“BRING THEE HITHER TO ME”

The Woman's Auxiliary asks the prayers of the Church on the Festival of the Transfiguration of Christ (August 6th), the Auxiliary's “Altar Day.”

The following resolution was unanimously adopted at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, St. John's Church, Los Angeles, May 24, 1898, and endorsed the following day by the Diocesan Convention, with the addition that where practicable the offerings be devoted to the General Fund of the Woman's Auxiliary, *viz.*:

Resolved, That we set apart the Feast of the Epiphany for an Auxiliary Day, and that, as members of the Auxiliary, we consider it not only a privilege but a duty to attend the services held on that day in the parish to which we belong; and further,

Resolved, That should the appointment of this day meet with the approbation of the clergymen of the Diocese, they be requested to offer, at the celebration of the Holy Eucharist on the Feast of the Epiphany, special prayers for the work of the Auxiliary.

We ask this for the merits of Him Who came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, Thy Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

Minutes of the Thirty-Fourth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary

The Thirty-fourth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles was held on Tuesday, January the 28th, in St. Paul's Cathedral, opening with a celebration of the Holy Communion at 9 o'clock. The Rt. Rev. W. Bertrand Stevens, D.D., Bishop of the Diocese, was the Celebrant, assisted by the Very Rev. Harry Beal, D.D., Dean of the Cathedral; the Rev. R. Rankyn Barnes, Bishop's Chaplain; the Rev. Henry Smith and the Rev. Robert M. Hogarth.

The business meeting followed, and was held in the Cathedral Hall, which was filled to overflowing. Miss Hibbard called the meeting to order at 10 o'clock. Hymn 268, "Jesus shall reign where'er the Sun," was sung and Bishop Stevens read the opening prayers.

Miss Hibbard asked that the minutes of the last annual meeting might be omitted as they were published in the "Annual." She called upon the officers for their annual reports. The Recording Secretary, Mrs. J. J. Hunker, being absent through illness, her report was read by the Corresponding Secretary; then followed the reports of the Vice-President at Large, the District Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Corresponding Secretary, Supply Secretary, Educational Secretary, the Altar Department, United Thank Offering and Church Periodical Club. Our devoted United Thank Offering Treasurer, Mrs. Stockton, also kept away by illness, her report was read by Miss Merryweather of La Jolla.

Mrs. Habersham, Chairman of "Advance Work Program," gave a short talk, also Mrs. Swan, Provincial Secretary of the Church Periodical Club. Deaconess Rariden reported for the Church School Service Program and also read Mrs. Vallat's report on the Birthday Thank Offering.

Miss Magill read Rev. John Yamazaki's very interesting report of his work at St. Mary's Japanese Mission and also reported that over \$700.00 had already been sent from this Diocese toward the "Monteagle Memorial Doorway."

Miss Hibbard announced that the Treasurer's books were in process of being audited by Price, Waterhouse and Company.

The roll call and pledges followed. Sixty-eight branches were represented by 483 delegates. Visitors from seven other Dioceses were present, and one from Scotland.

The President's address followed. Mrs. Cowles taking the chair at that time. Mrs. Beal made a motion that the splendid address of the President be printed and a copy sent to each branch of the Auxiliary to be read at a meeting. Bishop Stevens put the motion, which was carried unanimously.

A motion was made from the floor that messages of affectionate greeting be sent to Mrs. Joseph H. Johnson and the two officers who were ill, Mrs. Hunker and Mrs. Stockton. Motion carried by a rising vote.

Mrs. Riddell and Mrs. Stevens, who represent the "Girls' Friendly Society" on the Board, made no reports but were asked by the President to stand a moment.

The closing prayers were read by Bishop Stevens.

Several announcements were made by the President, after which the meeting adjourned to reassemble at 2 o'clock.

* * * * *

The afternoon meeting was held in the Cathedral, which was quite crowded, and opened with Hymn 534, "Lead On, O King Eternal," followed by a few words of greeting by the Very Rev. Harry Beal, D.D., Dean of the Cathedral.

Miss Hibbard, in welcoming Bishop Rowe, said it was always such a delight to the Woman's Auxiliary to have Bishop Rowe come to speak to us. The Bishop told us that while in Santa Barbara he had received news that the new dormitory at St. Mark's School, Nenana, Alaska, had been destroyed by fire in intensely cold weather, fortunately in the day time, so that everybody was saved, also the contents of the building.

The Rev. Paul Mather, a native priest of Alaska, paid a great tribute to the missionaries who had done so much for his people, with special reference to the first missionary, Mr. William Duncan, who was sent out by the English Church Missionary Society in 1857, and their present much loved Bishop Rowe. He also told us of work in his own church, a Sunday School of 110, Young People's Fellowship of 29, choir of over 50, and a Guild of 38, who make and send clothes to the Sailors' Home in Tacoma.

The next speaker was Mrs. Ethel Richardson Allen, whose sub-

ject was "The Significance of the Institute of Pacific Relations." Mrs. Allen, who has just returned from Japan, paid a great tribute to St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo, saying it made Christianity a reality to the Japanese and showed the best of America on Japanese soil.

Bishop Stevens' subject was "The Woman's Auxiliary and Christian Social Service. He said it was our duty to know about our own institutions and feel a responsibility and enthusiasm for them. The Bishop told the history of the Church Welfare Association, how and why it was founded and impressed on us that the producing of Christian character was the most important thing in the world.

Hymn 483, "God is Working His Purpose Out," was sung as an offertory hymn. This offering was divided between Bishop Rowe and the Church Welfare Association.

Then followed the appointment of officers for the coming year. Before doing so, Bishop Stevens paid a tribute to the old Board, especially the President, Miss Hibbard, and spoke with regret of the several officers who either through ill health or stress of circumstances felt obliged to resign. The new appointments were: Miss A. V. Boulton as Vice-President for San Bernardino Convocation, to succeed Mrs. Hanson; Mrs. George Weld for Santa Barbara Convocation, to succeed Miss Jane Rouse; Mrs. W. L. Van Shoick for San Diego Convocation, to succeed Mrs. Henderson; Mrs. Thomas Fleming, Jr., as Recording Secretary to succeed Mrs. J. J. Hunker, and Mrs. Russell Richardson as Publicity Correspondent to succeed Miss Laura Smith. Mrs. C. H. McKellips was appointed Secretary of the newly organized "Social Service Department."

Bishop Stevens pronounced the blessing and the meeting then adjourned.

Report of the Recording Secretary

During the past year there have been eleven business meetings, two special meetings, seven regular Diocesan Auxiliary meetings, a luncheon for Dr. Teusler, Summer School Conferences and the Advent Quiet Day. At the regular monthly meetings there has been an average attendance of from eighty-five to one hundred persons.

The first regular monthly meeting for the year was held on Tuesday, February 12th, at two o'clock. Miss Hibbard welcomed the newly appointed officers. The Auxiliary was asked to endorse the following motion which was made at the Officers' Meeting—that the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles, co-operate in the movement to erect a Memorial Chapel to Bishop Johnson at Westwood. A motion was made and carried that the action taken by the officers be endorsed. The speakers of the afternoon were The Rev. Harold Kelly, of the Seamen's Church Institute, whose subject was "A Cruise Around South America." and the Rev. J. Loring Clark who spoke on "Personal Religion and Evangelism." Tea was served by St. Mark's, Pasadena.

The March 12th meeting took the form of a luncheon for Dr. Teusler, who spoke to us on behalf of the fund for St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo, to which he has given so much of himself and his substance. He stirred up much interest and enthusiasm.

At the April 9th meeting the Rev. Royal H. Balcom, D.D., was the speaker, his subject being "Domestic Missions." He spoke particularly of his work among the Arapahoe Indians on the Wind River Reservation, Wyoming. Tea was served by the Girls' Friendly Society.

At the May 14th meeting the Auxiliary had in mind dear Bishop Johnson, being within a few days of the first anniversary of his death. Mrs. Willoughby Rodman was the speaker of the afternoon, her subject was "Africa, From Cape to Cairo." At this meeting Miss Hibbard gave a report of her visit to New York where she attended for the first time, as the representative of the Eighth Province, the National Executive Board Meeting of the Women's Auxiliary. Tea was served by St. Stephen's, Hollywood.

June 11th was the last meeting until the autumn. Reports from the Synod were given. Mrs. Laslett brought a report from the Educational Day in which a high spiritual note was struck. Mrs. Beal gave a general resume of the Synod. The Rev. Dean Lewis gave a report of the men's meetings so we were able to get all sides of the Synod. Holy Trinity Parish, Alhambra, served tea.

The next meeting was not held until October 8th at two o'clock, and as it was the first meeting since the death of the Presiding Bishop, The Rt. Rev. John Gardner Murray, D.D., a brief memorial service was held. The prayers were read by Bishop Stevens. Resolutions upon the death of Bishop Murray were read. A motion was

made and carried that a copy of the resolutions be sent to members of the family and incorporated in the minutes. A tribute to the memory of Mrs. Monteagle was read. A motion was made and carried that it be placed on the minutes. The speaker of the afternoon was the Rev. C. Rankin Barnes, who talked about his visit to Mexico and what the Church was doing there. Dean Newell, of the School for Christian Service at Berkeley, also spoke. St. John's Parish, Los Angeles, served tea.

At the November 12th meeting our traveled officers, Mrs. Spencer Smith, Mrs. Hanson, Mrs. Habersham and Miss Magill spoke to us briefly of some personal contacts they had made on their travels. The Rev. David Covell also spoke to us about the General Church Program and the urgent need of each parish paying its quota if the program is to be carried out, using the late Presiding Bishop's words, "We must carry on and carry through." The Rev. Harold Kelly brought to the meeting Mr. Robert Noble, who gave an outsider's impression of the work being done for the sailors by the Seaman's Church Institute. Tea was served by St. Paul's Cathedral Branch.

The December meeting was devoted to explaining about the new obligations the Auxiliary had assumed in financially backing the Church Welfare Association. A motion was made and carried that the Auxiliary stand behind the Executive Board in the action it had taken in sponsoring the Church Welfare work. Dr. Miriam Van Waters, Mrs. William Bertrand Stevens and Mrs. Riddell presented the different phases of the work and were very interesting. Tea was served by St. Matthias, Los Angeles.

The Summer School Conference was held July 1st and was very well attended. The question under discussion was "How may we reach and influence other groups of women?" There were several able speakers and practical suggestions were offered.

The Advent Quiet Day was held Tuesday, December 3rd, with a good attendance. The service opened with a celebration of the Holy Communion, the Very Reverend Harry Beal, Dean of the Cathedral, being the celebrant. Dean Powell of the Divinity School of the Pacific gave the meditations on "The Body of Christ."

Report of Box Work

The Auxiliary has kept apace during the past year, 1929, with its record of former years, although we, your Supply Secretaries, are of the opinion that some of our Branches in this Los Angeles Diocese are lagging. In a measure you may feel weary of well doing. A questionnaire was submitted to the House of Bishops concerning "value of the missionary box in the life of the Church today." The Bishops to whom this questionnaire was sent seemed to be of the opinion that although the missionary box might not be the best way of helping our missionaries, yet until such time as the salaries of the missionaries can be increased and the appropriations of missions more nearly cover their needs, the Mission Box should continue along the same lines as heretofore, so we must follow in line and do our very best for the cause.

They mention particularly the great educational value of these boxes and also state that they are a means of drawing the women together, especially in the rural communities, and in interesting them in the work of the Church.

As the Supply Department is to continue along the present lines, may we stress two or three points. First—as the missionaries count on the clothing to supplement salaries and appropriations, will you please see that the appeals are entirely filled? Second—will you endeavor to make the women understand that we have some difficulty in filling all the appeals sent to us and for this reason we hope they will not respond to outside appeals made to them, but if they have more time and more money to spend on the Box work will apply to us for further allotments. Third—as the Boxes are considered of great educational value, will you try to interest as many women as possible in the sharing of the filling of the Boxes, rather than have a small group do the work (as long as it is accomplished).

For our Advent work we have had some difficulty in filling the appeals given us by our Bishop for the Diocesan work. There were 12 Boxes to fill, two for general work, one for Oregon, when given to us the missionary was stationed in Wyoming, but when the Box was completed he and his family were transferred to Oregon. It was taken in full by St. Paul's Branch of San Diego, valued at \$327.79. We have decided St. Paul's, San Diego, is the banner Branch this year.

The one for Arizona was filled by the Diocese at large, but no one group in such a case is interested in this box, only the supply

secretaries. You do supply the cash, but not the actual work, and rather fall down on your job, so to speak. Only five Branches have taken full boxes, and we were given 12 to supply, as our Bishop gave us 10 and the Board in New York sent us two. The outside ones were valued at \$715.69. The 10 Diocesan ones are valued at \$1,479.74. The total valuation for our Christmas work is \$2,195.43; 46 Branches sent us cash to meet our expenses for Christmas. Montecito, one of the smaller Branches, went over the top, giving us \$125 for the work, quite sufficient for at least two of the smaller boxes. We also gave to a Cathecist in Dakota, \$35.00 for his suit and \$5.00 to a woman missionary in Shanghai, China. She asked for a year's subscription to a magazine.

We have 80 Branches in the Diocese this year—16 Branches sent cash, five Branches filled full boxes, and 29 Branches did nothing.

Our Lenten work for 1929 was more than satisfactory. The Alaska shipment was given to four places in Alaska: Nenana, Tanana, Wrangell and Arctic Village, and in Wusih, China, St. Andrew's Hospital. A bale of bedding supplies was sent to Cluett House, Honolulu, a box of shirts for boys to St. Barnabas School, Bontoc, Philippine Islands, and four bales of clothing and one box of medical supplies to Farmington, New Mexico, San Juan Mission, Hospital for Indians. The total valuation for the Lenten work for 1929 was \$8,883.38.

This year, 1930, the Board in New York has asked us to provide literally for the Islands of the Sea. St. Luke's Hospital, Manila, P. I., and St. Luke's Hospital, Shanghai, China. For Alaska, Anvik and Eagle, also to give to St. Margaret's Home, Berkeley, California, some household supplies, namely sheets, blankets and towels.

The Church has again demonstrated that its responsibility is wherever the American flag flies. St. Luke's Hospital, the first modern hospital in Manila, treats over 12,000 free patients annually. Its splendid record of service gives it a secure place in the affections of Americans, Europeans, Filipinos and Chinese alike.

Thanking you for your loyal co-operation in the past and feeling sure that you will do everything in your power to make the supply work of real value to our missions and missionaries.

Gifts of used articles: brass, silver, linen and silk, received from various sources, have been reconditioned and made available for requisitions, thereby increasing the Guild's power of giving with very little expense. We have visited several Missions and given advice as to how to care for the Linens and Sacred Vessels.

Report of the Educational Secretary

During the past year the work of the educational department has shown a gratifying increase. This is due to the faithful and untiring effort of each educational secretary who has fostered the interest in her own parish branch. To them I express my sincere appreciation.

Forty-two (42) branches and missions have reported interest in educational work. Nineteen (19) have held program meetings, thirty-two (32) have had discussions groups or study classes, six (6) have enjoyed successful Bible classes. Eight (8) auxiliaries have libraries or book shelves and one branch places the "Spirit of Missions" on the table of their local public library.

I have spoken to thirteen (13) auxiliaries, led twenty (20) Bible classes and twelve (12) discussion groups; also six (6) classes on "Roads to the City of God" by Basil Mathews at the Los Angeles Summer School. I have conducted six (6) sessions of educational conferences, two (2) of these at Santa Barbara, two (2) at San Diego, and two (2) at the Cathedral.

Three sets of circular letters have been sent to all branch secretaries and I have written by hand two hundred and twenty-six (226) letters and cards.

The book business has doubled in volume over that of last year. Three hundred twenty-three (323) copies of "Roads to the City of God" have been sold besides one hundred ten (110) copies of "The New Africa" and numerous other books leaflets, etc. Receipts from the sale of books, pamphlets, cards, etc., amounted to six hundred fifty-five dollars, thirty-nine cents (\$655.39). Expended for the purchase of books, for printing, postage, etc., six hundred thirty-three dollars, fifty-nine cents (\$633.59), leaving a balance on January 20th of twenty dollars, eighty cents (\$20.80).

Of the three convocations other than Los Angeles, San Diego shows the greatest educational activity. One of the many interesting things accomplished there was a series of interdenominational classes on "Roads to the City of God."

To the Diocesan library many new books have been added and kept in constant circulation. The resignation of Mrs. M. H. Jolley was accepted with regret. Mrs. Frank C. Sweehorn very kindly consented to accept the duties of librarian.

My sincere thanks are due to the other members of our most

efficient educational committee—Mrs. Wadsworth Baylor of Santa Barbara, Mrs. G. A. Hanson of San Bernardino, Mrs. W. L. Van Schoick of San Diego, Mrs. Baird Cooper, who has charge of the speakers' bureau, and Mrs. B. W. Vallat of Santa Monica. They are a constant inspiration to me and to those who look to them for leadership.

Let us never be content with the past but with open minds and hearts grow forward and upward ever having as our glorious goal "the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ."

Report of St. Mary's Japanese Mission

Members of the Woman's Auxiliary:

At this Annual Meeting I beg to express to you and every member of the different branches that have helped us my heartiest thanks and gratitude for the great assistance given during the past year to the work of St. Mary's Japanese Mission, Los Angeles. Your help really enabled me to carry on the work most successfully last year and I am very happy in giving you a short report of our progress.

At the last Annual Meeting, we reported three hundred children in our Sunday School. Now that number has increased a little and we are crowded inside and outside the small church building which we have outgrown in these fifteen years since you, the Women's Auxiliary, bought it for us.

Twelve of the boys and girls in our Sunday School were confirmed last year, and we now have the Holy Communion celebrated in English for them in our Mission. Forty-six, of whom the greater number were children between the ages of nine and sixteen years, were baptized; and a noteworthy fact is that most of them are the children of Buddhist parents. Twenty-three of them were baptized on Christmas day, and it was a very joyous Christmas for St. Mary's. But there was a sad incident, too, for four girls whom we had expected to be baptized at that time, did not come, having been forbidden by their parents who are not Christians and who had changed their minds. So we pray and wait for next Easter

when those who were disappointed can be made the children of God and members of the Church, together with other candidates.

In addition to our thirty Boy Scouts, all of whom are Church boys, we last year organized a new Girl Scouts' Troop in the Mission, starting with twelve Church girls under the very able leadership of Miss Knapp and her assistant, Miss Laton. So our work of Christianizing and Americanizing is going on in a steady march.

The adult members of our Mission are helping me loyally and the Brotherhood of St. Andrew is doing faithful work in bringing people to Church.

Early in December our Woman's Guild held a very successful Bazaar for the benefit of the Building Fund and over two hundred dollars was cleared. Many of our American friends came to this Bazaar and their presence was a great help and inspiration to our people.

Our greatest cause for gratitude to the Woman's Auxiliary this year is that Mrs. Stockton, who is your United Thank Offering Treasurer, came to help our work. With the aid of our Japanese worker, Mrs. Hirata, Mrs. Stockton is now ably carrying on the Kindergarten with new method and spirit. Not only that, but she has brought a new missionary zeal to our Mission. She, herself, takes charge of a big Sunday School class consisting of the Boy Scouts and candidates for Confirmation, and brought a friend to teach another class. Besides, through Mrs. Stockton's efforts, our Woman's Guild is going to join the Woman's Auxiliary.

St. Paul's Cathedral sends us Miss Johnson and Miss Feariss; St. John's, Mrs. Stockton; St. Matthias', Miss Laton; the City and County Mission sends Mrs. Brady, and lately, Miss Frost has come from St. James, Los Angeles, to help us. I appreciate deeply the assistance of the various Churches in this way.

But the thing we need most vitally for this important work is the Church building—the Church proper and a well-equipped Parish Hall—for our ever increasing Sunday School. And I am confident that the Woman's Auxiliary, which gave us the place to work on and has continued to help us, seeing now a good result and great opportunity, will surely support us in getting this most needed building for the extension of His Kingdom—the Church.

I sincerely thank you and ask your continued support.

CONSTITUTION

I. This Society shall be called THE LOS ANGELES BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE NATIONAL COUNCIL.

II. The object of the Society is: By systematic and united effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among the women of the Diocese, to promote the study of missions, to encourage prayer for missions, and to be of service to the National Council in all its departments.

III. The Church itself is the great Missionary Society, and every person, by baptism, becomes a member of this Society; therefore, every baptized woman in the Diocese is a member of the Woman's Auxiliary. But terms of membership in any parish branch shall be fixed by that branch.

IV. All Parish Societies that so desire may become branches of this Auxiliary, first obtaining the consent of the Rector or Clergyman-in-charge, by appointing a Secretary and notifying the President of their intention to work in unison with the Auxiliary.

V. A President, a Vice-President-at-Large, a Vice-President, a Vice-President over such divisions of the Diocese as the Bishop may counsel, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, a Supply Secretary, an Educational Secretary, a United Thank Offering Treasurer, a Directress of the Altar Department, a Directress of the Church Periodical Club, and an officer over any other department that may be formed, shall be appointed by the Bishop.

VI. The Annual Meeting shall be held at the time of the Diocesan Convention, and Monthly Diocesan Meetings on such dates and in such places as the President may appoint. General meetings may be arranged by the Vice-Presidents, in their respective districts.

VII. An Annual Quiet Day shall be held during the season of Advent.

BY-LAWS

1. The duty of the President shall be to preside at the meetings of the Society, and have general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop. The Vice-President shall act for the Presi-

dent in her absence, and assist her in the care and oversight of the work. The duty of the other Vice-Presidents shall be to preside in the absence of the President at the general meetings held in their several charges, and to co-operate with the President in the supervision of the work of the Auxiliary in the sections to which they respectively belong.

2. It shall be the duty of the Corresponding Secretary to correspond with the various branches in the Diocese, to collect their reports, and to prepare an annual report.

3. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of meetings, to keep a record of such meetings, and to prepare an abstract of the minutes for the annual report.

4. The Treasurer shall keep an account of all moneys received and expended, and make a report at the Annual Meeting.

5. The Supply Secretary, the Educational Secretary, the United Thank Offering Treasurer, the Directress of the Altar Department, the Directress of the Church Periodical Club shall superintend their several departments, in consultation with the other Diocesan Officers.

6. The Secretaries of Parish Branches are required to correspond with the Diocesan Officers, who alone correspond with the National Secretaries of the Woman's Auxiliary.

7. Each Parish Branch shall make an annual pledge, according to its ability, to the following Diocesan Funds—*the General Working Fund, the Bishop's Missionary Fund, and the Altar Fund. These pledges, and all other money, must be sent through the Diocesan Treasurer, and all checks made out to her.*

8. At the Annual Meeting each branch represented shall be entitled to but one vote on business of general import.

9. All moneys collected for the United Thank Offering Fund shall be paid to the Diocesan Treasurer of that fund, and by her paid to the Diocesan Auxiliary Treasurer.

This Constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a motion made at the Annual Meeting, and voted on the following year.

President's Address

*To the Presiding Bishop and Council, Bishop Stevens, and Officers
and Members of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of
Los Angeles:*

As we face 1930 and a new cycle of ten years, my message to you is expressed in the thought—Adventure for God. We feel this new life, this fresh spirit of adventure, pulsating all around us in both the physical and spiritual world. The days of war and reconstruction are over and we face a new era, an era in which world forces are reaching out as never before, in spite of almost unsurmountable obstacles, towards peace and understanding. Surely this is adventure in its bravest form. Another potent sign of the times is the growing realization that the Machine Age is of itself incapable of inspiring life. In the Church this thought is met with the challenge that if Christianity can only put a soul into our Machine Age the Twentieth Century may yet be the most glorious age the world has known. Here is high adventure for all of us.

But before we see what fresh adventure we are called upon to undertake as an Auxiliary let us take stock of the past year. From the reports you have just heard I think we may be justly proud of our work under all departments and in all four Convocations. We have not only lived up to our past standards, but we have surpassed them. In addition to our usual gifts of money we gave \$2,823.87 to St. Luke's International Hospital, Tokyo. More branches have been established and a greater educational and devotional consciousness developed. Our Annual Advent Quiet Day was a high water mark in the year's work and more and more we realize that we must have the deep spiritual background if our work is to be enduring. This year of growth is due to the splendid co-operation of the following: the diocesan officers, many of whom have served so long and faithfully on the Board, the heads and members of all committees, the parish presidents and other parish officers, and finally every member of the Auxiliary in this Diocese, from the largest parish to the smallest mission. All of you have made this record possible and caused my third year as your president to be a very happy one. Let us always remember that whatever new work we undertake must be in addition to these definite obligations that fall upon us as an Auxiliary to the National Council and as we broaden our work let us

not forget the great missionary object for which we exist—the spreading of the Kingdom of God on earth.

A new department of work which has been established during the past year at the request of the National Council and which deserves a paragraph to itself is the Recruiting Committee for Women Workers with Miss Rosalie Winkler as chairman. Three young women from this diocese have volunteered for missionary service during the past year, two of whom have already received their appointments from the National Council. Miss Thelma Kelm, a nurse from the Good Samaritan Hospital and a member of St. Paul's Cathedral, is now on the staff of the San Juan Hospital for Indians at Farmington, New Mexico. Miss Evelyn Ashcroft of St. Paul's, Pomona, is at present on the high seas on her way to China as a teacher. Miss Rosalia Kerr of the Pasadena Hospital is awaiting her appointment as a nurse. It is a splendid thing for this diocese to be represented on the firing line by these earnest and consecrated young women, and our prayers and best wishes go with them.

So much for our work during the past year, but with this success has come also a divine discontent—a burning realization that we must broaden and adapt our work to meet the changed conditions in the lives of women today. We must reach the young women and hold their interest or we are doomed. In this respect I rejoice in the two new Junior Branches that have just been organized—one at St. Luke's, Long Beach, and the other at St. Augustine's, Santa Monica. Our heartiest congratulations go with these pioneers in what we hope will be a new era in the life of the Auxiliary in this diocese. Then we must adapt our work to the professional women and give them an opportunity to attend meetings. In a recent book called "Middletown—A Study in Contemporary American Culture" occur these words, "What has become of the useful maiden Aunt? She isn't darning anybody's stockings, not even her own. She is a draftsman or an author, a photographer or a real estate agent. She is the new phenomenon in every-day life." Are we as an Auxiliary to loose this "new phenomenon in every-day life" by our lack of imagination and adaptability? Then there are the newcomers who flock into California each year by the thousands. In a report recently sent me from New York occurred this question, "What is the greatest problem in your Diocese?" to which I replied, "Keeping pace with the rapid and phenomenal growth

of population in Southern California." The older branches of the Auxiliary could greatly help in this respect if they would sponsor the work in the new missions. Here then is our objective for 1930 —Building for the Future in reaching these three groups of women —the young woman, the professional woman, and the newcomer.

Now for one of the great adventures that we as an Auxiliary in this Diocese are asked to undertake, that is the creation of a Social Service Department. Last fall at the request of the Church Welfare Association, of which Bishop Stevens is chairman, and of Dr. Miriam Van Waters, referee of the Juvenile Court, we were asked to sponsor the work of a Field Worker at the Juvenile Court to work among girls of our own Church. After serious thought and many heart searchings your Diocesan Board felt they could not turn down this call from the Diocese in an hour of need. The Board therefore asked Bishop Stevens to create a Social Service Department and appoint a secretary, and furthermore voted to sponsor the work of the Church Welfare Association and under-write the salary of the Field Worker to the extent of \$2,000 a year. At the December Diocesan meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary this action of the Board was endorsed by the meeting. The great significance of this work I will leave to the eloquence and inspiration of Bishop Stevens, who is to speak to you on this subject this afternoon. Suffice it to say that this new venture is fully in accord with the work of the Woman's Auxiliary, and the majority of the Diocesan Branches in the United States already have Social Service Departments. This work should also be of special appeal to our new Junior Branches and may lead to many interesting developments. I feel sure that Bishop Stevens and the new Social Service Secretary can count on our loyal support.

Our second adventure comes from the National Council in the great Advance Work program that Mrs. Habersham has told you of in which the men and women of the whole Church are to join in a new Corporate Gift with each Diocese assigned different and definite missionary objects to work for. This is to be preceded by a great educational program. Here is glorious adventure indeed and when the Diocese makes its plans and we are asked to co-operate let us do so with vigor and enthusiasm.

So as we face 1930 we find ourselves at the crossroads with fresh adventure for God ahead if we but choose the right path. It

will mean hard work and the difficulties, doubts and disappointments that attend all progress. But in the words of Evelyn Underhill, the English mystic and psychologist, "To be spiritually alive means to be growing and changing; not to settle down among a series of systematic beliefs and duties, but to endure and go on enduring the strains, conflicts and difficulties incident to development." With this thought in mind I pass on to you the following greeting from Miss Grace Lindley, our National Executive Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, "Let's wish each other a joyous, adventurous pilgrimage through 1930!"

IN MEMORIAM

At a meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles, held in the Cathedral House, October, 8, 1929, the following resolution was unanimously adopted by a rising vote:

Resolved: That in the death of the Presiding Bishop of the Church, the Rt. Rev. John Gardner Murray, D. D., the Woman's Auxiliary as well as the Church at large, has lost a true friend and an inspired leader. Bishop Murray possessed a deep personal religion, which surrounded him with an atmosphere of spirituality, impressing strongly those with whom he came in contact. Another outstanding trait was his great charity, always respecting the convictions of others, though possessing strong convictions of his own.

He was also a great executive, bringing to the service of the Church and its great head his consecrated talents, strengthened and developed by years of a very successful business career.

This unusual combination of tolerance, strong conviction and deep spirituality, with wide executive ability and experience fitted him in high degree for the position of leadership to which he was called. The Church will miss sadly his wise counsel and administrative powers.

The Woman's Auxiliary memorializes his unfailing missionary zeal as exemplified in his last words to the General Convention in Washington, when just before the final benediction he said, "The Spirit of the Lord God is upon us, and we are anointed to preach glad tidings to a waiting, wanting world; we have no power of ourselves to help ourselves, but the power of the Holy Ghost is upon us, and will remain with us. Brethren, in the possession and exercise of that power may we go forth as witnesses to our Blessed Lord, both in Jerusalem and in Judea and Samaria and to the uttermost parts of the earth." These are the words of a veteran and enthusiastic missionary, spoken from a full heart at a solemn time. He being dead yet speaketh to ears attuned to hear of the privilege and joy of missionary service. His consecrated life has ended here triumphantly.

We recognize the high honor that is his, that as he stood at God's Altar the Master called, and "he was not, for God took him."
