for the cheer and help which you have given me. You cannot understand—no one can understand, how your aid and sympathy have sustained me. Only the heart knoweth its own bitterness. You have sustained me and you have largely sustained the work of the Diocese not only by your contributions but by your earnestness and holy determination.

Brighter days seem to be coming. There has been a wonderful awakening during the past year. I begin to look forward to the time when the laymen of the Diocese will follow the example which you have set them. The financial outlook has had a most depressing effect upon the laymen. A woman thinks of the present, a man too often worries about the future. It is my hope that in the near future you can take your position in the Auxiliary of the Church in the United States on the same basis as the others. I do not think your example has been fully appreciated. What Bishop Young did has been followed, but on different lines. I am not fully persuaded that all the purposes of the General Auxiliary have been wise, for the reason in many Dioceses where the Auxiliary has been most active the apportionment has not been paid. With the exception of the first year we have always paid our apportionment. This has seemed to me to be a duty, and I have opposed everything which could interfere with its payment. You have been the mainstay during these trying years and it is possible you may have a larger field before you in the future. I hope and pray and believe whatever may be in store for you in the future, you will work with the same earnestness, self-sacrifice and determination you have manifested in the past eighteen years.



### Address of Diocesan President

---

As our annual meeting is held for the first time in St. Mark's Parish, let the inauguration be one of earnest effort. We are often told that enthusiasm will overcome all obstacles and crown with success almost any undertaking. By united effort, let us preserve, first, that golden thread of continuity of prayer, that our work may be elevated, expanded and illumined for those who will occupy our places when our share of the mission work is done. Let us resolve to be strenuous and enthusiastic in season and out of season. I ask you to pursue and persevere in your crusade, for it is a crusade for the up-building of the Church by aiding the missions in the Diocese and lending a helping hand to those beyond our borders—the pioneers in the various fields of activity—blazing paths through unexplored regions. It is said, "Whenever David Livingstone's footsteps are crossed in Africa, the fragrance of his memory seems to remain."

The Mission Study classes are so well organized, the course of study so clearly defined, embracing every mission field, that it makes it scarcely necessary for me to remind you that the Florida Branch of the Auxiliary must keep in touch with the great world of missions for "the upbuilding of Christian nations in unchristian lands" by a generous response to the call for the united offering, to be given at the Woman's Auxiliary service at the time of the General Convention held in Cincinnati in October. Florida gave \$500.00 at Richmond. Let us give freely and cheerfully the same sum, or more if possible.

You are well aware that our offering, Diocesan (or Systematic), is our first consideration; it must never run below, because we give outside by redoubling our efforts. Our Treasurer assures me that better work is accomplished for the Diocesan Offering when the women have to redouble their energies to give the United Offering. I hope this triennial year will not prove an exception.

The Juniors have faithfully and cheerfully carried on their work for the year. Their reports justify more than honorable mention. Their efficient corps of officers are unflagging in their efforts to perfect this organization for the children of the Church. Give your cordial support.

The "Julia M. Weed" Memorial Branch of the Juniors report a well-organized band of earnest workers. The offerings of this branch will be devoted to the education of young men for the ministry. Mrs. A. H. King, Directress; Mrs. George L. Drew, Treasurer; Miss Alice Munnerlyn, Secretary.



The Babies' Branch—always interesting as little helpers in the missionary work of the Church. These little ones pour a wealth of pennies into the treasury of the Church. Added to the lovely influence, they are rapidly becoming more than an unseen force.

The Church Periodical Club—Mrs. John E. Hartridge, Diocesan Correspondent—reports advancement and a better prospect for this year's work. I hope the Auxiliary will give an enthusiastic support to this important branch of our organization. All of us are refreshed by reading the clever articles appearing daily, weekly, and monthly in the papers and magazines. Let us send them on through our Correspondent to those not so well equipped for intellectual enjoyment.

As the *Florida Church News* seems to have a firmer hold each year on the Woman's Auxiliary, I would again ask your co-operation. Let us pledge the same amount; it is quite necessary as a part of Diocesan work. Among its leaves are many working plans and useful suggestions. It brings the Parishes and Missions in touch with each other. Our Monthly Reports are published, notices given. Our work is better known and appreciated.

Still the work went on, sometimes a generation built wrongly and the next generation had to build again. Still the work went on through all the centuries, till at last there stood forth to the world a mighty monument of beauty and truth to



command the admiration and inspire the reverence of mankind. So let it be with the Woman's Auxiliary. Let it build wisely, let us build surely, let us build faithfully, let us build not for the moment but for future years, seeking to establish here below what we hope to find above—a "house of many mansions" where there shall be room for all.

The President called upon Mrs. L. Drew Williams to explain. Mrs. Williams told the Association of the faithful services of the Rev. Owen P. Thackara in the early history of the church in East Florida; particularly at St. Augustine, Palatka, Jacksonville, Tallahassee and Fernandina, and how when his daughter, Miss Eliza Thackara, went to Arizona to devote her life to hospital work among the Navajo Indians, the Florida Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary pledged itself to contribute a certain amount yearly to aid her in her work, as a memorial to her father.

Mrs. Burt also spoke in loving remembrance of Mr. Thackara and his work in organizing the church in Palatka.

Indeed every one seemed imbued with the spirit of today's Epistle, "Use hospitality one to another *without grudging*."

### Report of Corresponding Secretary

According to reports sent in this year, the Auxiliary now numbers 658 members, an increase of thirty-seven over last year.

One cent a day is asked of each member, which means \$3.65 a year. I have made out the average amount per contributor for each branch and it may surprise you to hear that only seven branches average a cent a day or over for each member. All of the rest come below the desired contribution, some giving an average of 83 cents for each contributor.

I should like to call the attention of the officers to the keeping



of correct reports of the work done during the year, and not itemized in the Diocesan Treasurer's Report.

Each Parochial Secretary should keep a list of boxes or anything else sent out of the Parish, giving their value, *when, where and to whom sent*. This information is demanded of me each year by the General Secretary, Miss Emery, and I find it impossible to supply it from the meager reports sent in.

Auxiliary Day, it is pleasant to report, was very generally observed this year, and Mission Study is, at least, a *Lenten* observance in each branch. During the year past I have written many letters besides several circular letters containing the usual reminders of Christmas boxes, Auxiliary Day, United Offering, Mission Study and the Annual Meeting.

Each month I have had my Auxiliary notes off to the *Florida Church News* on or about the tenth day. This paper comes out in a new dress and very much enlarged this month.

It will be remembered that at the last Annual Meeting the President appointed the Corresponding Secretary Custodian of the Contingent Fund. This fund was created, *primarily*, to help the publication of the *Florida Church News*, being based on the surplus money received as subscriptions to that paper (over and above the \$50.00 pledged to its editor) by the Woman's Auxiliary.

### Report of Junior Auxiliary

---

How good it is to have these annual meetings and take counsel together over the difficulties of our work! Truly this is so, but how many of the Junior Branches are represented? Last year out of an expected twenty-six there were only ten delegates present. Is there any remedy for this difficulty? Would it be possible in June, when the Bishop has his annual meeting with all the Junior Branches in Jacksonville, to have the others in the State meet with us then? School duties would not interfere then. Another difficulty: There are sixty parishes and missions in our Diocese, in each of which we are supposed to have Branches, but in truth I have only fourteen Branches at work and three that have disbanded, temporarily let us hope.

Our constitution says, "In each Parish or Mission the Rector or Missionary shall appoint the Directress of the local Branch." It does not say who shall organize the Branch. Is not that the duty of the Woman's Auxiliary in each place? Will not those who are present help me in that particular when they go home? Our rector says to his Confirmation class: "You are each made members of the Auxiliary when you are baptized. It is just a question of whether you are going to be a *good* member or not."

I do feel so grateful to the faithful Directresses who have worked untiringly with the Juniors this year. We have a galaxy of noble women giving their rest time to this work all over the State. Oh! mothers, send your daughters to the meetings. To deepen their spiritual lives is to make them sweeter women, wives and mothers.

In our Diocese at present there are two candidates for holy orders and three postulants, and it is to aid these, through our Bishop, that the Junior Auxiliary of this Diocese is banded together. For this purpose we have raised three hundred and twenty-eight dollars and twenty cents. A sum that is much too small.

Federal Point we welcome to our Band. The only new Branch this year.

In the year 1910-1911 we are hoping for better things. The Ember seasons of the church should be especially prized by us, with the beautiful prayers for those about to be dedicated to the ministry, and if an offering is taken at those seasons (four times a year) it should go to the Bishop for the clergy. Can we do anything to interest others in these seasons of our church?

I trust you will help me to make the Juniors a powerful agent for good in our diocese.

CONSTITUTION OF THE FLORIDA BRANCH OF THE  
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

---

## I.

This Association shall be called the Florida Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.

## II.

The object of the Association is to pray for GOD'S blessing upon the Church, and to obtain contributions for Missionary Work.

## III.

Any person may become a member of this Association, who may be admitted thereto by the Directress of one of the Parochial or Mission organizations.

## IV.

There shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, Diocesan Treasurer, Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary appointed by the ecclesiastical authority of the Diocese. The President of the Junior Branch and the President of the Babies' Branch of the Auxiliary, shall be, ex-officio, Vice-Presidents of the Auxiliary.

## V.

This Association shall have an organization in every Parish and Mission. The Rector, or Missionary in charge, shall appoint a Directress, Secretary and Treasurer, whose duty it shall be to divide the Parish or Mission into districts of convenient size, assigning to each a Collector, or Committee of Collectors, who shall, each month, collect the pledges; once a year to procure from the Rector or Missionary a list of the members of the Parish, or Mission, and try to secure from each member a contribution of one cent a day.

In case a Parish or Mission is vacant, the Bishop may appoint the officers.

## VI.

There shall be a Diocesan Committee, composed of the President, the Vice-Presidents, the Diocesan Treasurer, the Recording Secretary, the Corresponding Secretary and the Directresses, or the accredited representatives of the Directresses.



The President, or one of the Vice-Presidents acting for her, and any three of the above named officers shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

In case both the President and Vice-Presidents are absent from the Diocese for more than one month, then one of the Secretaries of the Diocesan Committee may call the meeting to order, and any three of the above named officers shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

#### VII.

The President of the Association shall have general supervision of the Association, and shall decide in all cases of dispute. One of the Vice-Presidents shall act for the President when she is absent from the Diocese for more than three months. When requested by the President, the Vice-President may act for her, at any time. When acting for the President, the Vice-President shall exercise all the authority of the President.

The Diocesan Treasurer shall have charge of the funds of the Association, and shall keep a correct account of the same. She shall make all disbursements according to the direction of the ecclesiastical authority of the Diocese.

The Recording Secretary shall keep, in a book provided for that purpose, the minutes of the Diocesan Committee, and attend to such other work as the President may request.

The Corresponding Secretary shall, under the direction of the President, correspond with the organizations in the Parishes and Missions, and obtain information concerning their management and general welfare, and give such advice as the occasion may require.

The Treasurer of the Parochial Branches shall remit the funds which they have in hand to the Diocesan Treasurer on or before the fifteenth day of each month; the Treasurer of the Junior Branch shall remit each quarter, and the Treasurer of the Babies' Branch once a year.

#### VIII.

The Diocesan Committee shall meet on the first Wednesday of each month, and may be called together at any time by the President.

The Parochial or Mission organizations shall meet on the first Monday in each month, and may be called together by their respective Directresses at any time.

All meetings, wherever and whenever held, shall be opened with prayer.

#### IX.

Each Parochial Branch, and the Junior and the Babies' Branches



shall report the condition of the work to the President of the Auxiliary of the Diocese every quarter.

X.

This Constitution may be altered by the Bishop of the Diocese, after giving one month's notice of the proposed change, to the officers of the Association.

RULES OF ORDER OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY  
SOCIETY MEETING.

---

1. Opening Service and Address by the Bishop.
2. Roll Call by Branches.
3. Address of President.

5. Treasurer's Report.
6. Corresponding Secretary's Report.
7. Report of Church Periodical Club.
8. General Business.

Rule I. After the opening services, the President shall take the chair and call the meeting to order, when the order of business shall proceed.

Rule II. When a member is about to speak, she shall rise and, with due respect, address herself in an audible voice to the chair, confining herself strictly to the point in debate.

Rule III. No member shall speak more than twice on the same subject without the permission of the house.

Rule IV. While the President is putting any question, the members shall continue in their seats and not hold any private discourse.

Rule V. Every member present shall vote when a question is put, unless excused by the house.

Rule VI. When a question is under consideration, no motion shall be made, unless to lay it upon the table, to postpone it to a certain time, to commit it, to amend it, or to offer a substitute; and motions for any of these purposes shall have precedence in the order herein named.

Rule VII. A motion to lay on the table shall be decided without debate.

Rule VIII. A motion to adjourn shall always be in order, and, if unqualified, shall be decided without debate.



Rule IX. No motion shall be considered as before the house unless it be seconded.

Rule X. All committees shall be appointed by the President unless otherwise ordered.

Rule XI. The reports of all committees shall be in writing and shall be entered on the minutes, unless otherwise ordered.

Rule XII. Before the final adjournment of the meeting, the minutes of the last day's proceedings shall be read, corrected if necessary, and approved.
