## “BRING THEE HITHER TO ME”

The Woman's Auxiliary asks the prayers of the Church on the Festival of the Transfiguration of Christ (August 6th), the Auxiliary's “Altar Day.”

The following resolution was unanimously adopted at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, St. John's Church, Los Angeles, May 24, 1898, and endorsed the following day by the Diocesan Convention, with the addition that where practicable the offerings be devoted to the General Fund of the Woman's Auxiliary, viz.:

*Resolved*, That we set apart the Feast of the Epiphany for an Auxiliary Day, and that, as members of the Auxiliary, we consider it not only a privilege but a duty to attend the services held on that day in the parish to which we belong; and further,

*Resolved*, That should the appointment of this day meet with the approbation of the clergymen of the Diocese, they be requested to offer, at the celebration of the Holy Eucharist on the Feast of the Epiphany, special prayers for the work of the Auxiliary.

O Almighty Father, Who didst vouchsafe to Thy chosen ones on the mount the comforting vision of the glory that shall be revealed, to strengthen and cheer them in their Apostolic work, we beseech Thee to be with Thy servants, the members of the Woman's Auxiliary of this Diocese, in all their efforts for the spread of the Kingdom of Thy dear Son. Grant that to many hearts may go the call of opportunity to serve Thee in this work, in the bearing of others' burdens and the fulfillment of the law of Christ. In what they think and do, enable them to hear the voice of Thy Son to guide and strengthen them. And in all the means of grace in Thy Church, and more especially in the Holy Communion at Thy Altars, help them to see Him Who is invisible, that in their aims and difficulties and trials they may have the abiding faith that all things are possible to them that believe. We ask this for the merits of Him Who came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, Thy Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

O Lord, our Heavenly Father, we pray Thee to send forth more laborers into Thy harvest, and to grant them Thy special grace for every need. Accept, from grateful hearts, our United Thank Offering of prayer and gifts and joyful service; and bless it to the coming of Thy Kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Almighty God, whose son Jesus Christ came to cast fire upon the earth; grant that by the prayers of Thy faithful people a fire of burning zeal may be kindled and pass from heart to heart, that the light of Thy Church may shine forth bright and clear; through the same Thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

## Minutes of the Thirty-Third Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary

The Thirty-third annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles was held on Tuesday, January 29th in St. Paul's Cathedral, opening with a celebration of the Holy Communion at 9 o'clock. The Rt. Rev. W. Bertrand Stevens, D.D., Bishop of the Diocese celebrated, assisted by the Very Reverend Harry Beal, Dean of the Cathedral, the Reverend Mr. Doty, and the Reverend Mr. Mockford of Lompoc.

The business meeting followed this service and was held in the Cathedral House at 10 o'clock. Miss Hibbard called the meeting to order. Hymn 271 was sung and Bishop Stevens read the opening prayer.

Miss Hibbard asked that the minutes of the last meeting might be omitted as they are published in the Annual. She called upon the officers for their annual reports, beginning with the Recording Secretary. Then the Vice-President at Large, and the District Vice-Presidents. Our valued Treasurer, Mrs. Miller and her able assistant, Miss Cameron Leonard were both ill and unable to be present. Their report was read by Mrs. Page Brown.

The chairman of the Auditing Committee reported that the books had been audited and were found to be correct. The reports of the Corresponding Secretary, Supply Secretary, Educational Secretary, Altar Department, United Thank Offering, and Church Periodical Club followed.

Deaconess Rearden was also ill and could not be with us. Her report as Dioceasan Supervisor of the Service Program for Church Schools, was read by Mrs. Vallat, also the Birthday Thank Offering report.

Mrs. Laslett read the report of St. Mary's Japanese Mission.

Miss Hibbard gave the report of the Corporate Gift and read a letter from the chairman, Mrs. Habersham, written from the Holy Land, in which she sent her greetings to the members of the Auxiliary. All of the foregoing reports showed a steady growth of the work of the Auxiliary. Upon motion they were accepted.

Then came the roll call and pledges. Miss Hibbard requested that only three pledges be given at this time, namely: Bishop's Fund, General Working Fund, and Altar Fund, the others to be written on the Pledge cards which were passed around. This greatly aided the dispatch of business.

We missed our absent officers very much. The platform seemed empty without them, but we were fortunate to have with us our

Provincial President, Mrs. Thomas W. Kydd, and Bishop Sanford who helped to swell our numbers.

Mrs. Kydd brought a message from the Triennial, speaking of Personal Religion and Evangelism, under three heads, Obligation, Vocation and Inspiration, and asked us to consider five points: the ministry of books, ministry of prayer, ministry of the spoken word, ministry of the Holy Communion, and the ministry of example. Her message was very spiritual and uplifting.

Mrs. Cowles took the chair while our President made her address. Miss Hibbard asked us to rise as she read the opening paragraph of her address, which was a tribute to our beloved Bishop Johnson, whom we have so recently lost. She spoke of his wonderful gift of sympathy and understanding and his keen interest in the Woman's Auxiliary. She also spoke of Mrs. Bugbee, who had been a member of the Board in the early days and for many years did such fine work and who has now passed on to a larger life. Miss Hibbard spoke with grateful appreciation of Bishop Stevens' cooperation with us, assuring him of our continued loyalty. Our President spurs us on to greater achievement and asks us to have as our United Thank Offering goal in 1931, \$25,000. Her challenge was, "Courage and Vision." There was a rising vote of thanks to Miss Hibbard.

Two motions were made from the floor, one that a letter of love and greeting be sent to Mrs. Johnson; the other that a letter of sympathy be sent to our sick members and a letter of greeting to our absent members. Both motions carried by a rising vote.

The noonday prayers were read by Bishop Sanford.

Miss Hibbard made several announcements especially emphasizing that there would be an Auxiliary Conference from 1 to 2 o'clock.

The meeting then adjourned to reassemble at 2 o'clock.

\* \* \* \* \*

The afternoon session was held in the Cathedral at 2 o'clock, and opened with Hymn 486, "Christ for the World We Sing," followed by a greeting by the Very Reverend Harry Beal, Dean of the Cathedral, who also spoke in behalf of the General Church Program.

Miss Mary E. Sanford, National Field Secretary of the Girls' Friendly Society, took us on a tour of the Eighth Province, covering 35,000 miles, which was very interesting.

Bishop Stevens then told us what is being done at the University of California at Los Angeles, in a religious way. There is need for a common program which will be met by what is known as The

University Religious Conference, composed of all Christian bodies and Judaism. Through the cooperation of the Roman Catholic authorities, the Conference is taking over the Newman Club as their place of meeting. The Bishop said, "We are making history here in Southern California, as such a demonstration of religious fellowship is unparalleled." He hopes for great things from this body.

Miss Miriam Van Waters, Referee of the Juvenile Court of Los Angeles was the next speaker. She told us of what is being done in Juvenile Court to help the child. That it tries to defend the child as the parent would, and as so many of the children come from broken homes, a great effort is made to reach the home and real-just matters there. This is a wonderful piece of work and needs the financial support of the church members if it is to progress.

The Right Reverend Norman Binsted of Tohaku, Japan, gave a missionary address, making a strong appeal for St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo, which is to be rebuilt and to which we are being asked to contribute. Mr. Rush, who is on the committee for this work, also made a plea for it. Bishop Stevens endorsed all that was said by Bishop Binsted and Mr. Rush, saying that this work had been endorsed by General Convention.

Hymn 843, "God is Working His Purpose Out," was sung as an offertory hymn. The offering was divided between Bishop Binsted and Bishop Stevens.

Bishop Stevens said that for a number of years, we as a Diocese, had met our apportionment. This year our obligation has been increased 20 per cent, which makes it amount to \$54,000, but of course, it was to be considered a compliment that our apportionment had been increased.

Before appointing the officers to serve for the coming year, Bishop Stevens spoke with regret that a number of the old officers had found it necessary to retire. He paid a tribute to the old Board and specially commended Miss Hibbard for her fine leadership. The new appointments were: Miss Magill as Honorary Vice-President to succeed Mrs. Hubert; Mrs. Harry Beal as Assistant Vice-President of Los Angeles and vicinity; Mrs. F. C. Malpas, Corresponding Secretary to succeed Mrs. Page Brown; Mrs. M. K. Crawford, Treasurer to succeed Mrs. Ray O. Miller; Mrs. W. J. Pierce, Directress of the Altar Department to succeed Miss Lynne.

Bishop Stevens pronounced the blessing and the meeting adjourned.

## Report of the Recording Secretary

In the past year there have been: Eight regular officers' meetings; three special meetings; eight Auxiliary meetings; two Summer School conferences and the Advent Quiet Day.

The first Auxiliary meeting of the year was held February 14th in the Cathedral House. The speakers were Mrs. Lawrence Laslett, who succeeded Mrs. Beal as Diocesan Educational Secretary and Mrs. Ethel Richardson Allen, Assistant State Superintendent of Public Instruction.

The March meeting was held on the 13th in the Cathedral House as usual. At this time the delegates and alternates for the Triennial were appointed. The speaker announced for the afternoon was Mrs. G. K. Wade, National Supply Secretary, who was coming from Santa Barbara but was very much delayed by the breaking of the St. Francis Dam. We were fortunate, however, in having at our meeting, the Rt. Rev. William Remington, D.D., Bishop of Eastern Oregon, who kindly consented to fill in the time until Mrs. Wade's arrival and gave us a delightful impromptu talk.

At the April 10th meeting, the Girl's Friendly Society had an exhibition of the beautiful layettes, their contribution to the Alaska work. They also served tea for us that afternoon. Their President, Mrs. Riddell, was called upon to address the meeting which she did briefly. The speaker of the afternoon was Mr. A. Abbott Hastings, of St. Michael's Mission, Ethete, Wyoming. Mr. Hastings is a layman who has been devoting himself to work among the Arapahoe Indians, and told us many interesting things about them.

The May 8th meeting was presided over by Mrs. Cowles, Vice-President at Large, as our President, Miss Hibbard was in Salt Lake City, attending a meeting of the Synod. Deaconess Peppers, a U. T. O. worker, from the Philippine Islands was the speaker of the afternoon.

The June 12th meeting was opened with a brief memorial service to Bishop Johnson. The prayers were offered by Bishop Stevens. Mrs. Cowles paid a loving tribute, Miss Laura Smith read the resolutions and some of Bishop Johnson's favorite hymns were sung. Following this service the regular meeting was held. A former president, Mrs. Hubert, was present and said a few words to us. Bishop Sanford of San Joaquin was the speaker, who came to tell

us of his six weeks in the Orient. Bishop Riebsnider attended the meeting and kindly responded to Miss Hibbard's request to hear something from Japan.

June 26th the Woman's Auxiliary held a conference at the Summer School which was well attended and was very successful. Miss Boyer, the National Educational Secretary was among the speakers. June 27th the Educational Conference was held. Mrs. Laslett presided and Miss Boyer lead the discussions.

November 13th Miss Hibbard was ill and could not be with us. Mrs. Cowles presided. At this meeting Bishop Stevens, Dean Beal, Mrs. Cowles, Mrs. Stevens, Mrs. Beal, Mrs. Gardett, and Mrs. Vallatt brought us reports from General Convention.

The Advent Quiet Day was held December 4th, opening with a celebration of the Holy Communion at 9:30 a. m., the Rt. Rev. W. Bertrand Stevens, D.D., Bishop of the Diocese, Celebrant, assisted by the Very Rev. Harry Beal, Dean of the Cathedral. Before giving the meditations, Bishop Stevens announced the death of Rural Dean Evans and paid a very beautiful tribute to his memory. The meditations were three in number. First, Evangelism and Missions, second, Peace and Unity, third, Youth, Woman and Education, which were topics discussed at General Convention. Bishop Stevens emphasized both the spiritual and practical sides of each in a very helpful way.

The last Auxiliary meeting of the year was held December 11th. At this meeting Miss Hibbard gave a very comprehensive account of the Triennial and especially of the U.T.O. service, at which time she presented the gift of this Diocese which amounted to \$20,706.50. Miss Hibbard expressed her appreciation of the very fine work done by Mrs. Stockton, our U.T.O. Treasurer. The speaker at this meeting was the Rev. Vernon D. Ruggles, of the County and City Missions, who told of the work being done by that Society in public institutions, the General Hospital, etc., etc.

All of these meetings have been very well attended. Calling the roll has been helpful and has stimulated attendance.

## Report of Box Work

The Lenten Season is here, so to speak, and we enter upon another year of work and effort. In 1928 our Lenten supplies were given to Ft. Yukon, Allakaket and Sitka, Alaska. We also gave to the Hospital in Shanghai, China, bedding, etc., value over \$100. The total valuation of the Alaska shipment including Shanghai, also including medical supplies to Alaska outposts was \$7,856.91, nearly as much in valuation as 1927.

The Advent work as well was more than satisfactory. The Branches responded most generously, so that 10 of our Diocesan Missionaries received full boxes. Six branches taking full boxes two outside ones. St. Paul's, San Diego, one for Kingman, Arizona and All Saints', Pasadena, one for the Missionary at Farmington, New Mexico.

We have also sent to an Indian Catechist, Pine Ridge Agency, South Dakota, his suit and underwear and \$5.00 to the woman missionary at Alberene, Virginia. We have had about \$1,000 contributed for the Advent work and it has been possible to meet every need called for, a fine record for a branch to make.

The Alaska shipment, 1928—Ft. Yukon, 6 bales, 2 of these hospital supplies—7 boxes, 4 of these hospital supplies—approximate value \$3,000. To Allakaket—4 bales, 1 box of medical supplies, approximate value \$2,003.24. To Sitka, 4 bales, value \$1,835.44. Total number of pieces 22, all of which were insured to their destination.

This year, 1929, the Board in New York have asked us to provide a big allotment in our Western Mission Field, and it is a far cry from our Branch, Los Angeles to the Mountain Province Bontoc, Philippine Islands, Cluett House, Honolulu, a self-supporting home for young girls who need care at a critical period during the first years of freedom, a more dangerous period in Honolulu, probably, than the same would be to girls in any city on the mainland. We shall also supply the Hospital at Wusih, China. Also send supplies to San Juan Mission Hospital, Farmington, New Mexico, a hospital for our Navajo Indians. Eight Missions which include three hospitals so that we shall need more money than usual for medical supplies.

The middle of October we had an S. O. S. call from Nenana, Alaska. The mission was in desperate straits for winter clothing,

which were woolen underwear, sweaters, etc. As their regular appeal this year had been assigned to us, the supply department in New York telegraphed us for help. Our Diocesan working fund, came to our rescue and gave us \$196 for the time being and Mr. Horton, Bishop Rowe's commissary, purchased the articles in Seattle and sent them at once to Miss Blacknall, all that were required. The loan we can repay when cash is sent us towards the Alaska allotment.

In 1928 the Girls' Friendly Society of this Diocese made the layettes for Alaska, so beautifully made and daintily put together, they were worthy the attention of the finest needlewoman in Christendom and fit for the most tenderly nurtured baby in any land. The Supply Committee, feel they ought to be longer on exhibition and every member of the Auxiliary ought to see the wonderful handiwork these young women put into their sewing, for little babies in far off desolate lands. This year we have asked the G. F. S. to do all the layettes, 12 of them will go to New Mexico to the dispensary there, two to Arctic Village, Alaska, 20 to Nenana, Alaska and six to Tanana, total number being 40.

Thank you one and all for your hearty co-operation for the work you have accomplished. Let this be your thought for the new year "While life is good to give, I give".

## Report of the Educational Secretary

During the past year three factors have contributed to the success of the educational department; first, the fine foundation laid by my predecessors; next, the efficient and constant co-operation of each member of the educational committee and of all educational secretaries of parish branches; and, lastly, the unusual privilege enjoyed by this Diocese in the daily classes led, during the entire week of Summer School, by Miss Laura Boyer, National Assistant Educational Secretary. Miss Boyer also conducted a splendid educational conference which was largely attended.

Educational conferences for leaders have been held in San Diego convocation and I have led one normal class of four sessions in the Cathedral House.

Thirty-nine (39) parishes and missions have reported interest in educational work. Thirty-five (35) auxiliaries have held program meetings. Nineteen (19) have had discussion groups, eleven (11) have reported successful Bible classes, and four (4) have reading circles. Eight (8) auxiliaries have book shelves. One (1) donation subscription to "Rural America" was received.

I have spoken to ten (10) auxiliaries, conducted ten (10) discussions groups, five (5) Bible classes, four (4) normal class sessions, spoken at two (2) sessions of an educational institute arranged by Mrs. Van Schoich in San Diego, spoken at two (2) sessions of the Convocation meeting in San Bernardino, and at the Interdenominational School of Missions in Los Angeles. I have sent out three (3) sets of circular letters to all educational secretaries and have written by hand one hundred thirty-eight (138) letters and cards.

The book business shows a healthy increase over last year. Two hundred twenty (220) copies of "The New Africa" have been sold besides a number of copies of "A Church Awake" and numerous other books, leaflets, etc. Receipts from the sale of books, pamphlets, cards, etc., amounted to three hundred fifty-two dollars fifty-two cents (\$352.52). Expended for the purchase of books, postage, printing, mimeographing, etc. three hundred twenty dollars eighty-five cents (\$320.85); leaving a balance, January 17th of thirty one dollars sixty-seven cents (\$31.67).

My thanks are due to Mrs. M. H. Jolley who has been in charge of the Diocesan library, an institution which should prove of edu-

tional value to all auxiliary members. Several new volumes have lately been added to its shelves and donations of current books are most welcome. I wish, also, to express my special appreciation of Mrs. Wadsworth Baylor of Santa Barbara, Mrs. G. A. Hanson of San Bernardino, Mrs. W. L. Van Schoich of San Diego, and to the other members of the educational committee—Mrs. Baird S. Cooper, who has had charge of the speakers' bureau, and Mrs. B. W. Vallatt of Santa Monica.

Their cheerful service has been not only a help but an inspiration and my hope and prayer for the future is that in each parish there may be raised up leaders, under whose guidance the educational work may become a gateway leading us outward into fields of greater knowledge of and devotion to the things that are eternal.

### **Report of St. Mary's Japanese Mission**

St. Mary's Japanese Episcopal Mission carried on her work quite favorably in 1928 and I have cause of giving my heartfelt thanks to the ever increasing support of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese for past 21 years.

In spite of the lack of proper church and parish buildings we have managed to have our daily kindergarten, Sunday School and other church activities kept up very well. Ours is the All-Year active church. The Kindergarten which is being taught by one American teacher and a Japanese helper had an average of fifty children for daily attendance. The afternoon school taught by three Japanese teachers hold 95 pupils. Sunday school enrollment reached from 265 to 300 at the end of the last year and we have had Sunday school and church every one of the 52 Sundays last year. Besides these we have Boy Scouts of 30 boys and Girls Club—Girls Reserve and Chrysanthemum Club of Girls and Smaller Boys Club. The members of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew faithfully served with me in every work done in the Mission.

We received \$336.00 from the treasurers of Woman's Auxiliary last year for our work. Those are the pledges from the 20 branches of the Women's Auxiliary of the Diocese and I beg to thank you for the help, because it enabled us to carry on our work. St. Mary's has besides the Vicar five paid workers. Among these five two are in charge of Kindergarten who are paid by the Board of Missions and three other workers are paid by us. The salary of those three workers are together \$2520.00 yearly and \$600 for operation of the school bus and other expenses. Those workers are not merely teachers at Kindergarten and schools but they all work as missionaries so in keeping the schools it helps a great deal in Christianizing the Japanese children and their parents. And your support means a great deal in keeping the important work going on.

We are trying to get the new building built this year which is very badly needed. We must take care of the ever increasing numbers who come into the fold of the church. Those children of Buddhist parentage whose spiritual welfare is in our charge, must not be turned away. I pray and trust that the Woman's Auxiliary who has sponsored St. Mary's for past 21 years and which bought us our present location will help us not only to keep the work up but to have the new building provided for it.

In addition to the above I received a donation of \$25 which the Woman's Auxiliary gave to me to welcome and entertain those eleven Japanese Episcopal Church Delegates who came from Japan to attend the Tenth World Sunday School Convention held in this city, last summer.

They were taken to the sight seeing and visiting of the churches (St. John's, St. Paul's and St. James' of Los Angeles and All Saints', Pasadena) and finally were entertained at a dinner.

They were all grateful and asked me to thank the members of the Woman's Auxiliary.

## CONSTITUTION

I. This Society shall be called THE LOS ANGELES BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE NATIONAL COUNCIL.

II. The object of the Society is: By systematic and united effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among the women of the Diocese, to promote the study of missions, to encourage prayer for missions, and to be of service to the National Council in all its departments.

III. The Church itself is the great Missionary Society, and every person, by baptism, becomes a member of this Society; therefore, every baptized woman in the Diocese is a member of the Woman's Auxiliary. But terms of membership in any parish branch shall be fixed by that branch.

IV. All Parish Societies that so desire may become branches of this Auxiliary, first obtaining the consent of the Rector or Clergyman-in-charge, by appointing a Secretary and notifying the President of their intention to work in unison with the Auxiliary.

V. A President, a Vice-President-at-Large, a Vice-President, a Vice-President over such divisions of the Diocese as the Bishop may counsel, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, a Supply Secretary, an Educational Secretary, a United Thank Offering Treasurer, a Directress of the Altar Department, a Directress of the Church Periodical Club, and an officer over any other department that may be formed, shall be appointed by the Bishop.

VI. The Annual Meeting shall be held at the time of the Diocesan Convention, and Monthly Diocesan Meetings on such dates and in such places as the President may appoint. General meetings may be arranged by the Vice-Presidents, in their respective districts.

VII. An Annual Quiet Day shall be held during the season of Advent.

---

## BY-LAWS

1. The duty of the President shall be to preside at the meetings of the Society, and have general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop. The Vice-President shall act for the Presi-

dent in her absence, and assist her in the care and oversight of the work. The duty of the other Vice-Presidents shall be to preside in the absence of the President at the general meetings held in their several charges, and to co-operate with the President in the supervision of the work of the Auxiliary in the sections to which they respectively belong.

2. It shall be the duty of the Corresponding Secretary to correspond with the various branches in the Diocese, to collect their reports, and to prepare an annual report.

3. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of meetings, to keep a record of such meetings, and to prepare an abstract of the minutes for the annual report.

4. The Treasurer shall keep an account of all moneys received and expended, and make a report at the Annual Meeting.

5. The Supply Secretary, the Educational Secretary, the United Thank Offering Treasurer, the Directress of the Altar Department, the Directress of the Church Periodical Club shall superintend their several departments, in consultation with the other Diocesan Officers.

6. The Secretaries of Parish Branches are required to correspond with the Diocesan Officers, who alone correspond with the National Secretaries of the Woman's Auxiliary.

7. Each Parish Branch shall make an annual pledge, according to its ability, to the following Diocesan Funds—*the General Working Fund, the Bishop's Missionary Fund, and the Altar Fund. These pledges, and all other money, must be sent through the Diocesan Treasurer, and all checks made out to her.*

8. At the Annual Meeting each branch represented shall be entitled to but one vote on business of general import.

9. All moneys collected for the United Thank Offering Fund shall be paid to the Diocesan Treasurer of that fund, and by her paid to the Diocesan Auxiliary Treasurer.

*This Constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a motion made at the Annual Meeting, and voted on the following year.*

## President's Address

*To the Presiding Bishop, Council and Officers and Members of the Woman's Auxiliary:*

This is our first Annual Meeting since the death of our dear leader and Bishop, Joseph Horsfall Johnson, and our hearts are filled with sadness. Many organizations have placed on record an appreciation of his life and remarkable work as the First Bishop of the Diocese of Los Angeles. A resolution to that effect was adopted at our monthly diocesan meeting in June and will be printed in our Annual Report. But at this, our Annual Meeting, we wish not only to reaffirm all that has been said but also to record our peculiar sense of loss because of the beautiful and intimate relations that existed between the Bishop and the Woman's Auxiliary.

Bishop Johnson was literally our Father in God for through his inspiration we came into being thirty-three years ago. His wisdom and love gently nurtured us in those formative years and his wise choice of leaders laid the foundations for our present strength. Several of our diocesan officers, as well as some of you, can remember those early days and the great devotion of Bishop and Mrs. Johnson to the Woman's Auxiliary. No interest of ours was too small for the Bishop's attention, no problem too great. Even our faults had his kindly tolerance and his serene Christian optimism calmed and cheered all ruffled spirits. As the years came and went one felt more and more in his presence the words from one of his favorite prayers "Grant to us, thy children, such a consciousness of thy indwelling presence as may give us utter confidence in thee." Bishop Johnson's ideals for the Auxiliary were of the loftiest and the following words from his first address to the Woman's Auxiliary at their Primary Meeting in 1896 should sink deeply into the hearts of each one of us—"It is my desire that every baptized woman in this Diocese should appreciate that by virtue of her baptism she is a member of the Auxiliary, and that the church by such a broad conception of this society has imposed upon every woman an obligation to help by prayer and labor the great cause of missions. I beg those who know this fact to rise up to it, and I entreat women, as I also entreat the clergy, to make this fact widely and generally known. \* \* \* And my earnest prayer for you is that the same devout and broad spirit which has characterized your work at its beginning may mark it as long as you are permitted to labor for God." The Woman's Auxiliary was very near the Bishop's heart as he was near ours. We rejoice in our noble heritage.

In the death of Mrs. George F. Bugbee last July the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese has lost another of its faithful pioneer workers. Mrs. Bugbee was one of the leaders appointed by Bishop Johnson at the very inception of the Auxiliary and she served on the diocesan board for twenty-one years, first as treasurer and then as corresponding secretary. Her enthusiasm and devotion in those early days, her interest and loyalty to the end, have left their deep impress on the life of the Woman's Auxiliary. She will long be held in grateful and loving remembrance.

Grant them, O Lord, eternal rest,  
And may light perpetual shine upon them.

\* \* \*

My message to you today, at the end of my second happy year as your president, is contained in the two words, vision and courage—the vision to see the needs of today, the courage to act upon them. Let us look at our own Diocese first. Los Angeles now has the proud distinction of being the fourth largest city in the United States, and California one of the leading states in population. Elaborate plans are being made for the development of this last great frontier of America, commercially, culturally and artistically. It is well to ask ourselves this pertinent question—are we showing a corresponding enthusiasm for its spiritual development? We do not need George Bernard Shaw to tell us that "Civilization cannot survive without religion." As Christians the great words of Our Lord should be forever flaming before our eyes "Man cannot live by bread alone."

What are some of the concrete ways in which we, as members of the Woman's Auxiliary, can help Bishop Stevens in the great work he is doing in Southern California? To begin with we can give more generously each year to the funds that further the missionary work of the Diocese—such as the Bishop's Missionary Fund, the Altar Fund, the Advent Supply Work, and all our splendid social service organizations. We can take an interest in the new missions that are springing up like mushrooms and help establish new branches of the Woman's Auxiliary. In other words we must share our knowledge and prosperity with the newcomers. The time is also ripe for more evening branches of the Woman's Auxiliary, giving business and professional women an opportunity to serve, and for closer contact with our social service workers. Above all we can give ourselves through the ministry of example, of prayer, and of the spoken word—"the quiet adding, almost one by one, of those women who do not yet share in the church's work." There is something for each one of us to do to help bring the beauty and power

of Christianity to others.

I do not mean to imply that we have not done fine work in the past. We have and we can be justly proud of our year of splendid activity along all lines, and I want to take this opportunity to thank the officers and members of all the branches for their loyal cooperation. Our diocesan board has been smaller than usual due to the long absence from home of several of its members and the illness of several others, especially our able and devoted treasurer, Mrs. Ray O. Miller. This has meant redoubled work on the part of the remaining officers for which I wish to express my deep appreciation, especially to those who have served so long and faithfully on the board, and also to the Miss Cameron Leonard who so kindly came to our rescue as assistant treasurer.

As we look beyond the Diocese to the National Church the first thought that comes to our minds is the General Convention held in Washington last October, by all conceded to be the greatest convention in the history of the church, not only in numbers but in the wonderful spirit of brotherhood and service. The Triennial meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary played a very important part. For the first time we had a seat and a voice at the Joint Sessions of the House of Bishops and the House of Deputies. All our deliberations were of a farsighted and progressive nature, and emphasized the fact that we are an Auxiliary to the National Council in all its departments and that the whole world is our field. There our eyes were opened to the great and crying needs of today and we received the power to do things, the power that comes from the united action of a great corporate body. I hope that every president will secure a copy of the minutes of the Triennial Meeting and see that the eight great Resolutions passed are brought before her branch during the coming year. The United Thank Offering of \$1,101,450.40 was magnificent and it was the greatest privilege of my life to be the one to present your splendid offering of \$20,706.50. Can we not get a goal of \$25,000 from this diocese for the next triennium?

The General Convention is indeed the great inspiration that sends the church forward every three years. With this motive power behind us let us face the future with vision and courage, realizing anew the glorious opportunity that lies before us, and striving to live up to the noble traditions left us by Bishop Johnson and so ably carried on by our present leader and warm friend, Bishop Stevens.
