PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

(Abbreviated.)

As we meet together at another annual meeting we again miss the genial personality of our dear President, and, as last year, the calamity of war still hangs over the world.

First of all I would call your attention to the fact that all money for Auxiliary work which is reported at any annual meeting *must* be in the Treasurer's hands by or before April 30th of each year; otherwise it cannot be reported by her.

Secretaries will please see that the blanks sent to them are properly filled out; otherwise they cannot go into the Journal. Please be particular to state where the money came from and for what it was spent, according to the questions in the blanks.

Every Branch but two has contributed to the Altar Fund, and please bear in mind that the *minimum* sum has been one dollar, and the heart of the one who dispenses it will be made glad by *liberal* gifts to it.

That we have again more than met our apportionment gives us satisfaction and confidence that a higher record will be reached the coming year.

NEW CONSTITUTION.

The framing of a new constitution and by-laws at the last annual Convocation was a step in advance, as the old one had long since been outgrown. To new and inexperienced officers the need of definite rules and instructions is a real one, and we would urge each branch to have its own constitution and by-laws.

I would remind you that All Saints' Day is to be observed for a corporate communion of the Auxiliary throughout the Islands, and I suggest that the offering on that day be given to the Diocesan Altar Fund.

We would advise Branches to ask their Priest to hold Quiet Days or devotional afternoons occasionally. Days of intercession at the Cathedral in Advent and Lent have been of great help, and I commend them to all.

UNITED OFFERING.

A very important work of the Woman's Auxiliary is the United Offering. If every woman would give one cent a day and every fifth day put a nickel in the little blue box, using the prayer, what a wonderful offering we should have! That one cent a day, if we were only 120 women, would give us \$438 a year, or for three years \$1314.00. What would it be with 500 women? The offering is made at the Triennial Corporate Communion of the Woman's Auxiliary at the General Convention in October of each third year.

To be a member of the Woman's Auxiliary does not mean just going to meetings, doing a little sewing, or taking a mite box. There is a great deal more to it. We are to bear in mind what the Church of God is here to do, and that each one has a real share and responsibility in that Church. What we need most is a praying Woman's Auxiliary or, as Bishop Lloyd has said, we should "do our work on our knees."

Let us bear these thoughts in mind, and may our watchword for the coming year be: "Lord, what wilt Thou have *me* to do?"

**FOURTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE RECORDING
SECRETARY.**

Since the last annual meeting in May there have been two quarterly meetings, the first held at the home of the President, Mrs. von Holt, and the second in St. Clement's Parish House. Both were well attended.

We have had the pleasure of listening to Rev. Mr. Howard of Alaska, who spoke of conditions there, especially in connection with Bishop Rowe's travels and work. Also of hearing an account from Miss Hodgson of England, who was passing through here on her way to the Orient, of work there. She gave graphic descriptions of what is being done in India, of the inadequate number of workers for the size of the field, of the interest of those to whom Christ's message is brought, etc.

Along the line of educational work, Mrs. H. McK. Harrison has done persistent work, and Deaconess Spencer has held a mission study class, the subject being from the book entitled, "Japan Advancing Whither?"

At the annual meeting certain articles of the constitution were ordered changed, and the officers were directed to amend the by-laws. This has been done, and the new constitution and by-laws, together with various reports, have been printed and distributed among the members.

Our pledge at Convocation was that we work for "the equipment of work among Japanese women." A great part of the time at the quarterly meetings was spent in discussing ways and means by which this pledge might be fulfilled. It was hoped that suitable land could be found on which to erect a hostel for the Japanese women and girls. As this land could not be obtained at present it was decided that we do what we could to raise money toward the purchase of the land, when obtained, and the erection of a hostel. This report is supposed to stop as of April 30th, but perhaps it is permissible to let it include a few days in May, so that all may know how much has been accomplished toward our pledge. Under the able leadership of Mrs. John E. Baird, a Cherry Blossom Fete was held on May 5th and 6th. Not only our own Auxiliary members worked for this, but people of all denominations and nationalities became interested and lent a helping hand, so that \$2875.45 was cleared. The self-denial offerings were also put to the credit of this same account, so Holy Trinity has now quite a nest egg, which we hope will continue to grow until sufficiently large for all the needs of the work.

In addition to this we can report the building of a lanai at St. Mary's, Moiliili, to accommodate the younger school children. This has been a long-felt need, and its accomplishment makes the work there much easier.

This is a very brief review of what has been done during the year, but surely it shows that the year has not been an idle one.

REPORT OF CORRESPONDING SECRETARY.

(Condensed.)

While naturally I had hoped to report greater things, yet it has been a good year for the Woman's Auxiliary in the Hawaiian Islands. In the twenty parishes and missions, we have twelve branches of the Woman's Auxiliary and nine doing Junior Auxiliary work, with a total membership of 521, which is a gain of 21.

Our organization confuses many who are not used to it. Strong and independent parishes can have independent bodies of women devoting their whole time to missionary work, and other organizations working for the Parish exclusively; but if we were to follow that system there would be few branches of the Auxiliary in these Islands. We have to do as we are doing or do nothing. Each of our 17 guilds can for a part of each year resolve itself into a branch of the Auxiliary and work for Missions. The idea is being understood now as never before, and the publication of the year book helped this considerably.

The Missionary spirit is shown to be more general by the willing gifts of the local branches to every object for which we have appealed. Thirteen have given to the United Offering as compared with four in 1915. The Apportionment was paid by all branches except two. The District Expense Fund, which enables us to get out our annual report, received contributions from all branches. The usefulness of this report to clergy, officers and others is evident. Three hundred copies have been distributed, as well as many copies of the Auxiliary Handbook, which every Church woman should have.

Convocation pledges were promptly met. Eleven branches pledged to Japanese work, 12 to St. Mary's, 11 to Kula, etc.

Our box work made a great advance, and for the first time we prepared Diocesan boxes—one for St. Mary's School, Shanghai, and one for Iolani. St. Mary's box was valued at \$159.00 and Iolani's at \$44.35. Seven mission Sunday Schools were provided with Christmas gifts, and an Altar, reredos and Altar Rail were provided for Trinity. Altar linen was furnished for two missions. St. Clement's sent a box to Alaska. The total of our box work is larger than ever before, and this brings our grand total of cash and boxes to about the same total as the gifts of last year.

The Priory Juniors worked for a scholarship at Sewanee and sent a gift to the hospital at Tokyo. All Branches worked for the Japanese hostel.

Let us resolve to do better next year in every respect—in membership, knowledge, enthusiasm and gifts.

MINUTES OF THE FOURTEENTH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY, HONOLULU BRANCH.

(Condensed.)

The fourteenth annual meeting of the Honolulu Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was opened by a celebration of the Holy Communion at St. Andrew's Cathedral, Wednesday, May 31, 1916, at 10 a. m., the Rev. L. H. Tracy being the preacher.

Immediately after, an adjournment was made to the Davies Memorial Hall. In the absence of the President, Mrs. H. M. von Holt, Mrs. L. F. Folsom, Vice-President, presided. The roll-call showed the twenty parishes and missions represented by 85 delegates. The Acting President read her address, which opened with a memorial mention of the late Mrs. Caroline Clark, and continued with a brief account of the year's work.

The offering of the morning, \$29.05, was voted to the Rev. P. T. Fukao. At noon prayers were read for missions. The Treasurer's report was distributed in printed form and considered as read.

Reports were read of the Recording Secretary, the Corresponding Secretary, Secretary of the Junior Auxiliary, the Educational Secretary, the Little Helpers, the United Offering Secretary, the Altar Department and the Church Periodical Club.

Under the able supervision of Miss Emily Ladd, luncheon was served at the Priory, at which about 200 partook.

At two the meeting reassembled, and Mrs. Baird, chairman of the Committee on the Cherry Blossom Fete, reported \$2875.45 on hand for the hostel for Japanese girls and women.

The Bishop then appointed the officers: President, Mrs. H. M. von Holt; Vice-President, Mrs. L. F. Folsom; Recording Secretary, Mrs. W. L. Moore; Treasurer, Mrs. B. L. Marx; Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Henry B. Restarick; United Offering Secretary, Miss Gillet; Little Helpers Secretary, Mrs. L. F. Folsom; Church Periodical Club Secretary, Mrs. John E. Baird; Educational Secretary, Mrs. H. McK. Harrison; Directress of the Altar Department, Mrs. H. B. Restarick.

An article to be added to the Constitution was adopted providing for a Second Vice-President and a by-law directing each parish branch to pay yearly at least a dollar to the Altar Fund and each Junior Auxiliary fifty cents.

All Saints Day was adopted for the Corporate Communion of the Woman's Auxiliary throughout the District, the offerings of every branch to be given to the Diocesan Altar Fund.

After some discussion it was resolved that: "the special work of the District Branch for the coming year shall be, first, to guarantee the interest on \$2000.00 for the building of the chapel at St. Mary's, Honolulu, and, second, that work for the building of the hostel for Japanese women be continued." The vote was by parishes and missions, and the resolution was adopted.

The Rev. Mr. Kroll presented memorial resolutions in reference to Mrs. Caroline Clark and Mrs. Mary Karratti, who were both devoted workers for St. Mark's Mission and made an appeal for a memorial altar for St. Mark's, Kapahulu.

Then followed the addresses as announced by the Rev. J. J. Cowan, the Rev. Paul Tajima, Mrs. F. N. Cockeroff, Miss Annie S. Dran.

At this period Mrs. Theodore Richards, president of the Woman's Board

of Central Union Church, was conducted to the platform, where she offered the kindly greetings of the body which she represented.

Mrs. Kroll told of work among Hawaiian women and girls, the Rev. D. D. Wallace of the new chapel at Kona, Mr. Seno of the Paauilo Japanese Mission, and Mr. Kong Mau Tet of the new St. Stephen's Mission among the Punti Chinese.

The need of automobiles for missionaries was discussed and a resolution passed for a permanent automobile fund.

On motion of Mrs. Restarick, a resolution was carried that on the day of the Triennial Offering at St. Louis, October 12th, 1916, every branch have a corporate communion.

The offering of the afternoon, \$25.40, was voted to the District Expense Fund. The Bishop, as authorized by motion, appointed the following delegates to the Triennial Convention: Mrs. H. B. Restarick, Mrs. John E. Baird, Mrs. L. T. Peck and Mrs. John Guild.

The Bishop announced that instead of reading the report of the Guilds, the summary would appear in the June number of the Chronicle.

Pledges made by the various branches in response to the appeals of the afternoon amounted to \$425.50.

In accordance with the resolution offered by Mrs. Baird, she and Mrs. Lawrence Judd were appointed a committee to collect funds to complete St. Elizabeth's playground.

Mrs. H. McK. Harrison spoke of a plan to continue the one day's income by special birthday gifts, to which many pledged themselves.

The Bishop announced that Miss Van Deerlin, on account of her mother's failing health, would probably be some time absent from the Territory, after which adjournment was made, those present being asked to assemble for a picture and then to return to the Hall for tea.

DIRECTIONS FOR PARISH SECRETARIES.

1. Apply to the Corresponding Secretary when your branch is ready to work for a box. She will send you a list of needs of Missions and Missionaries to choose from.
2. When your branch has undertaken the work for which your selected letter calls, notify the Secretary at once, sending her the name and address in such letter, and your own address and parish.
3. Write to the Missionary at once, stating when and from whom he may expect a box.
4. Write to the Missionary as soon as the box has been despatched, also to the District Corresponding Secretary with statement concerning value of box.
5. Blanks will be sent for a report of the year's work. Read them carefully and fill them out fully. Return to the Corresponding Secretary at once. All boxes of books, single books or magazines should be reported through the Church Periodical Club Secretary.
6. Always notify the Corresponding Secretary of the names and addresses of new officers elected, or changes, if any have occurred during the year.

Foreign Missions are those beyond the jurisdiction of the Government of the United States.

Domestic are those within that jurisdiction, which includes Porto Rico, Honolulu, Philippines, Alaska.

Diocesan are those within our own Diocese or District.

**HONOLULU BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE
BOARD OF MISSIONS.**

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

This society shall be called, THE HONOLULU BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

ARTICLE II.

The object of the society is: By systematic and united effort to diffuse Missionary intelligence, to increase Missionary activity, to promote the study of Missions, and to encourage prayer for Missions among the women of the Missionary District.

ARTICLE III.

The Church itself is the great Missionary Society, therefore all Baptized women in this District who desire it, and who work for Missions in connection with their parochial organizations, shall be regarded as members of this Woman's Auxiliary, but terms of membership in any Parish Branch may be fixed by that Branch.

ARTICLE IV.

All Parish societies of women that so desire, may become branches of this Auxiliary, first obtaining the consent of the Rector or Clergyman in charge, and notifying the President of their intention to work in unison with the Auxiliary.

ARTICLE V.

The officers shall be: A President, a First Vice-President and a Second Vice-President, who shall act as Secretary of the Junior Department. Other vice-presidents may be appointed for such divisions of the Missionary District as the Bishop may counsel. There shall be a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, a Treasurer, a Secretary of the Babies' Branch, a Directress of the Altar Department, an Educational Secretary, a Secretary of the Church Periodical Club, and a Secretary of the United Offering. All of these officers shall be appointed by the Bishop at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VI.

The officers of the District Branch shall constitute a Board of Managers, who shall have general charge of the work under the direction of the Bishop.

ARTICLE VII.

The annual meeting shall be held at the time of the Convocation of the Missionary District, and quarterly meetings on such dates and in such places as the President may appoint.

ARTICLE VIII.

The representatives of five parishes shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE IX.

This constitution may be amended at any annual meeting, by a vote of two-thirds of the parishes or missions represented.

BY-LAWS.

I.

The duty of the President shall be to call meetings of the Woman's Auxiliary and Board of Managers, and to preside over the same. It shall be her duty to see that all new officers are informed of their specific duties.

II.

The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of meetings, to keep a record of proceedings, to prepare an abstract of the minutes for the annual report and if so ordered to issue and distribute, with the assistance of the Corresponding Secretary, the annual report.

III.

It shall be the duty of the Corresponding Secretary, under the direction of the President, to correspond with the General Secretary of the Auxiliary and with the various branches of the District, to furnish them with work, to collect their report, to prepare an annual report and to assist the Recording Secretary to issue and distribute the same.

IV.

The Treasurer shall have the custody of all money received by the District Branch and shall collect, if necessary, all sums payable to the same, in pledges made. She shall pay out money on the order of the President, and Secretary, except such sums as may be received for a definite purpose, which sums she may dispose of without formal direction. All moneys received for purposes outside of the district, shall be forwarded to treasurers empowered to receive the same.

V.

The Secretary of the Junior Department, Babies' Branch, Directress of the Altar Department, Educational Secretary, Secretary of the Church Periodical Club, Secretary of the United Offering, shall superintend, foster, and develop by correspondence and otherwise, their several departments on consultation with Diocesan officers.

VI.

It shall be the duty of the President, or of some person appointed by her, to visit, if possible, the Parochial Branches in order to promote the interest of the work.

VII.

It shall be the duty of any parish branch before it discontinues a pledge, which has been made for salary or interest, and which continues year by year, to give a year's notice of its purpose at the annual meeting.

VIII.

Each Parish Branch shall pay yearly to the District Expense Fund the sum of \$1.00, and Junior branches 50 cents. This will entitle them to seat their delegates and to vote.

IX.

Each Parish Branch shall pay yearly to the Diocesan Altar Fund at least one dollar from the Woman's Auxiliary and fifty cents from the Junior Auxiliary.

X.

Each parochial branch is entitled to five delegates. If it is impracticable to get women as delegates who live in the parish or mission, it is permissible to elect delegates who are resident in Honolulu.

XI.

The Secretary and Treasurer of each parish branch are to make yearly reports to the Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer of the District Branch, of all work done and money given to Missions inside and outside of the Diocese, and of the value of boxes sent.

XII.

The year of the Woman's Auxiliary shall end on April 30th of each year, the date on which the Parish and Convocational Year end, and all Auxiliary reports shall be made up to that date.

XIII.

These By-Laws may be altered or amended by a majority vote at each annual meeting.

Hear, we beseech Thee, the prayers of Thy Church, for those who, at Thy command, go forth to preach the Gospel to every creature.
