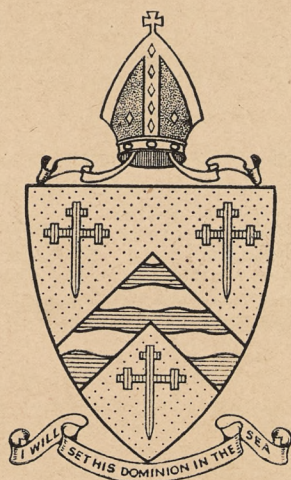

## REPORT OF PRESIDENT

This report must begin with an expression of appreciation to the Bishops, the Clergy, the visiting speakers and other guests, the officers and members of the Woman's Auxiliary who, together, have made the year 1938 one of achievement and inspiration.

In particular we must pay honor to the following past officers, Miss Mary Hunter, Mrs. William Braddon, and Miss Eveleen Harrison, who have labored most faithfully for many years, and whose untiring devotion has lent strength to us all.

The Jessie Weir Heinigke Memorial Library at St. Mark's School, Birmingham, Alabama, was dedicated on December 7th, 1938, and we trust that more gifts for it are still to come.

During the year the Provincial Synod met at Garden City; in the Woman's Auxiliary sessions we found eight dioceses represented by thirty-four delegates and eighteen alternates. We had the pleasure of serving a luncheon to the guests.

Our new Constitution was adopted.

Three diocesan meetings were held: in January, at St. George's Church, Flushing; in May, at St. John's Church, Huntington; and in November, at St. Ann's Church, Brooklyn.

For the year 1939 one of our greatest aims is to win the interest of these parishes and missions which have no active branches of the Woman's Auxiliary at present.

The times are critical: the world needs Christianity: it is our privilege and responsibility, in the Woman's Auxiliary, to do our part in the spreading of the "Good News" of the Christ.



This report is presented with gratitude for the progress we have made, and with joy in the confidence that the work will go forward as never before.

## JUNIOR AUXILIARY

The organization of the Junior Auxiliary is steadily becoming stabilized and we believe is now a decided factor in the Diocese. There are forty-six parish branches, an increase of fifteen during the past year.

District meetings have been held in Queens, Nassau and Brooklyn, semi-annually, each addressed by a missionary, and it is planned to hold a Junior *diocesan* meeting soon after Easter.

The district chairmen are working hard, and a diocesan project for the support, in part, of a child in the Good Shepherd Mission to the Navajo Indians, Fort Defiance, Arizona, is making definite progress. Some of the branches have assumed missionary responsibility of their own in caring for children in the community, or farther afield.

The branches are sharing in the Supply work, United Thank Offering, Church Periodical Club, Altar, and other Woman's Auxiliary enterprises, and through the "Spirit of Missions," informing themselves of the needs of the world.

An astonishing amount of work is revealed at the district meetings, when the girls make their reports. They are responsive, enthusiastic, and are more and more capable of leadership. These fine results give the advisers of the branches renewed courage and faith to go forward, and a vision of an Auxiliary being ever refreshed and strengthened by the addition of young, virile life.

Please consider forming a group in your parish, where girls from ten to twenty years are unoccupied, or crave this missionary experience and training. Consult first your Rector; then your district and diocesan chairmen, who are eager to help and cooperate in every way. We need the girls, we believe they need us, and the Church needs us all.

The Missions Committee feels that the most stimulating work they can do is to bring first-hand information of missionary work to each parish. Often there are workers from the field home on furlough or retired missionaries who are right at our doors. In travelling, our own members may have visited outstanding missions and have come home anxious to tell about them. There is a constant need of speakers for district and parish meetings. It will be much appreciated if anyone knowing of such will at once notify the Committee.

### DISTRICT OF BROOKLYN

Our keynote for the past year was Leadership and the Auxiliary has endeavored both corporately and individually to assume the responsibility imposed by the command of the risen Saviour: "Go ye therefore and teach all nations."



During the year eight business meetings, three meetings of the Evening Branches, a gathering of Juniors, and three missionary teas have been held, and at all of them our vision has been widened and our zeal for service kindled by the presence with us of missionaries and social service leaders who inspired us by the witness of their lives, no less than by the story of their works.

A conference of parish chairmen held in January, aimed at emphasizing the importance of cooperation between the parish branches and the diocesan organization, and at stimulating the sense of responsibility on the part of all the members. A conference of Junior leaders was helpful in formulating plans for developing that important department and a special meeting of the new delegates with the District Vice-Presidents was arranged to explain Auxiliary ways and methods and to help them select congenial fields of service in the Auxiliary program.

As a practical help to our missionaries, two sales were held at our meetings. In May the Indian Committee sponsored a sale of beadwork and other articles made by the Indians in the Niobrara Schools of South Dakota, and in December Deaconess Bechtol, from Puerto Rico, came to conduct a sale of fine linens from her industrial mission in Mayaguez.

At the request of the President, an outline of the Auxiliary plan was presented to the clergy and laymen of the Archdeaconry, hoping thereby to enlist still further the interest of the Rectors, and to enable the Auxiliary to enter more vitally into parochial and diocesan activity.

As a basis for all our work we depend upon the spiritual leadership of the Devotional Committee, and under their auspices a Lenten meditation was conducted by Father Joseph of the Order of St. Francis, who chose for his subject "The Fellowship of the Mystery."

By the distribution of devotional leaflets, by the summer and winter prayer leaflets expressly prepared for us by the Devotional Chairman and by a series of intercessions conducted by her, we have renewed our strength throughout the year. The Auxiliary participated in the Armistice Day of Prayer and in the World Day of Prayer, and we are indebted to Bishop Larned and the Reverend Mr. Dorrance for celebrating the service of Holy Communion with which we began our season in October.

The Literature Committee has provided through posters, maps and other literature all sorts of aid to our grasp of the mission fields and their needs and presides over the lending library. The chairmen sent Christmas cards to our delegates and missionary friends whom we have in our minds especially at that season.

The Missions Committees keep us informed of conditions and needs in the several fields of the Church's Mission, and we are indebted to them for planning our missionary teas.

The Educational leaders have conducted 23 sessions in 17 parishes on the subjects: "Rural America," and "The Moslem World," with an attendance of 526, and have answered many calls for informative talks on the Auxiliary.

By our monthly calendars we are informed of Auxiliary events during the winter season, and a summer letter brings us together in thought and in certain types of work, while the Auxiliary seems resting, but while the Mission work still needs our help.



The Bureau of Supplies, the United Thank Offering, the Church Periodical Club and the Altar Committee, while reporting as separate units, function as an integral part of our program.

The Hospitality Chairman and her associates are in constant attendance at our meetings and perform services not easily tabulated but eminently essential.

The three meetings of the Evening Branches as guests of various parishes are delightful features of our Auxiliary life and the enthusiasm evinced in the large attendance and the response to appeals are an inspiration to the entire District.

The District of Brooklyn accepted a quota of \$3,500.00 for the Missionary Objective and contributed \$3,734.62.

Through the open door of a new year we see vistas of challenging conditions that call for an outpouring of sacrificial leadership. In obedience to the heavenly vision may we respond with joy, "Lord here am I; send me."

#### DISTRICT OF QUEENS

During the year 1938, we have held eight meetings under the auspices of the Queens District. #### DISTRICT OF NASSAU

For a second time the Vice-President for the Nassau District has become the President of the Long Island Auxiliary. Mrs. McKechnie is still very helpful in the District. #### DISTRICT OF SUFFOLK

During 1938 three meetings were held in the District of Suffolk.

The January meeting was held on Thursday the 27th, at Grace Church, Riverhead, and was well attended, about 85 persons being present. The speaker was Mrs. Benson H. Harvey, who told of the work she and her husband do in the Philippines, and Mrs. Waller gave an outline of "Plans for 1938." On April 28th, the meeting was held at St. John's Church, Huntington, with a very good attendance. The Rev. Ernest C. Tuthill, of Tuscon, Arizona, spoke of his work in that part of the mission field, and also of his ministrations to the people who come to Tuscon for their health.

The Annual Meeting was held at St. James' Church, St. James. About 100 persons attended, and the speakers were Miss Frances Arnold, who gave an interesting account of a visit she made, in the interest of the Girls' Friendly Society, to the women in the Southern Mountains, and the Rev. J. Sherman of Farmingdale, who told of the work of Bishop Azariah in India.

At this meeting it was voted to hold all the Suffolk meetings as all-day sessions. For their objective to the Annual Missionary Quota for 1938, the District voted \$1,200.00, but in spite of strenuous efforts, the amount fell short of that amount, \$1,123.78 being raised. For the U. T. O. fifteen parishes gave \$794.77.

For 1939, \$1,200.00 was voted again, and as there has been increased interest in the Auxiliary during the year, we hope to meet our objective and, if possible, increase it. Several branches have been reorganized and a number of the younger women have come forward to take responsible positions. So, the new year is begun with increased enthusiasm and renewed faith in the work the Auxiliary is doing to bring the Gospel of our Lord to all His people.

#### RECORDING SECRETARY

The Annual Meeting of 1938 was held on January 13th, at St. George's Church, Flushing, with Mrs. Henry D. Waller presiding.

A resolution was presented to Mrs. John B. Pitman expressing appreciation of her work as president of the Auxiliary and regret at her resignation.

It was decided that the Woman's Auxiliary of Long Island would cooperate with the Church Periodical Club in donating a library to



St. Mark's School, Birmingham, Alabama, in memory of Mrs. Otto Heinigke, who had been president of the Auxiliary from 1920 to 1931, and during her long association with the Auxiliary had been an interested and devoted worker.

Mrs. Benson Harvey, wife of Canon Harvey of the Manila Cathedral, told of the work among people not born in the Philippines, but resident there for various reasons.

The Ven. Arthur Dumper, D.D., Dean of the Newark Cathedral, spoke on Church Unity, emphasizing a "Communion of Faith in Christ and His Truths."

A special meeting was held on March 4th at Grace Church, Jamaica, for the purpose of electing a new president in the place of Mrs. John B. Pitman, resigned. Mrs. Alexander R. McKechnie was unanimously elected as the President.

At this meeting the new Constitution was read in preparation for its presentation at the regular meeting in May.

Miss Alice Sweet of Splashdam, Va., told of the devastating conditions in small mining towns and the needs of the people.

The Spring Meeting was held at St. John's Church, Huntington, on May 19th, with a large attendance, about 375 being present.

At this meeting the new Constitution was adopted. Bishop Stires in his address said: "The Church should raise standards and strengthen the hands of the civil authorities by strength and example."

The Rt. Rev. Leopold Kroll, D.D., Bishop of Liberia, telling of his work in that country, said the object of the Church was to build ideals, to teach the people to understand responsibility and to teach them to live.

There was a large attendance at the Anniversary Meeting on November 10th, at St. Ann's Church, Brooklyn.

Officers for the new term were elected.

The Rev. Charles H. Webb, Director of the Church Charity Foundation, spoke in the morning and gave a graphic account of this great work being done in our midst, and urged the realization of personal responsibility to this many sided foundation of beneficence.

Miss Nellie McKim from Japan, and Mrs. Grafton Burke from Alaska, were the speakers in the afternoon. Both speakers dwelt on the importance of work with children, for through them the homes of the present are reached, as are also the homes of the future.

The study of approaches to Unity urged upon the Auxiliary members. John Oxenham's Hymn of Peace sung at Diocesan meetings and many hundreds circulated.



One hundred and fifty copies of "Prayers New and Old" sold.

Closer co-operation with other Communions in planning for the World Day of Prayer.

Inauguration of the May Day Luncheon with representatives of many Communions attending.

For the coming year we offer a revised list of *Suggestions* and we urge a wider use of the publications of the Forward Movement Commission.

Any Branch desiring to enter into Prayer Partnership with a worker in the field may receive the name of a Missionary who has signified her desire for such partnership. The assignments are made by the Church Missions House through the Diocesan Devotional Chairman. For the Branch such partnership means friendship, knowledge of the Partner's field of work and intercession for her; for the Missionary it means the prayers, sympathy and understanding of friends—perhaps unknown and far away—who believe in the power of intercession and practice it.

been doing with zeal, but give our minds and hearts to some new and stirring adventure in this great field.

#### EDUCATION

In this critical time it is most important that every serious minded woman be informed on, not only her own church matters, but, as much as possible, everything pertaining to the progress and defense of Christianity. The Pearl of Great Price must be preserved for all time. With this in mind, the Committee on Education is gratified to report that after the great conferences at Oxford and Edinburgh, many programs at both district and parish meetings presented the reports and findings. Discussion groups of not only their own members, but often those of other denominations, met to study means of promoting cooperation and unity, and the possibility of forming an ecumenical church.

The Moslem World was also a most interesting subject, though the Woman's Auxiliary of Long Island devoted more time to the Church and Rural America. Speakers from the field and members of the Church Army aroused much interest in our needs in the neglected areas. Contributions were sent of clothes and books, many to the workers connected with the Save-the-Children-Fund. A voluntary collection at Study Classes amounting to \$27.41 was sent to the Church Army.

In Brooklyn, as usual, over five hundred women were reached at group meetings held mostly in Lent. In the other districts, though similar meetings were held with a like attendance of from thirty to sixty or seventy, there were more parish reading groups of ten to twenty, led by their own educational secretaries, holding meetings during Lent. Again the Committee urges that educational secretaries should be appointed in every parish—Rectors please take notice.

Summer conferences were attended by many of our Woman's Auxiliary members on Long Island, in New York, and at Adelynrood, Massachusetts, as well as the Synod Meeting at Garden City. In October, the Queens District Woman's Auxiliary held a successful two day Institute at the House of Retreat and Rest, of the Sisters of the Nativity, Bavshore. Fifty women attended and addresses were made by Mrs. William Dickey, Secretary of the United Thank Offering, Diocese of New York, Mrs. Lewis W. Francis, Vice-President of the Brooklyn District, Miss Elsie Hutton, President of the Woman's Auxiliary of the



Second Province, and the Rev. Jonathan G. Sherman, who spoke on India, and Bishop Azariah.

As 1938 closed, Christians all over the world were awaiting the return of their representatives from the International Missionary Council at Madras. From this will come first hand information of the progress of Christianity in India, one of the subjects chosen for special study this winter of 1938-39, and an appeal to rally to the Call of Christ to fight His enemies in the world today. Again we shall have a wealth of inspiration in the reports of this Conference.

At home we have for our subject "The Church and the City," with much general material provided in books such as "The American City and Its Church," by Samuel C. Kinchloe, and a series of pamphlets, "The Church and Urban America," by members of the Episcopal Church. A fine series of articles will be found in "The Spirit of Missions," which magazine should be read by every church family.

The Committee will help plan programs and any parish wishing to study India may apply to Miss Eveleen Harrison.

#### DAILY VACATION BIBLE SCHOOLS

The intensive program of our Daily Vacation Bible Schools is carried along the line of our three objectives in the Woman's Auxiliary: Religious Education, Christian Social Service and Evangelism, thus training our boys and girls for leadership in the future.

Five days a week, for four or five weeks in the summer, provides far reaching influences in the lives of our young people, and combines the happy result of filling our empty parish houses with idle children and teachers.

Our Diocesan Auxiliary contributed \$505.00 for the schools, and this was supplemented by gifts from individual church schools, so that the total for 1938 reached the good sum of \$766.32.

The schools were placed in our Mission centers, where they met a great need. Three in Brooklyn: Christ Chapel, St. Barnabas, and Church of Our Saviour, Gerritsen Beach; and two in Queens: Church of the Resurrection, Corona, and St. Stephen's Church, Jamaica.

Twenty-five teachers and one supervisor covered the field, and the expenses included fees for the training school for teachers, supplies for each school, printing and salaries.

Next summer the committee hopes to open two more schools in our crowded districts. It can be done, if each Auxiliary branch will add something to the offering given last year. We are a part of the Forward Movement of our Church, and have pledged ourselves to carry on the great work of extending the Church of Christ throughout our diocese, nation and world.

## CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

### CONSTITUTION

#### ARTICLE I—NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Long Island Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council of the Protestant Episcopal Church of the United States of America.

#### ARTICLE II—OBJECT

The object shall be to unite the women of the Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Long Island in order to cooperate with the National Council in fulfilling the mission of the Church.

#### ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. All baptized women and girls are potential members of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Sec. 2. Active members are those who aid by prayer, work and offering. Delegates shall be appointed by the Rector or Priest-in-Charge.

Sec. 3. Honorary members are those whom the organization wishes to honor, and whose names have been recommended by the Executive Board. They must be elected at an open meeting of the organization.

#### ARTICLE IV—OFFICERS

The officers of this organization shall be a president, seven vice-presidents, namely: the first, Vice-President-at-Large, who may be the retiring president; the second, Vice-President in charge of Missions; the third, Vice-President in charge of Special Committees; and the remaining four, in charge of the Districts of Brooklyn, Queens, Nassau, and Suffolk; a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, a Treasurer, an Assistant Treasurer, and a Treasurer of the United Thank Offering. These officers shall be elected.

#### ARTICLE V—AMENDMENTS

The Constitution may be amended at any diocesan meeting by a two-thirds vote, one vote being accorded to each parish represented at the meeting. Notice shall be given at the previous meeting and read at a meeting of each District.

### BY - LAWS

#### ARTICLE I—DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section. 1. The President shall preside at all diocesan meetings, meetings of the Executive Board, appoint chairmen of committees and be a member ex-officio of all committees. In the absence of the President, the vice-presidents shall preside in constitutional order.

Sec. 2. The Vice-President-at-Large shall perform such duties as may be assigned to her by the President.

The Vice-President for Missions shall inform the District Chairman of Missions through conference, visiting, or providing speakers, of the needs and work in the mission field. Further, it shall be her duty to procure the speakers for the diocesan meetings.

The Vice-President of Special Committees shall be responsible for the presentation of all matters pertaining to special committees.

Sec. 3.—The Vice-President of each district shall preside at all meetings in her district. She shall be responsible for carrying out in her district the policies of the Executive Board.

Sec. 4. The Recording Secretary shall record and read the minutes and prepare the Year Book with the help of a committee. The Assistant Recording Secretary is responsible for the mailing list.

Sec. 5. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to the correspondence of the Auxiliary, and send out the notices of meetings.



Sec. 6. The Treasurer shall receive and disburse all funds of the organization, except the United Thank Offering and the district expense funds. She shall keep accounts thereof, and shall report at each meeting of the Executive Board, and at diocesan meetings.

The Assistant Treasurer shall receive moneys for the diocesan expenses.

The annual report shall be audited by an experienced accountant.

Sec. 7—The United Thank Offering Treasurer shall receive and take charge of all moneys contributed for the cause.

The annual report shall be audited by an experienced accountant.

Sec. 8. There shall be chairmen of standing committees, namely: Finance, Supply, Altar, Education, Devotion, Social Service, Hospitality, Literature, and the Junior Auxiliary.

Sec. 9. The Executive Board shall consist of the above officers and the chairmen of standing committees. It shall also include the Director of the Church Periodical Club.

The Executive Board shall be entrusted with planning the business of the organization.

It shall meet on the Monday preceding the first Thursday of the month, from October to May inclusive.

Sec. 10. It shall be the duty of the Vice-President of each district to appoint a substitute to represent the district in the event of her absence at meetings of the Board.

#### ARTICLE II—MEETINGS

Section 1. There shall be three diocesan meetings a year, i.e., the Anniversary Meeting and Elections in November, the Annual Meeting in January, and the Spring Meeting in May.

Sec. 2. District meetings shall be held at the discretion of the District Executive Board. It is recommended that no less than five district meetings be held a year, and that such meetings do not conflict with the diocesan meetings. It is recommended that meetings for the districts be arranged as follows:

Nassau .....	1st Thursday
Brooklyn .....	2nd Thursday
Queens .....	3rd Thursday
Suffolk .....	4th Thursday

#### ARTICLE III—ELECTIONS AND NOMINATIONS

Section 1. Diocesan officers shall be elected at the November diocesan meeting.

Sec. 2. District officers shall be elected at the December district meeting with the exception of Suffolk officers, who shall be elected at the October meeting.

Sec. 3. The President, the First, Second, and Third Vice-Presidents, the Secretary, the Treasurer, and their Assistants (diocesan) shall be elected for a term of three years with the privilege of re-election for one term only.

Sec. 4. The Diocesan Treasurer for the United Thank Offering shall be elected once every three years after the General Convention, with the privilege of re-election for one term only.

Sec. 5. The District Vice-Presidents shall be elected for a term of two years with the privilege of re-election for one term only. Election of a Vice-President for the Districts of Suffolk and Queens shall take place in the uneven years. Like elections for the Districts of Brooklyn and Nassau shall take place in the even years.

Sec. 6. All district officers shall be elected.

Sec. 7. A nominating committee of one from each district, and one at large shall be appointed by the Chair at the May Diocesan Meeting. The ticket shall be presented at the October meeting of each



district. For district elections, a nominating committee of three shall be appointed by the District Vice-President in October, to prepare a ticket for the December election, with the exception of Suffolk. This committee shall be appointed at the April meeting.

Sec. 8. The vote shall be by ballot. Each parish shall be entitled to one vote.

Sec. 9. The results of elections and appointments of chairmen shall be submitted, with addresses, in writing to the corresponding secretary, who in turn will notify the officers.

Sec. 10. In case an office should become vacant before the expiration of the term, it may be filled for the balance of the year in which the vacancy occurs, by appointment by the President with the advice and consent of the Executive Board, and the remainder, if any, of the unexpired term shall be filled by election at the next Anniversary and Election Meeting.

#### ARTICLE IV—GENERAL CONVENTION

Section 1. Delegates and Alternates to the General Convention shall be nominated by a committee consisting of three, from the Executive Board. They shall be voted upon at the regular February meeting of the Executive Board, preceding the meeting of the General Convention. The report of such elections shall be sent at once to the National Board of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Sec. 2. Fifty dollars shall be set aside each year from the Expense Account for the President's expenses to the General Convention.

#### ARTICLE V—AMENDMENTS

By-laws may be adopted, suspended or repealed at any regular diocesan meeting by a two-thirds vote of parishes present.

#### ARTICLE VI—ORDER OF BUSINESS

"Roberts Rules of Order Revised" shall govern all meetings. Committee:
