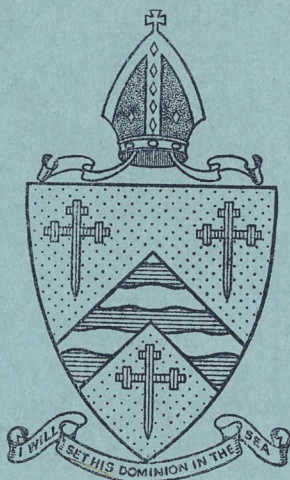

Report of Recording Secretary

The year 1929 has been for our Auxiliary a happy and very satisfactory one, showing progress in nearly every department. Statistics are tiresome but necessary, and in this case, short. We had 579 members: 342 from Brooklyn, 182 from Queens and Nassau, and 55 from Suffolk, a gain of 18 members; these represented 44 parishes in Brooklyn, 47 in Queens and Nassau, and 18 in Suffolk, making 109 parishes represented, which shows six gained.

We have held as usual 8 regular meetings, with an average attendance of 135. We have also held 8 Executive; add to these our Out-of-town and our Anniversary Meetings, of which we will speak farther on.

Our speakers have been, in January, the Rev. C. E. Snowden, Field Secretary at the Church Missions House, who talked on "How things happen in the Church"; in February, Mrs. Phelps, President of the New Jersey Branch of the Auxiliary, who explained the Corporate Gift, and the plans made for it at the last Convention, and at the same meeting, Dr. Milton, whose topic was "Evangelism." In March, Bishop Larned on "The Daily Vacation Bible Schools"; in April, the Rev. Mr. Pugh of New Jersey on his recent work at Porto Rico; in May, Deaconess Dahlgren, on the fund that is being raised for deaconesses. In October, Bishop Roberts, Suffragan Bishop of South Dakota, told us of his work there; in November Bishop Colmore, on Porto Rico, and in December, Fr. Souder, from the Philippines. These addresses were all entertaining, instructive, and uplifting. We sometimes have to ask ourselves do we fully appreciate the opportunities that are given through our organization in these addresses to learn of the work of the Church, and the needs of the mission field; they are a real education.

Over 400 women attended our Out-of-town meeting, held at Trinity Church, Hewlett, in May. Bishop Larned was our celebrant, and preached on the story of Emmaus, in which he showed us the power and importance of "a heart on fire for God." Dr. John W. Wood, and the Rev. A. H. Donovan, of Liberia, were our afternoon speakers.

Our Anniversary was spent at St. Paul's Church, Flatbush, and again our preacher was Bishop Larned. These are always days to look back upon and rejoice in; about 600 were present; such a number getting together who have the same aspirations and strivings to enlarge the Kingdom of God is an inspiration in itself. Our speakers in the afternoon were Archdeacon Goodman of Alaska, and the Rev. C. T. Bridgeman, Canon of St. George's Cathedral, Jerusalem.

Our special work was the Corporate Gift, carried on successfully by Miss Kuhlke; the Daily Vacation Bible Schools, and the Good Friday Offering for the Jews; these were cared for by Mrs. Smyth; all these "Adventures for God" amounted to more than was expected. Another extra was the money sent to help a young negro from Haiti, who is studying for the ministry, and we took a small part in raising the money for the tablet in the Cathedral at Washington.

In December our Election showed changes; Mrs. Smyth resigned as Recording Secretary, a position she has held for sixteen years. Mrs. J. F. Southmayd was elected in her place. Mrs. Joost resigned as Vice-President for Brooklyn; this vacancy has been filled by the election of Mrs. Francis. Changes in the chairmen of Committees resulted in the appointment of Mrs. Smyth as Chairman of the Diocesan Committee, and Mrs. Weed as Chairman of the Committee on Colored Work.

To our very great regret, Mrs. Van Nostrand, who has held the position of United Thank Offering Treasurer for twenty years, felt compelled to give up because of ill-health. Miss Mary Hunter has accepted this position, and Mrs. G. P. T. Sargent has become Chairman of the United Thank Offering Committee. Mrs. H. O. Huntting is Chairman of the Finance Committee, which has become an elective office. Mrs. J. W. Goodwin has consented to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Mrs. Meynen and becomes *Chairman of Mission Study*.

Miss Childs and Miss Hewlett are still doing excellent work with meetings for our far-away members, who cannot come to us, and by this means and the Monthly Reports all are able to keep in touch with what we are doing.

We sent three delegates to the Synod held at Albany, last November: Mrs. Heinigke, Mrs. Sargent and Miss Mary Hunter.

Our Finance Committee, by letters, appeals and constant work has made our quota reach a position of importance hitherto unknown. For 1929 this was \$8,000; we went well over \$9,000. All our other work is reported in the proper place in these pages.

To our great sorrow we have lost nine members by death, and in this connection we must speak particularly of Mrs. Meynen, our dear and devoted leader in Mission Study; her lovely Christian character, her devotion to her work, her steady example meant much to all of us, and we feel her loss very deeply. Others whom we miss and think of with real affection are Miss Murphy, Mrs. Weeber, Mrs. Fowler, Miss Simpson, Mrs. Vrooman, Mrs. Gilkes, Miss Gavey and Miss Weeks; all taken from us to do a larger work.

This is the last of many Annual Reports submitted by me. As I

look back over the years and think of the dear, splendid women with whom I have been associated, many of whom have been called to their Heavenly home, it gives me food for serious thought. Memory brings back to me our President, Mrs. Hutchins, a dear devoted woman of great ability, and one who never lost sight of the real object of our being, that of bringing others into the kingdom of God; of Miss Mary Benson, another President, generous, hospitable, big hearted, and will we ever forget the love she showed always for everything concerning our colored brethren? She was to them a true friend. Comes a thought of Mrs. Betts of Grace Church, Jamaica, one of the saints, and our dear Miss Faber of Far Rockaway, cheery, helpful, encouraging always, and there are so many others. One wonders, are they with us now, seeing the work they loved so well progressing as it is? Does some of the glory vouchsafed to them shine upon us? I like to think, for I will I hope, always be one of you, that they are still helping, still having their part with us, and my prayer is, that God will uphold us, as He did them, and that in the great plan of things which makes our part seem small indeed, we may not lose courage, but go on to better things, knowing there is One who says to us, as He said to His Servant of old, "Certainly I will be with thee." What more can we ask?

The purpose of this Committee is to stimulate and further the knowledge and interest of the United Thank Offering so that every woman in every Parish and Mission of the Diocese may

have a Blue Box and share in this great work of women for women all over the world.

The United Thank Offering is a security against our losing the opportunity of visibly expressing our gratitude, and the steady growth of this offering is a great encouragement to the Church in these anxious days.

The ideal is that the contents of these "Treasuries of Gratitude" shall be offered in each Parish twice a year, at a celebration of the Holy Communion. In many Parishes, in many Dioceses, All Saints' Day and Ascension Day are the days when these offerings are presented.

At the Triennial in Washington, the women of Long Island presented an offering of \$21,907.25. Up to January 1, 1930 (the first fourteen months of the new Triennium), the Treasurer reports \$9,525.87, which is an increase of nearly \$3,000 for the same period in the last Triennium.

If we continue in the same splendid, consecrated spirit and determine so to do, we may be able to set our goal near \$30,000.

But greater than the money itself is the fact of the ever-increasing number of women sharing in the United Thank Offering. If the spirit of thankful acknowledgment of special blessing by "putting something into the Blue Box" can be spread until every woman is reached, we shall help with the vast sum which the Church needs, but of much more importance, we shall have a renewed and revived spiritual strength. The offering will then be the symbol of the outward and visible sign of our Lord's inward and spiritual grace working in and through us.

The success of the United Thank Offering Committee depends on the response and cooperation of every woman in the Diocese. How better can we cooperate than by beginning every day with the United Thank Offering prayer which unites all the women who use it in a true bond of fellowship:

O Lord, our Heavenly Father, we pray Thee to send forth more laborers into Thy harvest, and to grant them Thy special grace for every need. Guard and guide the workers in the field, and draw us into closer fellowship with them. Dispose the hearts of all women everywhere to give gladly as Thou hast given to them. Accept from grateful hearts our United Thank Offering of prayer and gifts and joyful service; and bless it to the coming of Thy Kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Corporate Gift

1928 to 1930

The Corporate Gift for the last triennium, which paid for the building of three churches, two schools and one hospital, proved such a practical help towards the Advance Work on the Church's Program, that the Auxiliary, meeting in Washington in October, 1928, decided to work again for certain definite objects needed in the mission field.

The general Church is planning a special effort for the Advance Work Program during the present triennium. The Auxiliary will naturally take part in that when the time comes. The plan was not completed in 1929, so the Auxiliary is working independently during the first year of the triennium, leaving the last two years free to cooperate with the National Council.

Two churches, a school dormitory, and the water supply for an Indian mission were selected, and all were promised within the twelve months of 1929.

The money has been forwarded at intervals throughout the year. The work has been started whenever the necessary amount was available. In this way the church at Santo Domingo was begun before Easter, the water supply installed during the summer, and the church at Silver City and the dormitory assured long before the end of the year.

Long Island's fair share of the total cost was \$569. A report of what our parishes have given shows that we have done our share with something over for good measure.

Report of the Church Periodical Club

The Long Island Branch of the Church Periodical Club makes its Forty-first Annual Report as follows: 2,005 current periodicals sent regularly by 560 donors; 110 Bibles and Testaments; 800 prayer books and hymnals; 8,500 books, secular and religious; 1,540 tracts and catechisms; 42,708 Easter and Christmas cards; 10,232 picture cards and calendars; 1,547 carols, music and records; 2,325 pictures, games and scrap-books; and 65,215 odd numbers of magazines and periodicals.

It would be futile to strive to measure the joy, enlightenment, education and solace that these inanimate figures represent. A woman missionary writes "You will never know in this world the joy you have brought to us who are at the front of the battle." Another grateful soul says "Tell them there is one woman up here, sick and lonely, who every night asks God to bless them for the books." We are told that every Opportunity is a Responsibility; then every card, every book, every magazine must be a responsibility, as for every single one there is an opportunity.

The Quota given to Long Island this year was \$300; for the Medical Library in St. Luke's International Hospital, Tokyo, Japan. We have gone over the top, with \$319, and every book purchased will bear on its frontal a Bookplate inscribed either with the name of the donor or the one in whose honor or in whose memory it is given. Will it not be a joy to think that at least 100 of the names that we have so loved and revered are placed in such an enduring environment of honor and service?

We have also contributed \$32 to the Endowment Fund of the C. P. C., an invaluable asset to the finances of the Club and now amounting to over \$40,000. We are deeply grateful for the loyal support of the Church women of Long Island.

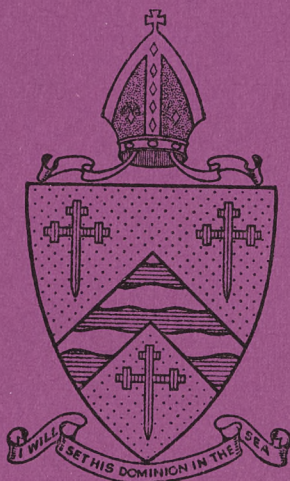

Report of Recording Secretary

The year 1930 was, as usual, a very active one for the Auxiliary, which also means a happy year. We had few changes in membership, and we are glad to report one new branch at All Saints Church, Long Island City.

We held our regular meetings, 8, during the year, average attendance, 125. Also 8 Executive Meetings, and 1 Anniversary and Out-of-Town Meeting.

We had the privilege of hearing most interesting speakers from various fields. In January, Mr. Barnes talked to us about "Quota," giving us very helpful and comprehensive statements. Miss Margaret Read from England talked to us of Student Christian Movement, an extremely important branch of work in English schools and colleges.

In February, Mr. William Smith told us of work at Du Bose Training School, and Bishop White of Springfield, Ill., brought us news of work in the Middle West. At the March meeting, Bishop Larned talked to us of the Daily Vacation Bible School. In April, we had the Rev. R. P. Frazier, Director of Advance Work, from the Church Missions House, who talked of the "Churches Program." In May, Miss Boyer talked of the 1931 study subject, India, and preparation for leaders of study classes. At the October meeting, Mrs. Olmsted told us of Middle River Mission, Fletcher, Virginia. In November, the Rev. Mr. Collett, Field Secretary from the Church Missions House talked of Advance work. In December, Mrs. Clark, Rosebud Agency, South Dakota, told of work among the Indians. These speakers from various branches of the Mission work have given us a close touch with the field where we are trying to do our bit towards teaching the great love of Christ.

In May, our Out-of-Town Meeting was held at Christ Church, Oyster Bay, Bishop Stires, the celebrant and morning preacher. A most inspiring sermon on the text St. John 10—18, "Other sheep I have." In the afternoon, Bishop Creighton talked of work in Mexico, and Dr. Mary James, from the Church General Hospital, Wu Chang, China, gave much interesting information. Over 400 women attended this meeting. The Anniversary meeting in November, was held at St. John's Church, Brooklyn, about 250 women attending. Here again, Bishop Stires was celebrant and preacher, his text, St. John 6—12, "Gather up the fragments that nothing be lost," a stirring sermon with much encouragement for greater work and success. In the afternoon, we heard the Rev. Hah-O-Sed, an Ojibway Indian priest from North Dakota, and

the Rev. G. Warfield Hobbs, Editor of the "Spirit of Missions." Our officers were re-elected in December with the exception of Chairman of Finance, Mrs. H. O. Huntting, who resigned, and in whose place, Miss C. Florence Kuhlke was elected. All of our Committee Chairmen have been "carrying on" with the usual enthusiasm and efficiency.

The United Thank Offering Treasurer, Miss Hunter, the Chairman of Educational work, Mrs. Goodwin, and the Vice-Presidents, Mrs. Waller, Mrs. Francis for Brooklyn, Miss Childs for Queens and Nassau, Miss Hewlett for Suffolk, each doing their part in a telling and effective way for the work of the whole organization in its great purpose.

Our Treasurer, Miss Gibson, whose work is undoubtedly the most arduous, is assisted by the efficient Finance Committee, whose united efforts helped us to go over our \$10,000 voted for Quota for 1930.

Our heads have been bowed in sorrow at the loss of six of our beloved members, Mrs. Smyth, Mrs. Napier, Mrs. Taylor, Mrs. Talmage, Mrs. Caruana, Mrs. Tucker. The passing of Mrs. Smyth left a place that could not be filled, though the work must be carried on. Hers was an example to all, untiring, unselfish, all to the glory of God. Sixteen years serving as Secretary with unfailing faithfulness and accuracy, many years a delegate, and Chairman of Diocesan Committee. Surely, of such is the Kingdom of Heaven.

Report of Work in Suffolk County

The year 1930 has been marked by decided progress in the work of the Woman's Auxiliary in Suffolk County, due to the more frequent meetings held in different parts of the county.

Francis, Vice-President for Brooklyn, spoke of the quota, emphasizing the fact that it is the business of the women of the auxiliary. Although the day was very stormy there was a very good attendance.

The next meeting was held on May 7th, at St. Luke's Church, Easthampton. Miss Atwater was the speaker and there was an attendance of forty-six. At this meeting it was decided to have an offertory for missions at the quarterly meetings in the future.

The increase in attendance at these meetings and evidences of greater interest are very encouraging.

The purpose of this Committee is to stimulate and further the knowledge and interest of the United Thank Offering so that every woman in every Parish and Mission of the Diocese may have a Blue Box and share in this great work of women for women all over the world.

In 1930 the Committee sent a questionnaire to all Diocesan Parishes and Missions. Fifty-eight Parishes answered the questionnaire, and upon request nearly three hundred new Blue Boxes were sent to these Parishes. This Committee during the year supplied United Thank Offering speakers for forty Parishes.

During 1930 seventy-four Parishes contributed \$8,308.67. The total of the United Thank Offering for this Triennium up to December 31, 1930, was \$17,834.54. The preceding Triennial Offering Long Island made during the General Convention at Washington was, \$21,907.25.

The Triennial Offering to be made at the General Convention at Denver, Colorado, is to be made on September 17th, nearly a month earlier than in previous years. This will make a serious difference in our total, as so many Parishes do no work until late in the fall.

If Long Island is to do its full share we must all make a prompt and supreme effort to have every available offering in Miss Hunter's hands by September 1st.

Our spiritual life grows and deepens as we acquire the habit of thinking of God's blessings to us, and of rendering thanks to Him by word and deed for these blessings.

We might classify the United Thank Offering givers as follows:

1. Those who have given because they were asked to give.
2. The women who draw a check now and then, possibly only when the offering is to be presented.
3. Those whose gifts are placed in the Blue Box as an expression of gratitude at the time the blessings are received. These comprise the greatest group and from them comes the major portion of the United Thank Offering.

The way of the third group is the ideal way which all should strive to follow.

It naturally follows that the third group would want to present their prayers and their offerings of gratitude for God's unspeakable gifts at the great Service of Thanksgiving—the Holy Communion: "Here we offer and present unto Thee, O Lord, ourselves; our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy and living sacrifice unto Thee."

Money given in this spirit is not an impersonal gift or material thing, but rather a part of ourselves.

There is no more fitting way to close this report than to voice the true United Thank Offering spirit as expressed by Mrs. Haley's poem written during 1930.

"Teach me to live my life the 'blue box' way,
Alert, aware, from smug complacence free,
Meeting the miracle of each new day
With lifting heart of thankfulness to Thee.
Because for me, that white high hour it brings,
That sudden radiance when beauty smiled,
That singing joy for tender human things,
Is but the Father speaking to His child.

Teach me to see Thy world the 'blue box' way,
Until my hands would reach all hands in need,
Until my heart counts all men kin since they
Are of one fold, the sheep whom Thou wouldst feed.
As He Who turned the water into wine,
At Cana's feast in far off Galilee,
Transform these humble loving gifts of mine
To helping, healing, lighting men to Thee."

Report of the Educational Secretary

In the busy world of today many people sadly need mental stimulation and spiritual awakening. This need is met in the Church in the Department of Religious Education with its many books and courses of study, programs and subjects for Discussion Groups. In the subject chosen each year is combined a treatment of World Problems, the best of Christian teaching and an increasing realization that the Foreign Mission Field has become truly the World, our Neighbor. The Woman's Auxiliary looks to its delegates to help promote this work in every parish. The first step is always to train Leaders. For this, during the past year, 4 normal classes have been held.

Report of the Church Periodical Club 1930

The Long Island Branch of the Church Periodical Club makes its Forty-second Annual Report as follows: 2,000 Current Periodicals sent regularly by 540 donors; 280 Bibles and Testaments; 3,000 Prayer Books and Hymnals; 9,000 Books, secular and religious; 1,500 Tracts and Catechisms; 48,540 Christmas and Easter Cards; 1,400 Calendars; 30,578 Pictures and Post Cards; 2,680 Toys, Games and Scrap Books; 1,256 Carols, Music and Records and 69,412 Odd Numbers of magazines and periodicals.

This is a most unsatisfactory Report, as of the 124 Branches listed, only 42 returned their Questionnaire and only 28 contributed to the Quota Fund; but the loyalty, generosity and devotion of the minority is gratefully appreciated.

Again our Quota of \$300.00 was for St. Luke's Medical Library, in Tokyo, Japan; and again every Parish contributing has their name enrolled by Bookplates in all the books purchased from the list submitted by Dr. Teusler. The inscription designates them either "In Memory Of" or "The Gift Of," according to request.
