THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY was created by the Board of Missions during the session of the General Convention, October, 1871, in the city of Baltimore, and approved by the Board of Missions at the General Convention of 1880, to assist it in meeting its regular appropriations and to aid all missionary work of the Church in any direction and in any way that may be recommended by the Board, or endorsed by the several Bishops.

The next annual meeting of the Georgia Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is to be held on the day before the Diocesan Convention, Tuesday, May 16, 1905, in Christ Church, Macon.

Proceedings.

ST. LUKE'S CHURCH, May 17, 1904.

The Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary was called to order by Rt. Rev. C. K. Nelson, Bishop; 84 women present. He gave gracious words of greeting, and appointed the Diocesan officers for the coming year.

At noon the Bishop called the Auxiliary to prayer for missionaries and their work, after which he turned over the meeting to the Diocesan Secretary, Mrs. Frank H. Miller.

Mrs. Emily Ravenel Walker was appointed Secretary.

The roll was called, delegates from 18 points responding.

Mrs. Ed. T. Brown, of Atlanta, on behalf of the women of St. Luke's Church, made a beautiful address of welcome to the Auxiliary.

The annual report and address was then read by the Diocesan Secretary.

A motion that the Secretary's report be received and accepted was made by Mrs. N. P. Black and carried unanimously.

An invitation to luncheon, from the Auxiliary of St. Luke's Church, was read and accepted with thanks. Mrs. Snook also invited the delegates to an afternoon tea at her home. Accepted with thanks.

Then followed the reading of a circular letter from the General Secretary.

Reports from the following Archdeaconries was read and accepted:

Albany, Atlanta, Augusta, Brunswick, Macon, Savannah.

An invitation, from Bishop and Mrs. Nelson, to a reception on the afternoon of 18th of May, was read, and accepted with thanks.

Adjournment for luncheon.

At half past two o'clock the meeting was again called to order.

The report of the Junior Branch Woman's Auxiliary was read by Miss Nita Black and accepted.

Report of the Babies' Branch, Mrs. P. Alston Waring, President, was read by the Secretary and accepted.

The Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

Pledges of \$50.00 each for the Bible woman in Japan; the girl at St. Hilda's School in Wuchang, China, and Diocesan expenses were made.

The Diocesan Secretary stated that she was sometimes embarrassed about using funds for some special object, when there were funds in the Treasury she had no authority to touch. Thereupon Miss Woodbury, of Athens, offered the following resolution: "That the Diocesan Secretary be authorized to draw upon the Diocesan Treasurer in making up unfilled pledges, or any expense deemed necessary therefor."

Mrs. Skagin, who has been appointed Diocesan Correspondent gave a talk on the subject of the Church Periodical Club, saying she knew by personal experience how good it was to receive the magazines, and asking the women from the different points to bear this work in mind and help in carrying it out, both with money and magazines.

Marietta reported an active Periodical Club, Miss Rogers in charge.

A memorial of Mrs. Sarah Couley, Atlanta, was read and received, standing. Also notices of the passing from our ranks of Mrs. Mary R. DeSaussure, 6th September, 1903, St. Luke's, Atlanta; Mrs. H. K. Reese, St. James, Marietta, 18th December, 1903; Mrs. R. D. Moore, Emanuel, Athens; Mrs. M. Goodwin, St. Paul's, Macon, 25th November, 1903; Miss Mary Finsley, St. Paul's, Macon, February 5th, 1904, were reported.

The Diocesan Secretary appointed Mrs. White, of Athens, and Mrs. Walker, of Atlanta, a committee to see that all the names of deceased members were entered on our reports.

Sister Katherine, of the Appleton Church Home in Macon, spoke of the Home, the training given to girls from three to eighteen years of age, and thanked all the members of the different churches for the aid received by the Home.

Mrs. White, of Athens, was asked to tell about the work of

the Athens women, whose report showed such fine work. She said, among other things, the women of the church had shouldered a debt of \$1,000.00 to free the church of debt, and hasten its consecration. She also spoke of the work done among the students in Athens.

The nomination of the following delegates to the Triennial convention in Boston, in October, followed: Mrs. C. K. Nelson, Atlanta; Mrs. Frank H. Miller, Augusta; Mrs. W. H. Elliott, Savannah; Miss. Lambert, All Saints, Atlanta

Alternates: Mrs. H. P. Wright, Thomasville, Mrs. Charles H. Phinizy, Augusta; Mrs. Beatty, Athens; Mrs. N. P. Black, Atlanta. On motion of Mrs. Black, the rules were suspended and all these delegates and alternates were elected by acclamation.

Miss Ayers, of Macon, read a letter from Mrs. Mallory H. Taylor in regard to traveling libraries for children. Mrs. Black moved this be sent to the Church Periodical Club, with the suggestion that the Junior Branches might help in this work. Adopted.

The Diocesan Secretary reminded the women of the mite boxes for the united offering, and the following resolutions were carried:

RESOLVED, That all mite boxes for the United Offering shall be opened and contents forwarded to the Diocesan Secretary by September 1st, 1904, to be presented at the Triennial meeting in Boston in October.

RESOLVED, That a committee be appointed by the Diocesan Secretary to summarize for presentation to the Diocesan Convention the results of the women's work for the past year, and asking to have the same printed in the Journal of the Convention, if not summarized before its adjournment. Adopted. Miss Woodbury, of Athens, and Mrs. Murdoch Walker, Atlanta, were appointed as the committee.

The following resolution was presented by Mrs. White, of Athens: That the visitors and delegates present at this meeting extend their sincere thanks to the women of St. Luke's Church, for the hospitality and courtesy shown to them. Carried.

Miss Woodbury, Athens, suggested that a leaflet published

every three months, telling of the Auxiliary work throughout the State and sent to each point, would increase interest in the work. This was favorably received.

Mrs. Walker, of Christ Church, Macon, spoke of the Birthday Fund established by Miss Humphrey, for the United Offering. Received as information.

The following was presented by Mrs. White, of Athens:

Be it Resolved, That we suggest to the Bishop the expediency of his appointing an organizing Junior Secretary, for each Arch-deaconry, to act in conjunction with Miss Black. Carried.

Miss Woodbury offered the following:

RESOLVED, That the Woman's Auxiliary here assembled, express its sense of great loss on the removal of our beloved former Diocesan Secretary, Mrs. F. F. Reese, from the Diocese, and our loving appreciation of her valuable service in our work. We extend her warmest greetings. Carried.

Letters to Mrs. Elliott, Savannah, written from the Boone School by a boy on the Bishop Elliott scholarship, were received and heard with much interest.

It was suggested that a book called "Fling out the Banner" would be found helpful for organizing societies and conducting meetings. Received as information.

Miss Woodbury, Athens, suggested that each branch should hold a special early celebration of the Holy Communion, at some appointed time, this being most helpful and inspiring. Suggestion accepted.

Meeting then adjourned finally.
