Minutes of Meeting for Organization

June 13, 1905

The Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese was organized at a meeting held in the Parish house of St. Stephen's Church, Harrisburg, at 4 o'clock in the afternoon of Tuesday, June 13, the day of the meeting of the Diocesan Convention. Owing to the shortness of the notice, but a limited number of delegates were present.

Bishop Darlington was present and opened the meeting by prayer.

Mrs. Rockhill Smith, of Harrisburg, was made chairman of the meeting, and Mrs. Robert F. Gibson, of Steelton, secretary *pro tem*.

A form of Constitution was offered, being the form used in the undivided Diocese, and was read by the secretary, and after the making of a few necessary amendments was adopted.

Special attention was called to the provision that all money should be sent to the organizing secretaries of the two archdeaconries instead of to the Treasurer of the Board of Missions in New York. This is done in order that all the Chapters may be sure to receive credit in the reports for what they have done.

After agreeing that all delegates present should vote as individuals, the meeting proceeded to elect officers, who will serve until the annual meeting in October.

Mrs. J. W. B. Bausman, of Lancaster, was unanimously elected President.

Mrs. George D. Ramsay, of Harrisburg, was unanimously elected Vice-President.

Mrs. Levi B. Alricks, of Harrisburg, was unanimously elected Secretary.

Miss Coleman, of Williamsport, was unanimously elected Treasurer.

Mrs. George D. Ramsay was elected Directress of the Junior

Branch, and Mrs. Robert F. Gibson, of the Babies' Branch, both unanimously.

After some discussion as to the income from the Bishop Rulison Fund, the matter of annual pledges was considered. It was determined that in the fall new pledges would be called for.

Mrs. Bausman invited the Auxiliary to hold its annual meeting in October in Lancaster. The invitation was accepted by a rising vote.

It was determined that, with the consent of the Bishop, the meeting of the Auxiliary in each Archdeaconry should follow the regular Archdeaconry meetings, when possible.

The organizing secretaries were requested to provide matter for a column in each issue of *The Harrisburg Churchman*.

Mrs. E. P. Almy, of Williamsport, was appointed Organizing Secretary for the Archdeaconry of Williamsport. The Organizing Secretary for the Archdeaconry of Harrisburg will be appointed later.

It was directed that printed copies of the Constitution should be sent to the Secretary of each Parish Chapter, that the Constitution should be read at every annual meeting and be printed in the Auxiliary column in *The Harrisburg Churchman*.

An offering, amounting to \$10.00, was made, after which the meeting adjourned.

Report of Williamsport Archdeaconry, 1905

All Hail to the Diocese of Harrisburg and Bishop Darlington.

The January meeting was held in Trinity Church, Williamsport, and was largely attended.

The Rev. George I. Brown conducted the quiet hour in a most impressive and helpful manner. After morning prayer and the celebration of the Holy Communion, luncheon was served in the Parish house. In the afternoon, before the business meeting, Dr. Driggs gave a most interesting talk on his work in Alaska, and Mrs. Israel, President of the Central Pennsylvania Diocese, gave us a very helpful address. The offering, \$29.00, was given to Dr. Driggs.

The May meeting was held in St. Paul's, Bloomsburg, and, as this was the first time Bishop Darlington had been with us, it was a very enthusiastic meeting. Bishop Darlington preached the sermon in the morning and gave us an interesting talk with many suggestions for work. We were delighted to have with us Mrs. Scott, the Honorary President, and Miss Mercur, the Secretary of Central Pennsylvania. We had also a very realistic address on Life in Japan by a Japanese woman. This was the first time Bloomsburg had entertained the Auxiliary, and it was appreciated by all. The afternoon offering, \$5.10, was voted to the Bishop's purse. The parishes of this Archdeaconry have done well, twelve, so far, with more to hear from, have contributed in some way, either by boxes or giving to the General Fund, or United Offering.
