The Woman's Auxiliary asks for the prayers of the Church on the Festival of the Transfiguration of Christ (August 6th), the Auxiliary's "Altar Day."

The following resolution was unanimously adopted at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, St. John's Church, Los Angeles, May 24, 1898, and endorsed the following day by the Diocesan Convention, with the addition that where practicable the offerings be devoted to the General Fund of the Woman's Auxiliary, viz.:

Resolved, That we set apart the Feast of the Epiphany for an Auxiliary Day, and that, as members of the Auxiliary, we consider it not only a privilege but a duty to attend the services held on that day in the parish to which we belong; and further,

Resolved, That should the appointment of this day meet with the approbation of the clergymen of the Diocese, they be requested to offer, at the celebration of the Holy Eucharist on the Feast of the Epiphany, special prayers for the work of the Auxiliary.

Minutes of the Thirty-eighth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary

The thirty-eighth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary was held on January 30th, at St. John's Church, Los Angeles. Bishop Stevens was the celebrant at the nine o'clock service of Holy Communion, assisted by Bishop Gooden and Dr. Davidson.

The business session was called to order at ten o'clock by the President, Miss Patton. Prayers were read by Dr. Davidson. Mrs. George Davidson, President of St. John's Branch, welcomed the Diocesan Auxiliary. The reports of the officers were not read, on account of lack of time. The reports of the Treasurer, U.T.O. Treasurer, and Directress of the Church Periodical Club had been printed and distributed. The reading of the minutes of the last annual meeting were omitted on motion.

Reports of the department heads followed: Deaconess Rearden of the Church School Service Program, read by Mrs. Quintin; Mrs. Quintin of the Supply Department; Mrs. Laslett of the Educational Department; Mrs. Riddell of the Social Service Department; and Mrs. Pierce of the Altar Department, read by the Secretary. The report of the Rev. Mr. Yamazaki of St. Mary's Japanese Mission was read by Mrs. Stockton. Miss Ingram, Chairman of the Woman's Recruiting Committee, gave her report.

Roll call followed, showing 564 present from ninety-two branches, and six visitors from six outside dioceses.

The report of the Committee on Constitution and By-Laws was read. The articles of the Constitution were voted on separately and carried practically unanimously, except for Article 5, dealing with the election of officers, on which a vote by branches was called for. The article was adopted forty-nine to forty-three. The articles of the By-Laws were all adopted, being voted on separately.

The following resolution was proposed by Miss Hibbard and adopted:

Whereas, St. Margaret's House, the School for Christian Service and Training School for Deaconesses, situated in Berkeley, California, is proving to be of increasing value, not only in the functions expressed by its name, but also as Educational and Religious Conference Center, as a Retreat House, as a hospitable tarrying place for Missionaries and in many other ways, and

Whereas, the importance to the Church of such a Center, especially in the far West, is constantly growing more evident, and

Whereas, at present the scope and power of St. Margaret's is gravely threatened by financial difficulties which were not dreamed of at the time of The Triennial of 1931, therefore be it

Resolved: That the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles in its Annual Meeting assembled respectfully request the National Council to grant the sum of \$20,000 of that portion of the United Thank Offering of 1934 not allotted to salaries, to be applied to the debt on St. Margaret's which was incurred at the time of purchase of the new property; and moreover, that this Resolution be immediately forwarded to the National Council in New York City.

A letter of greeting from Mrs. Habersham was read by the Secretary. A motion was made by Mrs. Parke and carried that bon-voyage greeting be sent to Mrs. Habersham. A motion was made by Miss Leonard and passed that a letter of sympathy and regrets for her absence be sent to Miss Magill. A motion was made by Miss Hibbard and passed that a letter of greeting and regrets for her absence be sent to Mrs. Johnson.

Announcement was made of conferences during the lunch hour of the Supply, United Thank Offering and Educational Departments.

Noonday prayers were read by Bishop Gooden. The meeting was adjourned for lunch.

The meeting reconvened at 2:00 P.M. Following a solo by Mr. Pierre White of St. John's Church, Dr. Davidson welcomed the Auxiliary.

Mrs. J. E. Cowles took the chair during the reading of the President's address.

A motion was made by Mrs. Davidson and passed that a vote of thanks be extended to Mr. W. F. Ludlam, who installed the loud speaker at cost. A motion was made by Mrs. Balmer and passed that a letter of sympathy be sent to Deaconess Napper.

Miss Patton then introduced Dr. John Wilson Wood, Executive Secretary of the National Council, who spoke very inspiringly on the work of the Woman's Auxiliary throughout the Church.

He was followed by Mrs. D. D. Taber, Field Worker of the National Board, who gave many practical suggestions.

The offering, which had been designated by the Board for the General Church Program fund of this Diocese, was then taken.

Bishop Stevens, in appointing the officers for the last time before the new constitution goes into effect, said it gave him great pleasure to reappoint all the officers who had so ably served during the past year. He then closed the meeting with the Benediction.

November—Mrs. Lawrence Laslett on “Builders of the Kingdom.” Pictures of missions to be worked for during Lent, 1934, shown by Mrs. F. A. Habersharn.

The Annual Advent Quiet Day was held on December 5th. Bishop Stevens of Los Angeles conducted the meditations.

There were ten regular and one special Board meetings held.

Three new branches were formed during the year at St. Mark’s Mission, Van Nuys, Grace Mission, Glendora, and St. Michael’s Mission, Belvedere.

Report of Work in Convocation of San Bernardino

The Woman’s Auxiliary of the Convocation of San Bernardino held its annual meeting in December, at St. Mark’s Church, Upland. A large delegation from each Parish and Mission was present. The reports read were inspiring; they were filled with a real missionary spirit, and showed an eagerness to work and a deepening of the devotional life of the members. In each report there was mention made of the benefit derived from the Corporate Communions and Quiet days. All branches observed the Armistice Quiet Day. Many reported study classes and social service work.

Trinity Church, Redlands, reported that all the groups had organized into the Episcopal Church Club, and through that organization worked into smaller groups. This they find has

given an added impetus to their work. Also they report a very successful Book Review Club.

San Bernardino has organized into a Service League, and under this method their interest has grown and their numbers increased.

All Saints', Riverside, has given us one new branch. We welcome them and look to them for help and inspiration.

On February 15th, at St. John's Church, San Bernardino, we had our annual Quiet Day. Bishop Gooden conducted this day for us. His meditations were on "the strength of prayer." Out of this day we feel came all the good work that we have accomplished.

It was the privilege also of many of the members to attend the Quiet Day at Christ Church, Ontario, conducted by the Sisters of the Nativity.

Mrs. Habersham visited all our branches, bringing her stirring missionary message and showing her pictures.

Mrs. Laslett gave an all day study class at Redlands. Many of the other Diocesan officers were with us and we look forward to an even closer contact with them in the coming year.

Miss Beardsley, Executive Secretary of the National Council, spent four days in the Convocation and it was a great pleasure to show her some of our work. Mr. and Mrs. Harper Sibley spoke in Redlands, giving us an account of the Rockefeller Committee and their findings in Re-Thinking Missions.

Mrs. C. H. Eagle, of Redlands, has accepted the task of being Supply Secretary in our Convocation and under her supervision we know the work will go forward.

To Miss Martha Wright, Educational Secretary, I owe a debt of gratitude for carrying on my work for me while I was in the east. With the understanding and cooperation that exists between our Branch Presidents and the officers of the Convocation, we look forward with earnestness to the work of the coming year. May we be given the vision to see the work and then the will to do it.

Report of the Vice-President of the Convocation of San Diego

The first event of general interest in the San Diego Convocation, during the past year, was the Annual Quiet Day held at St. Paul's San Diego on February 23rd; a day of real inspiration,

Bishop Gooden giving the Meditations, taking as his topic "The Spirit of Prayer."

On May 25th a General Meeting for the women of the Convocation was held at Trinity Mission, Ocean Beach, at which time our new Diocesan President made her first visit to the San Diego Convocation, giving a most interesting report of the Synod recently held in Stockton, and telling us many things of interest in the general work including the fact that the Branches must be prepared to vote, at the Annual Meeting, on the proposed new Constitution and By-Laws. Reports of the year's work were given by the Branch Presidents and proved both helpful and interesting. Mrs. Scott Quintin spoke of the Supply Work and of the possibility of having an Assistant Supply Secretary appointed in each Convocation. The Rev. Eric Bloy, a new-comer to the Convocation, gave the closing address.

The second General Meeting for the year was held at St. John's, Bostonia, on November 7th. The fact of its being such a really rural Mission seemed to add greatly to the interest and inspiration of the day and not only the opening Communion Service but a closing service of Re-Consecration to the work was held in the Mission church. Mrs. Laslett brought us, as usual, much of inspiration and interest and Miss Hibbard, just returned from the East, brought a thrilling message.

The Council Meetings of Branch Presidents and Convocational officers have been of even greater usefulness during the past year with an increased attendance.

We are pleased to announce the appointment of Mrs. L. C. Ridout as our Convocational Supply Secretary and the forming of a new Branch at St. John's Bostonia.

An incomplete survey showed that ten of the Branches had taken part in the Quiet Day of Prayer on November 11th.

Through our General Meetings, our Council Meetings, the fine cooperation of the Branches and the untiring efforts of our Convocational officers, Miss McLeod, Secretary; Miss Merryweather, Representative of the United Thank Offering, and Mrs. F. C. Bate, Educational Secretary, we feel the San Diego Convocation is working with increased efficiency and unity and, above all, with deeper consecration.

Report of the Vice-President of the Convocation of Santa Barbara

During the last twelve months the work of the women in this Convocation, through the Woman's Auxiliaries and through the

Guilds, has grown in every department; not perhaps in figures with a dollar sign before them, but in figures which we hope bear the sign of the cross and represent growth of the spirit.

During the year I have visited Ventura and Santa Paula in February; Carpinteria and Oxnard in March; Trinity, Santa Barbara in April; Lompoc in June; Santa Maria on All Saints' Day. So I have had the pleasure of meeting with all the members and officers everywhere except at Fillmore. At these meetings we are able to exchange ideas and to clear up questions, and there is a chance to stress the various channels through which the work functions—the United Thank Offering; the Church Periodical Club; Study Classes; Box Work—and all the others.

November 11th was the Quiet Day for Prayer, and I believe in every place prayers were said in the churches or homes that day.

Your Vice-President has attended most of the monthly Board Meetings in Los Angeles. The Annual Convocation Meeting was at Trinity, Santa Barbara, May 26th.

On March 16th the women of the Convocation met at All Saints', Montecito, for an all-day meeting. The speaker was our loved friend and neighbor (when she is in California), Mrs. Harper Sibley. Besides our own Convocation members, we invited the Federated Missionary Society of Santa Barbara, and they sent delegates from eight different churches. So there were 135 women in church and ninety stayed to lunch, and we all agreed we had seldom heard a more inspiring or interesting talk than Mrs. Sibley's.

On Sunday evening, December 17th, the Bishop rededicated the lovely little church from Hueneme which has been moved to Fillmore. It was a beautiful reverent service and the church was filled to overflowing with the loyal group from Fillmore and Santa Paula, and many also from the other churches. We hope the Guild which has worked so faithfully to secure a church will now grow into a Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese.

The growth of the work in the Diocese is rapid; the Convocations are given more and more responsibility each year. A new officer has been appointed—a Convocation Supply Secretary. I am happy to tell you that Mrs. Fred Mercer of Ventura has consented to hold that position for the coming year.

A fruitful year is behind us, let us press forward with great courage and faith and determination to know God's will for each one of us, so that we may know His plan and purpose for this Convocation, and be co-workers with Him in whatever He asks us to do.

Dr. Weld was always ready with help and sympathy and realized to the full the difficulties presented by those who had the privilege of working for and with him in the Master's vineyard; his smile of appreciation and kindness were never absent. I speak as one who knew him well and I feel that I am expressing the sentiments of not only our own Convocation but of the whole Diocese.

His wonderful work will go on, for the foundations are well laid, but his individual place can never be filled. Our deepest sympathy goes out to dear Mrs. Weld and family.

Report of the Supply Department

The Lenten Work for 1933 was sent to the following places: St. Mary of the Virgin, Sagada Mountain Province, Philippine Islands, St. Andrews Hospital, Shanghai, China; St. John's-in-the-Wilderness, Allakaket, Alaska; St. Timothy's Mission, St. Timothy, Alaska; St. Mary's Mission, Nixon, Nevada, and Mission of the Holy Spirit, Orleans, California.

We had 101 branches working for these Missions, so we are growing in size and, I trust, in influence. We sent forty-six boxes and twenty-eight bales, a total valuation of \$6,196.08. All the layettes for this work was furnished by the Girls' Friendly Society of the Diocese.

The Rev. E. A. McIntosh, of St. Timothy's Mission, writes, "We have disposed of the entire consignment. At the local prices charged here these goods totaled \$500 and the people here have profited to that amount. We have so many widows and orphans that we gave out a good twenty-five per cent.

"All of it is used in a way that benefits the people here for the entire value; as we exchange it for what they have that has

no value locally and for which they have no market." We valued St. Timothy's box at \$461.70.

Miss Hill, of St. John's-in-the-Wilderness, who is one of our United Thank Offering workers, writes, "Without the aid of the Woman's Auxiliary we could not carry on."

The Advent work consisted of two personal boxes to Missionaries, one in Nebraska, the other in Texas. The value of the two boxes was \$455.31. We sent \$27.00 to buy an Indian Catechist a suit and underwear and \$5.00 money orders to two of our women missionaries, one in Japan and the other at Bella Vista, Panama.

To thirty-six of our own Diocesan Missionaries we sent Christmas checks, which amounted to \$905.00. With ninety-eight branches working, our Advent total was \$1,397.31. The work of the Supply Department for 1933 was \$7,593.39.

This year each Convocation will have a Supply Secretary, Mrs. Fred Mercer representing Santa Barbara; Mrs. C. H. Eagle, San Bernardino, and Mrs. L. C. Ridout, San Diego. So we are counting on each Convocation responding one hundred per cent. The past year the Convocation of San Bernardino alone had this distinction.

I wish to express my appreciation to the branches for their cooperation during the past year. During 1934 I ask that each one of us hold the Cross a little higher, determined to make Him known to all the world.

Report of the Social Service Department

The Social Service Department looks back upon a busy year, 1933, and looks forward to an even busier one in 1934. There has been so much family case work to do that there has not been as much time for organization as I would have liked.

Our field worker for the Church Welfare Association won a scholarship at the Western Reserve University, Cleveland, and left us on the first of September to resume her studies. At which time I assumed some of her cases as well as those I already had. During the eight months of 1933 she was with us Miss Cooper did valiant service and her work in Long Beach after the earthquake will long be remembered. During the past year I have paid 780 calls on individuals, referred to me from various sources. These calls have in turn necessitated visits to hospitals, county offices, lawyers, private agencies and innumerable telephone calls and letters. The types of cases handled have been as follows: family

relief, Juvenile Court, preventive, psychopathic and illness of various kinds.

At Christmas forty church families were provided with Christmas dinners and staples sufficient for their needs for several weeks by the Department and the Secretary was ably and joyously assisted by All Saints' Church, Beverly Hills, in caring for many more.

The sum of \$1,377.54 was contributed to the Church Welfare Association during the year, over five hundred of this was made at a garden party given for the Church Welfare by Mrs. Isaac Milbank; \$1,839.00 was contributed by friends through the Diocesan Treasurer for relief; this was used all through the year but particularly after the earthquake, at Thanksgiving and at Christmas. One family was aided in getting to Utah where a job awaited the husband. The total amount paid through the Diocesan Treasurer for Social Service objects, including the institutions, was \$3,754.55. The value of work done and clothing given away which includes eleven layettes, bedding, clothing distributed through the Department, amounts to \$8,136.24, making a total of \$11,890.79 in work done and money given by the women of this Diocese.

Throughout the year I have had the privilege of the most gracious cooperation of the Good Samaritan Hospital, the Social Service Department of the General Hospital, several branch offices of the county, the Children's Protective Association, the Assistance League, Southern California Legal Aid Clinic, the Family Welfare and our own Institutions.

In many instances the Social Service Secretaries of branches of the Auxiliary have been most helpful and handled cases for me. Cases have been referred from various parts of this Diocese: the Philippines, the middle west and the east coast. Positions have been found for people whenever possible and the territory covered by the Secretary has included Glendale, Hawthorne, North Hollywood, El Sereno, Lynwood, Watts, Compton, and, of course, Los Angeles.

I wish I could tell you some of the cases but I treasure the confidences entrusted to me and my time is too short to even give you an idea. I wish to thank all those who have worked and given so faithfully and generously through this difficult year. I can not help but feel that the Auxiliary in this Diocese is endeavoring to carry out the admonition, "Bear ye one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ."

Report of the Educational Department

Both the devotional life and the educational work of the Auxiliary have shown a distinct increase during the past year. Sixty-two branches have held program meetings; thirty-one conducted discussion groups; forty branches reported corporate communions; twenty-three Bible classes, and fourteen prayer groups.

Report of the Committee on Church Literature for the Blind

Considerable progress has been made in the last year for the work in Braille.

As in previous years, the Spirit of Missions has been transcribed each month by Alfonso Verduesco, who, though unable to see, works with speed and accuracy on his Braille writer while articles are read aloud to him. Miss Nelson, the other member of the Committee, has transcribed "The Meaning of Christian Healing" by Rev. George F. Weld, and "The Personal Christ" by Irving Peake Johnson, Bishop of Colorado. Many Christmas cards were made and sent to those on our mailing list. The book of the Oxford Group, "For Sinners Only," is being transcribed and will soon be finished.

A new venture is the forming of a circulating library of Braille books. Miss Mary Melvin of Sacramento has consented to be the Librarian. We hope in this way to reach many more who care for the religious books we furnish. She is also helping us in transcribing. We are waiting for the consent of certain publishers before transcribing leaflets and books which we think should be in our library.

On October 10th, the regular Diocesan monthly meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary was given over to this Committee and the whole subject of Braille was brought up. The chief speaker was Alfonso Verduesco who presented the subject in a clear and interesting manner, and won the admiration of his listeners by his charming manner. The offering of \$44.18 was given to the Committee for the work.

The Committee feels that the work which it does is of real value, and though it grows slowly we have every expectation now of its further development.

There is much religious matter; sermons, articles and leaflets which should be done in Braille. Often a small volume appeals to a blind person, more than a book of several volumes.

We ask the support of the women of the Diocese to help us grow, so we may be more effective and helpful in the work we have undertaken to do.

St. Mary's Japanese Mission

The year 1933 was another blessed year for St. Mary's Japanese Mission. In spite of the depression, which was keenly felt by our members, whose number is not large, we have been able to carry on the work and the many activities connected with it in a way that has been encouraging. Our expenses have been greatly increased since the building of the new church and the parish house, causing us many financial problems. Of course our thanks go first to the Woman's Auxiliary for the warm support given us during the past year.

Our Sunday School has an enrolment of 320 and our children are being trained through the various departments to be good, strong, young churchmen. The young people are divided into a junior and a senior group. We have a chapter of the Junior Daughters of the King and a branch of the Girls' Friendly Society, a Boy Scout Troop, a chapter of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew, as well as other organizations for the younger boys and girls.

A Parish Council has been organized, composed of representatives from every organization in the church. This has resulted in the young people feeling their obligation to assist in the support of the church. They have made monthly pledges according to their ability. While we cannot expect much from their subscriptions, it will help them to become the future churchmen and to make their church self-supporting.

Our kindergarten is doing very good work under Mrs. Stockton. We had to part with our school bus which had served for the church work every day since 1925. It became old, inefficient, and expensive to keep. In its place we obtained two small used cars to take care of the transportation of over three hundred children. We find these cars more efficient and less expensive.

Our small branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is entitled to encouragement from you. It did good work last year, helping every important activity in the Mission, and also meeting its obligations as an Auxiliary to the National Council.

Lastly, I would say with sincere appreciation for all you have done for us, that there has never been a time when it was so important to stress the missionary work that is being done at St. Mary's. The efforts of the church to maintain this work for the Japanese people must be of great significance in the sight of our Heavenly Father. We have many difficult problems to solve and, in the name of our Saviour, Jesus Christ, I ask your renewed support of this work which you have assisted so generously for twenty-five years.

Report of Work Among the Isolated in the Diocese of Los Angeles

In regard to work among the isolated, there is only a brief report, owing to the fact that very little has been accomplished. The function of this department is to give, through correspondence, spiritual help and comfort to those of the Church who have no other means of contact with Her ministry, and to provide Churchly instruction for the young, or for others who have not been confirmed. It would seem, in view of the effort that has been made to discover such people, that there are very few of them in the Diocese.

Two years ago, when this work was first undertaken, and through what might have been a misinterpretation of the word "isolated," I received, upon my request as Supervisor of the department, a great many names, mostly from the clergy, of individuals who appeared to be those for whom this branch of friendly assistance was designed, but upon investigation, the greater number of them were found to be people who were not actually eligible to the service of the department. This does not imply the exclusion of any one who is in need of friendly cheer, but there are certain requirements for those who may properly be classed as "isolated." Many of the names received in the beginning were of invalids, and "shut-ins," who were really in parishes, and who rightly were in charge of the priest of the parish. Such names were eventually weeded out, leaving only a small number of truly isolated.

Some of these people have been reached, and contact established, at least to a certain extent, through cards at Christmas and Easter, as well as through letters, and an occasional reply has been received. Leaflets for the Auxiliary Day of Prayer were sent to all of the group, and a response was received from several individuals, betokening interest, while in one of the desert sections, the entire day was observed. During the summer, a trip by auto was made, in an attempt to make personal contact with several families who have thus far not been reached, and a certain amount of material assistance has been given to a number of others. A note of this help has been made in the report of the Social Welfare Department.

Development of this branch of Diocesan work is slow, but not discouraging, and it is planned, during the coming year, to make a more determined effort to find those people in the Diocese who come within scope of the help available through this department, and to accomplish more in the way of a response to the assistance offered. Even though there may not be many of those who require it, those who are in need should somehow be made aware of the Church, and of Her willingness to stand by them.

President's Address

Bishop Stevens, Bishop Gooden, and Officers and Members of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles:

Though during the past year we have been fortunate, in that we have lost none of our officers, either past or present, nevertheless sorrow and bereavement have come to some of them, and to them in their great loss we offer our deep and sincere sympathy: "May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace and may light perpetual shine upon them."

We have had given to us from Mrs. Charles P. Austin, of Santa Barbara, a very beautiful book of remembrance, which I hope that you have all seen today. In this book we hope to have placed the names of the faithful Auxiliary workers who have gone to their eternal rest, and so keep a record of those who served, but who are no longer with us.

At the end of this my first year as your Diocesan President, I look back with much gratitude to all the members who have so splendidly cooperated with me and with the Board, in trying to increase the usefulness and broaden the scope of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Through lack of time we were unable to hear the reports of our Convocational vice-presidents this morning; this does not mean that their work has been less than in former years, rather it has been more. They have carried forward their tasks with zeal and efficiency, their reports will be printed in the Annual and I urge you to read them for they are well worth while. My vice-president-at-large has been indeed a guide, philosopher, and friend; we can thank her and the ladies of St. John's for the whole-hearted welcome and wonderful hospitality, which we have enjoyed today.

You heard the reports of the Departments and so can judge for yourselves of their work, which has shown such unstinted effort and spiritual growth. I wonder if we really appreciate the tremendous amount of work our secretaries do in preparing reports and sending out notices? You have the printed reports of the Treasurer, the United Thank Offering, and the Church Periodical Club. I hope that you will study them carefully, for they show what has been done during the year, and are a record of which you may all be proud.

The Day of Prayer on November 11th was one of the outstanding events of 1933. I am glad to say that the Diocese of Los Angeles responded to this practically one hundred per cent. Twenty-five hundred leaflets were distributed. I know that each and everyone derived great spiritual stimulus from this quiet communion with God. The prayer leaflets were translated into French, Spanish, Japanese and Chinese, and the women of Canada and England joined with us. The words of one of our older hymns seem particularly appropriate:

“Prayer is the simplest form of speech
That infant lips can try:
Prayer the sublimest strains that reach
The Majesty on high:

O Thou by whom we come to God
The Life, the Truth, the Way,
The path of prayer Thyself hast trod
Lord, teach us how to pray.”

Bishop Perry, our Presiding Bishop, said recently, “The Acts of the Apostles are still being written,” and urged us not to lose the personal touch. He asked us to think of the face of some missionary, and to see behind him the face of our Lord. Let us try to do this in our work for the coming year, then there can be no lack of interest. The Convocation of San Bernardino has set us a good example in having their Branches choose some one missionary in whom to be personally interested. Also during Lent if you will try and find out as much as possible about the Mission Station for which you are working, you will gain in inspiration as well as knowledge.

This is the Triennial year and already plans are being made by the National Board to have it the best Triennial ever held. Miss Lindley says, “This does not mean the largest, or the busiest, but if we are to be true to our Lord, as He seeks to build the City of God, then the Triennial of 1934 must measure up to the seriousness and to the opportunities of the time in which we shall meet.” We in the Diocese of Los Angeles should feel a very special interest in this Triennial, for our Provincial Representative and former Diocesan President has been made Chairman of the National Board of the Woman’s Auxiliary, and will present the report of the National Auxiliary at the Triennial. This is a great honor which has come to our Diocese, and I hope that Miss Rebekah L. Hibbard will always know that we are back of her, that we appreciate her, and that we hope, humbly, to always fol-

low the high spiritual path upon which she set our feet, when she was our own beloved Diocesan President.

This year in May, the Synod of the Eighth Province meets in this Diocese, and the Provincial Woman's Auxiliary meets at the same time and place. The program will deal with inter-racial contacts, this was one of the five subjects presented at Denver. Mrs. John Riddell, chairman of the program committee, is preparing a varied and interesting program, so do plan to attend. This provincial meeting will teach you much of your Church, and also you will enjoy yourselves.

You have received today a chart showing the work which has been done by the United Thank Offering. Read that chart carefully, note that before the 1934 offering there is a question mark. Make the answer to that question the one which will leave your own soul at peace with itself—need I say more?

On February 16th there will be an inter-denominational day of prayer, the leaflets and material for which can be obtained through Mrs. Laslett. I hope our women will cooperate in this with the women of the other Protestant Communions.

During the year four new Branches have been added to our rolls, and one Branch has come back that was disbanded for a time. We have now in the Diocese one hundred and fifteen Branches. We are very happy to welcome these babies, the officers of the Board will be glad to help them in any way they can. We are anxious to give them all the information they want and to make them one with us. Let me urge them to attend the District and Convocational meetings. Then we meet with less formality, and with more time than here, and can become really acquainted. We want to grow in numbers, but much more than that we want to grow in devotional life. I shall be happy when every branch can report that it has had a Quiet Day and a Corporate Communion in its own Parish or Mission.

This has been a year of awakening along many lines, and not the least of these has been the abolition of the sweat shop and child labor, but remember these evils are only temporarily done away with unless the amendment to the Constitution is ratified by two-thirds of the states. So far twenty states have ratified the child labor amendment, and we can be glad that California was among the first. The Church must take a leading part in establishing righteousness and social justice. Bishop Henry Sherrill says: "It is not enough to pluck individuals from the burning fire: we must change the environment in which men live. The

Church can be either an outworn institution or the power of God to redeem human society."

Let us, my friends, help make it such a power; let us in this new year of 1934 go forward; go forward without Fear.

Report of the Woman's Auxiliary

Submitted to the Annual Convention February 1, 1934

During the year 1933 the Woman's Auxiliary has held monthly meetings in the Cathedral House; also the Convocation of Los Angeles has held five District meetings. We feel that these District meetings have been of great value. In the other Convocations the Vice-Presidents have likewise held meetings, which have done much to stimulate the work.

We had the great pleasure early in the year of hearing Mrs. Harper Sibley speak at one of our Diocesan Meetings; another of our programs dealt with Church Literature for the Blind. This was arranged by our vice-president in the Santa Barbara Convocation, Mrs. George Weld. I feel, in fact, that our monthly meetings have not only been well worth while but varied.

Mrs. Lawrence Laslett, our Diocesan Educational Secretary, held a class at Summer School on Training Leaders.

This year we had the great privilege of having Bishop Stevens conduct the Advent Quiet Day, and greatly appreciated his giving us the time from his crowded life.

Our different Departments have shown unfailing devotion to the work: in the Social Service Department Mrs. John L. Riddell has taken over many of the cases left unfinished by the Church Welfare Association Worker who left in September, as well as continuing her own very valuable Department. We were all sorry to lose Miss Cooper who had done such valiant service; her work in Long Beach after the earthquake will long be remembered. The Social Service Department visited during the year 780 Church families; at Christmas forty families were cared for, \$1,339.00 was given through the Auxiliary for relief work, and was used particularly after the earthquake and at Thanksgiving and Christmas. \$1,377.54 was contributed to the Church Welfare during the year; of this five hundred was raised at the

Garden Party given by Mrs. Isaac Milbank. The total of cash which passed through the Auxiliary treasury for Social Service was \$3,754.55; this includes the money sent to the Institutions but does not include the immense amount of material furnished such as clothing and bedding.

The Supply Department sent last Lent seventy-four boxes and bales valued at \$6,196.00 to the following places: Alaska, the Philippines, China and to our Indians in Northern California. At Advent two personal boxes were sent to missionaries in the United States, a suit of clothes was sent to an Indian Catechist in South Dakota, and thirty-six Christmas checks were sent to missionaries in our own Diocese. The total value for the year of the Supply work was \$7,593.39.

The Church Schools of the Diocese provided Christmas gifts for over 700 children and adults as well as for 106 lepers. The Altar Department has helped fifteen Missions in the Diocese.

The Church Periodical Club has done splendid work in keeping up the supply of books and magazines sent to Institutions and individuals, especially has it done excellent work among the Isolated, and in reaching children through a Church School correspondence course. The subscriptions to magazines for the clergy have increased this last year.

Since the last Triennial in Denver in 1931 the United Thank Offering has raised \$10,971.72.

CONSTITUTION

1. This organization shall be called, **The Los Angeles Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council.**
2. The object of this organization is: To advance the devotional life of the women of the Church, and to support the work of the National Council in all its Departments.
3. Membership shall be open to any woman in the Diocese of Los Angeles, who is willing to help further the object of this Auxiliary.
4. The officers shall consist of: a President, a Vice-President-at-Large, a Vice-President for each Convocation, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer.
5. Officers shall be elected as follows: The President and Recording Secretary at the Annual Diocesan Meeting the year of the Triennial. The Vice-President-at-Large and the Corresponding Secretary at the Annual Diocesan Meeting the year following the Triennial. The Treasurer at the Annual Diocesan Meeting the year preceding the Triennial. These officers shall be elected for a term of three years, and may not hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms. The Vice-Presidents of the several Convocations shall be elected for a term of two years at the Convocational Auxiliary meeting preceding the Annual Diocesan Meeting. All elections shall be by ballot.
6. The Executive Committee shall consist of: The President, the Vice-President-at-Large, the Recording Secretary, the Corresponding Secretary and the Treasurer.
7. All Departments of the Auxiliary shall correspond to those in the National Council. The Chairman of each Department shall superintend the work of her department in consultation with the Executive Committee. The Department Chairmen shall be appointed annually by the Executive Committee.
8. The Diocesan Board shall consist of: The Executive Committee, the Convocational Vice-Presidents, and the Chairmen of all Departments.
9. Any member of the National Executive Board, and any Provincial officer of the Eighth Province, residing in the Diocese shall be a member of the Diocesan Board.

10. A Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary may be formed in any Parish or Mission with the consent of the rector or clergyman in charge, by notifying the Convocational Vice-President.

11. The Annual Meeting shall be held at the time of the Diocesan Convention, and monthly Diocesan Meetings on such dates and in such places as the President may appoint. General meetings may be arranged by the Vice-Presidents in their respective Convocations.

12. An Annual Quiet Day shall be held during the Season of Advent.

BY-LAWS

1. The duty of the President shall be to preside at the meetings of the Diocesan Auxiliary, and have general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop. The Vice-President-at-Large shall act for the President in her absence, and assist her in her work.

2. The duties of the Convocational Vice-Presidents shall be to preside at the general meetings held in their Convocations, to organize all new branches, and to cooperate with the President in the supervision of the work of the Diocesan Auxiliary.

3. The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to correspond with all Branches in the Diocese, to receive their reports, and to prepare the Annual Report.

4. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of meetings, to keep a record of such meetings and to prepare an abstract of the minutes for the Annual Report.

5. The duty of the Treasurer shall be to keep an account of all money received and expended and to make a report at the Annual Diocesan Meeting.

6. All requests for information or supplies from Parish Branches shall be made to Diocesan officers or Chairmen of Departments and not to National Headquarters.

7. Each Branch of the Auxiliary to be in good standing shall pay an annual pledge according to its ability to the following

Diocesan Funds: General Working Fund, Bishop's Discretionary Fund and the Altar Fund. These pledges and all other money, with the exception of the United Thank Offering, shall be sent through the Diocesan Treasurer, and all checks made out to her.

8. All money collected by the Branches for the United Thank Offering Fund shall be sent to the Diocesan United Thank Offering Treasurer and by her to the Diocesan Auxiliary Treasurer.

9. At the Annual Diocesan Meeting only those Branches in good standing shall have a vote, and each Branch shall have but one vote.

10. A Nominating Committee shall be appointed each year by the Bishop, at least six months before the Annual Diocesan Meeting, and shall consist of a Chairman and one member from each Convocation. Nominations may be made from the floor at the time of the Annual Diocesan Meeting provided that the consent of the nominee has been previously obtained.

11. Delegates to the Triennial and to the Woman's Auxiliary of the Provincial Synod shall be appointed by the President, with the consent of the Executive Committee.

12. The Constitution and By-Laws must be read in every Branch at its Annual Meeting.

13. The Constitution may be amended by a motion made at the Annual Diocesan Meeting and voted on the following year. The By-Laws may be amended at any Annual Diocesan Meeting by a two-thirds vote of Branches present and voting, provided the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing to the Branches sixty days before the meeting.
