Report of Recording Secretary

In the year 1926 we celebrated our 54th birthday, and it becomes again the pleasant duty of the Recording Secretary to present her report.

We always have 8 regular meetings, and this year our attendance shows an average of 143 members. We have held 8 executive meetings with an average of 14 present.

We have in all 524 delegates: 313 from Brooklyn, 160 from Queens and Nassau, and 51 from Suffolk County. These come from 43 parishes and missions in Brooklyn, 41 in Queens and Nassau, and 16 in Suffolk County; thus 100 parishes out of our 151 on Long Island are working with us; our great ambition is to have every parish and mission join.

This number of delegates includes United Thank Offering Treasurers and Church Periodical Club Librarians, who are not expected to pay dues, although many of them are generous enough to do so.

Our speakers throughout the year have been, in January, Bishop Creighton, our Missionary Bishop to Mexico; he told us of his needs, his hopes and aspirations, and of how, as his work is all "advance work," he hoped we would keep Mexico in mind. "Do not," he said, "break in on your apportionments—meeting those is playing the game."

Bishop Burleson, in February, spoke on what he called the picturesque part of his work, that done among the Indians in South Dakota.

Mr. Donald Roberts, Professor of History at St. John's University, Shanghai, was our March speaker. His plea was for fairer treatment of the Chinese; he showed that their pagan ideas are emphasized, while we forget that the principles of Confucius are the basis of Chinese standards.

In April the Rev. W. S. Claiborne of Sewanee, Tenn., showed us what the Du Bose School is doing in fitting men who have not received college educations to go out and work in rural parishes, where there is no one to lead and guide.

In May, Mrs. Gerald H. Lewis, Secretary of the Summer Schools of Province II, talked on the origin and growth of these

schools; of how their program covers all fields of service; of how leaders are made in them. She gave us full particulars, and urged us to go back to our parishes, determined to secure and send young people who would profit by the training received, and be of real value to us on their return.

Dr. Goodwin spoke also; his topic was on the rural work of the Church. His book, "Beyond City Limits," which has been studied in Mission Study Classes, has familiarized many of us with his plea for work to be done along these lines.

Miss Mary Wood, of Boone Library, Wuchang, China, was our speaker in October. She enthused us with her story of things done which twenty years ago seemed a dream, and have materialized so splendidly.

In November, Deaconess Bedell told us her story of Stephen's Village, Alaska, where she is a United Thank Offering worker. She is quite alone, and satisfied that it should be so, as she finds she can do better in that way; she held us spell-bound with the beauty of Alaska and her description of the people and their ways and her love for it all reached every one of us. We caught the contagion and loved it, too, before she had finished.

And then in December we had Miss Smith of St. Agnes' School, Kyoto, Japan. She, too, thrilled us with an account of the headway Christian education is making in this land where a few years ago women were not thought worth while.

We cannot ring much of a change on all this—the story is the same each year. These splendid people leave us filled with their enthusiasm and a great desire to follow their examples and the example of the One who spent all His days doing for others.

In September the Annual Suffolk County Meeting was held at Grace Church, Riverhead. Mrs. Otto Heinigke, Miss Emma Lewis and Bishop Morris of the Canal Zone were the speakers. Miss Grace Hewlett, Vice-President of Suffolk County, presided, and the Rev. W. B. Holcombe, rector of the church, was the celebrant at the Holy Communion, assisted by the Rev. S. C. Fish of Southampton and the Rev. William Grainger of East Hampton.

In May we held our Out-of-Town meeting at St. John's

Church, Huntington; about 625 were present. Bishop Stires was the celebrant at the Holy Communion, assisted by the rector, the Rev. Charles E. Cragg, and the Rev. John Gerstenberg, rector of the Church of the Redeemer, Merrick; our Bishop preached. In the afternoon we heard Mr. Lamkie on the "Foreign Born," and the Rev. Harry Stretch, on Liberia. This was a most splendid day, in which we received a wonderful amount of kindness and hospitality. Our morning offering, amounting to \$226.00, has been used toward Long Island's part of "The Corporate Gift."

Our 54th Anniversary was held in November at the Church of the Incarnation, Brooklyn. Again our Bishop was the celebrant at the Holy Communion, this time assisted by the Rev. St. Clair Hester, D.D., the Rev. Frank M. Townley; D.D., the Rev. John H. Fitzgerald, and the rector, the Rev. A. W. Carrington. Our Bishop was the preacher. Our speakers in the afternoon were Dr. John W. Wood and Miss Lindley. The offering in the morning, amounting to about \$700.00, has been used toward our quota of \$6,000.00, and the afternoon offering, amounting to about \$200.00, goes toward "The Corporate Gift."

This, too, was one of the days over which memory loves to linger; being Armistice Day, the decorations were beautiful, as was the music, the speakers were unusually fine, and we were simply overwhelmed with kindness, goodness and unbounded hospitality; about 400 were present.

On each of these wonderful days the impulse with some of us was to say, as the disciples of old, "Lord, it is good for us to be here."

Each time our Bishop has preached to us he has given us a message of love, and shown his appreciation of women's work, and has left us feeling deeply grateful and encouraged.

A full Report of the Good Friday Offering and "The Woman's Corporate Gift" will be found on other pages; both show the greatest interest, and splendid work accomplished, and in this connection we must speak of the Box Work, the United Thank Offering, the Church Periodical Work, the Altar Work, Miss Kuhlke's Mission Study classes, which all are reported elsewhere, and for which we are justly proud and thankful.

Our Prayer Partnership plan just goes on; we hear little about it, but we know that under our dear Mrs. Fanning's leadership it is most efficiently doing its part.

Miss Childs' Zone meetings are increasing in value, showing themselves well worth while. Our Monthly Reports help many of our parishes, whose leaders are far away or for some reason not able to attend regularly; these Reports keep them in touch with us.

About 60 students from Long Island went to the Summer School, held this year at Burlington, N. J., and we took our part in the expense of bringing a young student up from Porto Rico and sending her through Columbia.

Because of a little change in time we have two Synods to report, to both of which we sent our delegates. The one held in January was at Utica, at which our President, Mrs. Heinigke, was elected Vice-President, and our Treasurer, Miss Roberts, their Treasurer, her residence in Princeton, N. J., making this possible. Bishop Fiske presided, and we long for space to tell of all that was done, both at the Woman's Auxiliary meeting and others.

Again in November another Synod, this time at Newark, N. J., Bishop Stearly presiding, and again we sent five delegates who brought us back valuable reports.

And now we have to give a little time to that most desirable commodity, money, without which after all we would find ourselves unable to do very much.

We have to report most gratefully a gift of \$2,000.00 with which to start an endowment fund; also a legacy of \$500.00 from Miss Meynen, the interest of which will help us so materially on our quota.

Our special is "The Corporate Gift," and in this our first year we raised for it over \$600.00, and have sent \$550.00 to the Treasurer of the fund, as work at Japan and Alaska has begun and they ask for it.

For our quota we planned to raise \$6,000.00; it has been a great joy to be able to send Mr. Barnes \$6,295.00.

For these two objects we strive to reach a certain goal, never getting away from it, and always remembering that in helping

to reach the Woman's Auxiliary quota we are helping to attain the amount of our own parish quota, not taking from it, but helping it, and in this way making this part of God's work easier for our Rectors, and for all concerned.

It is to our wonderful Finance Committee that we give all honor in this; without them we never would have understood the splendid part that we have been allowed to fill in what is truly work for God.

And what can we say of our faithful Chairmen, who by their fine presentations of work done in the different fields make us eager to fulfill our pledges. And our dear always faithful President, Mrs. Heinigke; what an inspiration and example we have in her!

In December we held our annual election, the only change being in the offices of Treasurer and Assistant-Treasurer.

It is with regret that we let Miss Roberts go from us, but removal to Princeton has made this necessary, and we are fortunate in having Miss Gibson to take her place.

Eight of our dear members have gone on into the higher life; may God have them in his keeping.

And so a Report of which we are humbly and gratefully proud ends.

"Grant unto us, Thy servants, dear Lord, a pure intention and a better faith, and such a measure of wisdom, courage and strength as will enable us to bring home to Thy fold many of Thy wandering sheep, O Blessed Shepherd of Souls, who with the Father and Holy Ghost we ever worship as one God for evermore. Amen."

Report of the Church Periodical Club

The Long Island Branch of the Church Periodical Club presents its thirty-eighth Annual Report as follows:

2,600 current magazines sent regularly; 85 Bibles and Testaments; 600 Prayer Books and Hymnals; 9,000 Books, theological and secular; 6,000 Tracts and Catechisms; 42,720 Christmas and Easter Cards; 15,000 Pictures and Calendars; 3,000 Carols and Music; 5,025 Toys, Games and Scrap Books, and 59,624 odd numbers of Magazines and Periodicals.

It has been a great disappointment that as yet the repeal of the unjust postal law has not gone into effect; it will surely at least be modified in the near future. There is no doubt that it has reduced the circulation of our current literature, but the majority of our donors have remained faithful and their recipients deeply appreciate their sacrifice.

Again, Long Island has been enabled, through the generosity of the Woman's Auxiliary, to complete its pledge of \$300.00 to the Medical Library of St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo, every volume of which was lost in the terrible earthquake. Every book purchased with this money bears the name of the Parish that contributed to its purchase inscribed on the bookplate within its cover; while some in addition perpetuate the name and honor of those held in loving memory.

A gift was also made to the Kuling Library. It is such a joy to have a share in brightening the leisure hours of our dear missionaries in China.

We were also made happy by the co-operation of the Young People's Fellowship, who chose to send their contribution to the High School Library at St. James Mission, Wuhu, China, through the C. P. C.

Again our conjunction with the work of the Merchant Marine Library Association brought delightful results. In return for the books suitable for their purpose which we supplied to them, such generous numbers of children's books were given to us as enabled us to make valuable additions to many libraries already established, as well as to place embryo foundations for future distributing centers. We do not wish to seem to claim too much for this work, but so much testimony is voluntarily given where the lure of books and pictures has proved the opening wedge for the first opportunity of religious instruction. All books of theology, fiction and juveniles, as well as Bibles, Hymnals and Prayer Books, will be gratefully received by the C. P. C. at the Diocesan House, 170 Remsen Street, but there

is no facility for handling magazines; these must be sent direct from donor to recipient.

As always, the sending of the current magazine regularly supplies the greatest need of the isolated missionary; it is absolutely necessary that they be kept up to date in current events to retain the respect of those to whom they minister, and no less important that their spirits be refreshed by lighter literature.

May the thirty-ninth year of the C. P. C. in Long Island, prove a benediction in the lives of God's children everywhere, and help his Church to prove to them that "Somebody Cares."

At the meeting of the Triennial of the Woman's Auxiliary in New Orleans, in October, 1925, it was resolved to make a Corporate Gift for advance work included in the Program of the Church. The following objects were decided upon for the present Triennium:

1. St. Agnes' School, Kyoto, Japan.
2. St. Timothy's Hospital, Cape Mount, Liberia.
3. Holy Trinity Cathedral, Port-au-Prince, Haiti.
4. Church of the Resurrection, Baguio, Philippines.
5. St. Mark's School, Nenana, Alaska.
6. Church of the Nazarene, Livramento, Brazil.

Long Island has pledged \$1,000.00 to this fund. It is hoped that every parish will give something during the course of the three years. An average gift of \$12.00 will assure our pledge. In 1926 we have received a few individual gifts, have had the

morning offering at the Out-of-Town meeting and the afternoon offering at the Anniversary meeting. These have totaled \$630.27.

The buildings at St. Agnes' School, Kyoto, and at St. Mark's School, Nenana, are already under way, so, at the request of the National Chairman of the Corporate Gift, money is to be sent in by the Dioceses at intervals during the Triennium to be put to immediate use.

Long Island sent \$550.00 in December, 1926.

Good Friday Offering

This year the Good Friday Offering made by the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Long Island has been given for the Special Building Fund of the Fort Valley High and Industrial School in Georgia, with the exception of \$25.00. In 1925 the Long Island Auxiliary, through its Good Friday Offering, gave a room in the Bishop Tuttle Training School at Raleigh, N. C., in memory of Bishop Burgess, and \$25.00 from this year's offering has been assigned to the Maintenance Fund of this room.

The Rockefeller Foundation offered \$100,000.00 to the Fort Valley School for new buildings and equipment, on condition that an equal sum be raised by the school itself. It was to help secure that gift that our Auxiliary made its offering on Good Friday of last year. Two gifts made in the fall for the same purpose are included in this report.

The total amount given was \$689.90. After deducting \$25.00 for the Maintenance Fund at the Bishop Tuttle Training School the gift to the Fort Valley Fund amounted to \$664.90.

The total number of churches contributing was fifty-four.

It is hoped that each succeeding year will mark a growing interest on the part of the Auxiliary in availing itself of this one opportunity which the Colored Committee presents for making a contribution towards a pressing need, which the National Council feels worthy of help, but which it cannot make provision for covering in its annual appropriations.
