May 5th-6th, Savannah, Ga.**

**FIRST DAY**

Monday, May 5th, 1924.

The Thirty-second Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Georgia was held in the Auditorium of St. John's Parish House, Savannah.

After registration the meeting was opened, at noon, with prayer by the President, Mrs. W. N. Pratt.

The vacancy caused by the resignation of Mrs. Harrison Watts not having been filled, the President appointed Mrs. Thomas Purse Recording Secretary for the meeting.

Mrs. J. K. McIver, of Saint Paul's, Savannah (the hostess church) very cordially welcomed the visitors.

The President, Mrs. W. N. Pratt, and the Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Wm. L. Wilson, having been appointed since January, 1924 (the fiscal year is from January to January) neither had formal reports; the former made several recommendations, to be acted on later, and the latter announced literature relative to reconstruction work to be done in Japan had been sent every Branch President, that notices requesting names and number of delegates expected to attend meeting had also been sent the Presidents.

Miss Colesberry, Treasurer, read her report showing a balance on hand January, 1924, of \$431.95. Report accepted and ordered placed in Minutes. Miss Colesberry asked permission to read two letters in connection with her report, granted; action deferred until later.

Miss E. M. Johnston asked if the budget made out in 1921 had been adhered to. Miss Colesberry replied no, the pledges had all been paid, but that no attention had been paid to the budget.

Miss Johnston also asked for information as to what would be done with oversubscriptions; moved that this be left for new business. Carried.

The President appointed the following committees:

Dispatch of Business Committee—Miss E. M. Johnston.

Mrs. Hull called attention to By-Laws requiring report of Nominating Committee at afternoon session of first day and asked for instructions. Miss Johnston moved to waive By-Laws and report on second day. Carried.

The Custodian U. T. O., Mrs. Blount, not having arrived, her report was read by Mrs. Wilson, accepted and ordered placed in the Minutes.

Mrs. M. D. Dickerson's report as Secretary "Spirit of Missions"



and Religious Education read by Mrs. Wilson, accepted and ordered spread upon Minutes.

"Woman's Special" Committee, no report.

Adjourned for luncheon, St. Pauls' Parish House, at 12:50.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION

Monday, May 5th, 1924.

The meeting convened at 2:30 in the Auditorium of St. John's Parish House.

Minutes of morning session read and approved.

Mrs. Hull moved that letters expressing regret at their absence on account of illness be written Mrs. W. H. Elliott, Honorary President, and Mrs. F. F. Reese. Carried.

Report of Box Secretary read by Mrs. Wilson.

There was considerable discussion about the box allotments. The President again instructed the members as to box work and urged them to abide by assignments.

The Custodian, Mrs. Blount, having arrived, asked permission to speak to her report—read at morning session—and told of how proud she is of the amount in hand for the United Thank Offering and urged that an effort be made to place one of the mite boxes in every home in each parish, and also requested that a regular time in the Spring and Fall be appointed for sending in the united thank offering.

Report of Educational Secretary read by Mrs. Wilson. Mrs. W. J. Cranston enclosed with her report her resignation, which was accepted with much regret.

Report of District Vice-Presidents:

Albany, Miss S. M. Woodson, read by Mrs. Wilson.

Augusta, Mrs. Percy Burum, read by Miss Harriet Ganahl.

Brunswick, Mrs. J. S. Wright.

Savannah, Mrs. W. N. Pratt, read by Mrs. Wilson.

All of these reports accepted and ordered spread upon the Minutes.

New Business:

Mrs. Wilson moved that the President's recommendations be the first new business acted on. Carried.

#### PRESIDENT'S RECOMMENDATIONS

"First: That the Educational Department be strengthened, that there be District Assistants to the Educational Secretary; these to be the District Vice-Presidents, to whom the Educational Secretary would send programs and they in turn were to be distributed by them to



the different branches. The programs not to be obligatory but some part of them should be used in order that all of the branches would be interested in the same subjects simultaneously." Carried.

"Second: That the Supply Department be developed. There is no branch so small but that it can do some work. Please never turn down an allotment; the Secretaries know most of the Missionaries and Workers personally and appeals for supplies are sent in with the approval of the Bishops. I went to the Mission House last month especially to ask the Supply Secretary if other boxes could be sent in place of those allotted, and she said positively no, so I beg that we stand by the plan and work only for the Missions included in the allotments from Headquarters." Much discussion. Mrs. Wilson moved that the Branches accept all assignments and co-operate as far as possible. Carried.

Business was suspended in order to listen to Rev. Mr. Haines of Liberia tell the assembly of the William Hoke Ramsauer Memorial School. Mr. Haines was introduced by Mr. Jonnard and his talk was most interesting and illuminating. He stated that although the \$10,000 has been oversubscribed, that much more is needed for equipment and maintenance. He also stated that \$50.00 a year would take care of a boy in the school and that while he was not authorized to so state, he thought an excellent way to meet this need would be scholarships.

The President stated that the Past President, Mrs. Haskell, was very anxious that Georgia should complete the payment of her Ramsauer pledges in this year so as our other "Specials" could be taken up. Unfortunately there was no report from the Chairman of the William Hoke Ramsauer Memorial.

The Ramsauer Memorial was temporarily tabled, hoping that the belated report would arrive by afternoon mail.

The Bishop arrived at conclusion of the Rev. Haines' talk and after his very earnest talk on the Spirit of Missions closed the meeting with prayer at 5:30.

---

## SECOND DAY

### MORNING SESSION

St. John's Parish House, Tuesday, May 6th, 1924.

The meeting opened at 10 o'clock with hymn No. 249, and prayer by Mrs. Harris of Augusta. Minutes of afternoon session were read and approved.

The third recommendation of the President was:



"That the strong branches help the weaker ones, and in that way help themselves. They can send their church papers through the Church Periodical Club and will be credited with doing that work. If near enough go to some meetings other than your own and hear what is being done and tell them of your work."

Mrs. Wilson moved that this be divided into two parts, making the last sentence the second part. Carried.

Upon motion the first part was carried.

Upon motion the second part was received as information.

Fourth Recommendation:

"That a conference of the Diocesan officers be held during each year when the work for the year could be planned. I do not know how this could be accomplished, as it has seemed impossible for any but two out-of-town officers to be present at this meeting. Permit me to call attention to the fact that all officers are expected at annual meetings and they should make every effort to be present."

The recommendation of the President that a semi-annual conference of the Diocesan officers be held, upon motion, carried.

Motion was made to appoint time, but to leave place of meeting to be decided by majority of officers. Carried.

The Finance Committee presented report.

Miss Colesberry recommended that the oversubscriptions to various pledges be applied to Bishop Rowe Scholarship. It was moved that this and similar recommendations be taken up under pledges. Carried.

The Corresponding Secretary reported that letters regretting their absence had been mailed Mrs. W. H. Elliott, Honorary President, and Mrs. F. F. Reese, and that one accepting, with regret, her resignation, had been sent Mrs. W. J. Cranston.

Upon invitation the body decided to meet in Albany in 1925, at the time of the convention of the Diocese.

Report of Mrs. H. M. Johnson, Prayer Committee, was read by Miss Ganahl.

Mrs. McKee read report of Clergy House in Saluda, N. C.

Two letters from Miss Tillotson on "Specials" were read by Mrs. Wilson; also "A statement of present urgent need for young women workers in China, Japan, Latin America, Liberia, Philippines, Honolulu and Alaska."

Nominating Committee reported. After nominations from the floor had been called for three times, Mrs. Purse moved that nominations be closed. Carried.

Mrs. Blount requested permission to make an announcement,



which was granted. She stated that \$115.00 was the amount of the offering at the Corporate Communion early this morning.

The Rev. Dr. W. H. Milton, Wilmington, N. C., a guest of the Convention, appeared before the Auxiliary and spoke interestingly on the five fields of service.

The meeting adjourned at 1 o'clock for luncheon in St. Paul's Sunday School building.

---

#### AFTERNOON SESSION

Tuesday, May 6th, 1924.

Minutes of the morning session read and confirmed.

Time for semi-annual meeting was discussed.

Miss Ganahl, Augusta, moved to reconsider action of body, relative to semi-annual meeting, at morning session. Carried.

Miss Ganahl moved to leave time and place to the discretion of the officers. Carried.

Mrs. Pratt read a letter from Miss E. D. Johnston, Executive Secretary, N. W. C. Dept., Diocese Georgia, asking endorsements of the plan outlined for the raising of funds for reconstruction work in Japan and urging the earnest co-operation of the women individually in this great work.

Miss E. M. Johnston moved: "That the Woman's Auxiliary of Georgia in annual meeting assembled endorse the endorsement of the Diocesan Convention of yesterday concerning the work of the reconstruction of the Church in Japan and that the members present will return to their homes with a ready will to further the plans as presented." Carried.

Letter from Dr. Claude M. Lee, Wusih, China, was read by Mrs. Wilson.

Mrs. Arthur Hazard, Augusta, moved to increase the Bishop Reese Educational Fund to \$200.00. Carried.

Mrs. Wilson, Savannah, moved to increase the Bishop Rowe Scholarship to \$200.00. Carried.

It was the sense of the meeting that the Expense Fund be increased to \$250.00.

The president asked the delegates in reporting to their Branches, to stress the importance and the necessity of these increases and to urge the co-operation individually and as Branches and also requested that she be notified as early as possible to what extent each Branch could respond.

Mrs. J. W. Quincey, Douglas, moved that all oversubscriptions



go to the pledge to which it was designated. Carried.

Mrs. A. B. Hull, Savannah, moved that a pledge of \$50.00 be made to the Clergy House in Saluda, N. C. Carried.

It was moved that every member add ten cents (10c) to her yearly dues and this money be given the hostess parish for expenses of convention. The motion was lost.

Mrs. J. K. McIver, Savannah, moved the adoption of the ticket brought in by the Nominating Committee with a rising vote of thanks. Carried.

The Secretary was instructed to cast the ballot and the following officers were declared elected:

There being no further business the meeting was closed with words of inspiration from the pen of Bishop A. S. Lloyd, read by Mrs. Wilson.

In the hush following a member asked the privilege of the floor and stated that she wished to be allowed to subscribe \$50.00 for a



scholarship to the Ramsauer Memorial as a thank offering for direct answer to prayer.

After the benediction the meeting adjourned.

## REPORT OF PRAYER COMMITTEE

There are very few definite results that the Prayer Committee can report this year. Two days of intercession were very generally observed throughout the Diocese. Several letters were sent out to the Presidents of Branches and one to the members of the Prayer Committee, requesting that the Branches, in the respective districts be given the information. This last letter requested all the groups and individual members to pray for Mrs. Taber's work in the Diocese.

Mrs. Haskell and the chairman of the Prayer Committee arranged and sent out to every Branch, a leaflet entitled, "Some Reasons and Suggestions for a Prayer Group." We hope these have been helpful.

Requests for information regarding Prayer Groups have been received, but there have been very few of these. It has been our earnest wish that every Branch have a Prayer Group. So far we have not attained this ideal.

Let me urge the President of every branch to get a copy of the Woman's Auxiliary Hand Book from the Church Missions House. I hope many have them already. In this will be found a beautiful and helpful outline of the duties and privileges of a Prayer Group, which will greatly help in organizing groups in Branches where there are none.

The Church Service League Prayer Leaflet is also a great help in a group as well as in one's private devotions. The subscriptions are 25 cents a year, 20 cents in clubs of five; and I wish we had many subscribers in the Diocese.

None of us has sounded the depths of prayer. We need to pray more and more. The promises in God's Word are so abundant to those who pray. Our Blessed Saviour said: "All power is given unto me," and again: "Ask and ye shall receive." And St. Paul says: "*Now unto him who is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us.*"

Oh, let us pray for that power to be released in us, and through us to others. Let us pray personally and in our groups, that the building program in Japan may be accomplished and Christ's Kingdom spread throughout the nation. Let us pray that the Bishop Tuttle Memorial Fund may grow rapidly, and the full amount be raised. Let us pray that the Woman's Auxiliary may become an increasingly great instrument in God's hand for sending the Light of the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the whole world.

A REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY OF THE  
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY, DIOCESE OF GEORGIA,  
DECEMBER, 1922, TO DECEMBER, 1923.

In February, 1923, the Educational Secretary made a trip in the Diocese of Georgia in the interest of the educational work of the Auxiliary, at which time she visited branches in the following cities: Thomasville, Albany, Americus, Douglas, Bainbridge, Fitzgerald and Moultrie. Talks were made, once or twice in each town, on the subject of the general work of the Auxiliary; study classes; prayer groups; co-operation of Auxiliary with C. S. S. L. and Y. P. S. L. as their part in the work of religious education. Conferences were held with officers, study class leaders, and U. T. O. Custodians as to their work and the conducting of classes. Two new Branches were organized at Fitzgerald and Moultrie. Prayer leaflets, educational and U. T. O. leaflets, were distributed in all places.

In return for such small service as she was able to render, received everywhere a most cordial welcome, a splendid co-operation, a manifestation of keenest interest and enthusiasm for the work of education, and more inspiration and real help from her contact with the Auxiliary women in the Diocese than she will ever be able to repay.

Letters were sent all branches, with regard to books and publications recommended by the national board for study during 1923, with prices quoted. Suggestions were also made by letter, for study classes, and all Branches were urged to send at least one member to Sewanee to the Summer Training School, to bring back to the home Branch help and inspiration for the coming year. The secretary herself went to Sewanee, studying under Dr. Wood the text, "Creative Forces in Japan," which book she has tried faithfully to teach to prospective leaders here in the Augusta District, and has recommended for others to use. Letters to various Branches, in answer to questions concerning programmes, study classes and publications sent out.

It is very gratifying to know that all branches have held programme meetings during the year, and many have had study classes, handled by different methods, some reading the text aloud with explanations, some using lecture method and others discussional method, the latter, of course, being the preferred form.

Very little was done during the last months of the year, because of continued illness, which lost time is deeply regretted.

With the permission of the Auxiliary there are a few suggestions as to the forward work that the retiring secretary would like to



offer:

First: That the educational secretary be sent to Sewanee each summer to study missions, and especially the text recommended for special study that year by the national board of the Auxiliary.

Second: That some definite amount be apportioned for traveling expenses of each secretary, so that such branches as can pay will do so, planning for such expense ahead of time by a pledge to a traveling fund for the educational secretary.

With such a plan, Branches which are unable to assist with the expenses, may still have the benefit of a visit from the secretary.

Third: That a small expense fund be allowed for postage, paper, typing, etc.

## CONSTITUTION

---

### ARTICLE I.

This association shall be called the Georgia Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council.

### ARTICLE II.

The object of this association shall be to help the National Council, studying Missions and giving to Missions.

### ARTICLE III.

All baptized women of this Diocese are eligible to membership.

### ARTICLE IV.

Section 1. There shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents (one from each District), Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Custodian of the United Thank Offering, Educational Secretary, Secretary of Boxes and Secretary of Spirit of Missions and Religious Literature.

Sec. 2. These officers shall constitute the Executive Board.

### ARTICLE V.

Section 1. All officers shall be elected at the Annual Meeting and be eligible for three consecutive years to the same office, excepting the Recording Secretary and Treasurer, whose term of office shall not be limited.

Sec. 2. Each branch shall be entitled to one vote, provided a delegate from that branch be present.

Sec. 3. The Nominating Committee shall report at second session of first day; the elections to follow immediately.

Sec. 4. Delegates to the General Convention and to the Annual Meetings of the Synod shall be nominated and elected from the floor.

Sec. 5. Should a vacancy occur in the President's office the Bishop shall appoint some one for the unexpired term.

Sec. 6. Should a vacancy occur in any of the other offices the President shall appoint some one for the unexpired term.



## BY-LAWS

### ARTICLE I.

#### Duties of Officers.

Section 1. The President shall preside at all Annual Conventions and Executive Meetings, and shall have the general supervision of the work of the Branch.

Sec. 2. The Vice-Presidents shall have the general supervision of the District to which they belong, and when requested by the President, may act for her.

Sec. 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Annual Convention and of the meetings of the Executive Board, and shall have charge of the publishing of the Annual Report.

Sec. 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all necessary correspondence of the Branch.

Sec. 5. The Treasurer shall receive and disburse all the money, contributions, except the United Thank Offering, and shall make an annual report of same.

Sec. 6. The Custodian of the United Thank Offering shall have charge of all offerings for that fund, and shall endeavor to promote interest in the same throughout the Diocese.

Sec. 7. The Educational Secretary shall guide the educational work of the Diocesan Branch. She shall endeavor to form a Mission Study Class in every Parish and Mission, and shall have charge of and distribute the literature issued by the Educational Department of the Board of Missions.

### ARTICLE II.

#### Meetings.

Section 1. There shall be an Annual Convention in the spring of the year, the date to be appointed by the Bishop.

Sec. 2. There shall be, if possible, an annual meeting of each District.

Sec. 3. There shall be an annual meeting of the Executive Board, preceding the Annual Convention.

Sec. 4. The annual election for officers of the various branches shall take place each year in December, the officers to take up their duties at the first meeting in January.



## ARTICLE III.

## Expense Fund.

Disbursement of the Expense Fund shall be left to the discretion of the President and two other officers of the Executive Board, selected by her.
