SPECIAL NOTES

St. Matthew's Day, September 21, the anniversary of the Bishop's consecration, is commended to all auxiliaries as a day of special consecration.

Each branch of the Auxiliary is urged to make a monthly corporate communion.

The Diocesan Board meets at 10 o'clock on the first Thursday morning of each month—October to June, inclusive—at Christ Church parish house, Indianapolis. All parochial presidents and ex-officio members of the board have the privilege of attending, but do not vote.

The annual meeting is held in January at the time of the Diocesan Council.

Presidents of parish branches are requested to present this Annual Report at an early meeting.

REPORT OF RECORDING SECRETARY.

The Woman's Auxiliary Board of the Diocese of Indianaolis has held ten regular and one called meeting since the Annual Meeting, January 25, 1921. At the February meeting Mrs. J. F. T. Sargent was elected Box Secretary. The Committee on Year Book was appointed as Mrs. Trowbridge, Mrs. Francis, Mrs. Perkins. The Lenten class was conducted by Dr. George H. Richardson, Rector of The Church of the Advent.

The Bishop of the Diocese suggested as the objects for pledges—St. Margarets Hostel, Bloomington, and St. Mathews Church, Irvington. Each branch to make its own choice. The Epiphany Offering was sent to St. Mary's, Shanghai. The Conference in Richmond was held June 14, 15, 16 with good attendance, many speakers and much profit. The year books were issued early in April, several copies being sent to each parish. Mrs. Sargent having resigned, Mrs. Judson was elected in September as Box Secretary. The Corresponding Secretary secured from Church Missions Home and sent to all branches literature concerning the Emery Memorial Fund, (to establish a home for retired missionaries), and asked that an anniversary service celebrating the semi-centennial of the Woman's Auxiliary be held on October 16, and that the offering be given to this fund. The annual Michaelmas Luncheon was given at Knickerbacker Hall with sixty-four present. Two delegates represented the Diocesan Branch at the meeting of the Provincial Synod in Milwaukee, October 5 and 6. On December 2 and 3 a day of Intercessan and Prayer was conducted by Bishop Francis in the Cathedral Church. A sewing machine was purchased and presented to Knickerbacker Hall. Our president and one member represented our Auxiliary at the semi-annual meeting of the Missionary Union of the City in November.

REPORT OF CORRESPONDING SECRETARY.

At the annual meeting of the Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, in January, 1921, a new office was created and a Box Secretary added to the Board. Since then the duties of corresponding secretary have been confined to the writing of various letters, sending notices, and distributing literature from the Church Mission Home. This last year has brought the usual account of correspondence including letters to City Rectors asking them to announce Lenten Bible Class and getting a larger distribution for the church paper "The Church at Work," etc., also sending the leaflet, "An Earnest Appeal," concerning St. Margarets Hall and St. Mathews, Irvington. It was also urged that each parish branch buy a copy of Miss Emery's book, "A Century of Endeavor."
