
"BRING THEE HITHER TO ME"

The Woman's Auxiliary asks for the prayers of the Church on the Festival of the Transfiguration of Christ (August 6th), the Auxiliary's "Altar Day."

The following resolution was unanimously adopted at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, St. John's Church, Los Angeles, May 24, 1898, and endorsed the following day by the Diocesan Convention, with the addition that where practicable the offerings be devoted to the General Fund of the Woman's Auxiliary, viz.:

Resolved, That we set apart the Feast of the Epiphany for an Auxiliary Day, and that, as members of the Auxiliary, we consider it not only a privilege but a duty to attend the services held on that day in the parish to which we belong; and further,

Resolved, That should the appointment of this day meet with the approbation of the clergymen of the Diocese, they be requested to offer, at the celebration of the Holy Eucharist on the Feast of the Epiphany, special prayers for the work of the Auxiliary.

We ask this for the merits of Him Who came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, Thy Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. Amen.





Minutes of the Thirty-ninth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary

The thirty-ninth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary was held on January 29, 1935, at St. John's Church, Los Angeles, beginning with the service of Holy Communion, with Bishop Stevens as celebrant, assisted by Bishop Gooden, Dr. Davidson and the Rev. M. K. P. Brannan.

At ten o'clock the business session was called to order by the president, Miss Patton. The Auxiliary prayers were read by Bishop Stevens. Mrs. George Davidson, President of St. John's Branch, welcomed the Auxiliary. Bishop Gooden made a short appeal for contributions from the branches toward a fund of \$750.00 needed by Dr. Mary James to complete a unit of her Maternity Hospital at Wuchang, China. The reports of the officers were then read, that of the Treasurer being accepted on motion, after which the report of the Auditor, Mr. Howard, was read by the Secretary. The report of Mrs. Fleming, Vice-President of the Los Angeles Convocation, was read by the Secretary in Mrs. Fleming's absence.

The reports of the department heads were then heard: Mrs. Stockton of the United Thank Offering; Mrs. Quintin of the Supply Department, who included in her report the box work of the Church Schools, prepared by Deaconess Rearden and that of the Birthday Thank Offering, prepared by Mrs. Vallat; Mrs. Laslett of the Educational Department; Mrs. Riddell of the Social Service Department; Mrs. Pierce of the Altar Department; Mrs. Habershaw of the Advance Work Program and Mrs. Gardett of the Church Periodical Club. Miss Hibbard as one of the four women elected on the National Council was called upon for a few remarks. Mrs. Weld told of her work in providing Braille literature for the blind. Mrs. Stockton read a report from the Rev. Mr. Yamazaki on St. Mary's Japanese Mission.

Roll call showed 430 present from the Los Angeles convocation, 20 from the San Bernardino, 9 from the San Diego and 9 from the Santa Barbara with 2 visitors from outside dioceses.

Mrs. Rushmore presented the report of the nominating committee, nominating Mrs. Harry Beal as Vice-President-at-Large and Mrs. F. C. Malpas as Corresponding Secretary. Nominations from the floor were called for but none were made. It was moved and passed that the nominations be closed and that the secretary cast the ballot for the nominees.

Miss Patton read the list of department heads appointed by the Executive Committee for the coming year. The only changes were the appointment of Mrs. George A. Robison as United Thank Offering Treasurer in place of Mrs. Stockton, resigned, and Mrs. Livingston Porter as Diocesan Directress Church Periodical Club. Mrs. Gardett will remain on the board as Provincial Secretary

Church Periodical Club. No appointment was made at present for Publicity Correspondent in place of Mrs. Richardson, resigned.

A motion was made by Miss Harriet W. Culin and passed that a rising vote of thanks of the members of the Woman's Auxiliary be extended to the retiring officers:

for their devoted and self-sacrificing work in the various departments of the Auxiliary.

Noonday prayers were read by Miss Patton and the meeting was adjourned for lunch.

Upon reconvening at 2:00 P.M., Dr. Davidson welcomed the Auxiliary to St. John's Church.

Mrs. J. E. Cowles was called to the chair during the reading of the President's address. At its close Mrs. Cowles suggested a rising vote of thanks and appreciation to Miss Patton.

Major Thomas E. Swan, Chaplain at March Field, was introduced and spoke on the Philippines, giving a graphic and interesting picture of the country, the various tribes and the missionary work done among them.

Miss Esther Brown, National Field Worker for Colored People, spoke of the work among the Negroes as she had studied it in different parts of the country. She mentioned lack of leadership and ineffective program as cause of slow growth.


Mrs. Lloyd Robinson of St. David's, North Hollywood, presented to Bishop Stevens the deed to the lot on which the mission is to be built.


The annual Advent Quiet Day was held on December 4 at All Saint's, Pasadena. The Rev. Douglas Stuart conducted the meditations.



Report of Los Angeles Convocation Vice-President

A district meeting was held during the year in each of the four divisions of the Los Angeles Convocation outside of the city: San Gabriel Valley at St. Mark's, Pasadena; Coast at Hermosa Beach; Orange County at Fullerton, and San Fernando Valley at Eagle Rock. The hostess branches took a great deal of trouble and made the meetings delightful; and the district presidents, Mrs. Freeman, Orange; Mrs. Vallatt, Coast; Mrs. Robison, San Fernando, and Mrs. Barstow, San Gabriel, did all the work of arranging for the meetings.

During the summer in the missionary district of Hawaii I visited ten of the eleven missions on Oahu as well as Iolani School for boys and St. Andrew's Priory School for girls. I spoke to the Woman's Auxiliary diocesan board at a lovely tea given for me by Mrs. Thompson, the president; and also at a branch meeting in the Hawaiian fishing village of Kahaluu. From Honolulu we went to Victoria, B.C., and there I visited the branches of St. Barnabas, and of St. Michael and All Angels.

I visited twenty-eight branches in this Convocation, and also spoke at Redlands and Corona, and at the San Bernardino Convocation educational conference. Two new branches were started during the year—St. Ann's in Lynwood and St. Martin's, Watts. Report of the Vice-President of the San Bernardino Convocation

This year the work in the Convocation of San Bernardino was strengthened by a visit from the National Field Secretary, Mrs. Taber.

During the week she was with us she visited many of the branches, and held one all day council with the Presidents and leaders at which time the problems of the work in the Convocation were discussed, the strength and the weaknesses, with a looking forward to a new goal.

Evidently a seed was sown, for on reading over the reports, I find one Parish Branch has this objective:

"To link every woman in the Parish definitely with the Church; to give her opportunity to serve in the way most suited to her talents; to provide opportunity for her to participate in group meetings, study classes, and other educational projects; to the end that through fellowship, study and service she may come to find herself an integral part of the body of CHRIST and a co-worker with Him in establishing the Kingdom of GOD."

On January 12 at All Saints', Riverside, we had an all-day meeting with Mrs. Laslett. Our subject: "Building Programs Both educational and devotional."

On February 12 at the Mission of St. John the Baptist, Corona, the Reverend Leslie Hill conducted our annual Quiet Day. His subject, "The Way of the Cross Leads Home," gave us much thought for our Lenten Meditations.

October 11 at St. John's Church, San Bernardino, we had a corporate communion, remembering the great offering gathered that day at Atlantic City.

Following this service we had a profitable hour of discussing the educational work with Mrs. Laslett and in the afternoon Mrs. Fleming gave a missionary talk on the work in the Hawaiian Islands.

November 7 at the Church of the Holy Spirit, Hemet, we held our annual meeting; we dispensed with all business, save the election, and listened to the stirring message of Dean Newell.

The Armistice Day of prayer was observed in all branches.

The packing of the boxes in the Convocation has stimulated the interest of the box work.

We are glad to welcome to our official staff Mrs. George Tilton of San Bernardino, as Secretary of the United Thank Offering.

It was my privilege to be elected to the office of vice-president. I am happy to serve again, believing that with the continued splendid cooperation of all the presidents, encouraged by the example set by our efficient secretaries, Miss Martha Wright, Mrs. C. H. Eagle and Mrs. George Tilton, together we may go forward more earnestly as a group of women furthering the cause of Christ in His Church.

Report for the San Diego Convocation

The first Convocational event in 1934 was the Annual Quiet Day held at St. Paul's San Diego on February 27. The Meditations were given by Bishop Stevens, taking as his theme "What Is the Christian Life?" and the day was one of helpfulness and inspiration.

On April 9 a General Meeting for the women of the Convocation was held at All Saints', San Diego, at which time our Diocesan President made one of her much-appreciated visits. Reports of the year's work were given by the Branch Presidents, and showed that better organized and more general work was being done throughout the convocation with more corporate Communions and emphasis upon the spiritual side. Mrs. Tabor was also with us upon this occasion and proved stimulating and helpful. Another feature of the program was a very effective rendering of Mrs. Laslett's playette "An Almost Hopeless Case" by the members of All Saints' Auxiliary.

The highlight of the year was the meeting of the Synod and the Provincial Auxiliary at St. James-by-the-Sea, La Jolla, in May. Large numbers of Auxiliary members attended the services and meetings, many staying in La Jolla the entire time. We of the San Diego Convocation feel very grateful for the opportunity of being hostesses upon this occasion which proved so inspiring and challenging.

On October 11 a United Thank Offering Service was held at St. Luke's, San Diego, in response to the suggestion from our Diocesan Treasurer. The Rev. Mr. Williams gave a most helpful address and the offering was sent for the next Triennial offering.

On November 6 the women of the Convocation were asked by Dean Barnes to meet with the Convocation at St. Paul's, San Diego, on the occasion of the visit of the Bishops and the "Team" from General Convention. At this time, in accordance with the new Constitution, the Vice-President of the Diocese for the San Diego Convocation was elected for a term of two years.

We have completed our first year with our own Supply Secretary and feel grateful to Mrs. L. C. Ridout for her work and to Mrs. Scott Quintin for her kindly efforts in showing Mrs. Ridout "how it must be done."

We regret the fact that Mrs. F. C. Bate was obliged to curtail her work as Convocational Educational Secretary owing to the exacting demands of business and has finally had to give it up entirely. She will be very much missed.

We are grateful as always to Miss Maude Merryweather for her work as Convocational representative of the United Thank Offering.

The Vice-President has visited most of the branches throughout the year. These are always happy occasions and with the

Council meetings of Branch Presidents, help more than anything else in the work.


An incomplete report showed that the Quiet Day of Prayer on November 12 was observed by a number of Branches.

Report of the Vice-President of the Convocation of Santa Barbara

The women of the Santa Barbara Convocation have, during the last year, gotten to know each other, and to know each other's work. This is partly the result of the appointment of a new officer, Mrs. Fred Mercer of Ventura, who is Convocational Supply Secretary. She invited the whole Convocation to Ventura last spring so we could see each other's Lenten work and hear the various reports, and learn from our Diocesan Supply Secretary, Mrs. Quintin, how to pack our boxes and value the contents. We had a delightful informal afternoon of great value.

Another day which we all remember gratefully was when Mrs. Harper Sibley came to All Saints', Montecito, and gave us one of her inspiring talks.

At the Autumn Convocation Day, we had the privilege of entertaining the "Team" just back from the Triennial at Atlantic City. Our guests were Dean Roberts of Colorado, Dean Blankingship of Havana, and Dean Anna Newell of St. Margaret's, Berkeley.

A meeting of great value was held last October when the officers of the Auxiliaries and Guilds met to consider the Presiding Bishop's message—his call to his people to seek and find God's purpose. If God has a purpose for us as individuals, and for our Convocation as a corporate body, what are we going to do about it? This was prayerfully discussed and the answer was earnestly sought. We twenty-eight women gathered together, all knew God's purpose can be carried out only through us. To find God's purpose in our own lives, we must reach God through prayer and hear His message. And to find His purpose for the Convocation, we must be units who are completely in touch with God, so that His power can flow through us all. We agreed to devote far more time to our own daily devotions, especially to listening to God to learn what

His purpose is; and in our Auxiliary meetings to emphasize the devotional side. If God has a purpose and plan for this Convocation we want to find it, so we can be a strong Power for Him to use.

Your Vice-President has visited Carpinteria, Fillmore, Santa Maria, Ventura, and Montecito during the year, and has attended most of the Board Meetings in Los Angeles, and has visited the Woman's Auxiliary in Lancaster.

The women in Carpinteria meet and do their Auxiliary work, though there have been no church services at Saint Andrew's during the last year.

The Quiet Day of Prayer last November was observed in every Parish and Mission in the Convocation. The interest in the Study Classes, and all lines of educational work, is growing slowly but surely. It seems as if the next step for the Convocation is to find a leader in this Department—someone who would be Convocational Educational Secretary.

Our love and prayers are extended to Mrs. Burleson of Oxnard, in her recent sorrow.

The women extend congratulations to Dean Hammond, and look to him for leadership and friendship.

Report of the Supply Department

During the 1934 Lenten Season, 104 branches of the Woman's Auxiliary and twenty Girl's Friendly branches worked for the following Missions: The Hudson Stuck Memorial Hospital, Fort Yukon, Alaska; Christ Mission, Nenana, Alaska; San Juan-in-the-Desert, Farmington, New Mexico; St. Mary's Hall, China; Rev. Warren Fenn, Anchorage, Alaska, and Mr. Casper Mather, Ketchikan, Alaska.

The Girl's Friendly of the Diocese made all the layettes which were sent to the missions, the valuation being \$357.00. We sent seventy-nine bales of clothing and household supplies and four boxes of medical supplies. The total valuation of the Lenten work was \$5,724.05. Letters of appreciation have been received from all the missionaries.

For our Advent work we sent two personal boxes to missionaries, one at Gillette, Wyoming, the other to Shawnee, Oklahoma. The boxes were filled by St. Paul's, San Diego, and All Saints', Pasadena.

We sent \$27.00 for a suit of clothes to a Catechist in South Dakota; to a missionary in Oklahoma \$20.00 for a surplice and \$5.00 each for two of our women missionaries, one in the Philippine Islands and the other at El Paso, Texas.

Thirty-six of our Diocesan missionaries received Christmas checks amounting to \$905.00. The total Advent work was \$1301.88. The entire work of the Supply Department for 1934 amounted to \$7025.93.

This year we have been asked to work for five missions, three schools and one hospital. This request is greater than last year but with the assistance of every branch, I am confident the entire allotment will be filled.

A great amount of credit is due Mrs. Mercer, Mrs. Eagle and Mrs. Ridout, our Convocational Supply Secretaries, for their splendid work during the year.

I wish to thank the members of the Woman's Auxiliary and the Girl's Friendly for their loyal support.

Report of the Social Service Department of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of Los Angeles

During 1934, 102 parishes and missions did Christian Social Service within the parish or mission, 69 within the community and 65 within the Diocese. Sixty-five parishes and missions have either a social service committee or an individual appointed for the work. These auxiliaries gave \$2,928.86 to social service objects through the diocesan treasurer of the Woman's Auxiliary. The value of work done, clothes and food given away, amounted to \$3,732.75, making a total of \$6,661.61.

The Birthday Bed has been a great blessing during the year, and several auxiliary members have expressed deep gratitude for the splendid attention and loving care they received while in the Good Samaritan Hospital at the expense of that fund. It will be a real achievement when the fund reaches the amount necessary to allow the Auxiliary the use of the bed 365 days out of the year. As social service secretary I have paid 1804 calls, attended 91 committee and board meetings and spoken on 21 occasions. It was my privilege to attend the National Conference of Social Work at Kansas City last May, where I was invited to speak at one of the National Child Welfare Conferences; and to go to General Convention in Atlantic City last October.

Besides the \$1,326.41 given through the Diocesan Woman's Auxiliary Treasurer for the Department of Social Service by the branches and interested individuals, I have distributed clothing, food and medicine to the amount of \$2,200, not reported elsewhere.

This brings the total amount of cash, clothing, food and medicine given for social service objects during 1934 by the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of Los Angeles to \$8,861.61. Eighty-nine families were remembered at Christmas and a smaller number at Thanksgiving. The average number of families to be helped in different ways varied from thirty to forty-eight a month. Some individuals have been found work, many have been aided in obtaining permanent relief, legal advice, hospitalization, and served in whatever other way lay in our power to do.

Thirty-six complete layettes were given away through the secretary during the year.


The Good Samaritan Hospital, branches of the County and S. E. R. A., have been most cooperative, as have the Southern California Legal Aid Clinic, the Assistance League and the Ebell Rest Cottage, etc. The growth of the work has been most encouraging; there is better understanding and more participation in social work by the branches than ever before. This coming year it is my hope to stress the educational side through conferences and discussion groups.

I cannot complete this report without expressing my thanks to the branches who have so splendidly cooperated with me throughout the year, and to the individuals whose generous gifts of clothing and money have made it possible to carry on the work on the scale on which it is done.



Report of the Committee on Church Literature for the Blind

A year ago I reported a library of Braille books was to be started. This has been done, with Miss Mary Melvin of Sacramento, as the Librarian. We are deeply indebted to Miss Melvin who has given so much of her time to this cause.

She then felt the time had come for the Committee to reach a larger number of blind readers than it was doing, and she suggested we advertise our books in various Braille magazines. This we did. In some magazines the advertisements were free; in others we had to pay. She wrote me:

"I have received at least twelve answers to our notices and advertisements, requesting the Spirit of Missions; a list of our books; and other information about our Library. I have had communications from Alabama, Tennessee, Baltimore, Kansas, Ohio, New York City, Harrisburg, Pa., Hartford, Ct.; and City Mills in Massachusetts."

So our work was immediately increased. Though Miss Melvin is our Librarian, we send the books through the State Library, as the Library has franking privileges and we have not. (I will quote from letters to Miss Melvin.)

Kind Friends:

I lost my sight when I was three months old, my blindness being caused from sore eyes. I was raised in the Methodist Orphanage at Selma, Ala., and was educated in the School for the Blind at Talladega, Ala. I am cared for by the city. I take several religious and secular magazines, among them is the Church Herald. I read from several religious and secular libraries. I would like to join your library and you may send books as you see fit. I would also like to have the Spirit of Missions sent to me regularly. If you have back numbers of this magazine which you are through with, please send them to me. Thanking you in advance for your kindness, I am yours sincerely,

HARRY HILL, Selma, Ala., c/o Y.M.C.A."

Miss Melvin also writes as follows:

"I have had a letter from a former friend of mine, a teacher in the Connecticut School for the Blind at the same time that I taught there. She sees some and has married a man who also has poor sight. She, or her husband, read our notice in The Ziegler Magazine, published in Monsey, New York. I want to send her Dean Weld's "Meaning of Christian Healing" as I believe she would appreciate it."

The work then grew so fast we needed more workers, and were fortunate in having Mrs. Fischer of La Jolla offer to transcribe the Spirit of Missions regularly for us. As Alfonso Verduesco continues transcribing The Spirit of Missions each month, we have two copies regularly. He also has finished the big task of transcribing "For Sinners Only," which is in nine volumes.

We have in our Library now the following books and pamphlets:

Our need is for more workers and for more financial help. There is considerable work involved in making a volume. A trained person has to do the transcribing, someone has to do the proof reading, and someone has to shellac the pages and bind the book together. If the transcribing is done by a blind person, someone with eyes has to read the articles aloud. Proof reading is often done by the blind who are paid a few cents a page. In a recent letter from Miss Melvin she says:

“Last Friday a week ago, six of our women here and I went to the State Library to learn how to shellac those Braille pages preparatory to making them into books. Then just a week ago today, these same six women and I went to the Diocesan House and shellaced material and bound it into eight volumes. This was Braille material which I had here in the house, including Mrs. Fischer's work, some of Miss Nelson's work, and some things that I got from the East.

“I arranged the Oxford Group material and Dean Weld's sermon on “Surrender” each in separate volumes as you wished. I shall take those eight books to the State Library today or tomorrow.”

At the Synod in La Jolla last spring, the following resolution was passed:

Resolved, That the delegates here assembled make it a special point to acquire all the information possible about the work of the Committee on Literature for the Blind and return to their respective Diocese and Missionary Districts pledged to report the work done by this Committee of the Province.

Be It Further Resolved, That the Woman's Auxiliary of the Eighth Province designate the Epiphany season as a time to remember this work in their prayers and by their gifts.

I have, therefore, sent a notice to every Diocese and Missionary District of the Eighth Province, reminding them of this resolution and asking them for their continued interest.

A letter from Yuma, Arizona, has asked for suggestions and information, so that this program can be carried out.

As in the past, Miss Nelson made many Christmas cards—I believe sixty—and has continued transcribing books and pamphlets during the year.

Fortunately for those who are not able to see, there are other ways for them to receive pleasure than through Braille—which is difficult for many (especially the old) to master. The talking book and radio are giving untold pleasure to untold numbers. This Committee is limiting itself to providing, in Braille, books and articles of a religious and spiritual nature, as there seems to be a real need for this.

The Committee feels justified now, and our Diocesan President has given me permission to appeal to you for financial support. I would like to report what money has passed through the hands of the Committee this year:

Report of St. Mary's Japanese Mission

Madam President and Members of the Auxiliary:

I take pleasure in sending you a short report of St. Mary's Japanese Mission for the year 1934. Since we were given the new Church and Parish Buildings, our work has steadily gone forward. Especially the work for the young people has shown a remarkable progress. Among those who were baptized during the year, twenty were young people. Sixteen were confirmed. Many of the young people faithfully attend the early Celebration of the Holy Communion. At the nine-thirty service Sunday morning, which is in English, we have a regular attendance of from one hundred and seventy-five to two hundred young people. Of these, eighteen are college students. We maintain our Sunday School enrollment of three hundred and twenty-five pupils. We have eighteen teachers, some Japanese and some American. It is our great satisfaction to see that the young people of St. Mary's are increasing more and more in knowledge of the Christian faith and in love of the Church.

Mrs. Stockton, our American worker, has had a great deal more to do than in previous years. Our daily Kindergarten, of which she is in charge, has increased in enrollment and attendance. Also, a very well-edited weekly parish paper comes out under her direction. It is of great assistance in our work. Besides, she helps our young people in every activity they have connected with the Church.

The Boy Scouts and Junior Chapter of the Daughters of the King are both strong in the Mission. The Girl's Friendly Society, under the leadership of Miss Helen Kibbe, beside its regular weekly meetings has been a great help to the Mission. Our various young people's organizations are doing good work under the general leadership of Miss Edith Knapp. We feel that we are training the future leaders of our Church.

St. Mary's Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is doing good work and we are all very earnestly trying to bring the Gospel of our Lord to our fellow people.

In giving you this report, I am sure you will be pleased to hear that the Mission to which you have given your warm support for so many years, is doing well. May I take this opportunity to express my deep gratitude and appreciation and to ask your continued support for, at this time as in the past, my people need Christ and His salvation.

Report of the United Thank Offering
For the Year Ending December 31, 1934

Madam President and Members of the Auxiliary:

The printed report of the United Thank Offering is in your hands.

It is therefore only necessary for me to add a few words, covering some things that the figures do not show, something far better than dollars and cents. It is this—105 Branches contributed to the Triennial Offering which we completed in October. It is the largest number of Branches that have ever shared in our Diocesan Thank Offering.

Remarkable, is it not, when we remember that 1932, 1933 and 1934, difficult and trying years alike for the individual and the Church, made up the triennium?

It is also rather remarkable that we are starting 1935 with a balance of \$449.08. This is the largest amount we have ever had on hand at the beginning of a new Triennium. It is good news. It makes us feel very hopeful for the Triennial Offering of 1937. I want you to understand that the balance of \$449.08 was money received after October 1, too late to be included in the Triennial Offering. Also, the Church of the Epiphany sent an offering but it came too late to be included in this report. It will be in the report for 1935.

I am also happy to have the opportunity to thank the parish treasurers. They have gathered together the offering and carried on, at a time when one would not of choice collect money. I am grateful to our Diocesan President, the Vice-Presidents of the Convocations and our Educational Secretary. They have done much to spread U. T. O. information throughout the Diocese.

Twenty years ago, when I was appointed by Bishop Johnson, thirty Branches made an offering. One hundred and five sent an offering to the Triennial of 1934. During this period over ninety-nine thousand five hundred dollars (\$99,500.00) has been paid into the Thank Offering Treasury.

Can we not feel that we are gaining ground and are a little nearer the ideal offering, and a little nearer that time for which we pray "when the hearts of all women will be disposed to give gladly as has been given to them."



Report of Work Among the Isolated in the Diocese of Los Angeles

It is now over three years since the department of Diocesan work connected with the welfare of the isolated was established as a separate branch of the Church Periodical Club, and though it has not advanced to the extent that was hoped for at its inception, yet a certain fundamental progress has been made—namely, a better understanding of the requirements for doing this work. With time, and patient endeavor, it must eventually meet with an established success, though possibly not a large success as compared with other dioceses of the east, or the middle-west, and south. The reason is valid. Conditions in California are peculiarly different from those in older and longer-settled sections of the United States. There are large areas in this diocese where as yet no one can attempt to live permanently, while in other localities, where people are known to be, they are so remote that it is difficult to find them.

At best, this is a work which goes slowly. A very real handicap is encountered in enlisting the interest and cooperation of the isolated themselves, even after they have been discovered. Possibly the depression of the three years since the League was established has been responsible to some degree, for this lack of interest, and in many cases, for no response whatever. We must hope, however, that with faithful and continued effort, some definite good will be achieved. A small success has been attained, and no one can say what shall be the ultimate of these beginnings. Through auto trips during the past year, isolated families were found, some contacts were made, and help in the way of Church literature and prayer-books, was given. The prayer-books, in particular, were greatly needed. Some material aid has also been provided, with gifts at Christmas, and letters, also cards, at Christmas and Easter.

President's Address

Bishop Stevens, Bishop Gooden, and Officers and Members of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles:

Once again it is my pleasure and privilege to address you, as your Diocesan President. We have come to the end of one year but we stand at the beginning of another. I think it is more important to look forward than to remember what is past, unless by remembering we can profit through experience and go forward with greater wisdom.

So for a moment let us look at some of the highlights and accomplishments of 1934. First I feel that the meeting of the Woman's Provincial Auxiliary at La Jolla was a rare opportunity for many of the Los Angeles members to see and meet others from distant parts of our great Province, and also to see and meet the Missionaries, it makes us realize the Church more as a unit and less as little scattered groups. I firmly believe that on the day when every member of every Parish Branch knows that she is a member of the whole great Auxiliary, the Auxiliary which stretches around the world, and is auxiliary to the National Council of the Church, on that day our troubles and difficulties of making the women interested will cease, and we will truly come into our own. But this can only be accomplished by education, by enthusiasm on our part, and by repeating over and over again the message of our Faith. I was horrified the other day to hear someone say that the indifference of good church workers was the greatest menace to our success; at first I was inclined to take exception to such a statement, but when I thought it over I asked myself was it not true? Do we really give the best that is in us to the work of the Church? If we did the world could not be as it is today, for there are enough real christians to leaven the lump, if those christians were truly fired with overwhelming zeal. At the Triennial, Dr. Francis Wei of China spoke to us on Missions in this Age. It was an excellent address, but over and beyond that, Dr. Wei brought to us the real understanding of what a true follower of Christ might be, he became a Christian after he was grown, but standing there before all of us whose christianity comes through long generations of church people, he made us feel that his was a real, a burning faith, in God and in His Son. Let us then ask ourselves is the indifference of the Church worker our greatest menace.

In October the Triennial at Atlantic City provided much food for study and for thought, the addresses given there were exceedingly interesting and I hope all the Branches are studying them. Our Executive Secretary, Miss Grace Lindley's Report and also her Meditations, given each day at noon, were unusually fine. They can be obtained from Mrs. Laslett, and I hope each Branch will get them. Miss Hibbard's excellent report of the National Board for the past three years gives us insight and understanding of the work of the Board and what it means to the auxiliary.

Miss Hibbard has spoken to you today telling of her new position. We in this Diocese are greatly honored that one of the four women chosen to sit on the National Council should be one of our own. I feel and I know you agree with me that the National Council could not have chosen better.

Mrs. Spencer H. Smith, who for fifteen years has been a member of the Diocesan Board, first as Convocation Vice-President of Los Angeles and later as Vice-President-at-Large for the Diocese, is retiring. She has contributed much to all of us, we on the Board will miss her cheery smile and her wise counsel. She has been instrumental in building up the organization to a high point of efficiency; we know that she will continue her interest in the Auxiliary, so we are not really losing her, but we hate to see her leave the Board. We welcome our new vice-president-at-large, Mrs. Harry Beal, and I look forward to working with her during the remainder of my term of office. She is not new to the Board, having served on it for a short time as Educational Secretary and we therefore know how fortunate we are in having her back.

Mrs. F. W. Stockton felt that she could no longer carry the double burden of working at the Japanese Mission and also being chairman of the United Thank Offering. The Executive Committee regretfully accepted her resignation. Her magnificent accomplishment speaks for itself, in the steady growth of the United Thank Offering through twenty years, and in the widening knowledge of this great Department. She has built well and always the spiritual has gone hand in hand with the material increase. Mrs. Stockton should be proud that in this last Triennium more women have given and greater interest has been shown. For it has not been an easy three years for anyone. We shall miss her also, more than we can express. Her successor, Mrs. George A. Robison, is well known to many of you as the efficient vice-chairman of the San Fernando District meetings, and we are happy and fortunate that she has consented to be Chairman of the Diocesan United Thank Offering. We know that it is in good hands.

Mrs. H. C. Gardett, having been appointed as Provincial representative of the Church Periodical Club, felt that she could not also remain the Diocesan representative, so the Executive Committee has appointed in her place Mrs. Livingston Porter. We are delighted at having Mrs. Porter, and as Mrs. Gardett will remain on the Board in her new capacity, we are not losing an old and dear friend, but rather are we gaining a new one.

Mrs. Russell Richardson, who for three years has been our efficient and charming Publicity Correspondent, is resigning. We accept her resignation with the utmost regret, and we thank her for her untiring interest and work; for the present no one is being appointed in her place.

Deaconess Rearden has sent in her resignation to the Bishop, as head of Church Schools Service Program. While we as a Board


will welcome her successor and cooperate with her in all things, nevertheless it is with heavy hearts that we see Deaconess Rearden leave us. It has always been a joy to have her at our meetings and we shall sadly miss her face.

As you see there are many changes this year, and so sadness creeps in at parting, but we are all cogs in a great wheel—we give what we can when we are called to help. The Church must go on for, "by the mouth of many messengers goes forth the voice of God."

We stand at the beginning of a new year of work, and prayer, of hope and faith. Let us make it a really worthwhile year; let us be able to look back and say 1935 was outstanding in the Auxiliary; let us truly try and follow the great theme given at Atlantic City, "If we be His disciples, let us go forth and be His disciples."

Report of the Woman's Auxiliary

Submitted to the Annual Convention January 30, 1935

I am happy to report that during the year 1934 all of the Departments of the Auxiliary have functioned splendidly, and we have been able to keep up our record of much work well done.

Being Triennial year the United Thank Offering is especially to be congratulated that under the fine leadership of Mrs. F. W. Stockton we were able to give \$17,210.00 at the great Presentation Service in Atlantic City last October. Not only was it a good offering, and as large as any we have ever given with the exception of 1928-1931, but more women had the blue boxes this time and so the interest in this outstanding work was increased. Also we have more money in the U. T. O. account than we had at this time three years ago, \$449.08 to be exact. Mrs. Stockton, who for twenty years has so faithfully acted as our Diocesan Custodian, is this year resigning. We are sad to see her go. We are grateful for her unswerving devotion; we are proud of the efficient department which she has built up. Mrs. George A. Robison, who has been appointed to carry on the U. T. O. work, will, I know, receive the same loyal interest and support from the Branches.

Mrs. Gardett, who has been our Diocesan Representative of the Church Periodical Club, has been promoted to the Provincial representative, and so she, too, is resigning, and we have appointed Mrs. Livingston Porter to take her place. As the Provincial Representative Mrs. Gardett will sit on our Board, so we do not feel that we are losing her. She has just completed a very fine year of work, and has provided books and magazines to many who would otherwise have had to go without.

Our Social Service Department has continued its much needed help for those of our people to whom distress and misfortune have come. During the year \$2,928.86 has been distributed in cash, \$5,932.75 in work, food and clothing, making a total of \$8,861.61.

The Supply Department sent 79 boxes and bales to four Missions in Alaska, one in China and one in New Mexico, amounting to \$6,120.93 in value; besides this we sent 36 Advent checks to Diocesan Missionaries, two personal boxes outside the Diocese, two Christmas presents to women Missionaries, making a total of over seven thousand dollars, a slight increase over last year.

The Altar Department has given to fifteen missions in the Diocese, and on October 25 a Corporate Communion was held at St. Paul's Cathedral for members of the Altar Guilds and their friends.


C O N S T I T U T I O N

1. This organization shall be called, **The Los Angeles Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council.**
2. The object of this organization is: To advance the devotional life of the women of the Church, and to support the work of the National Council in all its Departments.
3. Membership shall be open to any woman in the Diocese of Los Angeles, who is willing to help further the object of this Auxiliary.
4. The officers shall consist of: a President, a Vice-President-at-Large, a Vice-President for each Convocation, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer.
5. Officers shall be elected as follows: The President and Recording Secretary at the Annual Diocesan Meeting the year of the Triennial. The Vice-President-at-Large and the Corresponding Secretary at the Annual Diocesan Meeting the year following the Triennial. The Treasurer at the Annual Diocesan Meeting the year preceding the Triennial. These officers shall be elected for a term of three years, and may not hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms. The Vice-Presidents of the several Convocations shall be elected for a term of two years at the Convocational Auxiliary meeting preceding the Annual Diocesan Meeting. All elections shall be by ballot.
6. The Executive Committee shall consist of: The President, the Vice-President-at-Large, the Recording Secretary, the Corresponding Secretary and the Treasurer.
7. All Departments of the Auxiliary shall correspond to those in the National Council. The Chairman of each Department shall superintend the work of her department in consultation with the Executive Committee. The Department Chairmen shall be appointed annually by the Executive Committee.
8. The Diocesan Board shall consist of: The Executive Committee, the Convocational Vice-Presidents, and the Chairmen of all Departments.
9. Any member of the National Executive Board, and any Provincial officer of the Eighth Province, residing in the Diocese shall be a member of the Diocesan Board.

10. A Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary may be formed in any Parish or Mission with the consent of the rector or clergyman in charge, by notifying the Convocational Vice-President.

11. The Annual Meeting shall be held at the time of the Diocesan Convention, and monthly Diocesan Meetings on such dates and in such places as the President may appoint. General meetings may be arranged by the Vice-Presidents in their respective Convocations.

12. An Annual Quiet Day shall be held during the Season of Advent.



BY-LAWS

1. The duty of the President shall be to preside at the meetings of the Diocesan Auxiliary, and have general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop. The Vice-President-at-Large shall act for the President in her absence, and assist her in her work.

2. The duties of the Convocational Vice-Presidents shall be to preside at the general meetings held in their Convocations, to organize all new branches, and to cooperate with the President in the supervision of the work of the Diocesan Auxiliary.

3. The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to correspond with all Branches in the Diocese, to receive their reports, and to prepare the Annual Report.

4. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of meetings, to keep a record of such meetings and to prepare an abstract of the minutes for the Annual Report.

5. The duty of the Treasurer shall be to keep an account of all money received and expended and to make a report at the Annual Diocesan Meeting.

6. All requests for information or supplies from Parish Branches shall be made to Diocesan officers or Chairmen of Departments and not to National Headquarters.

7. Each Branch of the Auxiliary to be in good standing shall pay an annual pledge according to its ability to the following

Diocesan Funds: General Working Fund, Bishop's Discretionary Fund and the Altar Fund. These pledges and all other money, with the exception of the United Thank Offering, shall be sent through the Diocesan Treasurer, and all checks made out to her.

8. All money collected by the Branches for the United Thank Offering Fund shall be sent to the Diocesan United Thank Offering Treasurer and by her to the Diocesan Auxiliary Treasurer.

9. At the Annual Diocesan Meeting only those Branches in good standing shall have a vote, and each Branch shall have but one vote.

10. A Nominating Committee shall be appointed each year by the Bishop, at least six months before the Annual Diocesan Meeting, and shall consist of a Chairman and one member from each Convocation. Nominations may be made from the floor at the time of the Annual Diocesan Meeting provided that the consent of the nominee has been previously obtained.

11. Delegates to the Triennial and to the Woman's Auxiliary of the Provincial Synod shall be appointed by the President, with the consent of the Executive Committee.

12. The Constitution and By-Laws must be read in every Branch at its Annual Meeting.

13. The Constitution may be amended by a motion made at the Annual Diocesan Meeting and voted on the following year. The By-Laws may be amended at any Annual Diocesan Meeting by a two-thirds vote of Branches present and voting, provided the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing to the Branches sixty days before the meeting.
