

## Report of Recording Secretary

One of our speakers told us recently that nothing in God's universe stands still. The members of the Woman's Auxiliary find this true indeed. Our work moves steadily on, never any standstill, and all showing progress and advancement: it is a great joy to the Secretary in this our 56th year to present the following report, which speaks for itself: We have 561 members; 337 of these are in Brooklyn, 167 come from Queens and Nassau, and 57 from Suffolk; these represent 43 parishes in Brooklyn, 42 in Queens and Nassau, and 18 in Suffolk, in all 103 parishes in the different parts of Long Island.

We have held eight regular meetings, with an average attendance of 165. We have had nine executive meetings, with an average of nineteen.

Our speakers during the year have been Bishop Tyler, of North Dakota; Mr. Battle, head of the Okolona School, Miss., and Field Secretary for the Church Institute for Negroes; Mrs. Burke from Alaska; Mrs. Boynton, Provincial Secretary of the 2nd Province, who told of a recent visit to San Juan, Porto Rico, and the Virgin Islands. Miss Lathrop, who is in charge of Wyndham House, the Memorial to Bishop Tuttle in Manhattan, and Bishop Creighton, of Mexico. To hear these different phases of our work described by those so intimately associated with them adds very much to our interest and understanding of them.

At our Out-of-town meeting, which was held at Garden City, and was our Diocesan Triennial, we presented our United Thank Offering; there were about 650 present. Bishop Stires preached for us, his text being: "Go ye and teach all nations." In the afternoon our speakers were Dean Sargent, who talked on the United Thank Offering, and Dr. John W. Wood, who told us of its workers. We feel that our success in our offering sent to Washington is largely due to our Dean's splendid presentation of it; when we speak of our success, we know that in the actual sum we do not reach the splendid amounts of many of the other dioceses, but we have on Long Island one great handicap which they have not; that is the fact that Long Island is but a summer home for many of our wealthy Church people, whose actual churches are in New York and so their interest is divided.

At our Anniversary held in November at the Church of the Holy Trinity, Brooklyn, we were honored by having three Bishops with us; Bishop Murray, who preached in the morning, and Bishop Stires, and Bishop Colmore, who made addresses in the afternoon. The stormy day made a difference in the number present, but those who attended were more than repaid. It was a day to linger in one's memory.

Reports show that we are getting more in touch with parishes down on the "Island" than ever before; this is due to the meetings held under the leadership of Miss Hewlett and Miss Childs, and the monthly reports sent to those that desire them keep many who cannot be with us fully informed. It is a joy to us to have Miss Kuhlke with us once more; by special request she is again taking hold of the Corporate Gift for the next three years; her report shows how we went beyond our goal from 1925 to 1928; and so with the Good Friday Offering, under the care of Mrs. Francis, of which she has furnished a most satisfying account. All our work done we can read of elsewhere in these pages; we feel truly glad and thankful for it.

In October, five delegates attended the convention at Washington; Mrs. Heinigke, Mrs. Joost, Miss Hewlett, Miss Childs and Mrs. Smyth; we have all since our return visited the parishes that have invited us and hope that we have passed on at least a part of the wonderful inspiration received there.

In December our election showed no changes; all the officers being honored by being chosen to retain their positions. With our chairmen we have had to accept two resignations to our great regret; Mrs. Francis, after twenty-five years of the most faithful loving work for our colored brethren, felt compelled to give up; she has endeared herself to us all; we shall miss her guidance in this part of our work sorely; Mrs. Southmayd has kindly consented to take this position. Mrs. Peterman is another, who having resigned from the Chairmanship of the Finance Committee, leaves us at a loss; she also has been one of our dearest and most dependable workers for over twenty-five years; in that time, she has held several most important offices, and will always be remembered as the originator of the Woman's Auxiliary Quota, which has been of incalculable benefit to us and our parishes. Our comfort is they are both continuing as delegates and members of the Advisory Board and may rest assured will be called on whenever we need them; we know they will not fail us. Mrs. Hunting has come to our rescue as Chairman of the Finance Committee, and we are truly grateful.

Our quota, which we set at \$7,500, we more than met, and of course in this way fulfilled all pledges.

Our specials were met by a little extra generosity at our December meeting, many parishes responding to the call for help needed at that time. One special deserves particular mention; that is the Daily Vacation Bible Schools which as a Diocesan special asked for only \$200; this of course was not nearly enough to supply six schools with trained teachers and materials, but the whole-hearted cooperation given us meant a return of nearly \$700, which gave us a chance to do our part for the first time in this

as we felt it should be done; we hope to do better still. Another satisfactory thing was the part we took in Bishop Colmore's "Rest House." We also helped well in the relief sent to Porto Rico, in the recent disaster.

On learning that the National Woman's Auxiliary had passed upon the Kellogg-Briand peace pact, we ratified their action and our Secretary was instructed to communicate with our Senators in Washington.

Ten of our dear members have passed on to the higher life. We shall miss each one. Special action has been taken in the case of Miss Laura Mitchell, a charter member, and on request, Mrs. R. S. Fanning, our only charter member now, drew up the following resolution:

On November the fifth, 1928, Miss Laura Townsend Mitchell, one of our oldest, most regular and faithful members, passed from the Church Militant to the Life Triumphant.

Miss Mitchell was a charter member of this Auxiliary and for fifty-six years faithfully attended its meetings. Those who knew her could realize her unwavering devotion and loyalty to the Church and its Mission, and her ardent desire to do her part in helping to build up the Kingdom.

Therefore: Be it resolved that this Long Island Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary place upon its records this tribute to the memory of Laura Townsend Mitchell, praying "that we with all those who are departed in the true faith of Thy Holy Name, may have our perfect consummation and bliss in Thy eternal and everlasting glory."

"Father, in Thy gracious keeping  
Leave we now Thy servant sleeping."

We have many causes for thankfulness, not the least of which is the gentle guidance and wisdom of our dear President, Mrs. Heinigke.

And so another record comes to a close. Many hopes fulfilled, many desires granted, with many of us the knowledge that we have done our best although we may wish that it had been more. As the years go on we feel sure that this, too, will be given us, especially if we, with true and faithful hearts, "Study to show" ourselves, "approved unto God" workmen, "that needeth not to be ashamed."

## Report of Work in Suffolk County

The first of these meetings was held at Christ Church, Sag Harbor, and was very well attended. Mrs. Wayre and Mrs. Townsend came and told of the work of the Supply Bureau and the Indian Committee.

The Annual Suffolk County meeting was held at St. Peter's Church, Bayshore, on September 27, with a Corporate Communion at 11 a.m., box luncheon and afternoon session at which Bishop Creighton gave a most interesting account of his work in Mexico, and Mrs. Meynen told of her plans for Mission Study during the coming year.

The Vice-President has also visited the parish branches at Sag Harbor, Babylon and Sayville, at their regular meetings. There are several parishes in the county which have no representation in the Auxiliary, but it is hoped that by the more frequent meetings and the work of the new Suffolk County Committee these too may be reached and roused to do their part in carrying out the command of our dear Lord to carry His Gospel to the uttermost parts of the world.

Five years ago nine women workers in the field were assigned as Prayer Partners to the Long Island Branch of the Auxiliary, for special prayer and interest. The congregation seemed peculiarly to merit our interest and help as their church building, which is only a crypt, was badly in need of repair and they were bravely carrying on, having assumed and met financial responsibilities for their parish, and having paid their Diocesan Missionary quota in full. It was therefore a gratification to the Long Island Auxiliary to be able to give them for a Renovation Fund, the sum of \$550.04, to be administered by the Diocesan Council.

It is pleasant to note that among the largest gifts for this offering were those from the colored churches of Brooklyn, St. Augustine's, St. Philip's and St. Barnabas itself.

The Colored Committee is grateful to all the auxiliaries which have cooperated in this expression of friendliness for our colored friends, and it hopes that with each succeeding year more of our auxiliary members will experience the joy of participating in this beautiful Good Friday Offering.

## Report of the Church Periodical Club

The Long Island Branch of the Church Periodical Club makes its fortieth Annual Report as follows: 2,000 current magazines sent regularly, by 475 donors; 78 Bibles and Testaments; 475 prayer books and hymnals; 7,000 books, secular and theological; 1,100 tracts and catechisms; 40,000 Christmas and Easter cards; 10,500 picture cards and calendars; 15,000 carols and music; 2,000 pictures, games and scrap books and 58,000 odd numbers of magazines and periodicals.

This year we celebrated the Fortieth Anniversary of the founding of the Church Periodical Club, and it is with grateful hearts that we compare the above report of one Branch, with its humble beginning of one number of the Churchman sent out from the home of its Founder, Mrs. Mortimer Fargo, in 1888. It was fortunate that the Triennial in Washington could be the scene of this celebration, as it enabled so many of its members to enjoy its festivities, and to reminisce over its early days.

One of the most joyful events of the year was the repeal of the obnoxious postal law and the return to more normal rates. One cent for two ounces and this applying to all zones in the United States, making it no more expensive to minister to our Missionaries in Alaska than to those in Long Island, and we trust we shall show our gratitude by an increase in the number of current magazines offered; the demand can never be satisfied, but there has been a marked decrease in the supply during the unreasonable ratings, and we fear numbers of lonely lives have been depressed by the lack of reading matter, for many depend upon the C. P. C.

As we all know, the outstanding item of Advance Work this year in the Church is the building of St. Luke's International Hospital in Tokyo, Japan, and for its medical library the C. P. C. has pledged \$5,000. Of this Long Island's quota is \$300. We must not fail to meet our allotment.

It has seemed to your Director that our Parish Secretaries in Long Island would be greatly inspired in their work by more generally attending the C. P. C. meetings held on the fourth Monday of each month in the Parish House of St. Thomas' Church, 1 West 53rd Street, New York, at 11 A. M. There is always a speaker from the field, and as they tell of what the work of the C. P. C. means to them and how much more there is that we might do to help them and to brighten the lives of those among whom they labor, we are convinced that there is no more worth while exertion than that expended by the Church Periodical Club.

## The Corporate Gift

1925 to 1928

At the Triennial meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary in New Orleans in October, 1925, it was decided that during the coming three years the Auxiliary would make a Corporate Gift towards the Advance Work on the Church's Program, in addition to its regular work for the Quota, the Specials, the United Thank Offering, and the Supply Bureau. In two previous Trienniums the Auxiliary had shown its ability to gather offerings for unusual and appealing objects, having founded during 1919-1922 the Emery Fund of \$100,000 for the benefit of missionaries on furlough, and during 1922-1925 raised \$100,000 to build the training school for Church workers at St. Augustine's School, Raleigh, N. C., and to establish Wyndham House in New York City for missionaries in training and on furlough, in memory of Bishop Tuttle. The goal set for the Corporate Gift, 1925-1928, was \$100,000, to be divided among six widely scattered and varied needs; one hospital, two schools and three churches to be aided in their building programs:

St. Agnes' School, Kyoto, Japan .....	\$25,000.00
St. Timothy's Hospital, Cape Mount, Liberia .....	20,000.00
Holy Trinity Cathedral, Port-au-Prince, Haiti .....	12,500.00
Church at Baguio, Philippine Islands .....	18,000.00
St. Mark's School, Nenana, Alaska .....	15,000.00
Church at Livramento, Brazil.....	8,000.00

The plan for administering this fund was new, and proved most satisfactory. Instead of waiting to present the completed offering at Washington in 1928, the money was put to work as quickly as it came into the hands of the national treasurer of the fund. The result was that before the Triennial meeting in September, 1928, St. Agnes' School, Kyoto, Japan; St. Mark's School, Nenana, Alaska; Holy Trinity Cathedral, Port-au-Prince, Haiti, and the Church at Livramento, Brazil, had each received its full allotment and the buildings were completed or well under way, and the money for St. Timothy's Hospital, Cape Mount, Liberia, and for the Church at Baguio was in the treasurer's hands. Of the generous surplus over and above the goal, the Auxiliary voted to send \$5,000 to Bishop Mitchell for his Indian Work at Fort Defiance, Arizona, and the rest, some \$17,000, to Bishop Burleson for the construction of the Hare Industrial School on the Rosebud Reservation, South Dakota.

Long Island shared in this Gift, as it did in the Emery Fund and the Bishop Tuttle Memorial. We set \$1,000 as our goal. Be-

cause we were concentrating our efforts so earnestly on the Quota, and because we wanted to make the Corporate Gift as representative of the whole Diocese as possible, the Executive Board decided to devote part of the offering at the Anniversary and the Out-of-Town meetings to this fund whenever possible during the triennium, asking for only small gifts from the Parish Branches directly. Of our total gifts, \$56 was designated for St. Timothy's Hospital, Cape Mount, Liberia (from St. Ann's Church, Sayville, \$50 in November, 1926; from St. Philip's Church, Dean Street, \$5 in May, 1927, and from the offering at the meeting in the Church of the Resurrection, Richmond Hill, in May, 1927, \$1). The rest was given undesignated to be used for the six objects of the Corporate Gift.
