

## “BRING THEE HITHER TO ME”

The Woman's Auxiliary asks the prayers of the Church on the Festival of the Transfiguration of Christ (August 6th), the Auxiliary's “Altar Day.”

The following resolution was unanimously adopted at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, St. John's Church, Los Angeles, May 24, 1898, and endorsed the following day by the Diocesan Convention, with the addition that where practicable the offerings be devoted to the General Fund of the Woman's Auxiliary, viz.:

*Resolved*, That we set apart the Fast of the Epiphany for an Auxiliary Day, and that, as members of the Auxiliary, we consider it not only a privilege but a duty to attend the services held on that day in the parish to which we belong; and further,

*Resolved*, That should the appointment of this day meet with the approbation of the clergymen of the Diocese, they be requested to offer, at the celebration of the Holy Eucharist on the Feast of the Epiphany, special prayers for the work of the Auxiliary.

## Report of the Thirty-Second Annual Meeting of Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles

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The thirty-second annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles was held Tuesday, January 31st, at St. Paul's Cathedral, opening with a celebration of the Holy Communion at 9 o'clock. The Rt. Rev. W. Bertrand Stevens, D. D., Bishop Coadjutor was the celebrant, assisted by the Very Rev. Harry Beal, Dean of the Cathedral, the Rev. Mr. Doty and the Rev. Mr. Smith.

At the close of the service, the business session was held in the Cathedral House, Miss Hibbard presiding. Hymn 268 was sung and the Auxiliary Prayer said in unison. Then came the reports, beginning with the Recording Secretary, followed by the report of the Vice-President At Large, and the District Vice-Presidents. All were present but Miss Rouse, Vice-President for Santa Barbara and vicinity. Her report was read by Mrs. Weld.

Mrs. Page Brown, Chairman of the Auditing Committee, reported that the Treasurer's books had been audited and found to be correct.

The Treasurer's report was read, also the report of the Corresponding Secretary, Supply Secretary, Altar Department, Church School Service League, United Thank Offering, Educational Secretary, and Church Periodical Club. The reports were all very fine, showing a steady, healthy growth which is very encouraging. Upon motion these reports were all accepted.

Miss Patton read the report of the Japanese Mission and Mrs. Habersham gave a report of the Corporate Gift.

Then came greetings from the Provincial representatives: Miss Magill brought a message from Mrs. Kidd, our Provincial President, who was unable to be with us; Mrs. Swan, from the Church Periodical Club, and finally Mrs. Stevens brought a report from the fiftieth anniversary of the Girls' Friendly Society which she attended in Boston.

The roll was then called and the pledges made.

The President called the attention of the meeting to some necessary changes in the wording of the Constitution and By-Laws to

bring them up to date. A motion was made that these changes be made. Motion carried.

The proposed scholarship for the School of Christian Service at Berkeley was discussed, and owing to changed conditions there, it was voted to defer taking any final steps.

Upon motion from the floor there was a rising vote of thanks to the Diocesan officers.

Then came the President's address, which was very fine. She spoke of the growth of the Auxiliary in the last year and urged us on to even greater attainment. She expressed her appreciation of the cooperation given her by all the branches. It was with deep feeling that she referred to the great loss the Auxiliary had suffered in the death of the Directress of the Altar Department, Mrs. Robert Carr Block. In closing, Miss Hibbard asked some very searching questions as to our spiritual life, reminding us that at the Triennial the emphasis is to be upon this very thing, the deepening of our spiritual experience so that we may "witness Christ at home as well as abroad by what we are, what we say, and what we do." This, as well, was her message to us.

A motion was made that the President's address be read at every branch meeting of the Diocese. Motion carried.

A motion was made, seconded and carried that greetings be sent to Bishop and Mrs. Johnson, and to our District Vice-President, Miss Rouse.

It was announced that the offerings of the day would be divided between Bishop Moulton and Dr. Burke, two of the speakers of the afternoon.

The noonday prayers were said by Dr. Burke, after which some announcements were made and the meeting adjourned for an hour's recess.

The afternoon session was held at two o'clock in the Cathedral and opened with singing Hymn 105, followed by greetings by the Very Rev. Harry Beal, Dean of the Cathedral.

Miss Ida Stewart Barnes, Social Service worker, at Saint Barnabas House, Los Angeles, gave a very interesting account of the work being done there.

Dr. Grafton Burke, of the Hudson Stuck Memorial Hospital, Fort Yukon, Alaska, told of the splendid work they are doing

among the old and young, many of their patients coming from great distances.

After singing Hymn 493, Mrs. Adela J. Ballard, Western Supervisor of Farm and Cannery migrants under the Council of Women for Home Missions, gave some very startling statistics, saying there were one million migrant workers in the United States, and three million children to be ministered to. The Episcopal Church is doing a good work in places, but there is still great opportunity for service.

Bishop Stevens then told of the plan to build a chapel at Westwood, near the new University of California buildings in order to minister to the students. He feels this to be a great opportunity.

The Rt. Rev. Arthur W. Moulton, D. D., Missionary Bishop of Utah and Nevada, was the next speaker. The title of his address was, "What Difference Does It Make?" He opened his address by telling us that within the past few days he had received word from the National Council that there would be a ten per cent reduction in the missionary appropriation. This added to the five per cent reduction of last year, makes a total reduction of fifteen per cent and is a very serious handicap in carrying on the missionary work. The failure of some dioceses to meet their apportionment has brought about this condition.

During the singing of Hymn 474, the offering was taken.

Before appointing the officers to serve for the coming year, Bishop Stevens spoke in very high terms of Miss Hibbard's administrative ability, complimenting her upon the meeting of the day which he said "was a model meeting, even for men." All the officers, with the exception of two were reappointed. Mrs. Lawrence Lazlett was appointed Educational Secretary to succeed Mrs. Harry Beal, who found it impossible to continue the work and Miss Lynne as Directress of the Altar Department to fill the office left vacant by the death of Mrs. Block.

Bishop Stevens then pronounced the benediction, and the meeting adjourned to the Cathedral House where tea was served.

## Report of the Recording Secretary

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During the past year, there have been nine regular Officer's meetings, two special meetings, seven diocesan auxiliary meetings, two Summer School conferences, and the Advent Quiet Day.

The first Auxiliary meeting was held February 8th, in the Cathedral House. Bishop Stevens opened the meeting and welcomed our new President, Miss Hibbard, who had kindly consented to take the office left vacant by the resignation of Miss Magill. The speaker of the afternoon was Chaplain Husk of the U. S. N. His subject was "Missions of North Carolina."

March 8th, Mr. Miller, Field Director of the Near East Relief, gave a talk and showed some interesting pictures.

April 12th, there were two speakers, Mrs. J. Alvin Shirley, a former missionary in the Yukon, and the Right Reverend Edwin Robins, D. D., Bishop of Athabasca.

At the May 10th meeting, the very sad news reached us of the death of Mrs. Robert Carr Block, who had served so efficiently for a number of years as our Altar Directress. Prayers for the dead were read and resolutions were offered. At this meeting four rural clergy were the speakers. They were the Rev. Mr. Mockford from Lompoc, the Rev. Mr. Dexter, San Fernando, the Rev. Mr. Macdougal, of Hemet, and the Rev. Mr. Bate, Bostonia, each telling of his work and his problems.

The speakers at the June 14th meeting were Deaconess Ridgley and Deaconess Julia Clark, who had just arrived from China, and were able to give us some of their war experiences.

The Summer School conferences were held June 29th and 30th and were very helpful and worthwhile.

The next meeting was not until October 11th, at which time the Rev. Harold Kelly of the Seaman's Church Institute, San Pedro, was the speaker.

November 8th, the Rev. Mr. Bartlett, Field Secretary, to the National Council, spoke on the General Church Program. Dr. and Mrs. Grafton Burke, of the Hudson Stuck Memorial Hospital at Fort Yukon, Alaska, told us something about their splendid work, and our former President, Miss Magill, came to us as our Provincial

Representative to the National Executive Board of the Woman's Auxiliary and brought us a message from the autumn meeting.

At all these meetings there has been an average attendance of from 75 to 80. A new feature has been introduced, that of serving tea at the close of the meetings, the different Parishes taking turns of acting as hostesses. This has proved very successful as it gives the members a chance of meeting the speakers as well as each other and enjoy a social half-hour.

The Advent Quiet Day was held Tuesday, November 29th, in the Cathedral, Bishop Stevens was the celebrant assisted by Dean Beal. The meditations were given by the Rev. Dr. Ridgley, formerly of Nanking, China.

Under the auspices of the Diocesan Woman's Auxiliary, a meeting was held on December 2nd, at which the Right Rev. Edward L. Parsons, D. D., Bishop of California, gave a report of the "Conference on Faith and Order," held at Lausanne, Switzerland, August last, which he attended as a delegate. It was a great privilege to have had this opportunity of hearing Bishop Parsons.

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### Report of Box Work

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The Diocesan work for the year 1927 is quite as encouraging as the year 1926.

The Branches responding generously to all requests sent out by the Supply Department. The Lenten work being sent to supply the needs at the Hudson Stuck Memorial Hospital, under the care of Dr. and Mrs. Burke at Fort Yukon, Alaska. St. Timothy's Mission, St. Timothy's, and St. Andrew's Mission, Stephens Village, under the care of Deaconess Bedell. We also sent to St. Luke's Hospital, Tokio, Japan, blankets and bath towels, which Dr. Teusler had asked for. The total valuation of the Alaska shipment, including Tokio, Japan, also medical supplies to the Alaska outposts, was \$7,988.56, certainly going over the top; being \$1,863.14 better than

we accomplished in 1926. We gratefully thank our generous, efficient Branches, who one, and all made this marvelous gift possible.

The Advent work too has been far beyond our hopes. We have given to 12 of our Diocesan Missionaries, full boxes. Five of our Branches took each a box, and one, the outside box for Nevada, St. Paul's San Diego.

Outside the Diocese we have sent a box to New Mexico, and one to Nevada; also gave a Catechist at Mission, South Dakota, his suit and underwear; and to two women missionaries, one in Japan, and one in China, each \$5.00 as a Christmas gift. 55 Branches gave of their bounty for the Advent work, six taking whole boxes, and about 49 giving cash to buy for the other boxes. We have had almost \$1000.00 sent us to make it possible to give of our largess for the Advent work.

This year, 1928, the Board in New York have sent us allotments for the Hudson Stuck Memorial Hospital at Ft. Yukon, St. John's in the Wilderness, Allakaket, and St. Peters by the Sea, Sitka. As heretofore, we have such unbounded faith in our Diocesan Branches we feel the bales will carry all that these Alaskan Missions ask for. To quote from Kipling:

"It ain't the individual,  
Nor the army as a whole,  
But the everlasting teamwork  
Of every bloomin' soul."

### Report of the Altar Department

The Altar Department has continued its activities during the year 1927 with unabated interest through feeling keenly the loss of the guiding hand and enthusiastic personality of its beloved Directress, Mrs. Block, whose death occurred in May. A fund has been started to perpetuate her memory, entitled the "Anne Scott Block

Memorial Diocesan Altar Fund." To date there has been received \$384.28 and we hope that the fund will grow to proportions which duly reflect our appreciation of the splendid work which Mrs. Block did in the Altar Departemnt.

The fall work was inaugurated with the Quiet Hour on Wednesday afternoon, November 2nd, conducted by the Dean of the Cathedral, the Very Rev. Harry Beal.

Every Wednesday morning, at 9:30 at the Cathedral there is a session of the class in ecclesiastical embroidery and anyone who has any problem in Altar work can come in for consultation and advice. We can often help with the showing of samples of materials and designs and the reference to catalogues. More workers are needed and anyone who is skillful with the needle could accomplish a great deal for us, with comparatively little effort.

## Report of the Educational Secretary

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The visit of Miss Boyer to our diocese and four convocations last March, proved remarkably stimulating to our educational work. Miss Boyer is the Assistant Educational Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary of the whole Church, and her visit was arranged for by my predecessor, Miss Hibbard. An all-day institute was held in each convocation by Miss Boyer. She spoke on the discussion method, explaining and strongly commanding it, and also gave an introduction to the study of the rural problem, which was our subject for 1927. A total of 385 women heard Miss Boyer.

Next in importance, I would place two normal classes for leaders—one splendidly led by Mrs. Laslett for the five days of our diocesan summer school last June, and the other equally well led by Mrs. McIndoe for four meetings in San Diego in September. Mrs. Van Schaick and several other leaders then conducted four interesting meetings this fall in connection with the San Diego district institute.

Another feature of our participation in summer school was the Woman's Auxiliary educational conference one afternoon. The attendance at this was ninety, which was over twice as many as in 1926.

In 1927 twenty-nine study classes on "Beyond City Limits" have been reported to me. Twenty-five Auxiliaries have held monthly program meetings. There have been five class groups on the Bible and Prayer Book. Seven Auxiliaries have had reading circles.

Four subscriptions to "Rural American" for our clergy have been given by three Auxiliaries and one also gave a "Rural Worker's Fellowship." The Study Classes were asked to make a voluntary offering for a rural clergy conference to be held in this diocese under Bishop Steven's directions. The amount received from eleven classes was \$59.76 which together with \$41.00, the offering at one of our diocesan monthly meetings, when several of our rural clergy spoke, makes the total \$100.76.

I have spoken at twelve Auxiliary meetings on educational work. I have sent out three sets of circular letters to all branch secretaries and educational secretaries in the diocese. The book business has been flourishing. One hundred eighty-five copies of "Beyond City Limits," and two hundred seventeen copies of "A

Church Awake," have been sold. Besides a number of copies of other books and manuals. The receipts from the sale of books and leaflets amounted to Three Hundred Ten Dollars Fifteen Cents (\$310.15). Expended for purchase of books, postage, mimeographing Two Hundred Eighty-Four Dollars Forty-Three Cents (\$284.43); leaving a balance, January 30th, 1928, of Twenty-Five Dollars Seventy-Two Cents (\$25.72).

Mrs. Mac Ewen gave many faithful hours arranging, cataloging and increasing our diocesan educational library, which is available for anyone interested and will be found in the Assembly Room of the the Cathedral House. The library contains about eighty well selected volumes of recent publications.

To the diocesan educational committee, consisting of Mrs. Vallat, Mrs. Baird S. Cooper, Miss Dunlop, Mrs. Ruggles and Mrs. Mac Ewen, I want to give special thanks for their help. The educational secretaries and leaders in our parishes and missions deserve great praise. They are holding up a light for their fellow Church women. Many more of our congregations should have such light-bearers, may the number increase, for they help keep bright the light of Christ at home and far away.

### **Report of St. Mary's Japanese Mission**

I wish to express my hearty thanks to the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese for the support given to the St. Mary's Japanese Episcopal Mission during the past year.

The Woman's Auxiliary bought the Church site for St. Mary's 15 years ago. Mrs. Johnson gave us a Parish Hall, but we have outgrown them and cannot accommodate our 250 children and we badly need the Church and Parish Hall to meet.

There are in Southern California, 28 Japanese Missions. Recently they all built new churches to meet the need. I am happy, however, to tell you that we have the largest Sunday School in all

these 28 Missions, but we do not have adequate quarters, and must have our own church building.

Our Sunday School is ever increasing in the enrollment and attendance. Kindergarten keeping attendance of 50 daily. Boy Scouts which was only started one year ago with 12 boys, now has 25 scouts with 18 candidates waiting for the age qualification. Girls under Miss Knapp's valued leadership doing fine work. 20 members volunteer each Sunday to carry on this work.

We have in St. Mary's five paid workers besides the Priest of the Church. Your help enables us to carry on the Church work with these paid workers.

Twenty-one years ago you gave a start to this Mission and it is now reaping the fruit abundantly. \$40,000 is needed to have a well equipped Church and Parish Hall; toward that Miss Mary Patterson promised \$5000. The members of St. Mary's will raise \$5000. With this \$10,000 as a foundation we are going to start to raise this year a fund for the rest of the \$30,000.

Now the Woman's Auxiliary gave us the start and the lot. (We have two lots, one given by the Woman's Auxiliary and one by Miss Patterson) on which we will build our Church and Parish House, and I am sure that warm motherly support will be given for the building of the New Church by the Woman's Auxiliary.

## CONSTITUTION

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I. This Society shall be called THE LOS ANGELES BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE NATIONAL COUNCIL.

II. The object of the Society is: By systematic and united effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among the women of the Diocese, to promote the study of missions, to encourage prayer for missions, and to be of service to the National Council in all its departments.

III. The Church itself is the great Missionary Society, and every person, by baptism, becomes a member of this Society; therefore, every baptized woman in the Diocese is a member of the Woman's Auxiliary. But terms of membership in any parish branch shall be fixed by that branch.

IV. All Parish Societies that so desire may become branches of this Auxiliary, first obtaining the consent of the Rector or Clergyman-in-charge, by appointing a Secretary and notifying the President of their intention to work in unison with the Auxiliary.

V. A President, a Vice-President-at-Large, a Vice-President, a Vice-President over such divisions of the Diocese as the Bishop may counsel, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, a Supply Secretary, an Educational Secretary, a United Thank Offering Treasurer, a Directress of the Altar Department, a Directress of the Church Periodical Club, and an officer over any other department that may be formed, shall be appointed by the Bishop.

VI. The Annual Meeting shall be held at the time of the Diocesan Convention, and Monthly Diocesan Meetings on such dates and in such places as the President may appoint. General meetings may be arranged by the Vice-Presidents, in their respective districts.

VII. An Annual Quiet Day shall be held during the season of Advent.

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## BY-LAWS

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1. The duty of the President shall be to preside at the meetings of the Society, and have general charge of the work, under the di-

rection of the Bishop. The Vice-President shall act for the President in her absence, and assist her in the care and oversight of the work. The duty of the other Vice-Presidents shall be to preside in the absence of the President at the general meetings held in their several charges, and to co-operate with the President in the supervision of the work of the Auxiliary in the sections to which they respectively belong.

2. It shall be the duty of the Corresponding Secretary to correspond with the various branches in the Diocese, to collect their reports, and to prepare an annual report.

3. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of meetings, to keep a record of such meetings, and to prepare an abstract of the minutes for the annual report.

4. The Treasurer shall keep an account of all moneys received and expended, and make a report at the Annual Meeting.

5. The Supply Secretary, the Educational Secretary, the United Thank Offering Treasurer, the Directress of the Altar Department, the Directress of the Church Periodical Club shall superintend their several departments, in consultation with the other Diocesan Officers.

6. The Secretaries of Parish Branches are required to correspond with the Diocesan Officers, who alone correspond with the National Secretaries of the Woman's Auxiliary.

7. Each Parish Branch shall make an annual pledge, according to its ability, to the following Diocesan Funds—*the General Working Fund, the Bishop's Missionary Fund, and the Altar Fund. These pledges, and all other money, must be sent through the Diocesan Treasurer, and all checks made out to her.*

8. At the Annual Meeting each branch represented shall be entitled to but one vote on business of general import.

9. All moneys collected for the United Thank Offering Fund shall be paid to the Diocesan Treasurer of that fund, and by her paid to the Diocesan Auxiliary Treasurer.

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*This Constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a motion made at the Annual Meeting, and voted on the following year.*

## President's Address

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*To the Presiding Bishop, Council and Officers and Members of the Woman's Auxiliary:*

My first year as your President has been a most delightful one. Due to the fine pioneer work of my predecessors, Miss Magill, Mrs. Hubert, and Mrs. Cowles, as well as still earlier Presidents, I found a Diocese splendidly organized and fully awake to the ideals and responsibilities of the Woman's Auxiliary. The branches have given me their heartiest co-operation and wherever I have had the pleasure of personally visiting them I have been received with great cordiality. It was a special pleasure to attend the Convocation meetings at San Diego and Redlands, and to visit Santa Barbara, Ventura, and Santa Paula. New life is being developed in the Convocations which speaks of a splendid future. All of this added to my staff of efficient and untiring officers has made the past year a very happy and easy one.

From the reports that you have heard this morning I think we may justly say that we have had a successful year. Our United Thank Offering is the largest we have ever had. At the last Triennial we gave \$16,129.06 from this Diocese, let our aim for 1928 be \$18,000.00. The Corporate Gift should also receive our loyal support. The work of the Supply Department has been splendid, and the Educational Department has had an unusually active year. There has also been a larger attendance at our monthly diocesan meetings which shows that the Auxiliary members are eager to learn of the current work and problems of the Church. We rejoice in all this gain but do not let us rest satisfied. We have a tremendous piece of work ahead of us. We have seventy-two branches of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese—splendid—but on the other hand there are one hundred and nineteen parishes and missions. Our aim is to have a branch in each parish and mission. An impossible vision you say, but “a man's reach should exceed his grasp, or what's a heaven for.” The older, stronger branches can be of great assistance in helping us to establish these new branches and in sheltering them under their broad wings.

It is hard to speak of the great loss that the Auxiliary has suffered during the past year in the death of the Directress of the Altar Department, Mrs. Robert Carr Block. A woman of rare gifts

and charm she brought to her task the fullest consecration, and her loss to the Diocese cannot be adequately expressed. Her fellow officers are grateful for the great privilege of working with her for the five years she served the Diocese. Her fine spirit lives on in her successor who brings to the work the same efficiency and high aims. I wonder if we all thoroughly realize the vital piece of missionary work that the Altar Department is doing in caring for the missions in our own Diocese. This department, as many of you know, was started many years ago by our own dear Mrs. Johnson and faithfully served by her for twenty years, and it has always had at its head a splendid type of woman. I commend it to you.

We spoke a little while ago of our material gains. What of our spiritual success? We have had our Quiet Days, our Corporate Communions, our Prayer Circles. Have they resulted in the deepening of our spiritual lives? As members of the Woman's Auxiliary do we stand out in our parishes and communities as women of character and spiritual force? Are we striving to meet the great problems of a changing world with courage and intelligence? Does Christianity so shine through us—its joy, its beauty, its power—that others want to be like us? It is well to ask ourselves these pertinent questions. At the next Triennial the emphasis is to be on this very thing—the deepening of our spiritual experience so that we may “witness to Christ at home as well as abroad by what we are, by what we say, and by what we do.” It is also my message to you today.

With this thought of the Triennial I want to close. Next October our delegates will be representing us at Washington and we want them to do so with the happy consciousness of work well done. This calls for the loyal support of each and every member of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of Los Angeles.

## In Memoriam

Entered into the Rest of Paradise on the fourth of May, 1927, at Paris, France, Anne Scott Block.

The following resolution was adopted at the June meeting of the diocesan officers:

*Resolved*—That in the death of Anne Scott Block, the Directress of the Altar Department of the Woman's Auxiliary, the Diocese of Los Angeles has suffered an irreparable loss.

Mrs. Block endeared herself to everyone with whom she came in contact, not only by her able leadership and untiring efforts as Diocesan Directress of the Altar Department, but by her rare personality. She gave of herself as well as of her time and talents, and underneath all her activity and buoyancy of spirit lay a deep spirituality and an abiding faith and joy in the Church and Her Ways. Her Wednesday classes in ecclesiastical embroidery, held at the Cathedral, will long be remembered by those who had the privilege of attending them, and the clergy and workers in the small missions will miss the cheer and enthusiasm she brought when she visited and encouraged them in their efforts to surround the Lord's own Service with simple and reverent dignity. Many churches and missions stations have been beautified through her ministrations. To her life was a privilege to be lived in service to others and she leaves behind her a host of friends throughout the Diocese in all walks of life who will cherish her memory in their hearts.

Grant her eternal rest, O Lord, and may light perpetual shine upon her.





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
