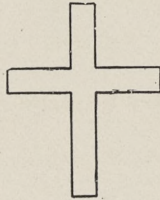

The Woman's Auxiliary asks the prayers of the Church on the Festival of the Transfiguration of Christ (August 6th), the Auxiliary's "Altar Day."

The following resolution was unanimously adopted at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, St. John's Church, Los Angeles, May 24, 1898, and endorsed the following day by the Diocesan Convention, with the addition that where practicable the offerings be devoted to the General Fund of the Woman's Auxiliary, viz.:

Resolved, That we set apart the Feast of the Epiphany for an Auxiliary Day, and that, as members of the Auxiliary, we consider it not only a privilege but a duty to attend the services held on that day in the parish to which we belong; and further,

Resolved, That should the appointment of this day meet with the approbation of the clergymen of the Diocese, they be requested to offer, at the celebration of the Holy Eucharist on the Feast of the Epiphany, special prayers for the work of the Auxiliary.

Report of the Eighteenth Annual Meeting.

ST. PAUL'S PRO-CATHEDRAL,
Los Angeles, May 12, 1914.

The Eighteenth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles was held in St. Paul's Pro-Cathedral and Parish House on May 12, 1914.

The Holy Communion was celebrated in the Pro-Cathedral at 9:00 a.m., the Bishop of the Diocese celebrant.

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by the President, Mrs. J. E. Cowles.

Three hundred and seventy-five delegates were present.

The Secretary, Miss Laura G. Smith, read her report of the year's meetings of the Diocesan officers.

Excellent reports were made by the District Presidents, Miss Magill, Mrs. Wheelock, Miss Halley and Miss Rouse. Mrs. Lowe's report of the Little Helpers was read by Mrs. Bugbee.

Mrs. Wotkyns, the Box Secretary, and Mrs. Johnson, Directress of the Altar Department, gave their reports.

The Treasurer, Mrs. Leonard, read her report.

Miss King reported the work of the Junior Auxiliary. Miss Smith read Mrs. Willett's report of the United Offering and the report of Mrs. Hubbard, Treasurer of the Japanese Mission.

All these reports were interesting records of work accomplished, showing great increase in missionary zeal.

Following Mrs. Hubbard's suggestion that only \$45.99 were needed to complete the amount of the note owed by the Japanese Mission (when the Bishop had added the promised \$100.00), over \$50.00 was quickly pledged.

There was a standing vote of appreciation of Mrs. Hubbard's long and earnest services in the Japanese Mission, and also, as an expression of sympathy to her and regret at her absence.

The taking of pledges followed.

The noon hour having arrived, the Bishop said the prayers for Missions.

The officers' conference brought out many interesting things for discussion.

It was moved and carried that a committee be appointed to consider the matter of a memorial for our twentieth anniversary in 1916, the object to be considered later.

There was a rising vote of thanks to Mrs. Leonard in appreciation of her work.

Mrs. Wotkyns also asked for a rising vote of thanks to Mrs. Wade and Miss Lawrence of St. Paul's Pro-Cathedral for their help so generously given each year.

It was moved and carried that a committee be appointed to consider the question of lunch for the delegates in attendance at the annual meeting.

Over four hundred delegates and friends were at lunch.

The afternoon session was called to order at two o'clock.

Mrs. Cowles made her annual address with its usual note of optimism and inspiration; in it, she incorporated also the stirring pastoral of the House of Bishops.

Miss Wheelock followed with report of the Church Periodical Club.

All reports which had been made during the day were on motion accepted.

The Rev. David T. Gillmor made a ringing appeal for increased interest in the work of the Junior Auxiliary.

It was a great inspiration to hear of the new Missionary Vision — the Rev. George F. Weld told of the modern dream of the Missionary World, the vision of World Brotherhood; that Christian Unity can only come through passionate self-forgetfulness. The laxity of life during the Middle Ages came from an inward vision instead of an outward, and the world stood still. Personal sanctity is to work not for our own souls but those about us. Serious economic questions of these days should be worked out with the missionary touch.

It was moved and carried that Mr. Weld's address be printed and put into permanent form.

The Rev. J. M. Yamasaki made a plea for our interest in the 8000 of his countrymen who are in Los Angeles. He brought home to our conscience the criticism often heard in Japan that when the Japanese return to their country from a Christian nation, they bring everything with them but Christianity.

Mrs. Stephen Cutter Clark told of the work done by the Daughters of the King and Miss M. K. Jacobs of the equally good work accomplished by the Girls' Friendly Society.

The Rev. W. T. Cleghorn spoke eloquently in behalf of the Mission under his charge, the negroes, claiming that there are 20,000 of his people in Los Angeles. They are greatly in need of a building to aid ethical and social development, to be used on week days.

The Rev. A. G. H. Bode spoke for the Seamen's Mission, and said if Mr. Yamasaki claimed 8000 and Mr. Cleghorn 20,000 he could claim

many more who would be coming through the gates of the canal and who would need the ministrations of the Church. The three speakers made tempting appeals to the hearts of the members of the Auxiliary.

Deaconess Wile made a touching little speech, asking for interest in the Church Home for Children—her report of the work for the year an appeal in itself.

The Bishop gave a short address, expressing his grateful appreciation of the help the Auxiliary gives to him, both as a Diocesan and personally, in ready sympathy and willingness to help him at all times.

All the old officers were re-appointed with the additions of Mrs. F. D. Simons, Assistant Corresponding Secretary, and Miss Rebecca R. Halsey, Secretary of the Young Woman's Auxiliary.

The Bishop pronounced the benediction.

Report of the Recording Secretary.

There have been during the last year eight regular meetings of the Diocesan officers of the Woman's Auxiliary, a Summer Quarterly, a Winter Quarterly and the Annual Quiet Day.

One of the regular meetings of the Diocesan officers was held in New York at the time of the General Convention. There were more officers at that time in New York than in Los Angeles. Present were Mrs. Johnson, Mrs. Cowles, Mrs. Bugbee, Mrs. Wotkins and Mrs. Hubert.

The Summer Quarterly was held at St. Luke's, Long Beach, with a good attendance. The speakers were the Rev. J. M. Yamasaki and Miss Julia Clark, both of whom were entering on their new work, the former in the Japanese Mission in Los Angeles, and Miss Clark in the mission field of China.

The Winter Quarterly was held at St. Athanasius' Church, Los Angeles, February 17th. The special speaker was Miss Sarah H. Reid, Secretary to Bishop Graves, of Shanghai, and to Dr. Pott, of St. John's College, Shanghai. Her talk about the actual work accomplished in the mission field where she had worked for five years was of great interest. In both St. Luke's, Long Beach, and St. Athanasius', the hospitality was generous and delightful. The pleasant social hour was greatly enjoyed also.

The meditations given by the Rev. George Davidson at the Advent Quiet Day were on a high spiritual key and those who were there were refreshed and uplifted.

The reports of the Secretaries will give the results of this year's work which has been accomplished by the branches. We have not fallen below our standard. Each year we place our goal forward, and each year we reach it. Today the goal is once more on the far horizon.

The Annual Auxiliary Day, 1916, will be our twentieth anniversary. The meeting on that day will begin with the celebration of the Holy Communion in the new Pro-Cathedral. It is only a suggestion, but I wish we might include in our ambitions a "Special"—a memorial of that anniversary, to be placed in the new Pro-Cathedral.

Report of the Box Work.

It is Keble who says, "If we would always remember that it is God who set us our task we could not either be slothful or worldly minded."

The Box Work for Advent, 1913, was supplied by forty-one branches, and for that purpose, besides goodly, well filled boxes, we had in cash sent for the work \$440.55, so that seventeen of our own missionaries in different parts of the Diocese were fully equipped with this world's goods. We were much gratified in the beautiful, kindly, helpful way the branches responded to the Advent appeal.

The Lenten work for Alaska was much above the average. More articles perfectly new are contributed. This year we have given Miss Langdon for Tanana an equipment for the hospital, and also for the mission house. The bales were packed April 29th, and as most of the branches had their contributions at the Parish House promptly the work was more easily handled. May 1st saw the big consignment leave for Seattle. Seventeen bales of clothing and bedding, a Singer sewing-machine, fireless cooker, a barrel of blue willow-ware china, box of glass, a box of white enamel dishes for the children's table given by one of the junior branches, one big box of shoes, two of toys, books and games, three pails of candy, thirty pounds in each pail, and a sack of magazines sent by Santa Monica. The actual value was two thousand dollars.

Miss Emery asked us this year to give Paul William, the lay-reader at the Mission of the Saviour, Tanana, his own personal bale, so much loving care made it up. We had the wherewithal to buy Paul and Daisy (his wife) a complete outfit, San Gabriel gave the four-year-old daughter a perfect ward-robe. It was all so pretty and well chosen. Santa Ana provided Moses (the son's) wants, and we added sheets, blankets, comforters, rugs and towels from the other branches, so we have had the pleasure of writing to Miss Emery that Paul William had a bale sent him valued at one hundred and eighty-five dollars.

We feel our branches have done bravely, and quoting from Miss Langdon who met, at a meeting in a city in central New York, a member who once belonged to this branch, speaking of the work from Los Angeles, she said, "They are wonderful boxes, nothing from

elsewhere can touch them." So my faithful co-workers do not ye be weary in well doing. Every one of your smallest efforts is appreciated to the utmost in that far off, desolate region.

Report of the Junior Auxiliary.



Motto: St. Luke ii: 49—

"Wist ye not that I must be about my Father's business?"

Last year we reported twenty-six branches of the Junior Auxiliary in our Diocese. Of these five have not been active this year, for various reasons. However, two branches that did not report last year have taken a fresh start after an appeal to the Woman's Auxiliaries of their parishes.

They responded, in one parish, by seeking for and finding a good leader.

In the other by encouraging their former leader to take up the work again and generously giving the Juniors their aid in getting material for their box work and sending for the book required for the Junior study course.

Some motherly oversight like this, we wish the Woman's Auxiliary in each parish would have over their children of the Junior Auxiliary, who will, if carefully *trained*, as well as their needs supplied, bring their fresh young life and helpfulness as a rich return to the Senior branch when they graduate into it, as our General Secretary expects all young women over twenty-one to do.

The three new branches, with the two renewed ones, make the number of our branches this year, also twenty-six. We are so proud of the three new branches, which have shown such vigorous life from the beginning, and they were only organized a few months ago. One is in the parish of St. James', San Diego, their leader the rector's wife. The report comes to us recently that the twelve bright girls and earnest workers composing it were so sorry that the hospital at Tanana, Alaska, was burned this year, and everything destroyed that they worked hard making things for it as an expression of their sympathy. Their contribution was certainly appreciated. Then St. Philip's branch, Los Angeles, has not only contributed to the boxes, but has helped toward paying their mission's apportionment by earning seven

dollars and paying it in as a Junior pledge to count on their apportionment.

The last to be formed, and it is quite an ideal branch, is the one at the Church Home for Children. This branch was organized and is directed by Deaconess Mytton. They have a special Junior service every Sunday afternoon, when emphasis is given to the two most important aims of our Auxiliary, prayer for missions and study of missions. With these two aims in her mind, as of special importance, a leader may impress upon the children's minds such faith in the power of prayer for missions and pictures of the needs of the children still in darkness in many lands, that they will not only respond now but may form a purpose in their hearts to some day give *themselves* to some *real* part of that mission work, "To go or do, as God calls." We are only sowing the seed now and must not expect much fruit. But we can say that the children's gifts this year for both the Southern California and Alaska boxes to the Indians were the best of any year, and many beautiful and useful gifts went in these boxes.

The best boxes of all are sent each season from the Junior Auxiliary of the Bishop's School, La Jolla.

We would like here to gratefully acknowledge the aid given by Miss Grebe every year in the packing of these boxes.

As a report of past events also, we would mention the Junior Rally of last December, when our Juniors brought their gifts to be sent to the Indians on our Southern California reservations. We were delighted to have our good Bishop with us to lead the missionary service. He and Dean MacCormack gave inspiring talks to the children. Then Mrs. Boone, for so many years a missionary in China (now the leader of the Junior Auxiliary of San Bernardino, which she revived), gave a most interesting account of "Life in China"; she was followed by Deaconess Miller, who gave us another interesting talk about her Indians. She is the presiding genius of these Christmas boxes, suggesting what we should send, and then up on those reservations, unpacking and giving from the beautiful Christmas trees (one for each of the reservations), "useful and joyful" presents to the poor Indian children and women, who look upon her as their good angel. We were privileged to go with the Deaconess last Christmas season and had two weeks of delight never to be forgotten, especially when at the Christmas trees we saw our Juniors' Christmas gifts received with such joy, and we hope the Junior leaders will soon begin to plan for the next Christmas box.

We are blessed in having the leadership and influence of Sister Josephine in the Junior Auxiliary of St. John's, also of Deaconess

Webster at St. Athanasius'. And of other good leaders of faithful Junior branches in this city, and other parishes in the Diocese. Deaconess Webster writes in the last Los Angeles *Churchman* of their Mission Sundays at St. Athanasius' which are a great benefit to members of the Junior Auxiliaries in every parish where they will have them. We attended a very interesting one at St. Paul's Sunday-school a couple of months ago under the direction of Deaconess Napper.

We have visited twenty of the branches this year and find that what we need most is not more, nor better, leaders, but to gain the interest and co-operation of the mothers. Nothing is more discouraging to a leader than after having faithfully and prayerfully prepared a talk and work for her Juniors, to have only a third, or less, of her class come to the meetings, week after week. If the mothers would only understand that we wish the children to come for what they may *receive*, more than for what they may give!

We, too, should often have been discouraged in the two years and a half of our Secretaryship, but for the sympathy and support of our Diocesan President, and the kind interest of the other Diocesan officers also, in their Junior Auxiliary.

Our General Secretary, Miss Grace Lindley, writes that she expects to be with us later this year. Watch the Junior page in the Los Angeles *Churchman* for news of her coming.

In closing, let me quote another's words, "We as leaders of the children must have a *vision ourselves* of the city of the Great King in all its glory, with its open gates and its room for all nations, and then earnestly pray with all that prayer may involve of work and love and sacrifice, 'May Thy Kingdom Come.'"

Report of the Church Periodical Club.

When I became Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club a year ago my hope was that those willing to send their used magazines and books to other fields would be ready to pour them into the laps of our sister dioceses, especially those of the Eighth Department and Mexico. This would leave an abundance of current literature for use within our own borders and should increase the number of periodicals

sent out regularly by contributors, the ideal way of obtaining our "purpose of providing periodicals and books for the clergy and laity who are unable to procure them in any other way." Much of this material would go to reading-rooms, as they are established, and to institutions. But I was told that the central office in New York expected us to care first for ourselves, as too much time was consumed by the exchange of letters between the East and the West, or words to that effect. For a time this left me without heart for the work, as it savored too much of parochialism, a form of selfishness against which we are all striving to keep our parishes and diocese free. Our report, though smaller than last year's, gives no cause for discouragement. We now have a treasury with a balance of ten round dollars and fifty cents, and the wall of indifference is beginning to wear through in several spots. We still hope for a suitable place in which to work, and while brains and pen and ink are necessary adjuncts, other things are equally important.

Our purpose of providing periodicals, books, etc., for reading-rooms, and of placing in public libraries our best Church literature, received the sanction of the Bishop on his return from the General Convention and the silent approval of nearly all the clergy. Reading-rooms would have been established in two or three missions if money could have been procured for running expenses and the simplest furnishings. The libraries at Santa Barbara and Santa Monica each receive four Church papers. Those of Carpinteria, Hemet, Lompoc, Long Beach and Pasadena are provided with the *Spirit of Missions*, the *Churchman* and the *Los Angeles Churchman*. San Jacinto, Los Angeles and one of its branches have the *Spirit of Missions*.

All Saints', Pasadena, is not only providing its own city library with the list of books approved by the Bishop, but will be a big brother to Santa Maria. Long live this spirit at All Saints', and may it soon permeate the Diocese and the whole Church!

Of our ten librarians of a year ago seven have resigned and one has been seriously ill for several months. All are efficient workers. We regret they had no time left for this branch of Church work. Miss Wotkyns made an excellent record for All Saints', Pasadena, followed by Miss Usher, of Santa Monica. The three librarians-at-large rendered good service in the distribution of magazines sent them, as did also the Rev. Messrs. Carver and Hickman, Captain Farr and others. During the year fifteen librarians were appointed. Of these one was dropped for inefficiency and one resigned because of ill-health and a prospective six months abroad.

In November Redondo sent us a cheque for a wonderful one-dollar bill that was immediately placed in the bank as a nucleus for our new book fund. This is meant to cover the cost of books, tracts and subscriptions.

St. Philip's, Los Angeles, asked for fifty new Prayer Books and fifty new Hymnals. These were kindly given by the New York Bible and Prayer Book Society.

The *Churchman* graciously reduced its annual subscription for public libraries to \$1.75. The *Living Church*, as generously, gives us its clerical rates of \$2.00. Both papers to be sent direct to the libraries. The Young Churchman Co. grants us a discount on any of their own books we wish to place in public libraries. These books to be sent direct to the libraries at the expense of the donors.

In February we received the first copies of the Church Periodical Club Round Robin, a type-written messenger bearing helpful suggestions from all quarters, sent from the central office to the correspondents, from time to time. We welcome the arrival of the *Confab*, the monthly bulletin of the Massachusetts branch, with its splendid last report, and forthwith adopted this branch as our model. The report reads: "Branches, 76; librarians, 57; magazines sent regularly, 1958; contributors sending regularly, 936; books of all sorts, 4247; traveling libraries, 6; money received by librarians, \$1496.49; money received by correspondent, \$904.25." Let us emulate its example by each year increasing the number of periodicals sent regularly by our contributors, thus gradually breaking the habit of filling our homes with unbound magazines that would do a world of good if passed on to others soon after reading. Of course there always will be some back numbers, but we must not specialize them. After placing in public and private libraries, reading-rooms and institutions that want them, all such out-of-date magazines of value as are offered us when we first enter a parish, or after a vacancy of some length, it is for the librarian of that parish to prevent any further such accumulations by making telling "appeals to those who have desirable magazines to send them, after reading, regularly every week or month to those who ask for them." If more people, just Christians alone, would realize that many, in less fortunate circumstances, have seen better days and are still capable of enjoying and profiting by the best; that there are superior minds among the dark-hued races, they would not withhold for a possible lack of appreciation their *Harper's Monthly* from an inmate of the County Hospital, though she asked for it, nor their *Church Times* from a clergyman of another race, though it was the only paper for which he asked. There are six hundred patients

in the hospital of this county and they are not all there for life, nor all advanced in years, nor uneducated.

Many among the great mass of people need but to learn of the nobler things of which they are capable, gladly to change their course in life, and your Church paper, your review, or magazine of history, science, art, etc., may open the way for some boy or girl, some man or woman to find his or her life work.

When you think of the lives made useful and happy, lives saved from hopeless failure for the service of God, you will not begrudge these other children of God the little additional thought, time and expense required in sending them your used magazines while they are still current literature.

It is our privilege and pleasure to represent the *Spirit of Missions* in this Diocese, and we esteem it an honor to stand for this the foremost magazine of its kind published in the world. It is also our one really representative Church paper, in that it sets forth the fundamental work and true spirit of the Church. If its entrance into every home in a self-centered, lukewarm parish will cause that parish to "look not on its own things alone but also on the things of others," and the reading of an odd back number will bring to confirmation one unacquainted with the Church, does it not behoove each one of us to increase the number of its readers and subscribers within our own field of labor? Only 387 of our 10,600 communicants take the *Spirit of Missions*. The great city of Los Angeles, including Garvanza and Hollywood, has only 118 subscribers. Write at once to the *Spirit of Missions*, 281 Fourth Avenue, New York City, for the list of subscribers in your parish, mission or community, and you will be astonished and ashamed at the result. Subscribe for and *read* the *Spirit of Missions* yourself. It costs but one dollar a year, is full of our Father's business and contains much of interest for men, women and children. We ask the assistance of the clergy and of the officers of our parish organizations in this Church-wide campaign for more readers and more subscribers to the *Spirit of Missions*. The Church Periodical Club now has a prayer of its own, written by Bishop Rhineland of Pennsylvania. The first Sunday in May of each year has been set apart as our day of remembrance and for our corporate communion.

My first year as Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club has been a year of preparation, and if the results, like the renowned choir, remain invisible, it is but for a while.

St. Mary's Japanese Church Mission.

The progress of our Mission has been very encouraging during the past year.

June 3rd, Mr. John M. Yamazaki, having completed his three years' course at the Berkeley Divinity School, graduated. Bishop Brewster paid him the compliment of asking him to make an extemporaneous address at the alumni supper, when Dean Hart said he acquitted himself most creditably. In parting, some of his fellow-students and the professors gave him the nucleus of his theological library.

July 24th he was ordained Deacon by our Bishop at the Pro-Cathedral, and directly after resumed his position as Superintendent of the Mission. Examinations seem to present no terrors to the Rev. Mr. Yamazaki, probably due to careful preparation.

"All the world loves a lover," so we hope our branch may be interested in hearing of the engagement and marriage of the Rev. and Mrs. John M. Yamazaki. Years ago when our faithful Miss Paterson was serving under the Rev. Mr. Kennedy, a Canadian missionary in Japan, she met a Japanese trained nurse who had such severe burns she died in consequence. Before her release she told Miss Paterson she would die happy if she would only adopt her little sister, so she would not be brought up as a heathen. Miss Paterson consented, and Miss Mary Tsune Tanaka was trained as a Bible woman by the Rev. Mr. Kennedy, who regarded her as the most promising of all the Bible women under his care.

It was there Mr. Yamazaki met his fate, but she continued her work as a Bible woman, and he, his preparations for Holy Orders in San Francisco, Los Angeles and the Berkeley Divinity School and following the example of Jacob and Rachel, served for her seven years. Last August his fiancee came over with Bishop MacKim, Miss Paterson and the Rev. Mr. Yamazaki meeting them in San Francisco when they were married, August 12th, at the Cathedral, Bishop Nichols officiating, Miss Paterson giving away the bride.

As few present today had an opportunity of seeing the wedding robe a description of it may not come amiss, as it was given by the family of the groom.

It was a handsome navy blue silk kimona, the coat of arms of the groom's family being on the sleeves and an elaborate design in palms embroidered on the front of the kimona. A concession of a white veil, wreath of orange blossoms and a bouquet of white rose buds (the last from the best man) was made to the home of their adoption. Soon after they came to the Mission they had the large dining-room converted into a kindergarten and part of the screen porch used as a kitchenette. These changes were made at the expense of the Japanese themselves except for ten dollars, a voluntary offering from a Chicago friend of the Mission. The playground, fitted up by the members of the Girls' School at La Jolla, has added much to the pleasure of our Japanese children.

It would not have been possible for us to purchase, October 22, 1912, the house now used for our Japanese Church Mission, 961 South Mariposa Avenue, if it had not been for Miss Mary L. Paterson's generous loan of \$500, without interest and no date set for re-paying

her loan. We had to pay \$500 down, the balance \$1800, to be met in quarterly payments of \$75 and quarterly interest at 7 per cent., said payments being met promptly, so the principal has been reduced to \$1350.00.

But what return have we made to Miss Paterson for her kindly loan?

CONSTITUTION.

I. This Society shall be called THE LOS ANGELES BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

II. The object of the Society is: By systematic and united effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among the women of the Diocese, to promote the study of missions, and to encourage prayer for missions.

III. The Church itself is the great Missionary Society, and every person, by baptism, becomes a member of this Society; therefore, every baptized woman in the Diocese is a member of the Woman's Auxiliary. But terms of membership in any parish branch shall be fixed by that branch.

IV. All Parish Societies that so desire may become branches of this Auxiliary, first obtaining the consent of the Rector or Clergyman-in-charge, by appointing a Secretary and notifying the President of their intention to work in unison with the Auxiliary.

V. A President, a First Vice-President, a Vice-President over such divisions of the Diocese as the Bishop may counsel, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, a Secretary of the Junior Department, a Secretary of the Babies' Branch, a Directress of the Altar Department, a Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, a Secretary of the Missions Classes, and an officer over any other department that may be formed, shall be appointed by the Bishop.

VI. The Annual Meeting shall be held at the time of the Diocesan Convention, and Quarterly Meetings on such dates and in such places as the President may appoint. General meetings may be arranged by the Vice-Presidents, in their respective districts.

VII. An Annual Quiet Day shall be held during the season of Advent.

BY-LAWS.

1. The duty of the President shall be to preside at the meetings of the Society, and have general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop. The First Vice-President shall act for the President in her absence, and assist her in the care and oversight

of the work. The duty of the other Vice-Presidents shall be to preside in the absence of the President at the general meetings held in their several charges, and to co-operate with the President in the supervision of the work of the Auxiliary in the sections to which they respectively belong.

2. It shall be the duty of the Corresponding Secretary, under the direction of the President, to correspond with the General Secretary of the Auxiliary and the various branches of the Diocese, to furnish them with work, to collect their reports, and to prepare an annual report.

3. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of meetings, to keep a record of such meetings, and to prepare an abstract of the minutes for the annual report.

4. The Treasurer shall keep an account of all moneys received and expended, and make a report at the Annual Meeting.

5. The Secretary of the Junior Department, the Secretary of the Babies' Branch, the Directress of the Altar Department, the Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club and the Secretary of the Missions Classes shall superintend their several departments, in consultation with the other Diocesan Officers.

6. The Secretaries of Parish Branches are required to correspond with the Diocesan Officers, who *alone correspond* with the General Secretary and the Secretaries of the Board of Missions, and to transmit to them all moneys.

7. Each Parish Branch shall make an annual pledge, according to its ability, to the current expenses and work of the Diocesan Branch, and also to the Bishop's Missionary Fund for Diocesan work.

8. At the Annual Meeting each branch represented shall be entitled to but one vote on business of general import.

9. All moneys collected for the United Offering Fund shall be paid to the Diocesan Treasurer of that fund, and by her paid to the Auxiliary Treasurer.

This Constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a motion made at the Annual Meeting, and voted on the following year.

Address of the President.

To the Right Reverend the Bishop, Officers and Members of the Woman's Auxiliary:

As I have pondered over my annual address and wondered how best to convey to you an adequate realization of the full message of the General Convention, held last October in New York, where this Diocese had a full delegation of clergy and laity, as well as Auxiliary women, I have come to the conclusion that the Pastoral Letter, issued by the House of Bishops and read by the Bishop of Tennessee in the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, at the closing service, will be far more forceful than any words of mine.

I, therefore, present it to you in full, with the request that it be read at the opening Fall meeting of each branch. It has appeared in various Church papers and, doubtless, has been seen by some of you, but it is my earnest desire that the women of the Auxiliary, singly and collectively, should read, study and incorporate it in their activities. It will be printed in the Annual Report, unless I am able to procure it in pamphlet form, in which latter case it will be sent you with the Eighteenth Annual Report.*
