Wednesday, April 21st, 1921

FIRST DAY

Wednesday, April 21, 1921.

The twenty-ninth Annual Meeting of the Georgia Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary convened at St. Mark's Church, Brunswick, Ga., at 10 o'clock. Holy Communion was celebrated by the Rt. Rev. F. F. Reese, D. D., assisted by Rev. William Johnson, Rector of the Parish. The offering of \$182.00 (including \$150.00 from St. Paul's, Augusta) was devoted to the United Thank Offering.

At the conclusion of the service the delegates registered and the business session opened with prayer and a few words of welcome by the Rector.

Bishop Reese addressed the Conference, thanking the women for their loyalty and urging greater zeal in prayer for the Master's work.

The meeting was called to order by the President, Mrs. A. B. Hull, of Savannah. Mrs. J. S. Wright of Brunswick welcomed the visitors; Mrs. J. K. McIver of Savannah responded.

The President gave a report of last year's work.

The Roll showed sixteen branches represented by thirty-two delegates; eight Officers present.

The Treasurer's report was read by the Treasurer, and showed \$1,042.80 received, and a balance of \$91.65 on hand Dec. 31st, 1920. The report was accepted with thanks. The Treasurer reported over payments on certain pledges, while only one pledge in 1920 was not met. After discussion, Miss Eugenia M. Johnston made the following motion, which was adopted:

"That the Treasurer be empowered to use any part of a balance at the end of the year to make up the full amount of unpaid pledges."

Report of Custodian of United Thank Offering, Mrs. James Davenport, was read, showing the United Thank Offering to be \$950.86 Dec. 31st, 1920. Letter was read from Mrs. Davenport, expressing her regret that illness prevented her attendance. The President stated that the Corresponding Secretary would write a letter of sympathy to Mrs. Davenport.

The following resolution was adopted by the Convention:

"In view of the fact that the Church Periodical Club is one of the National Organizations of the Church Service League; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Church Periodical Club of the Diocese of Georgia be separated from the Woman's Auxiliary, in preparation for forming a Diocesan Council of the Church Service League."

At the noon hour, business was suspended for noon-day prayer, led by Mrs. McIver.

At 1 o'clock the delegates were invited to the Parish Hall, where lunch was served by the women of St. Mark's Church.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The meeting opened at 3 o'clock with prayer by the Rector of the Parish. An encouraging report from Mrs. Edward C. Blount, Box Secretary, was read; also a letter of regret that she was unable to attend the Convention.

Motion was made and carried that \$20.00 be paid annually by the Auxiliary toward the expenses of the Executive Board which meets in New York several times yearly, \$5.00 of this amount was pledged by Section B. of Grace Church, Waycross.

Report of Educational Secretary, read by Mrs. A. H. Hilsman.

Report of Secretary Church Periodical Club, Miss Annie P. Wright, read by Miss Edith D. Johnston.

An interesting report on church affairs was made by Publicity Director, Miss Edith D. Johnston.

Letter was read by Miss Lula C. Colesberry, from Miss Susie C. Taylor, regarding a contribution of \$10.00 from the Little Helpers Branch, St. Mark's. It was decided that it be given to a memorial fund to the founder of the "Little Helpers."

Letter was read from Rev. Mr. Bonnell Greely, Colorado, asking gifts for a sale he was planning for April 30th, for the Theological Department of a school he was conducting. Mrs. Albert Hutt was appointed Chairman to receive and forward articles to him.

The following resolution was adopted, and vote of greetings sent as follows:

"The Woman's Auxiliary of Georgia in session at St. Mark's Church sends greetings to the Colored Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary of Georgia, now having their annual meeting at St. Athanasius Church, assuring them of their interest and sympathy, and offering their co-operation in every way possible."

Mrs. Frank B. Screven, Secretary of the Emery Fund, asked for gifts for said fund, payable June 1st—\$205.00 was pledged.

Report of Corresponding Secretary was read, also her letter of resignation, which was accepted with regret.

It was decided that the Bishop Rowe Scholarship be a permanent pledge of the Auxiliary. Mrs. H. D. Reed of Waycross stated that Grace Church School had pledged \$100.00 for a scholarship this year. Mrs. F. C. Exley, for a class in St. John's Church, Savannah, and Mrs. J. P. Stewart for "Section B," Grace Church, Waycross, pledged \$10.00 each on the Auxiliary Scholarship.

There were several interesting short talks by delegates on the work, and conditions in the different churches.

The meeting adjourned for an automobile drive around the city.

At 8 o'clock, Rev. W. T. Dakin, Rector of St. John's Church, Savannah, delivered an eloquent address at St. Mark's Church.

SECOND DAY

Thursday, April 22, 1921.

The Holy Communion was celebrated at St. Mark's Church at 8 o'clock Thursday morning, by the Rt. Rev. F. F. Reese, D. D., assisted by Rev. Wm. Johnson.

At 10 o'clock the business session was resumed, the meeting being opened with prayer by Bishop Reese.

The minutes of Wednesday's meetings were read, corrected and approved.

Report Secretary Spirit of Missions read by Mrs. J. S. Wright.

Reply to note of greeting sent Wednesday afternoon to the Colored Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary at their Convention at St. Athanasius Church read by Secretary.

Miss Edith D. Johnston gave an outline of the work of the Church Service League and the Church School Service League. Miss Johnston was heartily thanked by the Conference for the clear way she presented these two new branches of the Church's work.

Report District of Augusta read by the Vice-President, Mrs. John Hagler.

Report District of Albany read by Secretary in the absence of Mrs. J. H. Merrill the Vice-President.

Report District of Brunswick, read by the Vice-President, Mrs. J. P. Stewart.

Report District of Savannah, read by the Vice-President, Miss Eugenia M. Johnston.

The following motion made by Miss Edith D. Johnston was adopted by the Conference:

"Resolved, that this Conference authorize the President of the Woman's Auxiliary, in consultation with the Bishop, to organize a Diocesan Council of the Church Service League."

Mrs. F. F. Reese gave a talk on the work of the Daughters of the King.

Miss Lula C. Colesberry, Miss Eugenia M. Johnston and Mrs. F. C. Exley as "Finance Committee" made their report. The object of this committee at this time was to create a budget and to readjust and increase pledges made by the Branches, so that pledges made by the Auxiliary would be taken care of when due.

The delegates present responded generously, and all felt that some real constructive work had been accomplished, when all pledges were cared for and an expense account of \$225.00 was pledged.

The Finance Committee was thanked by the Conference for their efficient services.

Chairman of Nominating Committee made the report of the Committee. The report was accepted by the Conference, and the following officers elected for 1921:

PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

Dear Friends of the Woman's Auxiliary:

Again we are met together to take counsel of each other, compare our aims and their results in the year that has gone, to rejoice and give thanks where we have gone forward, face our failures and try to see what mistakes have caused them, and then go forward in the new work laid out for us in the coming year.

Our first work is to meet the pledges already promised. A list of these will be found in each annual report. I hope it will be possible to accept a new pledge each year, because we do not want to stand still. The Bishop Rowe Scholarship assumed last year was met in full. The Church School of Waycross, Grace Church, contributed liberally to this fund, helping to send the \$100.00 to Bishop Rowe, early in the year. I am glad to be able to report that the necessary legislation regarding the stopping of the salmon canneries at the mouth of the Yukon was passed. This was Archdeacon Stuck's last wish and the object of his most earnest work during the months of his visit to the States before his fatal illness. We are thankful that in some small measure we were able to help in thus saving the lives of many Alaskan Indians.

I hope you are all laboring, without ceasing, for the United Thank-Offering to be presented at Portland in 1922. Let us use every effort to make this offering at least \$3,000. Mrs. Davenport's report shows we have, so far, made no advance in this offering beyond the same time in the last three-year period. Please take this matter up with your Parish Branch and endeavor to increase the offering largely in the next eighteen months.

There are many plans for our organization at present. I spoke to you last year of the new plans for the box work. Mrs. Wade, supply secretary from the Missions House in New York, was in Savannah in January and made this work most vital for us. There is one phase of this department in which we can all help, i. e., in stocking a supply closet for headquarters to draw on in an emergency. We wish to start this closet at once. Any articles usually sent in boxes can be sent to Mrs. E. C. Blount, Box Secretary, Waynesboro, Ga., new clothing of all kinds, hospital supplies, surgical dressings, sheets, pillow cases, towels, etc. No matter how small the quantity, send something, but it must be new. There is need for an unlimited quantity of knitted goods for the

Seamen's Church Institute. Four times a year a report of what we have in hand is sent to the Missions House so Mrs. Wade knows where she can get certain articles when needed.

Another very important undertaking is the raising of \$50,000 by October, 1921, to be known as the Emery Fund, the interest to be used for Missionaries from the foreign field at home on furlough. Mrs. F. B. Screven of Savannah has charge of this fund for the Diocese and will make her report to you later. She will explain it and I earnestly ask your co-operation with her.

The Synod of the Province of Sewanee (Fourth Province) which includes fourteen Southern dioceses from North Carolina to Louisiana, meets October 25th in Savannah. At the same time and place the Woman's Auxiliary of the Province meets. We in Savannah are looking for the help of the entire diocese in order to make this Synod profitable and helpful.

At this Conference you elect your delegates to represent you at the Synod. Savannah is preparing to entertain all who come, and we are hoping many old friends and new will be there.

I would like to stress the importance of the summer schools for Church workers. Our nearest school is at Sewanee, where the Educational Department of our Province has its headquarters. Do try and attend this school in August and I can promise you information, inspiration, and a broadening of all your views and knowledge concerning the Church and her mission.

So, dear friends, let us all "be up and doing," eager, well informed and inspired Church-women, remembering that in the words of our favorite mission hymn,

'Tis thine to save from peril of perdition,
The souls for whom the Lord His Life laid down;
Beware lest, slothful to fulfill thy mission,
Thou lose one jewel that should deck His Crown.

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I.

This association shall be called the Georgia Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Presiding Bishop and Council.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this association shall be to help the Presiding Bishop and Council, studying Missions and giving to Missions.

ARTICLE III.

All baptized women of this Diocese are eligible to membership.

ARTICLE IV.

Sec. 1. There shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents (one from each District), Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Custodian of the United Thank Offering, Educational Secretary, Secretary of Boxes, Secretary of Spirit of Missions and President of Little Helpers.

Sec. 2. These officers shall constitute the Executive Board.

ARTICLE V.

Election of Officers.

Sec. 1. All officers shall be elected at the Annual Meeting, and be eligible for three consecutive years to the same office.

Sec. 2. Each branch shall be entitled to one vote, provided a delegate from that branch be present.

Sec. 3. The Nominating Committee shall report at second session of first day; the elections to follow immediately.

Sec. 4. Delegates to the General Convention and to the Annual Meeting of the Synod shall be nominated and elected from the floor.

Sec. 5. Should a vacancy occur in the President's office the Bishop shall appoint some one for the unexpired term.

Sec. 6. Should a vacancy occur in any of the other offices the President shall appoint some one for the unexpired term.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I.

Duties of Officers.

Sec. 1. The President shall preside at all Annual Conventions and Executive Meetings, and shall have the general supervision of the work of the Branch.

Sec. 2. The Vice-Presidents shall have the general supervision of the District to which they belong, and when requested by the President, may act for her.

Sec. 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Annual Convention and of the meetings of the Executive Board, and shall have charge of the publishing of the Annual Report.

Sec. 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all necessary correspondence of the Branch.

Sec. 5. The Treasurer shall receive and disburse all the money, contributions, except the United Thank Offering, and shall make an annual report of same.

Sec. 6. The Custodian of the United Thank Offering shall have charge of all offerings for that fund, and shall endeavor to promote interest in the same throughout the Diocese.

Sec. 7. The Educational Secretary shall guide the educational work of the Diocesan Branch. She shall endeavor to form a Mission Study Class in every Parish and Mission, and shall have charge of and distribute the literature issued by the Educational Department of the Board of Missions.

Sec. 8. The President of the Little Helpers shall correspond with Parish Presidents, distribute the red barrels, collect their contents, and remit said contents to the Diocesan Treasurer.

ARTICLE II.

Meetings.

Sec. 1. There shall be an Annual Convention in the spring of the year, the date to be appointed by the Bishop.

Sec. 2. There shall be, if possible, an annual meeting of each District.

Sec. 3. There shall be an annual meeting of the Executive Board, preceding the Annual Convention.

Sec. 4. The annual election for officers of the various branches shall take place each year in December, the officers to take up their duties at the first meeting in January.

ARTICLE III.

Expense Fund.

Disbursement of the Expense Fund shall be left to the discretion of the President and two other officers of the Executive Board, selected by her.
