“Bring them hither to me”

The Woman's Auxiliary asks the prayers of the Church on the Festival of the Transfiguration of Christ (August 6th), the Auxiliary's “Altar Day.”

The following resolution was unanimously adopted at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, St. John's Church, Los Angeles, May 24, 1898, and endorsed the following day by the Diocesan Convention, with the addition that where practicable the offerings be devoted to the General Fund of the Woman's Auxiliary, *viz.*:

Resolved, That we set apart the Feast of the Epiphany for an Auxiliary Day, and that, as members of the Auxiliary, we consider it not only a privilege but a duty to attend the services held on that day in the parish to which we belong; and further,

Resolved, That should the appointment of this day meet with the approbation of the clergymen of the Diocese, they be requested to offer, at the celebration of the Holy Eucharist on the Feast of the Epiphany, special prayers for the work of the Auxiliary.

Report of the Twenty-ninth Annual Meeting.

ST. PAUL'S CATHEDRAL,

Los Angeles, January 27, 1925.

The Twenty-ninth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles was held at St. Paul's Cathedral, Tuesday, January 27, and opened with a celebration of the Holy Communion at 9:30 a. m. The celebrant was the Right Rev. Joseph H. Johnson, Bishop of the Diocese, assisted by the Right Rev. W. Bertrand Stevens, Bishop Coadjutor; the Very Rev. William MacCormack, D.D., Dean of the Cathedral; the Rev. G. R. Wreford, of San Diego, and the Rev. William Cowans.

At the close of the service the Auxiliary adjourned to the Cathedral House; the President, Miss Magill, called the meeting to order. The reports were read and accepted. As the Treasurer, Mrs. Abiel Leonard, was absent, owing to serious illness, her report was read by Mrs. Cowles.

Mrs. Page Brown's report revealed the fact that fifteen Branches had not been heard from. At this point, Bishop Johnson spoke a few words, urging each Branch to do its part in order that the work, as a whole, might be more effective.

In the absence of Miss Jane Rouse, Mrs. Weld read the report from Santa Barbara and vicinity.

The Altar Department, United Thank Offering, Educational and Church Periodical Club reports were all very gratifying, showing a material increase in the work.

The Japanese Mission report was read by Miss Hibbard.

The Rev. Wm. Cowans read the noon-day prayers, after which the pledges were made.

The afternoon session convened at two o'clock and was opened by singing Hymn 165. Dean MacCormack then addressed the Auxiliary, giving them a very hearty welcome.

Before reading her report, the President made some announcements and brought before the meeting the question, "Did they wish to help build St. Margaret's School for Girls and eight Kintergartens in Tokio, Japan, by collecting old gold and silver?" A motion was made, seconded and carried that this method be used throughout the Diocese to raise the money.

The message which Miss Magill brought from the Executive Council was, "Try to awaken the women of the Church to such a

conception of Christ that we all may become more effective instruments of His power in the accomplishment of His purpose for the world."

A motion was made, seconded and carried that a letter of sympathy and appreciation be sent to the Treasurer, Mrs. Leonard; there was a rising vote.

Mr. Philip M. Styles, of the Young People's Fellowship, was the next to speak and gave a very interesting and comprehensive talk about the aims and ambitions of that organization.

The Rev. Perry Austin, of St. Luke's, Long Beach, made an address; his subject being, "The Church of Christ in the Heart of a Great Industrial Center." He took us, in thought, to that industrial center in Philadelphia, known as Kensington, where he did such splendid work for several years. He says, "The task of the Church is to make the people know and feel the love of God."

The Rev. C. M. Covell, Executive Secretary of Christian Education and Social Service, spoke of the Sumner School to be opened by Bishop Johnson, June 29, and asked each one to spread the news.

We were fortunate in having with us Miss Florence Newbold, the National Secretary of the Girls' Friendly Society, who gave an outline of the history of that Society from its inception; how it was organized in England at the time of an industrial crisis and then, as time went, extended its work, so that now it ministers not only to the needs of working girls, but to the girl whose background is the Country Club. She spoke of the ideals of the Society, saying they were concerned with the principles of living rather than the artificial activities; classing those principles under four heads: Friendliness, Steadfastness, Purity of Life, Acceptance of a Proven Religious Faith.

Bishop Stevens then gave a short talk, telling of the rapid growth of the work in the Diocese and the great need for every one to support the Church's program.

Bishop Johnson appointed the officers for the ensuing year. He spoke with great affection of Mrs. Leonard, regretting the necessity of the resignation of one who, for so many years, had been such a faithful worker as Treasurer of the Auxiliary. He appointed her daughter, Miss Cameron Leonard, Assistant Treasurer *pro tem.*

The Bishop then pronounced the blessing and the meeting adjourned.

Tea was served, Bishop and Mrs. Johnson, Bishop and Mrs. Stevens, receiving in their respective offices, the Deaconesses acting as guides through the Cathedral.

Report of the Recording Secretary.

There have been held, during the past year, seven regular business meetings of the Woman's Auxiliary, five Diocesan meetings, the Summer School Conference and the Advent Quiet Day.

The first Diocesan meeting was held at St. John's Parish House. Mrs. Monteagle, who for many years was President of the Province of the Pacific, gave an inspiring talk. The Right Rev. Joseph H. Johnson, Bishop of the Diocese, pronounced the blessing.

April 8 the meeting was held in the Cathedral House. It was the first time the Auxiliary had met in the new building and was heartily welcomed by Dean MacCormack. The speakers of the afternoon were: Deaconess Hodgkins, Dean of the Deaconesses' Training School of the Pacific and School for Christian Service, and the Rev. Royal Balcom, of Wyoming, who gave an interesting account of his work among the Indians.

The June meeting was held by special invitation at St. Luke's, Long Beach, and proved a very enjoyable occasion. The Rev. Perry Austin opened the meeting. Miss Magill, the Diocesan Auxiliary President, was the speaker of the afternoon.

July 17 the Diocesan Woman's Auxiliary held its first conference at the Summer School. It was such a success that every one felt it must have its place, each year, on the Summer School program.

In October the Diocesan meeting was held in the Cathedral House. The Rev. Mr. Cowans opened the meeting with prayer, and made a short address. The Rev. Mr. Covell, Executive Secretary of Christian Education and Social Service, gave a talk along those lines.

November 11 the meeting was held at the Cathedral House. The Right Rev. W. Bertrand Stevens, Bishop Coadjutor of the Diocese, opened the meeting with prayer. The Rev. Mr. Barnwell, Field Secretary of the National Council for the Province of the Pacific, addressed the meeting, his subject being "The Nation-Wide Campaign," giving an outline of the apportionment plan.

The Advent Quiet Day was held Tuesday, December 9, at St. Paul's Cathedral. There was a celebration of the Holy Communion at 9:30 a. m. The Right Rev. Joseph H. Johnson, Bishop of the Diocese, celebrant, assisted by the Rev. Mr. Cowans. Bishop Johnson conducted the meditations, making a strong plea for a deeper spiritual and religious life.

Report of Box Work.

The shipment for Alaska was sent this past year to St. Timothy's Mission, Tanana Crossing. In that shipment there were 67 bales of clothing and house supplies, one box of medicine, two boxes of candy, and an extra box of overalls from one of our Junior Branches, costing \$32.40; the above bales all going by parcel post, our postage amounting to \$217.70. We also supplied St. John's Hospital, Ketchikan, Alaska; sending to that point 4 bales of hospital supplies, clothing and knitted goods.

So far, the supplies for Tanana Crossing have not all been heard from, Mrs. Wright in her last report telling about half had arrived; but we are assured the remainder are safe but slow in delivery, depending upon dog teams to pick up the numerous bundles for the far-off station.

All bales that had been received were in perfect condition. The total valuation for the Alaska outfit, in box work, was \$5,772.75, and besides 41 Branches contributed in money, including their box work, \$467.56, so we were able to pay in full our Alaska bills for postage, medicine, candy, burlap, insurance, etc., leaving a balance of \$74.63.

It is gratifying to report that all our Branches, including 61 Senior Branches, the Junior and the Girls' Friendly Society contributed to this splendid Alaska shipment, the clothing was unusually fine, in quantity and in work, and we thank you all for carrying out directions so carefully; those in charge of the work were thrilled as the different bundles were opened to find directions had been carried out to the letter. The work for our own Diocese for Advent falls below the mark. We have 61 Branches; of that number 23 failed. Did not respond in any way. We had 17 missionaries in the Diocese to care for.

Nine of our Branches supplied full boxes, 3 of them taking each, 2 boxes, so that 12 of the missionaries had all their needs beautifully cared for, and the other five were looked after by the Diocese at large; as we only had \$465.56 contributed from 29 Branches, we were compelled to borrow from the Diocesan Working Fund to make up the deficit.

The Diocese has grown, but we have not kept up with the growth; we did so well for Alaska, but fell down for those in our own borders. We also supplied the needs of two domestic missionaries, one in the Diocese of California, and one in the Diocese of New Mexico. Our

personal gift \$5.00 was given to Miss Florence Langdon, one time missionary to Alaska. She was much touched at our remembrance.

This year, 1925, the Alaska shipment will be sent to St. Stephen's Mission, under the fostering care of Dr. Grafton Burke, Fort Yukon; as that entire mission suffered from a devastating fire and everything in the hospital and Mission House was a total loss, we ask for a generous response to the requests sent out to each Branch. The demands are heavy we admit, but we feel sure the Diocese can meet them. One request Mrs. Burke makes is for a bolt of white swiss for curtains. Don't fail us. Some of our generous Branches give of their largeness, and let us all "go over the top!" You will find the letters from the Alaska missionaries in the January number of the Los Angeles *Churchman*.

Report of the Altar Department.

The report of the Altar Department of the Woman's Auxiliary for 1924 will show a gratifying increase over last year, but it must be remembered that with building and alterations or various churches in the Diocese many furnishings have passed through our hand. It is encouraging to know that all of the Altar Guilds of recent organization have given of their work this year. Because of these many gifts we have been able to provide as follows:

To St. Luke's, San Diego, hangings, eucharistic lights, cruets, bread box, altar linen and service book.

To Laguna, altar, brass cross, eucharistic lights and cruets.

To La Crescenta, altar.

To Chula Vista, altar, wooden cross, eucharistic lights, linen and service book.

To St. James', San Diego, green silk burse, veil and markers.

To El Sereno, silver chalice, patten, cruets, eucharistic lights, linen and service book.

To Oceanside, alb and amice.

To Culver City, altar linen and organ.

To Wilmington, set of linen.

To the General Missionary, to be used at Walnut Square, altar, lectern, prayer desk, pulpit, dossal, burse and veil.

To Chapel at McKindley Home, purificators.
 To Church of the Advent, chasuble and alb.
 To County and City Mission, cassock, two albs, surplice, green silk, burse and veil, and altar linen.
 A gift of four stoles and clerical suit, was sent to fill a need in the Diocese of California.
 The purchase of a portable altar for the use of the General Missionary fulfilled a wish of many months.
 Through the Altar Guild and friends of St. James' Church, South Pasadena, a portable altar was given as a memorial to "Florence Dobbins Lowe" for Father Ruggles' work.
 Another portable altar with very beautiful linen was given by a parishioner of the same parish for use in the southern part of the Dioceae.

The work of the women and the money pledges have made these gifts possible, but the inspiration and great help of the year has come from the Quiet Hour, kindly arranged and conducted by Bishop Stevens at the Cathedral on October 31st. The Directress of the Altar Society of Massachusetts calls this "a great step forward in Altar Guild work, having great influence in impressing the spiritual meaning and privilege of this work on the women." Let us hope that each one of us will realize the responsibility of the privilege.

Report of the Educational Secretary.

Nineteen hundred and twenty-four was the best year the Educational Department has ever experienced, not only in numbers but in the type of work done. Last winter **Japan** proved a most popular and timely subject, and was studied by the following parishes and missions: Anaheim, Santa Ana, Beaumont, Carpinteria, Corona, Covina, Hemet, La Jolla, Long Beach; Los Angeles—SS. James' and Barnabas', St. Paul's Cathedral (two classes: one St. Perpetua's Guild), Church of

the Redeemer, St. Stephen's and St. Thomas' (joint class); Monrovia, Montecito, Pasadena—All Saints', Riverside (three groups), San Bernardino, San Diego—St. James' and St. Paul's, Santa Monica, Sawtelle, and Upland. These classes all used the **Discussion Method** under competent leaders with the exception of Long Beach, and SS. James' and Barnabas', Los Angeles, who had program meetings; and Hemet and San Bernardino who had reading circles.

The parishes and missions using other subjects than that of Japan are as follows: **Discussion Groups**—Los Angeles, St. Athanasius' and St. John's, using the "Story of the Program"; Tejunga, Watts, and Wilmar, where classes on different mission fields were led by Deaconess Miller. **Program Meetings**, using Current Church Topics—Los Angeles, St. Athanasius', St. Matthias', and St. Thomas'; Ontario, Pasadena, Pomona, Redlands, Santa Barbara, and South Pasadena. **Reading Circles**, using *The Spirit of Missions* and other reading—Chula Vista, Carpinteria, Eagle Rock; St. Luke's, Los Angeles; Redlands, and Redondo Beach. **Lectures** on Church History—Santa Barbara. **Bible Class**—St. Matthias', Los Angeles.

China now challenges us as the subject, especially recommended for study, the text-book in use being the vivid and comprehensive "China's Real Revolution," by Paul Hutchinson. Seven parishes and missions took up this study in the fall: Anaheim, Corona, Hollywood; St. Paul's Cathedral, Los Angeles; St. James', San Diego; Santa Monica, and Venice; and many others have made plans for Epiphany and Lent. This makes a total for the year of thirty-two Discussion Groups of Study Classes, eleven Program Meetings, eight Reading Circles, one series of Lectures, and one Bible Class—representing the work of forty parishes and missions. Fourteen new leaders came to the front and seven new branches took up the work. Special thanks are due to Mrs. W. W. Conner, Deaconess Miller, and Miss Margaret Dunlop, for leading classes outside of their own parishes.

The Educational Secretary wishes to thank all her co-workers, both leaders and members of classes, for their fine spirit of co-operation and understanding, which alone has made possible the growth of the work.

Report of St. Mary's Japanese Mission.

The work of St. Mary's Japanese Mission during this last year by the support of the Woman's Auxiliary was abundantly blessed.

There was marked progress in the enrollment of the Sunday-school, 160 members as against 120 for last year's attendance. As the little Ford is unable to accommodate all the pupils, it is, however, necessary to eliminate some of the children each Sunday.

I am sorry to state that Mrs. Thomas, who has been teaching our Sunday-school for three years, had to leave for Pasadena, but she left as her successor, Miss Hartwell, and we now have three American teachers, besides six Japanese. We still need more American teachers, and if possible would like to replace all Japanese teachers.

Among the upper class of the Sunday-school we formed a Young Citizen Club. They meet every Friday and receive religious instruction, and also instructions along the lines of good American citizenship. Some of them have been in our Sunday-school for nearly ten years and will be ready soon for the confirmation.

We formed also a choir from among them under the leadership of Mrs. Rafter and Miss Morehouse. We expect to have a good choir, and I would like to see a vested choir in our church before long.

Our kindergarten, with Miss Morehouse in charge and one Japanese helper, is doing splendid work. At present we have 43 in daily attendance.

Besides regular pastoral work, the Rector is quite busy, engaged in many other social and rescue works in general. With the help of Dr. Francis, he visits the sick and needy, and during last year we helped six tuberculosis cases, five insanity cases and many other minor cases. Miss Morehouse, who is also a trained nurse, assisted me in this work.

I want to again thank all the members of the Auxiliary for their earnest support and great interest given in the welfare of St. Mary's Mission, and trust they will continue this good work.

CONSTITUTION.

I. This Society shall be called THE LOS ANGELES BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE PRESIDING BISHOP AND COUNCIL.

II. The object of the Society is: By systematic and united effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among the women of the Diocese, to promote the study of missions, and to encourage prayer for missions.

III. The Church itself is the great Missionary Society, and every person, by baptism, becomes a member of this Society; therefore, every baptized woman in the Diocese is a member of the Woman's Auxiliary. But terms of membership in any parish branch shall be fixed by that branch.

IV. All Parish Societies that so desire may become branches of this Auxiliary, first obtaining the consent of the Rector or Clergyman-in-charge, by appointing a Secretary and notifying the President of their intention to work in unison with the Auxiliary.

V. A President, a Vice-President-at-Large, a Vice-President, a Vice-President over such divisions of the Diocese as the Bishop may counsel, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, a Directress of the Altar Department, a Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, a Secretary of the Missions Classes, and an officer over any other department that may be formed, shall be appointed by the Bishop.

VI. The Annual Meeting shall be held at the time of the Diocesan Convention, and Quarterly Meetings on such dates and in such places as the President may appoint. General meetings may be arranged by the Vice-Presidents, in their respective districts.

VII. An Annual Quiet Day shall be held during the season of Advent.

BY-LAWS.

1. The duty of the President shall be to preside at the meetings of the Society, and have general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop. The Vice-President shall act for the President in her absence, and assist her in the care and oversight of the work.

The duty of the other Vice-Presidents shall be to preside in the absence of the President at the general meetings held in their several charges, and to co-operate with the President in the supervision of the work of the Auxiliary in the sections to which they respectively belong.

2. It shall be the duty of the Corresponding Secretary, under the direction of the President, to correspond with the General Secretary of the Auxiliary and the various branches of the Diocese, to furnish them with work, to collect their reports, and to prepare an annual report.

3. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of meetings, to keep a record of such meetings, and to prepare an abstract of the minutes for the annual report.

4. The Treasurer shall keep an account of all moneys received and expended, and make a report at the Annual Meeting.

5. The Directress of the Altar Department, the Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club and the Secretary of the Missions Classes shall superintend their several departments, in consultation with the other Diocesan Officers.

6. The Secretaries of Parish Branches are required to correspond with the Diocesan Officers, who *alone correspond* with the General Secretary and the Secretaries of the Board of Missions, and to transmit to them all moneys.

7. Each Parish Branch shall make an annual pledge, according to its ability, to the current expenses and work of the Diocesan Branch, and also to the Bishop's Missionary Fund for Diocesan work.

8. At the Annual Meeting each branch represented shall be entitled to but one vote on business of general import.

9. All moneys collected for the United Thank Offering Fund shall be paid to the Diocesan Treasurer of that fund, and by her paid to the Auxiliary Treasurer.

This Constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a motion made at the Annual Meeting, and voted on the following year.

President's Address.

To the Presiding Bishop, Council and Officers and Members of the Woman's Auxiliary:

The reports you heard read this morning show you how well the Auxiliary has done this past year, and I am sure it will be an incentive to us to do even better another year. We have welcomed several new Branches, some very small, but it proves that there is a growing feeling, even in the little Missions, that the way to grow and help ourselves is to share what we have with others.

As usual, I report failure on my part to visit all the Branches during the year, it has become quite a physical impossibility, but I have visited in each Convocation, attended the Provincial meeting (held last May in San Jose), and two meetings of the Executive Board in New York.

The needs of the Church are proving more and more, not only the need for more workers, but for greater personal religion. This had been felt so strongly that the Executive Board recently sent a resolution to the National Council pledging its aid toward arousing the women of the Church to a greater sense of spiritual responsibility. This resolution you have read in the Church papers, and it has been read at our Diocesan and parish meetings. If the Woman's Auxiliary is to attempt a greater leadership among the women of the Church (and as an Auxiliary to the National Council it ought to do this), then we must begin, each one of us, to examine ourselves. To think and act in groups is good in many ways, but groups are made up of individuals, and no matter what we do or how we do it, it finally comes back to the individual. So let us strive to make this Auxiliary a greater spiritual power among the women of the Church. Let us cease our worry about ways and means, and try to awaken the women of the Church to such a conception of Christ, that we may all become more effective instruments of His power, in the accomplishment of His purpose for the world.
