REPORT OF WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

The twenty-fourth annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held at St. Paul's, Louisville, Thursday, May 21, 1908. It was opened at 10 o'clock with a sermon by the Bishop of the Diocese and Corporate Communion, when 120 received. Immediately after the service the business session began in the Sunday-school room, Mrs. T. U. Dudley, President, in the chair.

Minutes of the last annual meeting were heard and approved.

The Treasurer's report was then heard and ordered filed, with no questions or corrections.

The President again urged upon the Auxiliary the importance of making the apportionment the first work of the year.

Mrs. Stanley Adams was then called upon to make her report as Corresponding Secretary, which report showed splendid work in sending material help to those in the mission field. Mrs. Brown moved that this report be accepted. The motion was seconded, voted on and carried.

Mrs. Brown, Diocesan Secretary of the Juniors, gave her report, showing great progress in the work among Juniors. Mrs. Woodcock moved it be accepted. Mrs. Adams seconded it. Voted on and carried.

Mrs. Glazebrook, Custodian of the United Offering, reported, since October, 1907, \$257.34, which amount is in bank drawing interest.

The report from the Church Periodical Club, Mrs. J. P. Love, Diocesan Correspondent, was most encouraging.

The Extension Committee, Mrs. Woodcock, Chairman, reported four new branches—the Church of Our Merciful Saviour, St. Paul's, Hickman; Christ Church, Elizabethtown, and the Intermediate Branch of the Church of the Advent.

The President then called for reports from the branches, in the following order: Advent, Advent Intermediates, Calvary, Calvary Intermediates, Epiphany, Grace, Cathedral, Cathedral Intermediates, Our Merciful Saviour, St. Andrew's, St. Mark's, Crescent Hill; St. John's, St. Luke's, Anchorage; St. Paul's, St. Peter's, St. Stephen's, Christ Church, Elizabethtown; St. Paul's, Henderson; St. Paul's, Hickman; Grace Church, Hopkinsville; Grace Church, Paducah; Christ Church, Bowling Green.

Mrs. Dudley asked the wish of the meeting if Miss Emery's letter be read now or during the afternoon session. Mrs. Musson moved that it be read in the afternoon. This was seconded, voted on and carried. Mrs. Adams read a note from Miss Emery expressing great appreciation of the Alaska work.

Mrs. Adams reported that the Auxiliary at Henderson had sent her a sweater for Mrs. Rowe, and that it had been sent to her by mail.

The President announced that the election of officers was in order, and asked Bishop Woodcock to take charge of the election.

The Bishop spoke a few words of encouragement and congratulation upon the year's work, and expressed the hope that this year would be a banner year in honor of its being the twenty-fifth anniversary.

The following officers were elected: President, Mrs. T. U. Dudley; Vice-President, Mrs. C. E. Woodcock; Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Stanley Adams; Recording Secretary, Miss Nannie Hite Winston; Treasurer, Miss F. C. Anderson; Custodian of United Offering, Mrs. James Glazebrook; Diocesan Correspondent of Church Periodical Club, Mrs. J. P. Love; Diocesan Secretary of Juniors, Mrs. Leslie Brown; Diocesan Secretary of Babies' Branch, Miss Mary Semple.

The Bishop congratulated the Auxiliary upon their officers, and said that he had counted the offering taken at the morning service, \$20.85.

Mrs. Dudley again took the chair and thanked the Auxiliary for her re-election. She asked if any members present remembered the first Auxiliary meeting, in old St. Paul's, when there were but four branches—St. Paul's, Calvary, Christ Church and St. Andrew's. She spoke of the growth of the work and said that the time has come when the Auxiliary should have a constitution to govern its work, as in many other Dioceses.

Mrs. Woodcock moved that the President appoint a committee to look into the question.

Mrs. Musson asked if it be possible to draw up a constitution to be given a trial of a year?

Mrs. Brown seconded Mrs. Woodcock's motion, which was voted upon and which seemed to be unanimously carried.

Mrs. Walker, President of the St. Paul's Branch, asked that the names of the Branch Secretaries be sent her, so she could notify each branch of the part it should pay toward the lunch.

Mrs. Dudley then said that, in looking through journals of other Dioceses, she saw in some that they had a fund called "The Bishop's Cent." She expressed the wish that this Auxiliary would start such a fund, which should be given to the Bishop to do with as he pleases.

There being no further business and the hour for the lunch having arrived, the meeting adjourned.

After a most delightful lunch, served by the St. Paul's Auxiliary, the meeting was called together again in the Sunday-school room. In the absence of the new Recording Secretary, the minutes were kept by Mrs. Goodloe.

The first report called for was that of the Secretary of the Babies' Branch. Miss Semple, Diocesan Secretary, being out of town, the Recording Secretary read it.

The Recording Secretary then announced an increase of \$391.37 over last year's work, \$3,333.16 being the total for last year, \$3,724.53 for this year.

Mrs. Dudley read a note of welcome from Miss Emery, sent with her annual letter.

The Corresponding Secretary then read the annual letter.

Another letter from Miss Emery was read by the President, thanking her for the photographs of the contents of the Alaska box, which should be put into the Spirit of Missions, with an account of the box. She spoke of her trip to Europe, which the New York Auxiliary had given her, and Mrs. Dudley said that at the last Board meeting it had been decided that we send her a letter upon sailing, wishing her God-speed, and a small silver traveling cup with inscription, from the Auxiliary. This met with favor from the members, and a box was placed upon the table, into which any one so desiring might put a contribution.

Mrs. Dudley announced the names of the Committee on Constitution: Mrs. Woodcock, Chairman; Miss Lizzie Robinson, Mrs. H. S. Musson, Mrs. Maxwell.

Miss Lizzie Robinson then gave a most delightful address upon the growth of the Auxiliary and upon our great privilege to help in the work. Upon the close of her address, Mrs. Dudley introduced the Rev. Robert Patton, Missionary of Departments 4 and 7, who gave a short, but very forceful, talk on the importance of the extension of knowledge of mission work.

Mrs. Meade Robinson then made a motion that a note be sent Mrs. Mockridge, expressing our regret that she could not be with us, and the hope that the little boy would soon be well. The Secretary was instructed to send such a note.

Mrs. Slaughter moved that a vote of thanks be given to the Auxiliary of St. Paul's for their hospitality. This motion was seconded by Mrs. Woodcock, voted on and carried.

The President said that at the last Board meeting it had been the opinion of the Board that the offerings taken

at this annual meeting should go as a special to Bishop Kinsolving, to do with as he wished, but that since that meeting she had seen in the Spirit of Missions that there was lacking over \$700,000 on the appropriations for the year, so she asked the pleasure of the meeting as to what should be done with the offerings for the day, amounting to \$80. Mrs. Love moved that this amount be sent to the Church Missions House to help meet this large deficit. Mrs. Musson seconded this motion. Voted on and carried.

The offering was then taken.

The Bishop closed the meeting with prayer and benediction.

REPORT OF CORRESPONDING SECRETARY.

Four new branches have been organized during the past year, making twenty-one branches in the Diocese.

Twenty boxes have been sent, valued at \$1,061.36, besides which a font for Trinity Mission, at Longview, Tex., was given by the Cathedral, and valued at \$74.25. Grace Church, Paducah, sent a hundred dollar typewriter to

Japan and replaced the communion service, a memorial to Bishop Dudley, at a cost of \$48.25. This service was destroyed at the church fire at Fairbanks, Alaska.

Intense interest was manifested in the Alaska box, the contributions surpassing the expectations of the most sanguine. Every branch contributed except two, they having made pledges before they knew of the united work. Five boxes and three barrels were sent to Deaconess Carter, and the value was \$1,000. We have been especially fortunate in sending these things free of charge.

We have much to be thankful for in the past, and hope that the year to come will prove what united work and united prayers can do. Respectfully,

These reports are followed by informal discussions.

Each branch seems to have made an earnest effort toward furnishing our Juniors with special missionary instruction, and as a culmination for our work along these lines a united service was held at the Cathedral on the afternoon of April 2d. The service was well attended, and the three addresses were intensely interesting and most helpful.
