REPORT
OF THE
THIRD ANNUAL MEETING,
MAY, 13, 1890.

The Third Annual meeting of the Iowa Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in St. John's Church, Dubuque, May 13, 1890.

A large number of the city ladies were present, but besides the Honorary President, Mrs. Perry, of Davenport, only three delegates from other Branches were in attendance. These were Mrs. Cook, of Clinton; Mrs. Hunt of Iowa City; and Mrs. Rock, of Cedar Rapids.

At a quarter past four the Vice-President called the meeting to order, and the Bishop of Milwaukee opened with prayer. He then gave a most interesting address on the usefulness and importance of Missions, and he also spoke most earnestly to the ladies on the very inadequate compensation received by most clergymen as compared with other professional men, but especially missionaries, who, after years of study and a large expenditure of money, are called to the greatest amount of sacrifice and even hardship, with scarcely the means of subsistence.

Bishop Leonard, of Utah and Nevada, followed, giving us much information about his work, which covers a field so vast that Iowa could be set in one corner. His earnestness and enthusiasm made a deep impression upon his hearers, and he closed his remarks by stating a case of pressing need for money to build a house for one of his faithful missionary teachers.

After this followed the business of the day, which consisted in the reading of reports, and the election of a new President and Secretary-Treasurer, those officers declining a re-election. Mrs. Rock, of Cedar Rapids, was chosen President; Mrs. Cook, of Clinton, was re-elected Vice-President, and Miss M. H. Garrett, of Burlington, Secretary-Treasurer.

After a few words by the President on the importance of systematic giving, and the Scripture rule of devoting one-tenth part of our income to the service of God, the meeting adjourned.

On the following morning a few ladies who had gathered at the Church made an impromptu collection for Missions in Utah, which was presented to Bishop Leonard. Amount, \$26.60.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

This association shall be called the Iowa Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

The objects of this association shall be the same as those of the General Auxiliary.

ARTICLE III.

All parochial missionary societies of women, and all baptized women of the Diocese desiring it, who contribute prayers or gifts to missions, shall be considered members of this association.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers shall be Honorary President, President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer.

ARTICLE V.

These officers shall be elected by the women in their annual meeting, during Convention of each year, and serve until their successors shall be elected.

ARTICLE VI.

The duty of the President shall be to call meetings and to preside over them.

ARTICLE VIII.

The duties of the Secretary-Treasurer shall be to give notice of meetings and keep record of them; to correspond with parish secretaries and with the Secretary of the Auxiliary; to obtain yearly reports from the Parochial Branches and incorporate them into an annual report for the Diocesan Branch. As Treasurer, she shall receive and disburse the mon-

seys of the Diocesan Branch ; obtain reports yearly from the Parish treasurers, and make up from them an annual report.

ARTICLE IX.

The officers, as a committee, shall use such efforts as lie in their power to increase missionary knowledge and zeal among the women of the Diocese, and encourage the formation of Parochial Branches.

ARTICLE X.

An annual meeting shall be held each year, at the time and place of the Diocesan Convention. Special meetings may be held during the year, upon the united call of three Parochial Branches, for the purpose of increasing interest.

ARTICLE XI.

This Constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting, by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

ARTICLE XII.

Two delegates or two alternates shall be sent from the Parochial Branches to attend each annual meeting.

BY-LAWS.

The officers shall hold an executive meeting before each general meeting, and at one other time during the year, at the call of the President.

The regular order of business for the annual meetings shall be as follows:

1. Prayers.
2. Roll-call.
3. Minutes of Meetings.
4. Report of the Secretary-Treasurer.
5. Election of Officers.
6. Miscellaneous Business and Addresses.

By-laws may be amended at any meeting by vote of a majority of those present.
