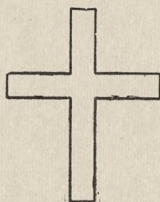

The Woman's Auxiliary asks the prayers of the Church on the Festival of the Transfiguration of Christ (August 6th), the Auxiliary's "Altar Day."

The following resolution was unanimously adopted at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, St. John's Church, Los Angeles, May 24, 1898, and endorsed the following day by the Diocesan Convention, with the addition that where practicable the offerings be devoted to the General Fund of the Woman's Auxiliary, viz.:

Resolved, That we set apart the Feast of the Epiphany for an Auxiliary Day, and that, as members of the Auxiliary, we consider it not only a privilege but a duty to attend the services held on that day in the parish to which we belong; and further,

Resolved, That should the appointment of this day meet with the approbation of the clergymen of the Diocese, they be requested to offer, at the celebration of the Holy Eucharist on the Feast of the Epiphany, special prayers for the work of the Auxiliary.

O Almighty Father, Who didst vouchsafe to Thy chosen ones on the mount the comforting vision of the glory that shall be revealed, to strengthen and cheer them in their Apostolic work, we beseech Thee to be with Thy servants, the members of the Woman's Auxiliary of this Diocese, in all their efforts for the spread of the Kingdom of Thy dear Son. Grant that to many hearts may go the call of opportunity to serve Thee in this work, in the bearing of others' burdens and the fulfillment of the law of Christ. In what they think and do, enable them to hear the voice of Thy Son to guide and strengthen them. We ask this for the merits of Him Who came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, Thy Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

Report of the Twentieth Annual Meeting.

ST. PAUL'S PRO-CATHEDRAL,
Los Angeles, May 16, 1916.

The Twentieth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles was held in St. Paul's Pro-Cathedral and Parish House, May 16, 1916.

9:00 a.m. Holy Communion, Bishop of the Diocese, celebrant.

The meeting was called to order in the Parish House at 10:00 a.m. by the President, Mrs. J. E. Cowles.

The President read a message from our Vice-President, Mrs. Hubert, wishing the delegates a most inspiring and interesting Annual Meeting. A motion was made and carried, that a response be sent to Mrs. Hubert.

The Vice-Presidents, Miss Magill for Los Angeles and vicinity, Miss Rouse for Santa Barbara, Miss Halley for San Diego, Mrs. Wheelock for Riverside, made encouraging reports.

The Secretary read her report of the year's meetings of the Diocesan Officers.

Secretary of Box Work made an excellent and interesting report.

Most gratifying were the reports of Mrs. Leonard, Treasurer; Miss Alice King, Secretary of the Junior Auxiliary; Mrs. F. W. Stockton, United Offering Treasurer, and Miss Magill, Educational Secretary.

Mrs. Johnson, Directress of the Altar Department, after making a splendid report, tendered her resignation. This came as a great surprise and many were the expressions of regret.

The taking of pledges followed, showing an attendance of 367 delegates.

The noon hour having arrived, the Bishop said the prayers for Missions.

The meeting reconvened at 2:00 p.m.

The Secretary read the report of Mrs. Lowe, Secretary of Little Helpers.

Miss Wheelock's report of the work of the Church Periodical Club was most interesting.

Miss King read the report of Miss Mary Hubbard, Secretary of the Japanese Mission.

Upon motion all reports were accepted.

Dean MacCormack welcomed the delegates, saying in part: "I have a deep and profound appreciation of the work of an organization that is carrying out the great Commission our Lord commanded."

Mrs. Swan moved, seconded by Miss Meeker, that Mrs. Johnson be constituted the Honorary Directress of the Altar Department. Unanimously carried.

Mrs. Patten moved, seconded by Mrs. Wotkyns, that Article 5 of the Constitution be amended to read "Vice-President at Large." Carried.

Mrs. Bugbee read an appeal from the Rev. Mr. Brigham for funds to have the Hymnal printed in the Indian language.

The President's address, with its note of encouragement and helpfulness, was most illuminating.

Following the President's address, the Rev. Randolph Lee gave a short talk on the Life of St. Paul.

Miss Mary B. Hill gave "The Challenge of the Church."

Rev. J. M. Yamazaki made a strong plea for some one who could devote his time to teaching the Japanese children the English language.

Mrs. C. T. Murphy gave a very interesting talk on the "Deaconess' Training School of the Pacific."

The Bishop spoke beautifully of the work of the retiring officers, and made the following appointments:

Mrs. Walter Wotkyns, Directress of the Altar Department.

Report of the Recording Secretary.

There have been during the year ten Regular Meetings of the Woman's Auxiliary, two Quarterly Meetings and the Annual Quiet Day.

In view of the fact that the Brotherhood of St. Andrew held its Thirteenth Annual Convention in Los Angeles, August last, and had

asked for a meeting of the women of the Church, our Diocesan officers decided to dispense with the Summer Quarterly Meeting and to co-operate with the Daughters of the King in a joint meeting held at the Bible Institute.

The Fall Quarterly Meeting was held in the Church of the Epiphany, November 9th.

The rector, the Rev. Wm. Bedford-Jones, spoke briefly on the "Why, When and Where of Missions."

Mrs. W. C. Mushet, President of the Epiphany Branch, welcomed the visitors, and spoke most beautifully of the inspiration a Quarterly Meeting brings to the parish branch.

Mrs. Joseph Horsfall Johnson gave a most interesting report of meetings of the Synod of the Eighth Province, held in Oakland, August last.

Her talk was so clear and satisfying, every visitor must have carried away a very intimate knowledge of the Province of the Pacific.

The meeting was unusually well attended; the Epiphany Branch entertained the Auxiliary hospitably and delightfully.

The Annual Advent Quiet Day was held Thursday, December 9th, in St. Paul's Pro-Cathedral.

The meditations were given by the Rev. Wm. Bedford-Jones, the subject: The Kingdom of God. He said in part: "The Woman's Auxiliary has a great opportunity to help with the coming of the Kingdom, and if our opportunity is great so must our effort be great."

The great meeting of the year was the Winter Quarterly held in the Parish House of St. Paul's Pro-Cathedral, the afternoon of February 28th.

The Rev. Albert Hall, rector of St. Mark's, Pasadena, conducted the devotional service.

Mrs. Cowles welcomed the representatives of the branches, and introduced the speaker, Dr. Hugh L. Burleson, head of the Editorial Department of the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society.

Dr. Burleson outlined the work of the Woman's Auxiliary as follows: (1) "It should be a leaven of Missionary information in the Parish." (2) "A Missionary Educator as a means of bringing people to think of Foreign Missions."

Of the United Offering he said, "It is distinctly personal, not the result of a tax, but the heart gratitude of a woman as a thanksgiving."

The talk was both inspirational and educational, and it was most gratifying to see every chair in the Parish House occupied.

During the year a great sorrow came to our beloved President, Mrs. Cowles, in the death of her mother. She had the most loving

sympathy from the members of the Auxiliary, many of whom remembered Mrs. Hill with great affection.

Another thousand dollars has been paid on the Birthday Bed Fund.

Dr. Burleson gives this definition of Domestic Missions: "Participation of the Church with the State in developing the highest type of American citizenship."

How large a share of this development shall the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles assume as her portion?

Report of the Box Work.

In Advent seventeen boxes were sent to our Diocesan missionaries, and for the work we received contributions amounting to \$374.00; but, to provide for all that was necessary, we had to borrow again from our kindly Working Fund. Our expenses were \$409.46, so that we are indebted to the Fund \$35.46. Ten of our branches prepared full boxes, giving to the fortunate missionaries chosen by a branch all that the missionary or his wife asked for. The Alaska work was most satisfactory, in almost all instances. What the

branches sent for the big bales was most gratifying. We had \$109.51 sent in money to buy all we needed to complete the work, and on Friday, May 5th, we sent to far-off Alaska, to Miss Langdon, at Tanana, twenty bales, five boxes—one containing drugs, value \$35.00; one of candy, value \$10.00, the other three being toys and shoes, and two sacks of magazines. The very conservative valuation of the shipment was \$2,000.

Considering all that you have done and are still doing for the sad countries across the sea, we feel more than grateful that your work for our own missions in the home land is far above the average of former years, when we did not share our blessings with those not of our own people.

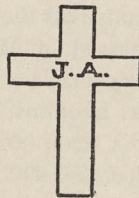

Report of the Junior Auxiliary.



Motto: St. Luke ii: 49—

"Wist ye not that I must be about my Father's business?"

The Junior Auxiliary has for its motto, the words of the Child Jesus, "Wist ye not that I must be about my Father's business!"

With this high ideal, that, as children of the Church, they must early begin to do *their* part, in bringing the world to Christ, they are given *three* things to do:

To *Study*, or learn through talks and stories and pictures, about the needs of children, not as fortunate as themselves, and what their Mother Church is trying to do for them; to offer daily *Prayer* for them, from their inspiring Junior Collect, and to *Give*, as their Bishop and the Board of Missions plan for them.

To that Board of Missions they give, each year, two pledges. One is for our Bishop Johnson Scholarship, which keeps a young Chinese

girl at St. Mary's Hall, Shanghai. This scholarship was begun in 1900. When one girl graduates, another is waiting to take her place.

We had a letter from St. Mary's Hall, this spring (in reply to our inquiry about the one now having our scholarship), which informed us that Pen Tsing Kyoen is quite worthy of it—indeed, a scholarship girl has to keep up to a fair standard, or another takes her place, as they wish to fit them to be helpers in the Christian education of Chinese girls.

Pen's sister, after graduating at St. Mary's, became head teacher at St. Agnes' School, Anking, China. The letter goes on to say that we have no idea how much a diploma means to a Chinese. One girl, who graduated last year, told the writer, how much her family respected her education, and said, "I am the only one in the family, men and women, who has a diploma."

Pen is a good average student, steady and dependable in her work, and will graduate from the Preparatory Department into the High School, this June, for a four-years' course. Surely not one of our branches, without whose help she could not be in St. Mary's Hall, will fail to do its part, these coming years.

It is this regular, continued support in mission work, which makes the united work of the Junior Auxiliary more valuable than if each branch worked from impulse all the time in its own way.

The other pledge to the Board of Missions is for *apportionment*. The Juniors exceeded our expectations *this year*, in their generous giving, so our Treasurer, Mrs. Leonard, was able to send nearly \$50 more for apportionment, that is, \$200.00. Our General Secretary, Miss Grace Lindley, writes us, that \$20,000 has been given from the combined efforts of the Juniors of our country, for this apportionment, "which will help in the work all over the world." She also writes that the \$20,000, she asked the Juniors to give for the building of the children's ward of St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo, Japan, is all completed, for which our Los Angeles Juniors sent \$100.

The Juniors' also pledge to the General Working Fund in our own Diocese.

Our Bishop asks that our Christmas boxes be sent each year to our Indians on the Reservations in San Diego County. That these gifts bring joy to the hearts of many poor Indians, a number of letters sent to their "Christmas Friends," the Juniors, informed us. The first rally of the Auxiliary year is held the first Saturday in December, when these gifts are gathered in, making a harvest festival of the first fruits of their work, at which happy meeting a friendly interest is shown in each other's work. At the rally of last December, Deaconess

Wile's children gave a short Indian play, and Deaconess Miller's Juniors represented the *needs* of our Southern California Indians, whose true friend she has been for many years, while Deaconess Webster's Juniors had a musical part.

At the Epiphany rally, Deaconess Mytton's Juniors of St. Matthias' gave an impressive play, "A Pageant of Bethlehem."

Our recent Easter rally was the best attended, we had our Bishop to lead the Junior service, followed by a missionary program, in which seventeen Junior branches took part, representing "Children of Many Lands." When America, last on the program, led the children from other countries in the march, all singing the inspiring hymn of "Onward, Christian Soldiers," we believe many felt the desire to do still better work in the future for Church and Country. The offering of \$10.00 was given for medicines, for the hospital at Tanana, Alaska.

The Juniors, in connection with the Sunday-school, are also asked to remember the fund still needed for endowing the Deaconess Grebe Memorial Bed at our Bishop's Good Samaritan Hospital here, and Mrs. Williams' Juniors of All Saints', Highland Park, at the Easter rally, gave a most interesting representation of the parable of the Good Samaritan, with missionary nurses as good Samaritans. We hope you will all remember, at least on your birthdays, your Bishop's Hospital. As your Box Secretary, I can report many generous and thoughtful gifts for the Alaska boxes. Our always to be depended upon helper at these times, Miss Grebe, says they were the best the Juniors have ever sent. As the Educational Secretary for the Juniors, we will report that we have tried to interest each of our thirty-five branches in a course of study suggested by the Educational Secretary of the Board of Missions; visiting nineteen of these branches for this purpose as well as for other Junior aims. Some have taken a six weeks' course, others have preferred an instructive missionary play, or occasional talks from the outside, and readings at their sewing meetings.

Having served more than four years as your Junior Secretary, we must resign as other duties call us Eastward. We wish we could express in words the blessing that has come to us through this office, held under our good Bishop and being associated with such earnest Christian workers and able officers, as comprise your Diocesan Board. We could not give up the office so cheerfully, did we not believe that under our successors the Junior Auxiliary will go onward with increasing enthusiasm—praying and working and giving, and thus helping to win the world for Christ our Lord.

Report of the Church Periodical Club.

During the fall seven visits were made in San Diego and vicinity, resulting in the appointment of two librarians, and of two parish secretaries of the *Spirit of Missions*.

Branches have been started at Pomona, St. James' Mission; San Diego, and Upland. Vacancies were filled at Coronado; the Church of the Epiphany, Los Angeles, and Sierra Madre.

In the splendid work reported by eleven of the librarians La Jolla leads in the number of periodicals sent regularly (22), followed closely by Long Beach, Redlands, South Pasadena, and Santa Barbara; while Santa Paula leads in the number of Christmas and Easter cards (20); and St. Paul's Pro-Cathedral in the number of subscribers to the *Spirit of Missions* (20).

Total work reported for the year: 175 periodicals sent regularly by 114 contributors, showing an increase in the number of persons actively interested in the work; 27 books were sent out; 180 Morning Prayer leaflets and 40 Sunday-school cards (to Alaska by the Juniors of Long Beach); 125 calendars, games, pictures, etc.; and 7 sacks of uncounted magazines.

This represents a very small portion of the work done in the Diocese. We trust the reasons for not reporting all of this commendable work to us will vanish in the near future.

Long Beach reports having received and expended \$5 for postage and express.

The following parishes, or their branches of the Woman's Auxiliary, kindly continue to pay our old annual dues of \$1.00: Long Beach; Los Angeles, St. John's, St. Matthias', and St. Stephen's; Pasadena, All Saints'; Redlands, Riverside, and Sierra Madre. Three years ago these dues were increased to \$2.00 for each branch. This money goes towards the current expenses of our central office in New York. Do you not think it is time to meet this obligation in full?

Beginning next year we hope our branch work will appear in the printed Annual Report of the Woman's Auxiliary, with the other reports from our respective parishes.

Through the Club our Neighborhood Settlement in Los Angeles has received upwards of three hundred "withdrawn" books from two public libraries. These books will not last long, but they help to tide over until the hoped for establishment of an annual April Book Shower for our church institutions in the Diocese. A number of parishes and missions now have secretaries of the *Spirit of Missions* whose names and addresses should be sent to their Diocesan Secretary. If these secretaries will also solicit subscriptions to our Diocesan paper (\$1 a year), they may retain for the United Offering twenty-five cents of each new subscription—an offer also made by the *Spirit of Missions*. For the welfare of the Church we again urge the general family reading of at least these two Church papers. Nearly all the public libraries are now receiving the *Spirit of Missions*. Communicants residing in institutions are happy recipients of current magazines. Those at the Los Angeles County Farm and Hospital especially appreciate being "remembered by some one from the outside world" where they once lived. When desired we obtain for them their eastern home-parish, or diocesan paper.

The timely articles in the *Living Church* (March 11, 25) and in the March and May issues of the Church Periodical Club Round Robin that tell of the "steady and steadily increasing demand from all parts of the Church, from clergy and people alike, for tracts and books containing simple, definite instruction on the faith and practice of the Church" and of our unpreparedness to meet the demand, very largely owing to the high cost of our Church literature, emphasize the necessity for traveling libraries and the wisdom of providing public libraries with our best Church literature. Thousands of people—many our own—are filling themselves with the husks of all the -ites, -ists, -isms, etc., that cumber the shelves of too many public libraries and with which our country is strewn—another argument in favor of our hastening to place in the hands of the people the Truth as received by the Church.

But Japan's need of the Truth is even greater than in this country. There "the result of western learning divorced from religion is rationalism, leading to pessimism and eventually to self-destruction. Five per cent. of the students in Japan committed suicide in the past year. In order to combat this rationalistic teaching and stem the tide of irreligion that is sweeping over Japan the native clergy must have the opportunity to read and study. The magazines and books sent from

this country have an inspiration and stimulus which cannot be got from Japanese fiction which is inconceivably vile."

"Bishop Tucker is trying to build up a good circulating library for his district and he will need many books. The regular appropriation for the district is not sufficient to cover this need. He asks our aid." Shall we leave him and his native clergy "without weapons fit for the defence of the Faith?" We are asked to give the following books: Bull—The Sacramental Principle (\$1.25), Western—The One Christ (\$1.75), Dean Robbins—A Christian Apologetic (90 cents), Swete—The Holy Catholic Church and the Communion of Saints (\$1.50), Figgio—The Gospel and Human Needs (\$1.25), and Gore's New Theology and Old Religion (promised). These prices do not include postage. Cannot we send them these few books and some clean fiction, with God's blessing? Please notify the correspondent what book or books on this list will be sent from your parish or mission.

Report of St. Mary's Japanese Church Mission.

The amount pledged to pay off the debt on the Mission property is \$204.00 per year. Small sums are sent from time to time by a few parishes. The payments are \$300.00 per year, with seven per cent. accrued interest. The amount due on the property is \$750.00.

There was spent during the year \$365.62.

There is now in the bank \$37.44.

Miss Mary L. Paterson made a valuable gift to the Mission property, her home, 960 South Normandie Avenue, which is directly back of the Mission. The Rev. Mr. Yamazaki and his family occupy it.

The members of the Mission have enlarged the chapel and a Japanese lay-reader, now in his own country, gave a fine set of inverted lights, which added much to its usefulness.

A parish house is greatly needed, where the members and their friends can meet to work, study, house the growing kindergarten, and have entertainments.

At present the members meet in the chapel; the altar is screened off.

There is a large number of Japanese in this section of the city, and there is no pleasant place for them to meet to study or for social gatherings except the Mission.

A fund has been started for this building, which is to be called "Paterson Hall," in honor of the missionary who did so much for this Mission.

Mr. Yamazaki is doing such splendid work that he ought to have the practical assistance he needs to carry on this portion of the Great Master's business.

CONSTITUTION.

I. This Society shall be called THE LOS ANGELES BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

II. The object of the Society is: By systematic and united effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among the women of the Diocese, to promote the study of missions, and to encourage prayer for missions.

III. The Church itself is the great Missionary Society, and every person, by baptism, becomes a member of this Society; therefore, every baptized woman in the Diocese is a member of the Woman's Auxiliary. But terms of membership in any parish branch shall be fixed by that branch.

IV. All Parish Societies that so desire may become branches of this Auxiliary, first obtaining the consent of the Rector or Clergyman-in-charge, by appointing a Secretary and notifying the President of their intention to work in unison with the Auxiliary.

V. A President, a First Vice-President, a Vice-President over such divisions of the Diocese as the Bishop may counsel, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, a Secretary of the Junior Department, a Secretary of the Babies' Branch, a Directress of the Altar Department, a Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, a Secretary of the Missions Classes, and an officer over any other department that may be formed, shall be appointed by the Bishop.

VI. The Annual Meeting shall be held at the time of the Diocesan Convention, and Quarterly Meetings on such dates and in such places as the President may appoint. General meetings may be arranged by the Vice-Presidents, in their respective districts.

VII. An Annual Quiet Day shall be held during the season of Advent.

BY-LAWS.

1. The duty of the President shall be to preside at the meetings of the Society, and have general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop. The First Vice-President shall act for the President in her absence, and assist her in the care and oversight

of the work. The duty of the other Vice-Presidents shall be to preside in the absence of the President at the general meetings held in their several charges, and to co-operate with the President in the supervision of the work of the Auxiliary in the sections to which they respectively belong.

2. It shall be the duty of the Corresponding Secretary, under the direction of the President, to correspond with the General Secretary of the Auxiliary and the various branches of the Diocese, to furnish them with work, to collect their reports, and to prepare an annual report.

3. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of meetings, to keep a record of such meetings, and to prepare an abstract of the minutes for the annual report.

4. The Treasurer shall keep an account of all moneys received and expended, and make a report at the Annual Meeting.

5. The Secretary of the Junior Department, the Secretary of the Babies' Branch, the Directress of the Altar Department, the Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club and the Secretary of the Missions Classes shall superintend their several departments, in consultation with the other Diocesan Officers.

6. The Secretaries of Parish Branches are required to correspond with the Diocesan Officers, who *alone correspond* with the General Secretary and the Secretaries of the Board of Missions, and to transmit to them all moneys.

7. Each Parish Branch shall make an annual pledge, according to its ability, to the current expenses and work of the Diocesan Branch, and also to the Bishop's Missionary Fund for Diocesan work.

8. At the Annual Meeting each branch represented shall be entitled to but one vote on business of general import.

9. All moneys collected for the United Offering Fund shall be paid to the Diocesan Treasurer of that fund, and by her paid to the Auxiliary Treasurer.

This Constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a motion made at the Annual Meeting, and voted on the following year.

President's Message.

To the Right Reverend the Bishop, Officers and Members of the Woman's Auxiliary:

Anniversaries play an important part in the lives of most individuals. From the time that the fond parent recounts the age of the loved infant, by days, then weeks and months to the first year, then year by year, there is always a special exhilaration accompanying the recurrence of the birthday.

We are now in the midst of the Twentieth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles. One short year more will place us at an age where an individual would reach his majority and become responsible for his own acts in the eyes of the law. We may, therefore, consider ourselves full grown and no longer in the experimental stage of development. A retrospective view is interesting and valuable in so far as it aids in facing the future. We have grown in all directions. We have voluntarily assumed increasingly heavier responsibilities and, over and over again, our faith has been justified and our courage strengthened by the blessings of accomplishment. We have tried to keep pace with the rapid developments in our fast growing Diocese.

We have, not alone been auxiliary to the Board of Missions in New York, but auxiliary to our Bishop and Diocesan Board of Missions in helping to smooth the paths of the increasing number of missions and missionaries.

We have earnestly striven to "put first things first," not obscuring the spiritual side of our work by material accomplishments, realizing that in increasing prayer lies our strength.
