

JESSIE WEIR HEINIGKE

"Then shall I know even as also I am known."

The Committee appointed by the President at the meeting of the Executive Board of the Woman's Auxiliary held on October 29th, 1937, offers the following resolution on the death of Mrs. Otto Heinigke.

Whereas it has pleased Almighty God to call to His larger service our beloved member, Jessie Weir Heinigke, be it hereby moved that the following resolution be entered on the minutes of this meeting.

While prominently active in many other Church, philanthropic, and civic organizations it is as a member of the Woman's Auxiliary that we pay to her this loving tribute.

For 49 years a delegate from Christ Church, Bay Ridge, Mrs. Heinigke was elected President of the Woman's Auxiliary in 1920, holding that office for eleven years, and at her resignation in 1931 was made an honorary Vice-President.

The work of the Auxiliary was always of paramount interest to her. As the Presiding Officer, her unfaltering loyalty of purpose, her faith and vision, her consecration to the Cause, made her a true leader.

As a member of the Executive Board, her wise judgment, her willingness to accept new methods, gladly laying aside her personal preferences, made her counsel of inestimable value to the last. She gave unstintingly of her self, of her time and strength with the lovely graciousness that never failed and that endeared her to all.

We thank God for her many years of devoted service; we thank Him that He permitted her to be a bright and shining light to the end of a long life here, then took her to the life of perfect service in His eternal and heavenly Kingdom.

Be it also resolved that a copy of this resolution be sent to Mrs. Heinigke's family, and that it be printed in the Diocesan paper, *The Church Militant*.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

REPORT OF RECORDING SECRETARY

The Annual Meeting of 1937 was held on January 13th at Christ Church, Manhasset.

Interesting reports were read by district vice-presidents and chairmen of committees.

The first speaker at the afternoon session was Miss Sarah Cleghorn whose subject was, "The Field of Social Service." She gave as a watch-word "Light and beauty for those who need it." Contended that social service is home missions.

The second speaker, Rev. John Gass, spoke on missions. He urged his hearers to exalt God and to put man in a humble place, leaving the saving of the world to God in which He depends on the human agency of His people.

The Spring Meeting was held at the Cathedral, Garden City, on May 20th. Bishop Stires preached in the morning on the text "She hath done what she could."

Miss Grace Lindley at the afternoon meeting spoke feelingly of conditions in the world today. "State, race and property divide the world, the fellowship of the Church unites it."

She was followed by the Rev. J. Kenneth Morris from Japan, who gave a graphic account of his work at the Church of the Resurrection, Kyoto.

The Anniversary Meeting was held at St. Bartholomew's Church, Brooklyn, on November 4th.

Bishop Stires gave a stirring address on missions.

In the afternoon Bishop Mitchell of Arizona gave an interesting description of his work among the Indians and Mexicans.

Bishop Larned dwelt on the high lights of the Convention and on the impetus given the work of the Church by the Forward Movement.

Many changes have taken place in the membership of the Executive Committee in the past year. Our President, Mrs. John B. Pitman, has resigned owing to ill health and has been succeeded by Mrs. Alexander R. McKechnie.

Mrs. Otto Heinigke, our President from 1920 until 1931 and during the succeeding years an honorary Vice-President, died on October 22nd.

Mrs. Frank W. Creighton, an honorary Vice-President, left us to take up the work in Michigan, where Bishop Creighton had been called.

Miss Ida Bell has superseded Mrs. Roy W. Moore as Assistant Corresponding Secretary.

The meetings have been well attended, the Spring Meeting having an outstanding number present of about five hundred.

REPORT OF DELEGATES TO THE GENERAL
CONVENTION AT CINCINNATI

October 6, 1937

Due to the enforced absence of the President, Mrs. Pitman, the Vice-President-at-Large was appointed to lead the delegation, namely, Mrs. Andrews, Miss Hunter, Mrs. McKechnie and Mrs. Quine.

In the limited space it is only possible to touch briefly on the great Convention which marked a new era in the life of the Church. Fellowship in Faith and Work was the motivating thought guiding the Woman's Auxiliary delegates through the days of deliberation, and the Spirit of Christian Unity—the inescapable brotherhood of man—emanating from the two great Ecumenical Conferences of Oxford and Edinburgh added depth and purpose to our thought there and thereafter. Mrs. Edwin Allen Stebbins, the gracious Chairman of the Woman's Auxiliary, had been a delegate to these Conferences and her able paper on that subject should be read by everyone.

What may be passed on to our women of Long Island that they may share in this experience with profit to ourselves and to our great Commission?

First to try to procure from the Church Missions House all possible reading matter telling of what transpired. There is available a "packet" for thirty-five cents containing the addresses given by Mrs. Pierce, Mrs. Stebbins, Dr. McKee, Bishop Azariah, Dean Roberts, Bishop Salinas and Miss Gordon; the Minutes of the Triennial Meeting, the Report of the Executive Board of the Woman's Auxiliary, the Report of the Executive

Secretary and a Litany prepared for the Triennial Meeting—all inspiring, challenging.

Study and read the story of the development and need in the Rural Field and in the Moslem World. In the Minutes will be found the Resolutions which were passed, two presented by your delegates. Also study the United Thank Offering Resolutions, and new plans, those of the Supply Department and the Church Periodical Club, together with the "Findings" which give valuable suggestions for our work.

To sum up: we recommend the forming of Evening Branches, Junior Auxiliaries, a general and wider knowledge of missions through reading and prayer, and the determination to tell more and more women of the organized plans for service embodied in the Five Fields—Parish, Community, Diocese, Nation and World.

Above all must we continue to pray and work without ceasing for Peace, for Christian Unity and for the Coming of the Kingdom of God.

"Our Father in Heaven, we pray Thee to send into our hearts and into the hearts of all men everywhere the Spirit of Our Lord Jesus Christ".

REPORT OF THE JUNIOR AUXILIARY

During the year 1937 there have been encouraging signs of development of the work among our girls. Seventeen new groups have been formed; there are now nine in Brooklyn District, nine in Queens, three in Nassau, and ten in Suffolk, making a total number of thirty-one Junior Auxiliary branches in the Diocese.

District meetings have been held in the District of Brooklyn at Christ Church, Clinton Street; united meetings for Queens and Nassau at All Saints' Church, Bayside, and St. James' Church, Elmhurst; in the District of Suffolk in St. Mary's Church, Hampton Bays. These meetings are conducted by the girls, and at each one a talk on missions has been given, with exhibits of work accomplished, and brief reports from the Branches represented. They are a source of inspiration for forming new groups and creating interest.

It is planned to have as a general project for the Diocese, the raising of the sum of seventy-five dollars to support a child in the Orphanage in Phoenix, Arizona, under Bishop Walter Mitchell's supervision.

At the General Convention in Cincinnati, the Woman's Auxiliary showed interest in the forming of groups of girls and young women for missionary work, and a Resolution was passed recommending the appointment of a liaison officer in each diocese for that purpose.

Our trouble here lies in the lack of leadership and understanding of Woman's Auxiliary work. For that reason it is doubly important to bring our young people *now* into a knowledge of the great Cause where the fields are "white already to harvest", that they in turn may lead others, taking their place in the ranks when the time comes.

The Chairmen are glad to cooperate with the Rectors and leaders who are anxious to organize Junior Auxiliaries, and hope to be called upon for suggestions, if there is need, with those already established.

There are, of course, many details yet to be worked out, one of the matters to be considered being the age at which the girls should enter the

Woman's Auxiliary. The ideal is to be able to start the girls (or boys) at a very young age, from the Little Helpers, and carry them through the High School period, although we want and need them at any age. The Sunday School class makes a good nucleus and an easy step into Auxiliary work. All groups should have definite plans, fully organized with officers and an adviser of mature age.

REPORT FOR THE DISTRICT OF BROOKLYN

The year just closed has been one of activity and, we trust, of spiritual growth, and although it is difficult to tabulate results, we present some of the steps taken in our efforts towards attainment.

Seven regular business meetings have been held, also three meetings of the Evening Branches and a meeting of Juniors. Two Missionary teas for Diocesan and Indian work have been given, and the Rector and Auxiliary of St. Bartholomew's Church entertained the Diocesan Auxiliary at the Anniversary Meeting in November. At all these meetings and teas missionary speakers from many fields have presented their part in the Church's Mission.

A Lenten Meditation given by Bishop Stires; a Bible class conducted by Dr. Gass of the Church of the Incarnation, New York; a Corporate Communion celebrated by Bishop Larned at the opening session of our winter season; observance of the Armistice Day of Intercession, and of the World Day of Prayer; special summer and winter prayer leaflets set forth by our Devotional Secretary,—all have been means of help towards the greatest requisite in Auxiliary growth, self-consecration.

In an effort to stimulate leadership we have held a special conference with the chairmen of the parish branches; also a meeting of the newly appointed delegates, when greeting and instruction were given and when the Fanning memorial leaflet was presented to each member.

The Educational Committee has conducted 23 classes in Missions study in the parishes, with an attendance of 403. During the summer a letter was sent to every parish chairman with suggested ways of service during vacation time. As a practical means of giving Missionary support, at our May meeting we held a sale of linen for Miss Mansfield's Industrial Works at Dante, Virginia. Monthly calendars distributed at our meetings stress the pledges for the budget, as well as tabulate forthcoming events. A sweet courtesy done by our Literature Chairman is the sending of a Christmas greeting to our Auxiliary members and friends who need a special remembrance at that season. Our lending library stimulates reading along many lines and is not confined to Missions Study.

The meetings of the Evening Branches continue to give response to a real need, by providing evening gatherings, when Auxiliary work is brought before business women and when Missionary addresses stir enthusiasm and cooperation. Some of our strongest Auxiliary branches belong to the Evening group.

Interest in the Junior work is slowly but steadily advancing and we now have groups functioning in seven parishes. In the spring the first District Meeting of these branches was held in Christ Church, Clinton Street, when after brief greetings extended by the Rector and by several of the Diocesan officers to our young Auxiliary members, Miss Brown, one of our enthusiastic missionaries from Nevada, told stories of her picturesque work among the isolated mountain folk of that Missionary jurisdiction.

We regret to report the loss of three of our chairmen during the year, but we are happy to welcome their successors,—Mrs. J. Clarence Jones, Chairman of the Colored Committee, Mrs. Waters, Chairman of the Church Periodical Club and Mrs. Pohlman, Chairman of the Domestic Committee.

At the request of the Finance Committee of the Diocese, the District of Brooklyn assumed a quota of \$3,500 for the budget, and it has given \$3,717, with every pledge met.

Two of our beloved chairmen have left us to enter the Church Triumphant,—Mrs. John Scoble and Mrs. Heinigke, and also one who for years served as the head of the Little Helpers of the Diocese, Miss Kroger. "O, God, to us may grace be given to follow in their train."

We feel that there should be two imperative objectives for the Auxiliary,—first, to devise means of winning youth for the cause of missions, and secondly, to call to leadership in the Auxiliary the women of our Church.

As was true in Greece, 2,000 years ago, so now, we need leaders who "dare beyond their strength, hazard beyond their judgment and in extremities are of excellent hope."

REPORT FOR THE DISTRICT OF QUEENS

During the past year nine meetings have been held under the auspices of the Queens County Auxiliary, reaching, we think, over seven hundred women and girls. Beside the regular Auxiliary activities, we have presented speakers on the Philippines, China, work with Negroes, Japan and social service in our own neighborhood. We have held an officers training institute at which 73 delegates from 16 parishes heard group discussions on various phases led by specialists in those fields.

Perhaps the keynote of the year has been an awakening in social service in our own county. As a result of a speaker on the needs of the new Queens General Hospital, women of five of our branches are co-operating in motor corps service for patients who have already received hospitalization but have no means of transit for subsequent treatment. The Social Service Department of the hospital has been most enthusiastic in its recognition of the Auxiliary's part in this needed work. The Church Periodical Club similarly reports that beside a growing interest in distant service, we are serving eight institutions of Queens County.

All standing committees report activity with especially good response from supply work and juniors. We have held as usual meetings in seven different parishes, bringing the work of the Auxiliary to their very doors. The Educational Committee reports that there has been an awakened interest in reading of mission study books.

We have had a difficult time with our financial quota, and can only hope for more parishes to help next year.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

In these days of much talk of Church unity one of the encouraging signs is the work of the Interdenominational Educational Committee. Each year subjects of vital interest are suggested for special consideration. The special subjects chosen the past year were Africa and the Negro in Our Country. Though Long Island was eager to gain more knowledge of the Dark Continent and our work in Liberia, special emphasis was laid on the Negro in Our Country.

Early in the year interest in the subject was aroused by a tour of the Church Institute Singers accompanied by leaders, telling of our schools "down where the need is greatest".

By addresses of workers from the field, as well as reading and discussion groups, and illustrated talks, the Woman's Auxiliary has carried on an active educational program to give us a better understanding of these, our fellow citizens.

Other subjects such as World Peace and special Mission fields were discussed in parish groups. Besides the officers and delegates who attended the Triennial Convention, members of the Educational Committee have attended many conferences; Miss Kuhlke and Mrs. Haley, the Missions Conference at Adelynrood, Mass.; Mrs. Amos and Mrs. Jackson, the Interracial Conference at Asbury Park; Mrs. Goodwin and Miss Taplin, the Save the Children Fund Conference in New York—all bringing back a broader outlook and renewed sense of responsibility to the women of the Church.

Preparations have already begun to train leaders to present the subjects for 1938—The Church in Rural America must have a forward look—surely the clergy will cooperate with the Woman's Auxiliary in studying this subject.

For our foreign field a special study of the Moslem World is suggested and Miss Harrison and the Chairman are ready to present this subject. World Unity and the Fellowship in Faith and Work are also subjects of vital interest for discussion as a follow-up of the great conventions.

The Forward Movement literature and the "Greatest Gift Card" have a wide circulation. Prayer groups multiply and the Prayer Partnerships link us intimately with the work of Gertrude Selzer, Bessie McKim, Christine Nuno, Mary McGill, Ruth Cumnock, Mabel Mansfield and Frances Jolly.

In addition to these activities in which the whole Diocese shares, the District Secretaries report as follows:

Brooklyn: A Lenten Meditation by Bishop Stires, a Bible Class led by Dr. John A. Gass, two issues of a prayer leaflet for the District, a circulating library which includes many devotional books.

Nassau: Daughters of the King cooperating by changing their own annual Day of Prayer to coincide with The Quiet Day For Prayer. A small library. The effort to associate more Praise and Thanksgiving with Prayer especially in private prayer.

Suffolk: Appointment of Miss Bertha L. Young of Huntington as Devotional Secretary for Western Suffolk.

Queens: New parish prayer groups, outlook hopeful for more. Other encouraging signs of interest and life.
