ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE RECORDING SECRETARY OF THE DIOCESE OF
KANSAS CITY BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S
AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD
OF MISSIONS.

To the Rt. Rev. Sidney C. Partridge, Bishop of the Diocese of Kansas City, and Women of the Auxiliary:

I herewith present my annual report of the work done by the officers and parish branches of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Kansas City, during the year of 1912-1913.

The three regular meetings have been held, with an increased attendance. The meeting in January was held in connection with the Institute, which was under the leadership of Miss Julia C. Emery and Miss Grace Lindley, who came to us from the Church Mission House of New York City. Delegates of earnest women came from various parts of the Seventh District to attend these splendid classes, and we of the Diocese of Kansas City feel more than repaid for our efforts in holding an Institute.

During the year our Bishop has organized a diocesan society of women who will in the future handle all money or pledges made to the Diocesan Missions.

We have created five new scholarships during the year, namely: The Everett Woodstock scholarship, the Mary Bowen scholarship, both gifts of our president, one in memory of her beloved husband and the other in memory of her mother; the Mary Whiting Atwill memorial, the W. B. Clarke scholarship and the Louise W. Musson scholarship.

The resignation of Miss Mary Bryan as the president of our Juniors was accepted with sincere regret. The newly appointed president, Mrs. Luther E. Reid of St. Joseph, comes to us with highest praises for her interest and knoweldge of Junior work.

The apparent increase in the year's work of the Woman's Auxiliary must have come to us through our earnest prayers and inspiration that was given to us during our three days' instruction of the Institute. May our prayers continue, may our Heavenly Father guide us to an earnest and helpful year that is to come.

I have corresponded with the Junior Branches regarding the year's study, the "Easter Gift," the "Union Box," a "Membership Campaign," the "United Offering," the "Circulating Library," etc., and with various parishes regarding the further organization of the work.

There are three new Junior Branches this year, in Kansas City, St. John's "Preparatory Study Class to the Wonan's Auxiliary," and St. George's Section Two, and in St. Joseph, Holy Trinity Juniors have been re-organized. We have two branches of older Juniors in Kansas City, at St. George's and at St. John's, and there was a study class for older girls at St. Paul's during Lent. There are two branches of the "Brotherhood of St. Paul" in the Diocese, at St. Paul's, Kansas City, and at Christ Church, St. Joseph.

The new feature of our year's work is the beginning of a "Circulating Library" for the use of clergy in isolated places, who have not the advantages of public or other libraries.

Study in the Junior Branches has been further developed than in any preceding year, with the inspiration and instruction gained from the Mission Study Institute, in January. Practically all of the branches have had some study of Japan.

The aims for the work this year have been :

First, our slogan, to General Missions our first and largest gift.

Second, to be more and more dutiful about our intercessions.

Third, to make this year "Japan Year."

Fourth, for each branch to take the "Spirit of Missions."

And on the organization side of the work our ideal is, every child in every parish a member of the Junior Auxiliary, or of the "Brotherhood of St. Paul," and in every parish a branch of the older girls who will be "graduated" into the Woman's Auxiliary.

CONSTITUTION
OF THE KANSAS CITY DIOCESAN BRANCH OF THE
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD
OF MISSIONS.

ARTICLE I.

The name of this Association is The Kansas City Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

Its object is to increase by united effort and sympathetic action, the interest of all the Parishes and Missions of this Diocese in the Missionary work of the Church.

ARTICLE III.

All baptized women of this Diocese are regarded as members of this Association.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this Association shall be, the Bishop, ex-officio, a President, three Vice-Presidents (one of whom shall be elected from a parish outside of the See City) a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer, all of whom, except the Bishop, shall be elected at the Annual Meeting next after the General Triennial Meeting, and shall serve three years; but the President shall not be eligible for two full consecutive terms.

The President, when elected, shall appoint and define the duties of an Educational and Organizing Secretary, a mite box Treasurer, a United Offering Treasurer, a Little Helpers' Treasurer and such committees as she may deem expedient, each to serve one year; and any vacancy occurring in these appointments shall be filled by the President for the unexpired term.

Any vacancy occurring in any of the elective offices shall be filled by appointment by the Board of Managers until the next regular meeting, at which time the vacancy shall be filled by election for the unexpired term.

The duties of the officers shall be those usually appertaining to their respective offices and such additional duties as may from time to time be prescribed by the By-Laws.

ARTICLE V.

There shall be a Board of Managers consisting of the Diocesan officers and the Presidents of the Parish Branches. This Board shall meet one month before each meeting of the Auxiliary, and at other times upon the call of the President.

It shall be entrusted with the management of the affairs of this Diocesan Branch of the Auxiliary and shall have power to transact all business that may come before it.

ARTICLE VI.

There shall be three regular meetings in each year, viz: On the fourth Thursdays of October and January, and the Annual Diocesan Council. Special meetings may be called by the President at any time.

ARTICLE VII.

Each Branch shall be entitled to representation at all meetings by its officers and four delegates chosen by itself.

Each Branch shall pay in advance such membership fees as may from time to time be fixed by the By-Laws.

ARTICLE VIII.

This Constitution may, with the approval of the Bishop, be amended at any regular meeting of the Auxiliary, by a two-thirds vote of the delegates present.

BY-LAWS

1.

The order of business at all regular meetings shall be as follows:

1. Divine Services.
2. Roll Call.
3. Reading of Minutes.
4. President's Address.
5. Report of Secretary.
6. Report of Treasurer.
7. Report of Corresponding Secretary.
8. Report of Educational and Organizing Secretary.
9. Report of Branches.
10. Reports of Committees.
11. Unfinished Business.
12. New Business.
13. Elections.

2.

The Recording Secretary, in addition to the regular duties of the office, shall prepare an Annual Report for circulation in the Diocese.

3.

The Corresponding Secretary, in addition to the regular duties of the office, shall make annually a full report of the work of the Diocesan Branches to the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary in New York.

4.

Parish and Mission elections of delegates shall take place during the month preceding the Annual Meeting and be immediately reported by the Local Secretary to the Diocesan Secretary.

5.

A current expense fund of one hundred dollars shall be provided annually for printing, postage, stationery and expense of speakers; and the amount shall be apportioned among the various Parish and Mission Branches by a committee of three appointed by the President.

6.

All elections shall be by ballot.

Any delegate may nominate.

Unless there is an election by a clear majority on the first ballot, the chair shall declare the two names having the largest number of votes, and subsequent ballots shall be upon these two names until a majority vote is reached.

7.

Each Branch shall pay an Annual Membership fee of fifty cents for each delegate and officer and no delegate or official shall be entitled to vote unless all the dues and assessments of her Branch shall have been paid in full.

8.

No part of the current expenses of the Association shall be paid from the funds contributed for Missionary purposes.

9.

Nine members of the Board of Managers shall constitute a quorum.

10.

These By-Laws may be altered or amended or suspended at any meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

BY-LAWS OF THE JUNIOR DEPARTMENT

of the

WOMAN'S AUXILIARY OF THE DIOCESE OF KANSAS CITY.

ARTICLE I.—Officers.

The officers of the Junior Department shall be a President, who shall be "the Vice-President of the Woman's Auxiliary, in charge of the Junior Department;" an Educational Secretary appointed by the President, with the approval of the President of the Woman's Auxiliary; and a Secretary and Treasurer elected in the Junior Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE II.—Duties of the Officers.

Sec. 1. The President shall have general supervision over the work of the Junior Department and endeavor to further it. She shall preside at the Junior meetings and shall report the work of the Junior Department at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Sec. 2. The Educational Secretary shall plan for a course of study, and collect and circulate all necessary information pertaining to Mission Study in the Junior Department, and shall make a report at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Sec. 3. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Junior Meetings and shall receive and record the Junior offerings and forward them to the Treasurer. She shall also prepare the Junior Annual Report of the Auxiliary.

Sec. 4. The Treasurer shall receive the Junior offerings from the Secretary and disburse them as they are designated, and shall report

the same at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary and the Junior Annual Meeting.

Sec. 5. The President of the Woman's Auxiliary and the Junior Officers shall constitute a Board, which shall have power to transact all urgent business that may come before it during the time between the Junior Meetings.

ARTICLE III.—Meetings.

Sec. 1. There shall be two meetings of the Junior Department a year. If practicable, on the Saturday following the October meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary and on the Saturday following the May meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary. Of these two meetings, the one nearest the Annual Diocesan Council shall be called the Annual Meeting.

Sec. 2. The representation at these meetings shall be the officers and four delegates from each Junior Branch, the delegates being chosen by the Branch. Officers and delegates shall pay yearly dues of twenty-five cents each.

Sec. 3. The Treasurer of each Branch shall send all moneys of the Branch to the Secretary five days before the Annual Meeting.

Sec. 4. Special meetings may be called by the President at any time.

ARTICLE IV.—Current Expense.

There shall be a Current Expense Fund raised by an assessment on each member of each Branch of ten cents a year, and the delegate's dues of twenty-five cents each.

ARTICLE V.—Credentials.

Delegates to the Junior Meetings shall be accredited upon the payment of Delegates' Dues and the Current Expense Per Capita Tax of their respective Branches.

ARTICLE VI.—Mode of Election.

There shall be a Nominating Committee of three appointed by the President. Elections shall be by ballot. A majority vote elects. Unless there shall be a clear majority vote on the first ballot the chair shall declare the two names having the largest number of votes and subsequent ballots shall be upon these two names, until a majority vote is reached. Any vacancy occurring in the elective offices shall be filled for the unexpired term, by appointment by the President.

ARTICLE VII.—Amendments.

The By-Laws may be repealed or amended at either Junior Meeting by a two-thirds vote of the delegates present, notice of such proposed change being given at the previous Junior Meeting and the Woman's Auxiliary concurring.
