Report of Recording Secretary

The Recording Secretary presents her report for 1923 as follows: We have held eight regular meetings, with an average attendance of about 136 members; eight executive, with an average of 16 present; one out-of-town meeting, held at St. George's, Flushing, when the church was filled with women and clergy from all parts of Long Island; our Anniversary, held at St. Bartholomew's, Brooklyn, with about 700 present, and the Suffolk County meeting, held at St. James' Church, St. James.

Our delegates numbered 443, which represented 274 from 42 Brooklyn parishes, 131 from 34 parishes in Queens and Nassau, and 38 from 16 parishes in Suffolk County.

Our speakers have been: Deaconess Newell, of the Hooker School, Mexico; Miss Cochran, of the Church of the Good Shepherd, Brooklyn, and Mrs. Talmage, of Oyster Bay, both of whom spoke on China, having just returned from a visit there; Mrs. Lewis, Secretary of the Summer Schools; Mrs. Biller, of New York, on our Indian work; Archdeacon Neve, of the Blue Grass District, Virginia; Miss Anne Brown, of the Church General Hospital, Wuchang, China; Bishop Colmore, of Porto Rico; Mr. H. Greenberg, who is in charge of our mission to the Jews in Brooklyn, and Mrs. Moort, of Liberia.

At our out-of-town meeting, the Rev. F. W. Creighton, rector of St. Ann's, Brooklyn, preached, and the missionary speakers were Bishop Hulse, of Cuba; Miss F. S. Sullivan, Chairman of the China Committee in New York; Mr. Robison, of Liberia, and Archdeacon Bambach, of Brooklyn, whose topic was our mission to the Jews.

At the Anniversary, the Rt. Rev. Arthur Selden Lloyd, D.D., Suffragan Bishop of New York, preached, and the speakers were: Dr. Reifsnider, President of St. Paul's College, Tokyo, who made the sorrows of Japan very real to us, having been an eye-witness of part of the awful catastrophe; and Dr. John W. Wood, of New York, who showed what our part might be in alleviating the suffering caused by it.

Seventeen speakers in all, who have shown us our opportunities and our privileges as stewards, to whom much has been entrusted, and from whom much will be required.

The splendid work done by the United Thank Offering, by the Church Periodical Club, by the Altar Society, in the

Box work, along educational lines, and by the various committees with their pledges, needs no comment here. It is all recorded in its proper place, and in every case we see with a deep sense of thankfulness, advancement.

The quota of \$2,000 set for us by the Diocesan Council was oversubscribed, nearly \$195 being sent for general missions through Mr. Barnes, for which Long Island gets credit. This we think is largely due to our following the wise request made by our Finance Committee, in every case to leave part of our money undesignated. By doing this we found at the end of the year every pledge, favorite or not, filled, and this sum left over. They also advised us to make the pledges our first thought, showing us how they count on our parish quota. Dearly as we love "specials" we took this advice, and have learned the wisdom of it, and have even had the joy of a few "specials" beside.

For the Daily Vacation Bible Schools, which now come under the head of Diocesan Work, we were able to start another school, that of St. Philip's, Dean street, for which the Rev. Dr. Boyd gave his services, we raising the money from the floor for its maintenance.

The Good Friday Offering was the largest we have ever had.

The Provincial work among students in the colleges is being cared for by our Assistant Treasurer, Miss Roberts, and resulted in paying the traveling expenses from Porto Rico of a young girl who had won a scholarship at Columbia, and who could not have accepted it otherwise, and in sending another young girl from Barnard, to go as counselor to the summer school at Princeton, hoping that from this she will carry back to the girls in her college the news of what our church summer schools are.

We learn that the plan for "prayer partnership" is being adopted by several of our parishes.

If it were not that they seem to have made a step forward, we would regret losing our Juniors, "our children," as we have always affectionately considered them, but, as members of the Church School Service League, they will be able to do a larger work, and our best and most loving wishes go with them.

The Bishop Rowe Foundation Fund, and the Bishop

Thomas Insurance Fund have been well and faithfully finished.

Our contribution to Japan went beyond all our expectations, in money, as well as articles sent through the Supply Bureau. After all our pledges were filled, Bishop Bratton's request for \$100 to help save his school from being closed was presented to us, and the amount raised from the floor in a few minutes. This has been sent as a memorial to our late member, Mrs. George F. Miller, wife of the rector of St. Augustine's Church, Brooklyn, always faithful and generous to us, who died in the fall.

We have lost seven members by death. Our most sincere sympathy goes out to those from whom they have been taken.

Sixty students from Long Island attended the summer school at Princeton, and it is good to hear of two missionaries gone from us, as nurses, to China, Miss Louise Cummings and Miss Bennett.

Our new work will be the raising of the money promised toward the two new missionary houses, which had to be put aside for Japan, and the raising through our pledges of the \$5,000 asked by the Diocesan Council, all of which will count on our parish quota, as it did last year.

This seems almost a report of money received and money spent, but God, and we ourselves, know that it means much more, for there is a vast amount of love, unselfishness and self-sacrifice goes with it.

Bishop Lloyd reminded us that we are writing a new chapter in the Book of the Acts. May it be a worthy one, with the thought humbly and gratefully kept in mind that "All things come of Thee, O, Lord, and of Thine own have we given Thee."

Report of the Educational Secretary

The Educational Secretary presents the following report of the work done in 1923:

Miss Laura Boyer, one of the educational secretaries at the Church Mission House, conducted a class for leaders at the Diocesan House on the text-book for the year, "Wanted—Leaders; A Study in Negro Development," by Bishop Bratton, and we had eight Parish Classes during Lent. The subject was full of interest and aroused much discussion; it forced upon us some very radical changes of opinion when we arrived at the conclusion that: "The Negro race shares with the other races of the world the task of building the Kingdom of God."

Miss Childs' class had a program of varied interest, hearing from different speakers about the work of the Auxiliary, about adult education in the Church, about the work of the Supply Department, about the General Convention of 1922 from two Long Island delegates, and about the development of the Negro in this country.

Eighty-six text-books were sold by the Educational Secretary.

Report of the Church Periodical Club

The Long Island Branch of the Church Periodical Club presents its thirty-fifth Annual Report as follows:

3,156 current magazines sent regularly, 160 Bibles and Testaments, 800 Prayer Books and Hymnals, 5,000 books, 2,500 tracts and Catechisms, 43,256 Christmas and Easter cards, 16,777 pictures and calendars, 1,220 carols and music, 500 games, puzzles and scrapbooks, and 56,649 odd numbers of magazines and periodicals.

Last year we recorded with joy the completion of the \$15,000 Library for St. Paul's University in Tokyo, Japan. To-day it is almost with awe that we tell the story of the seemingly miraculous preservation of that Library, in spite of the destruction of the building in which it was housed. St. Paul's University was destroyed by earthquake, but God preserved it from fire. Every book is in perfect condition, and those Memorial Book Plates that we so lovingly inscribed are still bearing testimony to our loyalty and devotion.

St. Luke's Hospital was not so fortunate; every volume was lost. Shall we not in gratitude and sympathy make an earnest effort to supply their loss with one at least adequate to their immediate necessity? Through the generosity of the medical staff of St. John's Hospital, C. C. F., \$70.00 has been given to St. Luke's International Hospital for the purchase of new medical books; also from St. Paul's Church, Flatbush, a fine gift of medical books and surgical instruments, value \$50.00. Other physicians in the diocese have contributed from their private libraries, all through the C. P. C.

The upbuilding of Boone School Library, Wuchang, China, was the special work assumed by the C. P. C. for the three years of this Triennial, and the allotment to Long Island as having the greatest number of branches (116) is \$300.00 a year for three years. Toward this assignment, according to notice given in the

early days of the year, all money contributed by the parishes has been applied, and book plates inscribed with the names of the parishes have been inserted in all books procured through this fund. St. John's, Cold Spring Harbor, did notable work, contributing \$67.00.

Our Provincial assignment was for the New World School, El Cotode Manati, Porto Rico. This we filled by a gift of 36 new books, value \$49.12.

A strong appeal has come for libraries in the Mountain Missions of the South. A visit by your President this summer to a number of these missions emphasized this need and libraries of about 200 volumes each have been sent to Valle Crucis Mountain Mission; St. Mary's in the Mountain, Sewanee, Tenn.; St. Andrew's Church School for Boys, St. Andrew's, Tenn.; also several Community Libraries; and the voluntary testimony of natives is that in all the country there is no such work being done for the Church and America as the education of these mountain boys and girls. This is an inspiring record of work accomplished. May it encourage us to attempt greater things in the year to come.
