FIRST DAY

Wednesday, April 22nd, 1925.

The Thirty-third Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council, Diocese of Georgia, was held in St. Paul's Parish House, Albany.

After registration the meeting was opened by singing, "Jesus Calls Us O'er the Tumult." Afterwards prayer was offered by Rev. John Moore Walker, Rector of St. Paul's Church, Albany.

The programme was presented by Mrs. Wilson, Savannah, and accepted.

Miss Nella Cutliff of St. Paul's, Albany, (the hostess church) very graciously welcomed the delegates and the response by Mrs. Jackson H. Harris was read by Mrs. W. J. Cranston owing to Mrs. Harris' illness. Twenty-four delegates and alternates responded to roll call as follows:

Next in order was the address of the President, Mrs. W. N. Pratt.

The report of the Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Wm. L. Wilson, was read and accepted.

Miss Colesberry, Treasurer, read her report, which was accepted. Mrs. Wilson moved that Miss Colesberry be allowed time to speak to her report later. Carried.

The regular order of business was suspended and Mrs. Pratt appointed the following committees:

The regular order of business was resumed: Mrs. E. C. Blount, Custodian of United Thank Offering, read her report and supplemented it with a short and very earnest plea to the members to think and pray more for the United Thank Offering. Report was accepted.

Mrs. Wilson moved that the Auxiliary adjourn for luncheon and reconvene at 2 p. m. Carried.

AFTERNOON SESSION

The meeting convened at 2:10. Business was suspended to listen to the Bishop's informal talk to the Auxiliary.

The Minutes of the morning's session were read, approved and accepted.

Mrs. Wilson moved that the regular order of business be suspended to vote on the following recommendation of Mrs. Dickerson, of Douglas, made at Executive Board meeting and approved by the Board. Carried. "Resolved: The Auxiliary recommends to the Con-

vention for consideration that future conventions open with a Sunday service." Mrs. Wilson requested the President to call on Mrs. Dickerson to speak to her motion. Mrs. Dickerson spoke very feelingly on the inspiration it was to the members from the smaller places to be privileged to attend such a service. After some discussion question was called for and the motion was carried and the Secretary instructed to convey to the Bishop the recommendation.

Next in order was the report of Mrs. H. H. Burnet, Secretary of Spirit of Missions and Religious Literature.

The report of the Educational Secretary, Mrs. M. D. Dickerson, followed.

Mrs. Roy E. Breen, Secretary of Boxes, presented her report.

District Vice Presidents' Reports:

Augusta: Mrs. Jackson H. Harris, report read by Mrs. Wilson.

Brunswick: Mrs. J. S. Wright, report read by Mrs. Sterne.

All reports accepted and ordered placed in the Minutes.

Mrs. H. M. Johnson, Chairman of Prayer Committee, had no written report, but urged the Branches to form Prayer Groups and also to have a prayer service before each regular Auxiliary meeting.

The President called a recess of an hour in order that the Auxiliary might adjourn to the Convention to hear the talks on Religious Education. The Meeting reconvened at 4:45.

The President made two announcements: That the Ramsaur Memorial Fund had been oversubscribed \$58.00, making a total of \$558.00.

That the collection taken at the Corporate Communion Thursday morning would be given by the Bishop to the United Thank Offering.

The President introduced the Rev. Middleton S. Barnwell, a Field Secretary of the National Council, who in a ten minute talk outlined most interestingly the work of a Field Secretary and told of the necessity of having one in each Diocese.

Mrs. Wilson called attention to the omission of Mrs. Pratt's name and moved that it be added to the ticket as delegate. Carried.

The meeting then adjourned.

SECOND DAY

Thursday, April 23rd, 1925.

The meeting opened at 10 o'clock with singing of "O Sion Haste Thy Mission High Fulfilling," and prayer by the President.

Minutes of Wednesday afternoon session read, corrected and approved.

Mrs. Jackson H. Harris, Augusta, Vice President, by request gave her report, which was read, in her absence, yesterday.

Mrs. M. D. Dickerson, chairman Bishop Tuttle Memorial, gave her report and recommended that the Diocesan pledge be made \$500.00. The report was accepted, the recommendation was discussed, made a motion and carried.

Mrs. Dickerson requested permission to call for pledges from the floor at this time. Granted and \$296.00 was pledged.

Mrs. Blount, Custodian, requested the privilege of making an announcement. Granted. Mrs. Blount stated that the offering at the Corporate Communion this morning was \$15.00, and that the total of the United Thank Offering at present is \$3,611.79, leaving \$388.21 to be raised by October.

Mrs. Wilson moved that each Branch be requested to have an Assistant United Thank Offering Custodian. Carried.

Mrs. Wilson moved that an expression of regret at her absence be sent Mrs. Wm. H. Elliott, Honorary President. Carried and Mrs. Pratt instructed the Secretary to send a telegram.

Miss Edith D. Johnston, Diocesan Executive Secretary of the Field Department, was granted the privilege of the floor and spoke of what the Auxiliary can do to help the Department in promoting the work of the Church.

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

Mrs. Wilson, Chairman, stated that in order to have this important matter impressed upon the members instead of a formal report she would ask the Treasurer, Miss Colesberry, to speak at length on her report of yesterday and then would invite general discussion.

Miss Colesberry went into details of her report and stated that all but one Diocesan pledge had been met and many of them oversubscribed.

There was much discussion and Mrs. W. J. Cranston, Augusta, moved to rescind action of 1924 meeting regarding surplus on pledges. Motion was lost.

Mrs. Wilson stressed the point that it is very unbusinesslike to vote to increase pledges and then return home and make no effort to raise the amount, and emphasized that it reflects very much on the Diocesan Auxiliary when its pledges are not met in full.

Mrs. Wilson asked the Chair to call for pledges for the present year for the Bishop Rowe Scholarship in order that the Fund would not again show a deficit. The result follows:

Grace Church School, Waycross, \$50.00; Americus, an increase of \$2.50; St. Andrew's, Douglas, \$5.00; St. Thomas, Thomasville, \$5.00; Junior League, Valdosta, \$3.00; St. Marks, Brunswick, \$5.00; St. John's, Savannah, an increase of \$6.30.

Mrs. Wilson moved that the President appoint a committee to make a proposed budget to be submitted to the Branch officers, they in turn to present it to their members for discussion, the paper with notations to be returned as early as possible to the President; it being agreed that all would abide by the decision of the majority as to details of Budget. Carried.

Mrs. J. H. Harris moved that the report of the Finance Committee be accepted. Carried.

Mrs. W. H. Johnson moved that the report of Branches be made in triplicate, one sent to the Treasurer, one to the President and one kept for local file. Carried.

Miss Colesberry asked for the privilege of the floor to extend an invitation to the Auxiliary to meet in Brunswick in 1925. The invitation was accepted with pleasure.

Mrs. Pratt read excerpts from a circular letter sent out by Miss Grace Lindley, Executive Secretary Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council Protestant Episcopal Church, dealing with various important matters discussed at the meeting of the Executive Board in New York.

Mrs. Pratt called attention to the playlet, "The Blue Box," and told of the interesting meeting when it was given in Savannah. She urged that each Branch put on this little play as it inspires individuals to have a part in the Church's work.

Resolutions upon the death of Mrs. F. F. Reese and of Mrs. Henry McKee were presented by the Necrology Committee.

A very inspiring talk was made by Miss Margaret Weed of Jacksonville, Fla., Provincial Representative of the Fourth District, and a vote of appreciation was given Miss Weed for attending our meeting and bringing us in closer touch with the work of the Church as a whole.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is with a feeling of thankfulness that I greet so many of our members today, for the greater the numbers who attend our annual meetings and learn what has been and is to be done the greater are our chances of extending the Kingdom. Our past year has been one of gain in numbers and interest as reports will show. I want to thank you for what you have done in Box work and for which I made a plea last year. I only wish all the branches had taken part, if only in a very small way. Our pledge to the Ramsaur Memorial was over subscribed and the Provincial Chairman of the fund hopes the branches will take scholarships in the school at Pandamai and so continue their interest.

We have the Bishop Tuttle Memorial to complete and I hope the major part of that will be in by May. We would not find it difficult to raise the amount if we would just put ourselves in the places of those returning missionaries. Imagine landing in a strange city in costumes seven years behind the times; thick clothes in summer perhaps and thin ones in winter. Would we not bless the women who had made it possible to have a home to go to where every one would understand why we looked so funny and where we would not be subjected to ridicule, looked, if not spoken? Think of the comfort of being looked after and made comfortable while studying and fitting themselves for better service after seven years of planning and working for others amid great discouragement at times. Let us do our best for them and to make it possible to train the colored women to help elevate the members of their race morally and spiritually. In memory of our dear old Mammies, let us help to make the school at

St. Augustan's, Raleigh, possible.

The Triennial Convention is to be held in October in New Orleans, and I have tried either by letter or through the Diocesan paper, which I hope you all read, to disseminate the information sent me by Miss Lindley. There are several important matters to come up about which you should inform yourselves so that your delegates who must be elected at this meeting may know how you feel about them and how they should vote.

About the delegates; only active members of the auxiliary are eligible and we are entitled to five, one of whom it is hoped may be a young woman. In choosing your delegates and alternates, please only elect those who are reasonably sure of being able to attend. At the Synod meeting in Wilmington, I was the only one of twelve elected who attended and I felt that Georgia must be represented by one white woman anyway. The President of the colored branch was there. It is a misfortune that we have not yet been able to pay the expenses of a delegate to the Synod, the General Convention and to send some one to a Summer School each year. Other branches no stronger than we are do it and I trust that we may soon be of that number.

It was interesting at the Synod meeting so many women of the Province and hearing their enthusiasm. Miss Lindley was there but as she was recalled to New York she made her address to the members of the Convention, the Auxiliary and the whole congregation. The Presiding Bishop, Bishop Bratton of Mississippi, asked Miss Lindley to speak from the pulpit, which she did with as much ease as though it were her accustomed place, and held the large congregation spell bound for an hour while she told of her visit to the mission stations in the Orient. There were two young women missionaries from Alaska and one from Liberia who told of their work and to each of whom \$50.00 was given for the work. Then an older woman, retired after 36 years in China, spoke feelingly of the opportunity of Christianity to make itself a power in China today. We were very much touched when an attractive looking young girl from South Carolina was introduced and we were told she had offered herself for the Mission field and hoped to be sent to China. In 1926 the Synod is to meet in Jacksonville and Miss Weed, who will be with us tomorrow is now Provincial President of the Auxiliary. She is also our representative on the Executive Board.

Last year we voted to increase two pledges but sufficient funds were not sent in for them and I hope we may be able to arrange our finances so that all pledges can be paid in full.

Instructions were sent me and passed on about the Peace Award and the Day of Prayer for Missions, in both of which some of us took part. The Secretary of the World Conference on Faith and Order asked permission to communicate directly with the branch presidents about taking part in the Week of Prayer in May, so I suppose you have received literature about it.

We have been called upon to mourn the loss of two most valuable members, Mrs. Reese and Mrs. McKee. Flowers were sent both families in the name of the Auxiliary.

Every few weeks calls come for teachers or nurses and so far Georgia has never responded. Have you no sons or daughters whom you could spare? They are so much needed in the Mission Field. We are being asked to do all in our power to promote Peace and suggestions for carrying out the plans will be given us. There is much work ahead for us which I have no doubt will be accomplished, but our greatest need is the development and deepening of our devotional life. We should have more prayer groups, corporate communions and quiet days, strengthening our Faith which will enable us to carry on successfully.

From May, 1924 ,to January, 1925.

Attended Sewanee Conference August 7th to 21st.

Thirty hour class room and project work. Six afternoon conferences. (Womans' Auxiliary). Eight evening programs or lectures. Missions in Alaska and China. Sent program suggestions to all 26 branches; also list of books for Lenten study, program made with the aid of Miss Boyer of New York. Sent questionnaire to all branches in January for report of educational work, urging all branches to send one member to Sewanee if possible.

Education has been given a first place in many branches and some educational work has been done in all branches heard from with the exception of one.

Moultrie, from response to questionnaire, stands first on stressing Education. Only 2 Branches heard from do not have study classes.

Of the 26 questionnaires sent out 19 answers have been received. Study for 1925-26 will be Latin-America. Courses* on all text books will be taught at Sewanee Conference in August. Surely some member from each branch will go for a vacation of at least two weeks. Nowhere could one find a more ideal way to spend a vacation. Urge some one to go.

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I.

This association shall be called the Georgia Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this association shall be to help the National Council, studying Missions and giving to Missions.

ARTICLE III.

All baptized women of this Diocese are eligible to membership.

ARTICLE IV.

Section 1. There shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents (one from each District), Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Custodian of the United Thank Offering, Educational Secretary, Secretary of Boxes and Secretary of Spirit of Missions and Religious Literature.

Sec. 2. These officers shall constitute the Executive Board.

ARTICLE V.

Section 1. All officers shall be elected at the Annual Meeting and be eligible for three consecutive years to the same office, excepting the Recording Secretary and Treasurer, whose term of office shall not be limited.

Sec. 2. Each branch shall be entitled to one vote, provided a delegate from that branch be present.

Sec. 3. The Nominating Committee shall report at second session of first day; the elections to follow immediately.

Sec. 4. Delegates to the General Convention and to the Annual Meetings of the Synod shall be nominated and elected from the floor.

Sec. 5. Should a vacancy occur in the President's office the Bishop shall appoint some one for the unexpired term.

Sec. 6. Should a vacancy occur in any of the other offices the President shall appoint some one for the unexpired term.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I.

Duties of Officers

Section 1. The President shall preside at all Annual Conventions and Executive Meetings, and shall have the general supervision of the work of the Branch.

Sec. 2. The Vice-Presidents shall have the general supervision of the District to which they belong, and when requested by the President, may act for her.

Sec. 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Annual Convention and of the meetings of the Executive Board, and shall have charge of the publishing of the Annual Report.

Sec. 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all necessary correspondence of the Branch.

Sec. 5. The Treasurer shall receive and disburse all the money, contributions, except the United Thank Offering, and shall make an annual report of same.

Sec. 6. The Custodian of the United Thank Offering shall have charge of all offerings for that fund, and shall endeavor to promote interest in the same throughout the Diocese.

Sec. 7. The Educational Secretary shall guide the educational work of the Diocesan Branch. She shall endeavor to form a Mission Study Class in every Parish and Mission, and shall have charge of and distribute the literature issued by the Educational Department of the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

Meetings.

Section 1. There shall be an Annual Convention in the spring of the year, the date to be appointed by the Bishop.

Sec. 2. There shall be, if possible, an annual meeting of each District.

Sec. 3. There shall be an annual meeting of the Executive Board, preceding the Annual Convention. A semi-annual meeting of the Board shall also be held.

Sec. 4. The annual election for officers of the various branches shall take place each year in December, the officers to take up their duties at the first meeting in January.

ARTICLE III.

Expense Fund.

Disbursement of the Expense Fund shall be left to the discretion of the President and two other officers of the Executive Board, selected by her.

ARTICLE IV.
