The Woman's Auxiliary asks the prayers of the Church on the Festival of the Transfiguration of Christ (August 6th), the Auxiliary's “Altar Day.”

The following resolution was unanimously adopted at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, St. John's Church, Los Angeles, May 24, 1898, and endorsed the following day by the Diocesan Convention, with the addition that where practicable the offerings be devoted to the General Fund of the Woman's Auxiliary, *viz.*:

*Resolved*, That we set apart the Feast of the Epiphany for an Auxiliary Day, and that, as members of the Auxiliary, we consider it not only a privilege but a duty to attend the services held on that day in the parish to which we belong; and further,

*Resolved*, That, should the appointment of this day meet with the approbation of the clergymen of the Diocese, they be requested to offer, at the celebration of the Holy Eucharist on the Feast of the Epiphany, special prayers for the work of the Auxiliary.

O Almighty Father, Who didst vouchsafe to Thy chosen ones on the mount the comforting vision of the glory that shall be revealed, to strengthen and cheer them in their Apostolic work, we beseech Thee to be with Thy servants, the members of the Woman's Auxiliary of this Diocese, in all their efforts for the spread of the Kingdom of Thy dear Son. ## Minutes of the Seventh Annual Meeting.

---

ST. PAUL'S PRO-CATHEDRAL,  
LOS ANGELES, May 12, A.D. 1903.

At 9 a.m. a Conference of Diocesan and Parish Branch officers was held in St. Paul's Parish Hall, presided over by the President, Mrs. Hubert, who opened the meeting with the Auxiliary prayers.

It was voted that an Annual Meeting Fund should be formed, to be used in entertaining delegates to the annual meeting; this fund to be raised by pledges from each branch in the Diocese.

At the Annual Conference of the previous year, it was voted that the number of delegates to be entertained will be one for every six members in a branch, or fraction of six.

At 10 a.m. the Holy Eucharist was celebrated, the Rt. Rev. the Bishop of the Diocese officiating; the Rev. Henderson Judd, epistoler, and the Very Rev. Dr. J. J. Wilkins, gospeler.

The sermon was preached by the Rev. F. F. Johnson, of Redlands.

Immediately after service the meeting organized for business, the President, Mrs. Hubert, in the chair. Roll-call was responded to by 164 persons, from 28 parishes and missions. Sixteen delegates responded for the Babies' Branch, and 24 for the Junior Auxiliary.

The report of the Recording Secretary, Mrs. Spencer, was read and accepted.

At noon the Bishop offered the noon-day prayers for Missions.

Mrs. T. McF. Patten, of Redlands, Vice-President of the Riverside District, reported the work done at the district meetings, from their beginning to the present time. This report was heard with interest, and was accepted.

Reports were read and accepted from Mrs. Hubbard, Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club; Dr. Anita E. Tyng, Secretary of Missions Classes; Mrs. Friesner, Secretary of the Babies' Branch, and Deaconess Grebe, Secretary of the Junior Auxiliary.

Mrs. Bugbee read a letter just received from Mrs. Prévost, wife of the Rev. Jules Prévost, missionary at Tanana, Alaska, thanking the ladies for the boxes sent last year, and giving many interesting details of the work there.

An interesting letter from Miss Mason, missionary teacher and hospital worker at Tanana, was also read.

The meeting then adjourned for luncheon, to which the clergy and delegates were invited by the city and neighboring branches of the Auxiliary.

At 2 p.m. the Auxiliary reconvened for business. Mrs. J. H. Johnson read her report of the Altar Department, which was accepted. She also read a letter from the wife of Bishop Restarick, telling of altar needs in Honolulu, and her hopes and aspirations for a much-needed new altar and furnishings for the Cathedral.

The Treasurer's report was read by Mrs. Cowles, and referred to the Auditing Committee.

Mrs. Lemmon, chairman of the S. R. Miller Building Fund Committee, reported \$575.54 on hand toward the proposed house.

Mrs. Miller reviewed the great progress made by the Indians under her training, and spoke of the urgent necessity of a proper house to work and live in.

The offering of the day, amounting to \$53.78, was devoted to General Missions.

The Bishop spoke of the Quarterly Collection for Diocesan Missions, and stated that he had asked the Woman's Auxiliary to distribute the pledge envelopes regularly, and to assist the clergy in explaining the necessity of this collection.

Regret was expressed that our honored Vice-President, Miss Towell, was unable, through ill-health, to be present at the meeting, and the Secretary was instructed to convey to her an unanimous vote of sympathy.

The President explained the Apportionment Fund and our obligation of raising our share of the \$100,000 pledged at the last Triennial meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary.

The Vice-President was then called to the chair, while Mrs. Hubert made a motion, to be acted upon at the next annual meeting, that the following section be added to the Constitution, to read:

Section 7. An Annual Quiet Day shall be held in this Diocese, on or within the octave of the Feast of the Epiphany.

The President then read her Annual Address.

Pledges were taken for the General Working Fund, the Bishop's Auxiliary Fund, and the Altar Fund.

The President read a letter of greeting from Bishop P. T. Rowe, of Alaska, written especially for this meeting; also a personal letter from Bishop Restarick, of Honolulu.

Mrs. Cowles then read an appeal from Bishop Restarick, also written for this meeting; and Bishop Johnson emphasized the importance of the work being done by Bishop Restarick in Honolulu, and endorsed whatever assistance the Auxiliary could extend.

The Bishop then re-appointed all the Diocesan officers, with the exception of the Treasurer, to which office he appointed Miss Emily A. Brown in place of Mrs. Butler, who is indefinitely absent from Los Angeles.

The meeting adjourned with the Bishop's benediction.

### Report of the Recording Secretary.

There have been during the year one special and ten regular meetings of the Diocesan officers, with an average attendance of seven.

August 26, the regular Quarterly Meeting was held in Santa Monica, at the Church of St. Augustine-by-the-Sea. About one hundred were present at the reverent service in the church; eighty received the Holy Communion.

After a bountiful lunch, served by the women of the parish, a conference of Diocesan and branch officers was held.

At the afternoon meeting, in the hall, the Rev. Mr. Browne welcomed the Auxiliary to Santa Monica.

The President, Mrs. Hubert, made an address, and spoke of her pleasure in meeting so many Auxiliary workers.

Mrs. Hubbard, Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, and Dr. Tyng, Secretary of the Missions Classes, read their Annual Reports, for which there had not been time at the Annual Meeting in May.

Mrs. Bugbee read a paper on Alaska, and the Rev. Mr. Church gave a talk on the progress of St. Athanasius' Mission, in Los Angeles; and the offertory, of \$27.25, was given to the building fund of that Mission.

In November, Mrs. Hubert invited the Bishop and clergy of the Diocese to meet the Diocesan officers of the Woman's Auxiliary, to

hold a conference at her home, to discuss methods of work and for mutual understanding. The Bishop and twelve of the clergy were present.

December 11, a Quiet Day was held in St. Athanasius' Church, conducted by the Rt. Rev. the Bishop. The offering, \$12.25, was devoted to General Missions.

March 17, the third Quarterly Meeting was held in All Saints' Parish House, Pasadena. This also was well attended; the hall was filled to its capacity. Mrs. Hubert presided.

Mrs. J. H. Johnson gave an interesting account of her recent trip to Mexico with the Bishop.

Miss Leffingwell spoke of her personal work among the Chinese in Honolulu.

The offering, \$40, was devoted to General Missions.

### Report of the Junior Auxiliary.

Allow me to make a confession. As I began this, my second yearly report, I remarked to one standing near, "This is a short year with the Juniors;" for, somehow, there had been present throughout the year a feeling that we were not doing as much as heretofore. There had been less encouraging letters, fewer new branches, and, it seemed, fewer boxes (probably I have gotten used to boxes, and it requires more of them to satisfy me). Be that as it may; when the amounts were added, imagine my glad surprise to find that we had gone beyond all previous years. These are the figures:

Having taken you, by these figures, into the joy of being a Diocesan Secretary, I would mention other signs of growth. First, there is an awakening interest in scholarships. One clergyman and his wife visited Honolulu on their summer vacation. As a result of the enthusiasm which they brought back, the little folk of their mission have raised \$25 as part payment of a scholarship in the Priory school at Honolulu. And now I am wishing that all our clergy and their wives, and members of the Auxiliary, would spend their vacation in some mission field, and come back filled with enthusiasm, and stir the stay-at-homes to greater things. One Sunday-school teacher spent an hour with your Secretary visiting the district of Asheville. Now her class of eight boys has half the money needed for a scholarship at Asheville, N. C.; and a Sunday-school noted for its missionary zeal is fast raising the amount needed for one at St. Augustine's, Raleigh, N. C.

In this desire to begin new work, however, we must each bear in mind that, as a Diocesan branch of the Junior Auxiliary, we are already pledged \$50 to the support of the Bishop Johnson scholarship at St. Mary's, Shanghai, China; and until each branch has helped to fulfil this obligation, it is not free to take up new work.

One of our branches has so stirred the depths of missionary enthusiasm that the ripples have been felt around the world, and, on account of it, these words have come to me from Miss Emery, New York: "The Los Angeles Junior Auxiliary is *fine*; please send us accounts of all your doings." True to the Divine promise, one member has made the whole to rejoice.

To-day we welcome three new branches—All Saints', Pasadena, in charge of Mrs. Blankenhorn, assisted by Miss Walton; Mission of the Angels, in charge of Mrs. Spencer, assisted by Miss Coryell; and Trinity, Redlands, in charge of Mrs. Logie, assisted by Mrs. Martin. And we report the reorganization of two—one of them among the very first to start a Junior branch—Epiphany, in charge of Mrs. Fillmore, and St. Andrew's, South Pasadena, in charge of Mrs. Dunn, assisted by Mrs. Perkins. Each of these five branches have sent in boxes that are a credit to them and to the Auxiliary.

From many these messages have been received: "We are studying about missions;" "Our children attend the study classes faithfully." *Receive these words* from every branch, and our work would go forward in bounds; for "Knowledge is power."

To me the greatest sign of growth is what has been done in the Sunday-schools. *Eight* of the schools in the Diocese are using the Missionary Leaflet on fifth Sundays, and a resolution was passed by

unanimous vote, at the Sunday-School Institute, recommending their use in all our schools. I would suggest that our Junior officers see that they have their heritage in their parish or mission school.

The Institute has also provided for three meetings a year of delegates and Sunday-school workers, to be held at the Pro-Cathedral, Bishop Johnson presiding, when the Diocesan, Foreign and Domestic Missionary work of the Church shall be brought before the Sunday-schools, not only to increase the Advent and Lenten offerings for missions, but to bring the whole subject, and the duties in connection therewith, more prominently before the teachers and scholars. I consider the work done in connection with the Sunday-schools of primary importance, for there we have all the children (boys and girls), teachers, officers and rectors together, considering *why* it is necessary for missions to exist, and *our* business, as baptized people, to help the Christ accomplish the work for which He became incarnate.

### Report of the Altar Department.

It is generally conceded that figures are uninteresting, so I will not burden you with a detailed account of the work in this department; yet I feel sure that all the members of the guild will be glad to hear a summary of the work accomplished during the past year.

The new altar was given to St. Mark's, Glendale, and this gift so stimulated the members of the little Mission that they made a successful effort toward raising the required amount for the interior finishing of the church.

Many of us have been interested in the little band of workers in Saticoy, Ventura county. They were anxious for the services of the Church, but were without any of the necessary adjuncts for such worship. Our appeal for help met with a generous response, so we were able to send altar hangings, surplice, stole and altar linen. I think a large amount has been raised toward the building fund for the new mission, but more money is needed, and I hope the faithful workers

may be encouraged, in the near future, by gifts that will enable them to continue the good work so successfully begun.

All Saints', Pasadena, was the recipient of handsome purple hangings, so we were benefited by their gift, as the former hangings, together with a silk chalice veil and burse, were sent to Trinity Mission, Hueneme.

The beautiful memorial altar given to St. Athanasius' enabled that Mission to send the one in former use to the Mission Room at Garvanza, where early services are often held instead of in the church, which at present is not so accessible. This guild has also given a handsome new altar, valued at one hundred dollars, to St. Paul's, Santa Paula. We can not but be proud of this Mission, which, so few years years since, came into existence, almost wholly dependent upon the assistance of others.

Many other missions and guilds were aided in various ways, so you can appreciate the work is going on, and all the guilds are doing their part toward assisting those less blessed than themselves.

Later they had light refreshments (or "the party," as children always call them). In this way all became acquainted, and parted knowing something of the missions for which they were working, and were more interested than ever before, and determined to make their branch a success.

At Easter their mite boxes were opened, the money put in a small white satin bag, with forget-me-nots painted upon it, and drawn together with a ribbon of baby blue. This was placed, by one of the

"little helpers," on the plate at the service on Easter Sunday, as their offering. Across the bag, and on a wider ribbon, is the name of the branch—St. Athanasius.

I think it would be well if we could all learn a lesson from this branch, and have some little "parties" in our different parishes. The children would then learn to enjoy putting their pennies in their boxes, and would know *why* they were putting them there.

Our offering is smaller than usual this year, owing to the illness, at Easter, of several of the secretaries, who were unable to gather in the pennies, but we hope these amounts will be collected soon, and can then be added to our next year's report.

We now number 17 librarians and 105 contributors, through whose efforts 69 Church and 37 secular papers have been circulated each week, and 14 Church and 69 secular periodicals each month. Boxes have been shipped as follows:

But the latest and most interesting feature of our year's work is the sending out of our Church Periodical Club traveling libraries, in which our Los Angeles branch has taken the initiative. Five cases have been very creditably filled. Over forty dollars' worth of new books were put in them, and nearly all the other books were almost as good as new.

The Robert Beach Boothe memorial is at Monte Vista; the Albert Gallatin Goodall memorial, at Moreno; the William Gold Hubbard, at San Jacinto; the Rev. George Franklin Bugbee, at the Needles; while the Bishop Johnson case awaits shipment. These cases contain 237 bound books, 49 with paper covers, and 47 periodicals.

## CONSTITUTION.

I. This Society shall be called the LOS ANGELES BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

II. The object of the Society is: By systematic and united effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among the women of the Diocese, to promote the study of missions, and to encourage prayer for missions.

III. The Church itself is the great Missionary Society, and every person, by baptism, becomes a member of this Society; therefore, every baptized woman in the Diocese is a member of the Woman's Auxiliary. But terms of membership in any parish branch shall be fixed by that branch.

IV. All Parish Societies that so desire may become branches of this Auxiliary, first obtaining the consent of the Rector or Clergyman in charge, by appointing a Secretary and notifying the President of their intention to work in unison with the Auxiliary.

V. A President, a First Vice-President, a Vice-President over such divisions of the Diocese as the Bishop may counsel, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, a Secretary of the Junior Department, a Secretary of the Babies' Branch, a Directress of the Altar Department, a Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, a Secretary of the Missions Classes, and an officer over any other department that may be formed, shall be appointed by the Bishop.

VI. The Annual Meeting shall be held at the time of the Diocesan Convention, and Quarterly Meetings on such dates and in such places as the President may appoint. General meetings may be arranged by the Vice-Presidents, in their respective districts.

## BY-LAWS.

I. The duty of the President shall be to preside at the meetings of the Society, and have general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop. The First Vice-President shall act for the President in her absence, and assist her in the care and oversight of the work. The duty of the other Vice-Presidents shall be to preside in the absence of

the President at the general meetings held in their several charges, and to co-operate with the President in the supervision of the work of the Auxiliary in the sections to which they respectively belong.

2. It shall be the duty of the Corresponding Secretary, under the direction of the President, to correspond with the General Secretary of the Auxiliary and the various branches of the Diocese, to furnish them with work, to collect their reports, and to prepare an annual report.

3. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of meetings, to keep a record of such meetings, and to prepare an abstract of the minutes for the annual report.

4. The Treasurer shall keep an account of all moneys received and expended, and make a report at the Annual Meeting.

5. The Secretary of the Junior Department, the Secretary of the Babies' Branch, the Directress of the Altar Department, the Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, and the Secretary of the Missions Classes shall superintend their several departments, in consultation with the other Diocesan Officers.

6. The Secretaries of Parish Branches are required to correspond with the Diocesan Officers, who *alone correspond* with the General Secretary and the Secretaries of the Board of Missions, and transmit to them all moneys.

7. Each Parish Branch shall make an annual pledge, according to its ability, to the current expenses and work of the Diocesan Branch, and also to the Bishop's Auxiliary Fund for Diocesan work.

8. At the Annual Meeting, each branch represented shall be entitled to but one vote on business of general import.

---

This Constitution and By-laws may be amended by a motion being made at the Annual Meeting, and voted on the following year.

## Address of the President.

*To the Right Rev. the Bishop and Members of the Woman's Auxiliary:*

The officers' reports to which you have just listened have given you so clear an insight into our year's work, it is not necessary for me to dwell in detail upon the different departments of our organization.

The work has been carried on earnestly, and we hope that our endeavors to satisfy both our superiors and those whom we represent, may please the members at large, in so far as to make them recognize that directness of purpose and perseverance in the face of many obstacles has been our loving and steadfast aim. How far results have been accomplished must be judged by the reports which have been offered to you to-day.

A number of the branches have been visited by your President, but being new in office, it was first necessary to learn many details in connection with the work, before visits could be undertaken intelligently and discussions with the various branches entered into. It will be desirable to extend that personal intercourse during the coming year.

The branches which have been visited during the past twelve months are San Diego, Santa Ana, Long Beach, San Bernardino (including representatives from Riverside, Redlands, Ontario and Colton); also Pasadena and Garvanza, and in the city, Church of the Epiphany, Church of the Ascension, Juniors of the Ascension, and St. Paul's, Anaheim (with representatives from Fullerton, Orange), Ontario and Pomona. New branches have been organized at Glendale and St. Luke's, Vernon.

A departure from the usual lines of our work was requested of us by the Bishop, in regard to assisting the clergy with the envelope system for increasing the Diocesan Missionary Fund, and for this end a conference was held between the Bishop, the clergy and diocesan officers, to plan and adopt the best means of working together. The number of clergy who responded to the invitation to meet and discuss this matter was most encouraging, and correspondence was carried on with the out-of-town clergy and branches, resulting in the acceptance of the present system, viz.: sending the pledge envelopes to every parish in the Diocese, through the Woman's Auxiliary. Only one parish failed to co-operate with this plan. We earnestly hope this important fund will increase steadily and systematically until larger possibilities may

be attained and the necessities of the Diocese be more generally supplied. We remember always, and sincerely desire it to be understood, that we *do* recognize our work to be a supplementary one, and are, therefore, happy to co-operate in the undertaking of this additional work, though it is somewhat foreign to our usual limits.

Since last May, when it was reported that six bales of clothing had been sent to Alaska, we have to report an extra bale and additional box of medicines shipped to Bishop Rowe, at Sitka, in July. This Lent, the usual work for Alaska has been continued, the result of last week's packing showing the same zealous interest in supplying the needs of the faithful workers there. We should be glad to receive any special donation toward extra medicine. This is one of the most important things to send. Bishop Rowe himself has not been very well since we had the pleasure of seeing and hearing him last year, and, after returning from an arduous canoe trip, was particularly in need of medicines and personally grateful for what we had sent. Several times he has emphasized this need. Emergencies constantly arise where it is imperative for him to first fulfil the functions of physician before those of the priest. Serving the physical as well as the spiritual necessities throughout his wide and scattered diocese, seem often to go hand in hand in his ministrations, and he therefore appreciates every box of medicine.

We are glad to report that two missionaries have gone into the field this year from our Diocese. Miss Owen and her work are too familiar to need more than a passing mention, but we are thankful that one from our midst has gone forth to carry the glad tidings into a distant land, and the Woman's Auxiliary was happy to combine with the clergy in arranging to hold a service at the Pro-Cathedral, where a celebration of the Holy Communion was offered to ask blessings on her work and safety in her long journey.

Shortly after this came the happy intelligence that Mrs. Miller had prepared one of her Indian girls to go to Pyramid Lake, Nevada, to assist in teaching among her own people. The personal loss of Frances La Chappe was a severe test to Mrs. Miller, but no higher tribute can be paid her on the success of her training, so soon to have prepared this Indian girl for such a fine work. Surely a wise Providence directed the choosing of so devoted and zealous a worker as she who is giving her strength, courage and interest to these Indian children of San Diego county.

We have listened to much business to-day; discussed ways and means, and emphasized the need of work; but in dwelling on these necessary preliminaries we must not lose sight of the true spirit of our

organization. Pleasing to our vanity as it may be to work for results, it is still more important to bear in mind that a deeper, nobler aim is set before us in the spiritual development of our own lives; it were a mockery did not the work and devotion go hand in hand; and, having done all, the results are not our responsibility.

The note of spiritual joy should be the essence of missionary work, for joy is strength, and the Epistles teem with texts that we shall be joyful. Such work must mean deep trials, great deprivations, anxious watchings, and oft-times slow developments; but out of all this discipline must spring the strength which comes of joy alone, that joy born of the recognition of Christ's command, joy in the endeavor to fulfil this command, and such joy shall be the strength of our work. When we have more fully come to understand the privilege of belonging to an organization with such high possibilities, we will the more eagerly voice the glad tidings to our neighbor, increase our numbers, and strive more zealously to extend His work. It is not an easy work; it is one full of undeniable responsibilities. Woman's place in the field is oft-times won at the cost of very great opposition, almost persecution, and yet even the priest can not alone pierce the seclusion and custom of ages, in such a country, for instance, as China, but must have the support and co-operation of the woman worker as an intermediary; to talk, to teach, to prepare the Christian converts for the ministrations of the Church. Of such importance is this fact, that the next United Offering Fund is to be applied to sending women workers into the field and meet in some measure this crying need. A recently returned missionary from China tells us that it is a mental shock to a Chinese woman to be examined by a man. It is essential for them to be trained and prepared for baptism and confirmation by *women*. Their lives have known no outward joy; where it is thought worth while to let girl babies live at all, they grow up into lives of utter seclusion, absolute submission and unquestioning patience. This custom of centuries can not be overcome at once, and the Gospel must be brought to them, primarily, through the loving, patient, instinctive sympathy of Christian women, before the priestly office can begin. The increasing tolerance of education among the Chinese women is a most hopeful sign, but their first training lies largely in the province of our missionary women, and a further urgent need is the demand for Christian nurses; and as we face these imperative calls, and remember that in 1904 our United Offering is going to equip a larger number of our brave women for these incalculably great opportunities, shall we not endeavor to fill our "blue boxes" to the brim, and bear in mind that every thought of thankfulness in our own lives which we acknowledge by this grate-

ful tribute, will help carry cheer, strength and the new light into these oppressed human lives, by enlarging the possibilities of our women workers, working for women.

During a recent trip to New York, I have somewhat studied methods and conditions there. The branch is most active and in a position to come much in personal touch with speakers from every quarter of the globe, and thus have the stimulus of ever freshly-awakened interest and wide intelligence. I have striven to bring back some glimmerings of this stimulating atmosphere, and as we tell off another mile-post to-day, in the completion of our seventh year, I urge upon you, dear co-workers, to start on our eighth year as though it were a fresh beginning, encouraged by all the good and acceptable work that has been accomplished, but with a determination that next year will be more prolific in development of interest in our work than ever before; more helpful by the many new members we intend to bring in; stronger because of the sense of personal responsibility. Not only must the officers work, but every individual member must let her officers know that she is doing her own part, and a strong, united effort to uphold each other's hands will increase and elevate our possibilities to a nobler accomplishment and endeavor to fulfil the Christ command.

Let me again urge the great obligation of daily prayers for missions, remembering that only so can our work begin, continue, and be a spiritual reality. Without the daily prayer our interest can be but lukewarm; with it our hearts must daily glow with loving desire to stretch out the hand of Christian fellowship, and our own lives rise to a higher level, by losing ourselves and being found again in the loving intercourse with our fellow-men. If we have striven to be earnest these past years, let us strive to re-double our energies in the year opening before us.

We are apt to enjoy such a meeting as we are holding to-day. There is an enthusiasm in the exchange of thought and interest; we are pleased to see faces perhaps not seen for a year; we are strengthened by the discussion of a congenial subject. We feel ready to be up and doing, brave to do and dare; but when a few days have passed we shall disperse, and after the first flush of excitement in telling the home branch of all the good desires and resolutions formed under the inspiration of this meeting, and we disband from all work for the summer, shall we allow our thoughts to grow lax and our plans passive? In repose we grow; the plant must have its quiet period of rest between blossoming seasons; the earth must have its nightly darkness between the daytime sun; the body sleeps in inactive passivity certain hours out of every twenty-four; yet no waste of time goes on.

There is no waste in Nature; during that period when the plant is seemingly dead, its functions are developing underground in quiet but unerring certainty. We do not *see* the passing of minutes into hours through the darkness, but we know that the dark hours are progressing steadily into dawn, and dawn into the full light of day. Our wearied bodies find refreshment in sleep, but our soul needs no such physical rest, but travels onward until we waken again to reality and activity, refreshed we scarce know why, save that sleep has been the course of nature, and we have acceded to and not defied its mandate. So must all things work together for good, when we fulfil the natural laws.

Just so are system and habit essential to the progress of our work. It can not be properly done spasmodically. We can not pick up our thread of interest from meeting to meeting, give it little thought between times, and expect results. This work is Christ's legacy, and it must become a part of ourselves in the habit of DAILY prayer and thoughts and plans for it. Therefore, when we disperse for the summer, and the work is seemingly abandoned for these several summer months to come, do not let us put it aside with the thought, "When autumn comes I'll take up this duty again." There would be no real heart in such a mental attitude; and during the quiet season, when on the surface so little activity is apparent, let us sow the thought that is to become the act, sow the act that is to become the habit, and keep our minds alive to take advantage of every passing opportunity to ennable and enlarge our possibilities.

Let there be no summer forgetfulness. When we meet the stranger at the seashore or the mountains, let us not be satisfied in superficial worldly conversation of the moment, but cement such friendships by the bond of seriousness. Let us recognize the supreme need to interest the uninterested and increase the interest of lax workers. Let us notice, wherever we go, what the Church is doing, and help it as we do our own home parish. Let the love for the command, "Go ye unto all men," be so simple and genuine in our hearts, that our unconscious influence will be for good, and let us strive to make the development of this trust show in our lives. Let our ideals be high, and let us turn our ideals into facts, that they may become an effective force, ever "lifting better up to best."
