
## **"BRING THEE HITHER TO ME"**

The Woman's Auxiliary asks for the prayers of the Church on the Festival of the Transfiguration of Christ (August 6), the Auxiliary's "Altar Day."

The following resolution was unanimously adopted at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, St. John's Church, Los Angeles, May 24, 1898, and endorsed the following day by the Diocesan Convention, with the addition that where practicable the offerings be devoted to the General Fund of the Woman's Auxiliary, viz.:

Resolved, That we set apart the Feast of the Epiphany for an Auxiliary Day, and that, as members of the Auxiliary, we consider it not only a privilege but a duty to attend the services held on that day in the parish to which we belong; and further,

Resolved, That should the appointment of this day meet with the approbation of the clergymen of the Diocese, they be requested to offer, at the celebration of the Holy Eucharist on the Feast of the Epiphany, special prayers for the work of the Auxiliary.

We ask this for the merits of Him Who came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, Thy Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. Amen.





## Minutes of the Forty-first Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary

The forty-first Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary was held on January 26, 1937, at St. Paul's Cathedral, Los Angeles. Holy Communion was celebrated at nine-thirty A. M. with Bishop Stevens as celebrant assisted by Bishop Gooden, Bishop Beal and Father Kaine of All Saints, San Diego.

The business meeting was called to order at ten-thirty by the President Miss Patton. After a hymn the Auxiliary prayers were read by the President. Mrs. W. F. Ludlam, President of St. Paul's branch, welcomed the Auxiliary. The reading of the minutes of the fortieth Annual Meeting was omitted on motion. The reports of the officers were read, that of the Treasurer being accepted on motion.

The Vice-Presidents next gave their reports. Mrs. Fleming for Los Angeles; Mrs. Van Schaick for San Diego; Miss Boulton for San Bernardino, and Mrs. Weld for Santa Barbara. Mrs. Weld, who is giving up her position as Vice-President of Santa Barbara Convocation to the regret of all, also gave a report on the Braille work. Mrs. Riddell introduced Mrs. J. W. Chapple, of the Association of Volunteers in Social Service, who spoke for a few minutes.

Roll call showed 333 present from 58 branches in the Los Angeles Convocation, 20 from 9 branches in San Bernardino, 26 from 11 branches in San Diego, and 26 from 4 branches in Santa Barbara, with 16 visitors from other Dioceses.

The report of the nominating committee was read by Miss Harriet W. Culin, chairman, as follows:

President Miss Anne Patton. Vice-President at Large, Mrs. Scott Quintin. Recording Secretary, Mrs. C. C. Hine. There being no other nominations it was moved and seconded that the nominations be closed and the Secretary cast the ballot. Carried.

The President read the list of department heads as follows: U. T. O. Treasurer, Mrs. George A. Robison; Supply Secretary, Mrs. Fred Mercer; Assistant, Mrs. G. W. Henderson; Educational Secretary, Mrs. Lawrence Laslett; Social Service Secretary, Mrs. John Riddell; Assistant, Mrs. E. C. Barrett; Directress of Altar Department, Mrs. Roy Strong;

Chairman Advance Work Program, Mrs. F. A. Habersham; Diocesan Directress, Church Periodical Club, Mrs. B. W. Vallat.

The following amendment to the constitution was submitted by Mrs. H. L. Kellogg, Monrovia, seconded by Mrs. G. G. Marugg, Monrovia. Add to Paragraph 5 of the constitution: "A vacancy in any Diocesan office occurring between elections to such office shall be filled by the Executive Board." This amendment to be voted on at the forty-second Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary.

A resolution was offered by Miss Boulton expressing regret at the leaving of Mrs. Harry Beal.

A memorial resolution was read by Miss Hibbard on the death of Dean Anna Newell of St. Margaret's House. This resolution was ordered spread on the minutes of the meeting.

After noonday prayers the meeting adjourned for lunch.

At 2:00 P. M. the meeting reconvened. Bishop Stevens welcomed the Woman's Auxiliary and expressed his appreciation of the work done. Bishop Beal gave a short farewell talk.

The President's address was read and on motion it was accepted and placed on file.

A motion was made and passed that a vote of thanks be given the St. Paul's Auxiliary and Mrs. Ludlam, Mistress of Ceremonies. Miss Anne E. Cady of the Good Shepherd Mission, Fort Defiance, Arizona, gave an interesting account of her work among the Navajoe Indians. She told of the great need of more funds to carry on the work there.

Due to illness, The Right Rev. Walter Burd, D. D., Bishop of Saskatchewan was unable to give his address. In his absence Mrs. Burd gave a most interesting account of the work in the far North.

The offering for the afternoon went to Miss Cady for her work in Arizona and to Bishop and Mrs. Burd for their work in the North.

Bishop Stevens dismissed the meeting with the Benediction.

Tea was served in the Cathedral house by the Diocesan Board.

## Report of the San Diego Convocation

Three General Meetings were held in the San Diego Convocation during 1936, the first a special meeting in March at All Saint's San Diego, held at the request of our Diocesan president, when Miss Patton and Miss Hibbard told of the serious deficit the National Church was facing and the branches in the Convocation pledged \$125.00 to do our part in keeping a special work in our province from being closed down. In April a meeting was held at St. Paul's San Diego when all the Lenten work done by the branches for Balbalosan in the Philippines was displayed. Mrs. Thomas Kydd told of the work at Balbalosan. An excellent talk on Christian Social Service was given by Mrs. J. L. Riddell and the Rev. Rankin Barnes, newly arrived from New York as rector of St. Paul's, gave interesting glimpses of the National Auxiliary.

Most of the branches were represented at the Auxiliary Conference held at the Diocesan Summer School at La Jolla in June.

At the request of our Diocesan President special corporate Communions were held by the branches on October 16th, the 65th anniversary of the founding of the Auxiliary, and A Quiet Day of Prayer was observed on November 11th.

A Leaders Conference for the Convocation was held at St. James-by-the-Sea, La Jolla, on October 29th when Miss Patton, Mrs. Laslett, Mrs. Quintin, and Mrs. Robison gave interesting talks on the work of their various departments and held conferences for leaders during the afternoon session.

Another fine meeting was at Oxnard in May when it seemed as if those present were truly interested to hear about the Synod which had just met in the Yosemite.

In making this, my last report as Vice-President of the Santa Barbara Convocation, I would like to give a picture of what the work of a Vice-President in the Northern Convocation is. In the counties of Ventura and Santa Barbara, there are not many large cities or centres where meetings can be held. Santa Barbara is the biggest place, and Ventura next. But out of reach of these centres lies, in the north, Santa Maria and Lompoc, and in the south, Fillmore, Piru, Santa Paula and Oxnard. This means that as the women from the smaller communities cannot go to the meetings far off, the Vice-President must go to them. This makes the work a very personal one and in that lies a great opportunity for the Vice-President. She visits frequently in the Guilds and Auxiliaries: She brings her knowledge and her enthusiasm to the individual. After each monthly Board meeting in Los Angeles, she has learned so much that she wants to immediately tell about it to her friends in the length and breadth of the Convocation. Personally, that part of the work has been what I have especially enjoyed, and I would like the Diocese to know how very happy I have been through the many friends I have made. Friendships

that are based on relationship, doing things together are fine and if the things done together are bringing Christ's kingdom on earth now,—then the relationships are of the best, and the friendships are lasting.

I can't give you a report of figures, of money raised, or meetings held this year: I'd rather give you as your servant in the Diocese these eight years, a report of what I feel has been accomplished. It seems to me that the work of the women, as a whole, has changed greatly: that, on the whole, we know more about church work outside of our own little circles: that we have broadened our outlook: that we have studied and read much: that even with the pleasure of raising money for salaries, etc., through card parties and pot luck lunches,—even so, the women are anxious to have U. T. O. boxes and do their share for the general work of the church at large because they *know* a little about it and what it does. So in looking back over these years, and remembering the small meetings, and the absence of any plan or direction in which *most* of us were going, I feel that today the opposite is very decidedly so. The Auxiliaries and Guilds are organized; every branch of church work has its representative; most of them have a program for the year and a program for each meeting.

The emphasis on prayer and a devotional period at each meeting is stressed, a deeper sense of values has been found, and the whole level of the women's work has been raised. This is all just a beginning.

Last November my term of office ran out, and a new Vice-President was elected at the Convocation meeting. I congratulate the Woman's Auxiliary of the Convocation on having Mrs. R. McClelland Brady as its new Vice-President, and I congratulate the Diocese on having Mrs. Brady as a member of the Woman's Auxiliary Board. Mrs. Brady is also to be congratulated on her new office. She will, I feel sure, take her responsibilities joyously and earnestly because she is a consecrated church woman.

May I take this opportunity to thank the members of the Board for their unfailing kindness and friendliness. It has been a most happy privilege to work with them.

## Report of Supply Department

During the 1936 Lenten Season, 104 branches worked for the following Missions:—St. Barnabas Mission, Kusatsu, Japan; Crow Creek Dormitory, South Dakota; Mission of Our Saviour, and St. Timothy's Mission, Alaska; St. Paul's Mission, P. I., and St. Albans School, Honolulu. The value of this work was \$6,170.18.

For Advent, we sent outside of our Diocese two personal boxes to Missionaries; a suit to an Indian Catechist; Christmas checks to two of our women missionaries and toys to the children of St. Michaels Mission, Wyoming; Christmas checks were sent at the request of Bishop Stevens to 37 of our own Diocesan Missionaries. We also had the privilege of supplying the paint for the Rectory at Lancaster and helped the Altar Department in providing a new surplice for the Rector. The Advent total was \$1,240.59. The total work of the Supply Department for 1936 was \$7,061.18, to this amount the Girl's Friendly contributed \$140.78.

## Report of the Social Service Department

Reports from the branches of the Woman's Auxiliary in this Diocese show that they have done intelligent Christian Social Service during the past year. Cooperating with Community Activities such as Clinics, Hospitals, Settlements, Children's Agencies, Red Cross, Work for the Blind, etc. To single out some branches for mention in this report would be unfair as I might leave out some which had done work quite as noteworthy as those mentioned.

During 1936, \$3,135.25 was contributed to the Diocesan Woman's Auxiliary Social Service Department by branches and interested individuals, the major portion of this amount by individuals, \$1,560.67 was given to Diocesan Institutions through the W. A. Treasurer, making total cash gifts of \$4,695.92. Work done, clothes, food, etc. given away by branches, as reported amounted to \$5,614.42\* plus that distributed by the Diocesan Social Service Secretary, amounting to \$3,000.00 brings the total of work done to \$8,614.42. The sum total being \$13,310.34. The Christmas work which was carried on as usual is included in the above amount.

My Community Service consists of serving on the following committees of the Council of Social Agencies—The Executive Committee, the Character Building Committee, the Association of Volunteers in Social Service, and being Chairman of the Committee on Social Legislation. Also I am Chairman of Social Relations of the Southern California Council of Federated Church Women, and Chairman of Children's Service to Children of the Children's Protective Association.

This year Mrs. Barrett and I hope to put more emphasis on the educational side of Social Service and bespeak your hearty cooperation. Please give attention to any notices that may come to you on that subject. We hope to have Convocational Social Service Secretaries appointed in a few weeks thus strengthening and coordinating the work.

May I say that the Diocesan Social Service Secretary has done much work which does not entail the spending of money and which is most difficult to report—such as clarifying situations for individuals confused in their association with agencies, placing convalecents, obtaining jobs, arranging funerals and many more things that come up from time to time. The work this year as in other years has not been confined to the Los Angeles Convocation. I wish to stress that point—namely that the Department has been useful outside of the Convocation of Los Angeles.


The California Conference of Social Work will be held in San Jose from May 9th to May 13th. I hope it will be possible for some of our church women to attend.

I am happy to report that Mrs. R. C. Boone of South Pasadena has most kindly consented to serve as Diocesan librarian and already many new books have been added to our shelves.


Church School material has been donated to three of the Schools of the missions of our Diocese.

On December 9th, a corporate communion for Altar Guild members and friends was held with Bishop Beal as celebrant and speaker. Bishop Beal spoke on "The Spirit of an Altar Guild," a most helpful and inspiring address. A luncheon and discussion meeting followed. Minutes of this meeting have been mimeographed and copies may be obtained at the Altar Department exhibit.

Also several used cottas; 2 linen chalice veils, 4 corporals, 24 Purificators as well as Manuals, cards, designs and patterns.



### Annual Report of the Work for the Blind For the Year 1936

A year ago I reported to you the death of Mrs. Irving Baxter, of St. Helena, California—a leader in work for the blind in this Province: today we grieve over the death of Mrs. Loaring Clark who was National Secretary of work for the Blind. We thank God for two such noble women.

At the Synod meeting last May in the Yosemite, it was voted that a fitting memorial to Mrs. Baxter would be raised through this Province during the Epiphany Season, a gift of money to be given to Miss Melvin for her labor of love for the work for the Blind. Miss Melvin, herself blind, is a member of our Committee for Church Literature for the Blind, and is the Librarian of our books. I have sent out notices and appeals to each Diocese and Missionary District in the Province, and hope to hear promptly from them.

During the year the Spirit of Missions has been transcribed regularly by Alfonso Verduesco, and eight months a second copy has also been made, by Miss Young of Stockton, for Mrs. Fischer at La Jolla.

Miss Melvin has a request from a young woman in Detroit, for a Braille copy of Girls Friendly material, as she wanted to join the Girls Friendly Society, so Mr. Verduesco has transcribed that for us recently.

This young woman also asked for a Forward Movement Leaflet called "Our Father". I am not sure whether that has been transcribed yet or not.

The Braille Department of the American Red Cross in Washington has heard of our Committee and asked for information about our work. People are beginning to know about us on the West Coast.

Miss Nelson was asked by a woman in New York for "A Book of Offices and Prayers". She asked for it especially for herself and others in the Home for the Blind where she lives—a home run by the Episcopal Church. Two volumes have been done and sent, and Miss Nelson is transcribing the third.

Miss Lang, in Oregon, has been doing a book by Prof. Overstreet and also "Hidden Years" by John Oxenham.

I don't know whether you realize how long it takes for an individual to make a book. It takes hours and hours and hours of time.

Last August the Librarian in the Blind Department at the State Library in Sacramento reported some of our readers had read all our books and that they need more *Church Books*. Well—how is our Committee going to supply those books? Either we must have more workers, you—and you—and you to transcribe for us, or if we have money perhaps we can occasionally buy one. But there are not many to be bought. The demand is not great for church books in Braille—if it were, they could be transcribed by machine as the Forward Movement leaflets are done. It looks to me, however, as if we must find more volunteer workers or raise money to pay blind workers who sorely need the work.

I had a letter from Mrs. Fraser, President of the Honolulu Woman's Auxiliary, last August, giving me the names of thirty-four blind people. I don't believe they could read the sort of literature we provide, but perhaps we ought to do something for them.

Mrs. Fischer undertook a very big task when she started to transcribe "Christ's Alternative to Communism" by Stanley Jones.

## President's Address

*Bishop Stevens, Bishop Gooden, Officers and Members of the  
Woman's Auxiliary, Diocese of Los Angeles*

Last year we celebrated the fortieth anniversary of the founding of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of Los Angeles. Last October 16th we celebrated the sixty-fifth anniversary of the National Woman's Auxiliary. During these sixty-five years the Auxiliary has grown from a small Missionary Society, into a great International Fellowship, which incorporates in itself all the work of women in the Church. A great achievement truly, but let us beware that we do not rest on our laurels. In the first year after the founding of the Christian Church, great things were accomplished, a miraculous growth was recorded, but a slump followed, things was taken for granted. Let us not fall into that too easy trap. The potential strength of the women of our Church is enormous, but we are only using a small part of it. It is our place to find out the means to use it all, each one of us must put her shoulder to the wheel. This is Triennial year, we could not find a better time to commence.

For four years now we have had a Day of Prayer on November 11th and I am happy to say that it has been well attended, this last year 128,000 leaflets were distributed, and everyone feels that they were of much value. This is a very encouraging sign of spiritual awareness.

On January 4, 1937, the Province of the Pacific, and St. Margaret's House, Berkeley, suffered a tremendous loss in the death of Dean Anna G. Newell; we are all deprived of a wise counselor and a good friend, one whose place it will be difficult to fill. But the monument she built will endure and will continue to send out trained women to help in the great work of our Church, because Dean Newell had a vision and was able to make that vision a reality; St. Margaret's is now recognized and appreciated in the whole Church, and when they wanted a new National Field worker for the Auxiliary, they chose a graduate of St. Margaret's, Miss Eleanor Deuel.

This year sees changes in our Diocesan Board. Mrs. Harry Beal the Vice-President-at-Large, must leave us before her term of office is up. The whole Diocese hates to have Bishop and Mrs. Beal go away from here, but we of the Auxiliary feel a special and personal loss. We have tried to make this loss seem a little less by adding her name to our list of honorary officers and have made her an honorary Vice-President. We hope she will return often and join us at our Board meetings, and we will keep her in our thoughts and in our hearts. It should make us more missionary-minded to thus have a personal friend in the missionary field of the Canal Zone.

This morning you elected Mrs. Scott Quintin, to take Mrs. Beal's place as Vice-President-at-Large, she needs no introduction, for she has been our very efficient Supply Secretary for four years, I am personally most awfully glad to have her for my Vice-President, and know that we will have happy days working together. I would feel badly about losing her as Supply Secretary if she had not trained up such a good successor in Mrs. Fred Mercer, that we need not worry, Mrs. George Henderson is going to be Mrs. Mercer's assistant, and the Supply Department is quite safe in their excellent hands.

We welcome Mrs. Clifford C. Hine, who was elected this morning as our Recording Secretary, she takes over Mrs. Mercer's former position, and I hope she is as glad to work with us as we are to have her.

Mrs. Livingston Porter, our Church Periodical Chairman, has unfortunately had to resign, and we are more than sorry to have her go, we are glad however, to report that Mrs. B. W. Vallat will take this important and arduous post. In the Convocation of Santa Barbara, Mrs. George F. Weld had found it necessary to give up her work as Convocational Vice-President, during the years that she has held this position she has been one of our most valued assistants and a warm personal friend of the members of the Board. In addition to her work as Vice-President she has been Chairman of the Provincial Committee on Church Literature for the Blind, and has in this connection done a magnificent piece of work. It is with great regret that we accept her resignation. Mrs. R. McClelland Brady has been elected by the Convocation of Santa Barbara to take Mrs. Weld's place as their Vice-President, and we feel ourselves very fortunate to welcome her as a member of our Board.

We worry over leadership, but after all the Auxiliary has always called women of vision and faith to help it forward. We have now as Honorary Vice-Presidents two outstanding women, Mrs. Josiah Evans Cowles, and Mrs. Harry Beal, and as Honorary Treasurer, Mrs. Abiel Leonard, and honorary head of the Altar Department, Mrs. Joseph H. Johnson. Some of you who are new to the Auxiliary may not remember, but such women as Mrs. Leonard, Mrs. Spencer H. Smith, Miss Helen Magill, Mrs. B. Marshall Wotkyns, Mrs. Cowles, and Mrs. Johnson were the pioneers who blazed the trails for us to follow. We owe them an incalculable debt of gratitude.

Last year during the Emergency of the Church, Bishop Stevens asked us to raise \$500.00. We were happy to help and we raised \$705.04. Dr. Lewis Franklin, our National Treasurer, says that we closed 1936 with all bills paid, this is fine, but he adds "The prospects for 1937 are not so good. There is no indication that the amounts that the dioceses will

give will bridge the gap of the \$240,000 which was raised through the 1936 Emergency Fund." Let us think that statement over very seriously. Surely we want no more emergencies!

The theme of the Triennial, which meets next October in Cincinnati, is to be "The Mission of the Church", this will be presented in three parts; Our Faith—Our Opportunity—and, Our Mission. The definition of this theme should be "The extension and deepening of the Christian faith and fellowship throughout the World." In the carrying out of this program we can all have a part.

The definite goals towards which the Auxiliary is now working are: adequate pensions for all women workers, this has long since been a source of anxiety to the National Board, but it was something that had to wait, now, however, we can move toward it, and it will be one of the important items to come up at the Triennial. There is already a sum of half a million towards a retiring fund, and another half million must be set aside before the Pension Fund can be set up. That is one goal, the others are: keeping up the buildings, which have been made possible by the U. T. O., paying the salaries of the workers, and the cost of their training. Also we must provide regular furloughs for our missionaries, play time is as important as work time.



### **Report of the Woman's Auxiliary**

**Submitted to the Annual Convention, January 27, 1937**

The year 1936 has on the whole been one of progress, and we feel that the Auxiliary is realizing more and more that each Branch is a part of the big whole and not a separate unit.

Last autumn the Diocesan Officers held leaders conferences in the various Convocations, these were received with enthusiasm, and I hope will bear fruit. In the Emergency of the Church Deficit last year, Bishop

Stevens called on the Diocesan Auxiliary to raise \$500.00, I am happy to report that we were able to turn over to him \$705.04.

On December 1st our Annual Diocesan Quiet Day was held in St. Columba's Chapel, Bishop Gooden led the meditations, and they were most inspiring.

The Supply Department sent to six Mission Stations, last Lent, 63 boxes. These have all arrived safely and we have had grateful letters from the Missionaries. One hundred and four Branches of the Auxiliary took part in this Lent work. At Advent we sent two personal boxes to missionaries outside the Diocese, a suit of clothes to an Indian Catechist, Christmas gifts to two women missionaries, one in China, and one in South Dakota. Then Christmas checks were sent to 37 of our own Diocesan Missionaries. Besides this we sent toys to the Indian children at Ethete, Wyoming, and we were able to supply the paint for the rectory at Lancaster. The Supply Department sent a total of money and material of \$7,061.18.

The Educational Department has had a very satisfactory year, \$809.46 has been received from the sale of books, and an increased interest is evidenced in programs. There are more prayer groups and more Corporate Communions.

The United Thank Offering has a splendid record, the total of 1935-1936 being \$12,872.33 as against the totals of 1932-1933 of \$11,019.18 thus showing an increase in three years of \$1,853.15. Also there are more women interested and contributing to this important work.

Mrs. Livingston Porter of the Church Periodical Club has had to resign, we are very sorry to lose her, but we are fortunate in securing for this important post, Mrs. B. W. Vallat, and we know that the work is in good hands.

The Altar Department has had an unusually fine year and is developing into a bureau of information and a school of instruction, with classes in ecclesiastical embroidery every week. We have also joined the National Altar Guild.

The Social Service Department has had another busy year and has been able to bring much relief and comfort to those in distress. During 1936 the Department has received through the Diocesan Treasurer \$3,135.25 besides this actual cash \$5,614.42 has been spent in work, food, and clothing. Sixty-six of our Auxiliary Branches are cooperating with agencies in their communities.

There are several changes in the Board. Mrs. Harry Beal the Vice-President-at-Large is one whom we hate to have leave us, she has

been not only a most efficient officer but also a personal friend to us all, and we have made her an Honorary Vice-President and hope she will many times be back and sit with us on the Board. Our interest and best wishes will follow her into her new field of work in the Canal Zone. Mrs. Scott Quintin who has been elected in Mrs. Beal's place, is a most happy choice as she has proved her ability in her capacity as Supply Secretary, and we are very fortunate to have her as our new Vice-President-at-Large. Mrs. Fred Mercer takes Mrs. Quintin's place as Supply Secretary, and as she has been Convocational Supply Secretary in the Santa Barbara Convocation, we know that she will be a splendid and reliable officer. Mrs. Clifford C. Hine is our new Recording Secretary, and we are indeed glad to welcome her to our Board. Mrs. George F. Weld the Vice-President of the Santa Barbara Convocation, and Chairman for the Provincial Committee for Church Literature for the Blind, has had to resign, we are very sorry to lose her for in the years that she has been on the Board she has won the hearts of all of us. The new Vice-President from Santa Barbara Convocation, Mrs. R. McClelland Brady is most welcome, and we look forward to working most happily with her.

## CONSTITUTION

1. This organization shall be called, **The Los Angeles Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council.**
2. The object of this organization is: To advance the devotional life of the women of the Church, and to support the work of the National Council in all its Departments.
3. Membership shall be open to any woman in the Diocese of Los Angeles, who is willing to help further the object of this Auxiliary.
4. The officers shall consist of: a President, a Vice-President-at-Large, a Vice-President for each Convocation, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer.
5. Officers shall be elected as follows: The President and Recording Secretary at the Annual Diocesan Meeting the year of the Triennial. The Vice-President-at-Large and the Corresponding Secretary at the Annual Diocesan Meeting the year following the Triennial. The Treasurer at the Annual Diocesan Meeting the year preceding the Triennial. These officers shall be elected for a term of three years, and may not hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms. The Vice-Presidents of the several Convocations shall be elected for a term of two years at the Convocational Auxiliary meeting preceding the Annual Diocesan Meeting. All elections shall be by ballot.
6. The Executive Committee shall consist of: The President, the Vice-President-at-Large, the Recording Secretary, the Corresponding Secretary and the Treasurer.
7. All Departments of the Auxiliary shall correspond to those in the National Council. The Chairman of each Department shall superintend the work of her department in consultation with the Executive Committee. The Department Chairmen shall be appointed annually by the Executive Committee.
8. The Diocesan Board shall consist of: The Executive Committee, the Convocational Vice-Presidents, and the Chairmen of all Departments.
9. Any member of the National Executive Board, and any Provincial officer of the Eighth Province, residing in the Diocese shall be a member of the Diocesan Board.

10. A Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary may be formed in any Parish or Mission with the consent of the rector or clergyman in charge, by notifying the Convocational Vice-President.

11. The Annual Meeting shall be held at the time of the Diocesan Convention, and monthly Diocesan Meetings on such dates and in such places as the President may appoint. General meetings may be arranged by the Vice-Presidents in their respective Convocations.

12. An Annual Quiet Day shall be held during the Season of Advent.



## BY-LAWS

1. The duty of the President shall be to preside at the meetings of the Diocesan Auxiliary, and have general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop. The Vice-President-at-Large shall act for the President in her absence, and assist her in her work.

2. The duties of the Convocational Vice-Presidents shall be to preside at the general meetings held in their Convocations, to organize all new branches, and to cooperate with the President in the supervision of the work of the Diocesan Auxiliary.

3. The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to correspond with all Branches in the Diocese, to receive their reports, and to prepare the Annual Report.

4. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of meetings, to keep a record of such meetings and to prepare an abstract of the minutes for the Annual Report.

5. The duty of the Treasurer shall be to keep an account of all money received and expended and to make a report at the Annual Diocesan Meeting.

6. All requests for information or supplies from Parish Branches shall be made to Diocesan officers or Chairmen of Departments and not to National Headquarters.

7. Each Branch of the Auxiliary to be in good standing shall pay an annual pledge according to its ability to the following Diocesan Funds: General Working Fund, Bishop's Discretionary Fund and the Altar Fund. These pledges and all other money, with the exception of the United Thank Offering, shall be sent through the Diocesan Treasurer, and all checks made out to her.

8. All money collected by the Branches for the United Thank Offering Fund shall be sent to the Diocesan United Thank Offering Treasurer and by her to the Diocesan Auxiliary Treasurer.

9. At the Annual Diocesan Meeting only those Branches in good standing shall have a vote, and each Branch shall have but one vote.

10. A Nominating Committee shall be appointed each year by the Bishop, at least six months before the Annual Diocesan Meeting, and shall consist of a Chairman and one member from each Convocation. Nominations may be made from the floor at the time of the Annual Diocesan Meeting provided that the consent of the nominee has been previously obtained.

11. Delegates to the Triennial and to the Woman's Auxiliary of the Provincial Synod shall be appointed by the President, with the consent of the Executive Committee.

12. The Constitution and By-Laws must be read in every Branch at its Annual Meeting.

13. The Constitution may be amended by a motion made at the Annual Diocesan Meeting and voted on the following year. The By-Laws may be amended at any Annual Diocesan Meeting by a two-thirds vote of Branches present and voting, provided the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing to the Branches sixty days before the meeting.

## IN MEMORIAM

*Deaconess Anna G. Newell, Dean of St. Margaret's House,  
Berkeley, California, January, 1928 to January, 1937  
Born February 8, 1881, Died January 4, 1937.*

RESOLVED—That in the death of Deaconess Anna G. Newell, Dean of St. Margaret's House, Berkeley, California, the Diocese of Los Angeles has lost a wise counsellor, and the Province in the entire Church an outstanding educational leader.

A graduate of the University of Missouri and the New York Training School for Deaconesses, Dean Newell began her Church work at the Cathedral in St. Louis, later becoming principal of Hooker School for Girls in Mexico City. After notable work in that mission field she became Dean of St. Margaret's House, Berkeley, California, on January 8, 1928, and until her death on January 4th of this year gave nine years of remarkable service in developing St. Margaret's House into a provincial Church Center of national significance.

A woman of brilliant intellectual gifts, fearless leadership, and single-minded devotion, she enlarged the scope of St. Margaret's House to include not only the training of Deaconesses but a School for Christian Service along many lines, notably that of Student and Social work. Through her liberal policy St. Margaret's House blazed the trail in the field of Christian social action.

Her loss to the Province and the Church at large is a great one, not only as a rare personality, but in the realm of progressive religious thinking. St. Margaret's House will stand a memorial to her creative ability, her courage to face modern problems with the Christian challenge, and her vision to see far horizons.

The Diocese of Los Angeles wishes to record its deep sense of loss and extends its sincere sympathy to the Board of Trustees of St. Margaret's House, and to the family of Dean Newell.
