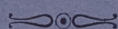


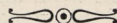

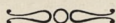
"BRING THEE HITHER TO ME"

The Woman's Auxiliary asks for the prayers of the Church on the Festival of the Transfiguration of Christ (August 6), the Auxiliary's "Altar Day."

The following resolution was unanimously adopted at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, St. John's Church, Los Angeles, May 24, 1898, and endorsed the following day by the Diocesan Convention, with the addition that where practicable the offerings be devoted to the General Fund of the Woman's Auxiliary, viz.:

Resolved, That we set apart the Feast of the Epiphany for an Auxiliary Day, and that, as members of the Auxiliary, we consider it not only a privilege but a duty to attend the services held on that day in the parish to which we belong; and further,

Resolved, That should the appointment of this day meet with the approbation of the clergymen of the Diocese, they be requested to offer, at the celebration of the Holy Eucharist on the Feast of the Epiphany, special prayers for the work of the Auxiliary.

We ask this for the merits of Him Who came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, Thy Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. Amen.

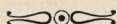

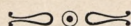

Minutes of the Forty-Second Annual Meeting of the Diocesan Woman's Auxiliary

The forty-second Annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles was held at St. Paul's Cathedral, on Tuesday, January 25th, 1938. There was a celebration of the Holy Communion at 9:30, with Bishop Stevens as Celebrant, assisted by Bishop Gooden, Rev. Alexander Campbell and Rev. A. H. Marsden.

Miss Patton, the President, called the meeting to order at 10:30, and the Auxiliary and the United Thank Offering prayers were repeated by the Assembly. Mrs. Erna B. Coles extended a gracious welcome on behalf of the women of St. Paul's. The Treasurer's report was read and accepted on motion.

Mrs. Thomas Fleming, Jr. gave her report as Vice-President of the Los Angeles Convocation, Miss Bolton for the Convocation of San Bernardino, Mrs. Van Schaick for San Diego and Mrs. McClelland Brady for Santa Barbara. The heads of all Departments read the reports of their year's work. Mrs. W. Bertrand Stevens announced that she was available for talks on the Conferences at Oxford and Edinburgh which she and Bishop Stevens attended this past summer. Mrs. Weld reported on the Braille work for the Blind.

621 women responded to the roll call: 521 from 66 Branches in Los Angeles Convocation; 41 from San Bernardino Branches; 30 from 7 Branches in San Diego; 39 from Santa Barbara District. There were 19 visitors from other Dioceses.

The report of the Nominating Committee was read by Miss Patton. There being no nominations from the floor, it was moved and seconded that the nominations be closed, and the Secretary was instructed to cast the ballot. Mrs. Scott Quintin was elected Vice-President at Large, and Mrs. St. Elmo Coombs, Corresponding Secretary. Miss Patton spoke with regret of Mrs. Brady giving up her work as head of the Santa Barbara Convocation due to her moving out of that district into Los Angeles, and welcomed Mrs. Charles W. Petit of Ventura, who takes her place. The President voiced the regret of the Board in losing Mrs. F. C. Malpas and Mrs. B. W. Vallat from the Board and introduced Mrs. Coombs, Mrs. Malpas' successor. Mrs. Fred Mercer moved a rising vote of thanks to Mrs. Malpas who has been so efficient and faithful in her work as Corresponding Secretary.

Miss Hibbard who heads the drive in the South for funds for St. Margaret's House at Berkeley, told of the progress of the campaign. A total of \$2,686 had been received in cash and pledges, to date.

Mrs. Riddell gave an announcement of the Convention Dinner to be held that evening at the "Town and Gown" Club under the auspices of the Social Service Department. Mrs. Quintin appealed for funds with which to purchase a radio for Miss Cady, our Missionary at Ft. Defiance, and a collection was taken.

A memorial Resolution on the death of Mrs. J. J. Huncker who was Recording Secretary of the Diocesan Woman's Auxiliary for a number of years, was offered by Miss Hibbard, who moved it's adoption. This was seconded and carried by a rising vote.

After the noon-day prayers, the meeting adjourned for the luncheon hour.

The Afternoon session convened at two o'clock, and opened with the singing of a hymn. Bishop Stevens welcomed the women of the Auxiliary and spoke with great appreciation of their work, stressing the fact that the Auxiliary exists for the extension of Christ's Kingdom. He referred to the fine service rendered the Auxiliary by Mrs. Malpas and Mrs. F. A. Haversham who after serving so long and faithfully are giving up official work on the Diocesan Board.

Mrs. Quintin took the chair and Miss Patton gave a resume of the year's work which showed fine accomplishment and great progress in the work of the Diocesan Auxiliary. In 1934, to put the results of the work into figures, \$9,000 was raised for Auxiliary projects, while during 1937, \$15,000 was available.

Mrs. Quintin announced the morning collection of funds for Miss Cady amounted to \$47.50.

Bishop Stevens paid a fine tribute to Mrs. Walter Burd of Saskatchewan whose splendid work for the Church was cut short when she was tragically killed in an auto accident. He introduced Archdeacon Paul of Bishop Burd's Diocese who brought greetings, and voiced the appreciation of that Canadian Diocese for our sympathy in their loss.

The amendment presented at the 1937 Annual Meeting viz., "A vacancy in any Diocesan office occurring between elections, such office shall be filled by the Executive Committee", was brought to vote and unanimously adopted.

Mrs. Ashcroft of Pomona read excerpts from a letter written by her daughter who teaches at St. Mary's School, Shanghai, telling of experiences in trying to save their School furnishings and supplies from the war-ravaged building.

St. Simon's Mission, San Fernando, was awarded first place in the Poster Contest by the judges, and Mrs. Laslett presented a book as the prize.

Miss Patton told of the decision to try holding the "Quiet Day" meditations in the morning of the regular December meeting. She appointed the following Department heads: Mrs. George Robison, U.T.O. Treasurer; Mrs. Fred Mercer, Supply Secretary; Mrs. Lawrence Laslett, Educational Secretary; Mrs. John H. Riddell, Social Service Secretary; and Mrs. Roy Strong, Directress of the Altar Department. No one had been appointed as yet to be Directress of the Church Periodical Club.

Bishop Stevens introduced Bishop Mitchell of Arizona who told of the great need of a Hospital to serve a section of Arizona where the nearest Doctor is a hundred miles away. He appealed for help in fostering this humanitarian work.

Bishop Moulton of Utah was presented by Bishop Stevens and spoke on the work done by the Church in Utah, essentially a rural project, for the district is sparsely populated. He referred to the splendid plan put into operation by Bishop Tuttle when he began that work seventy years ago, and which has been followed ever since, in establishing Churches, Schools and Hospitals to carry out the commands of our Lord.

Miss Patton introduced Mrs. J. B. Colton, a Persian-American, who addressed the assembly on the subject, "Mohammed or Christ?". Born a Mohammedan, she told of her search for the Truth, and her joy and satisfaction in finding the God of Love, and the blessed assurance of the future life through our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

During the singing of an offertory hymn, the collection was taken, part of which went to Bishop Moulton, part to Bishop Mitchell and the remainder into the Discretionary Fund.

Bishop Stevens closed the Meeting with the Benediction.

The Board of the Diocesan Auxiliary served tea in the Cathedral House.

FEBRUARY—Rev. Robert Andrews, Priest and Educator, on "Thirty-four Years of Missionary Work in Japan".

MARCH—Miss Rebekah Hibbard, member of the National Council, spoke on the high lights of the meeting of that body. Miss Patton gave a resume of the National Board meeting held in New York.

APRIL—Mrs. Charles Williamson, President of the Fifth Province, "Glimpses of Our Church in Foreign Lands".

A display of supplies given by the Branches for the Lenten boxes, was held following the meeting, which was at All Saints' Church, Pasadena.

MAY—Col. Thomas E. Swan, "History and Work of the Seaman's Church Institute".

JUNE—"Auxiliary Day", at the Summer School at La Jolla. Miss Josephine Christy spoke on "Ecclestical Embroideries", and Miss Patton gave a report of the Synod meeting at Seattle. Miss Rebekah Hibbard reported on the National Council meeting in New York and also told of the plan to raise money for St. Margaret's House in Berkeley.

NOVEMBER—The Right Rev. W. Bertrand Stevens spoke on "The Oxford Conference" and the "Conference at Edinburgh".

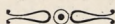

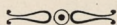

Report of the Vice-President of the Los Angeles Convocation

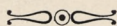

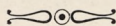
November 16th found many attending the Missionary meeting in Redlands.

The first Convocational event for 1937 was the Annual Quiet Day conducted by Bishop Gooden, at St. Paul's, San Diego, on February 23rd.

On April 29th a display of the work done for the Mission at Sagada, in the Philippine Islands, was held at St. Paul's Parish House, San Diego. We were happy to have Mrs. Mercer with us at that time and to have Mrs. Habersham show us pictures of the work in the Philippines and give us one of her interesting and inspiring talks. The work displayed was the largest amount ever achieved by the San Diego Convocation, most branches doubling or even tripling their former quotas. Special thanks in this work—the packing, shipping, etc.—is due to our efficient Convocational Supply Secretary, Mrs. Morris H. Brunt.

We were again privileged to have the Diocesan Summer School Auxiliary Conference held in La Jolla, in June, when reports of the meeting of the 1937 Synod were given and tea was served by the Woman's Auxiliary of St. James-by-the-Sea.

On November 9th a Convocational women's meeting was held at St. Andrews', La Mesa. Reports of General Convention were given by the Rev. Stephen C. Clark, Jr., the Rev. Bertrand Hause and Mrs. W. L. Van Schaick. A new Parish House enabled St. Andrews to entertain the women of the Convocation for the first time. A capacity crowd was present.

Miss Maude Merryweather, Convocational United Thank Offering Representative, reports all but three of the 20 Convocational Parishes and Missions, taking part in the United Thank Offering, the Offering from the Convocation, increasing each year during the past Triennium.

Mrs. Nassau Stephen's services as Convocational Secretary, have been of great help during the past year.

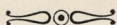
Miss S. C. Brock has been appointed as Convocational Representative of the Altar Department.

Co-operation with other Convocations has been very helpful and participation in the larger interests of the Diocese and of the Province, a great opportunity.

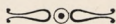
In our increasing awareness of God's purposes we are working toward greater evidences of His love, asking ourselves such questions as:

The following is a brief summary of the work of the Supply Department of the Diocese of Los Angeles:

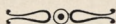
During the Lenten season of 1937 boxes were sent to the following Missions: Good Shepherd Mission, Fort Defiance, Arizona; St. Mary the Virgin, Sagada, Philippine Islands; St. Anne's Mission, El Paso, Texas; St. John's in the Wilderness, Alatna, Alaska; Hudson Stuck Hospital, Ft. Yukon, Alaska. 109 Branches assisted in this work. The value of the boxes were \$5593.30.

During Advent we sent three personal boxes to Missionaries, a suit to an Indian Catechist, Christmas checks to three of our women missionaries. At the request of Bishop Stevens checks were sent to 35 of our own Diocesan Missionaries.

The Advent total was \$1125.49. The total work of the Supply Department for 1937 was \$6718.79. Of this amount the Girls Friendly contributed \$200.00.

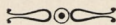

Report of the Social Service Department of the Woman's Auxiliary

January 1st, 1937 to December 31st, 1937

During 1937, \$4,319.36 was contributed to the Social Service Department of the Woman's Auxiliary. A great part of this sum was given by individuals. A few of the Branches contribute generously but their number is so small that there is the constant problem of financing the work.

Gifts to Social Service Institutions, by branches, through the Diocesan Treasurer of the Woman's Auxiliary amounted to \$1,931.00, making a total of cash for Social Service purposes of \$6,250.36.

Work done: clothes, food, Seamen's Boxes, etc., given by Branches (as reported) totaled \$5,599.37.

Amount of clothes, food, etc., distributed by Social Service Secretary and Committee, \$3,262.00, making a total of work done of \$8,861.37.

Total of work done \$8,861.37, plus total cash of \$6,250.36 makes a grand total of \$15,111.73 for Social Service.

To our great regret Mrs. Barret has resigned. We will miss her but we are grateful for the splendid help she gave us while she was active.

Eleven individuals have been found jobs during the past year by the Secretary, and are still working satisfactorily and happily.

The women of the Church can be of real service to their Community by cooperating with plans for the observance of National Social Hygiene Day, February the second, and in a continued campaign against syphilis. This is in line with a Resolution passed by General Convention (1937) which states in part "Therefore, Be It RESOLVED, that the General Convention of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America endorses the Campaign against syphilis now being conducted by the Federal, State, and local departments of health and by the medical societies, and urges the members of this Church to cooperate effectively with these organizations, especially in the dissemination of knowledge pertaining to the control of this disease."

Once again a Uniform Marriage and Divorce Bill has been introduced in the House of Representatives. Such a bill, if passed would be National in scope and is of great importance. May I commend it to your attention. If the bill is worthy of passage it will take the combined efforts of all right thinking people in this country to procure it's passage. More information will be mailed to Branches on this subject at a later date.

Your Secretary is still active in Community Programmes and on several committees of the Los Angeles Council of Social Agencies.

I wish to express my thanks for the fine work of our new but efficient Convocation Secretary for San Bernardino, Mrs. Norman Palmer, and to members of my committee who have helped so much in the year round programme and the Christmas work in the Los Angeles Convocation. Especially Mrs. A. F. Alton and Mrs. Harry Reynolds, without whose help it would have been difficult to carry on. By Easter we hope to have secretaries for the San Diego and Santa Barbara Convocations.

May I suggest that all Branch Social Service Secretaries study the "Annual" and note the work done by other branches? It is sure to be a stimulating experience.

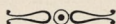

Report of the Educational Department

During the past year reports from the branches show a total of 1,576 women engaged in some form of educational program. This number is a gratifying increase. Several auxiliaries have followed the course of current events in the mission field; others have evening forum groups to which men are invited.

The devotional life of the branches appears to be deepening as evidenced by the increasing number of corporate communions held during the year and by the formation of several new prayer groups.

The book table continues to be a busy place at each Diocesan meeting and also during the sessions of Los Angeles summer school.

Church School material has been donated to four of the schools of the missions of our Diocese; in addition books and leaflets to the amount of \$57.50 have been given away.

I have spoken at four district meetings, addressed 26 branch sessions, and led six leaders conferences.

Received from sale of books, magazines, etc. and from gifts \$932.51. Expended for purchase of books, etc. and for postage, printing, etc. \$915.03; leaving a balance on hand \$17.48.

Mrs. Garnett Tyler, our prayer partner Secretary reports a successful year.

Our Diocesan Librarian Mrs. R. C. Boone has increased the usefulness of our library, 42 books having been loaned from its shelves and 17 new books purchased.

Receipts \$30.06. Expenses \$29.76. Balance 30 cents.

My sincere thanks are offered to all those who by their help and encouragement support the educational work. May it continue to increase scope and usefulness.

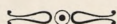

The Directress cannot praise too highly the splendid work of her assistant, Miss Gertrude Hovey. Much that has been accomplished is due to her untiring efforts.

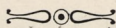
We gratefully acknowledge the cooperation of Dean Bloy. His interest has greatly furthered the work of this Department.

Then there are the cards, theological and secular books, games, magazines in quantities which amount to thousands, that are sent to institutions, schools, etc.

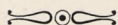
The Church Periodical Club of the Diocese has Clubs in 66 Parishes and some are very active. Ten new clubs were formed this last year.

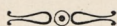

Report of Committee on Church Literature For the Blind

First Nine Months of 1937

My report covers only the first nine months of 1937. During that time there have been added to our Braille library many books which have been transcribed by Miss Nelson, Mrs. Fischer, and Miss Carter. I will name a few as I want you to know the kind of reading we supply to our blind readers.

A "Book of Offices and Prayers for Priest and People"; "The Story of the Church" by Bishop Irving P. Johnson; "An Outline of Personal Prayer" by Bishop Frank E. Wilson; Two books of Bishop Brooks' sermons—one called "How to Abound", and the other "How to be Abased"; About thirty copies of the leaflet for the "Quiet Day of Prayer" of the Woman's Auxiliary;—"Six Altars" by Bishop Stewart; and "The Spirit of Missions" has been regularly transcribed each month by our blind worker, Alfonso Verduco.

A leaflet called "My Religion" by Madame Chiang Kai-shek seemed to me so very fine and vital, I felt it should be available to the blind, so

I wrote to Shanghai for permission to transcribe it. Madame Chiang Kai-shek gave me her permission and Mrs. Fischer in La Jolla transcribed it, so now through Miss Melvin, our Librarian, it has been circulated and read by many. It is a very beautiful affirmation of faith.

During these nine months, I have raised for running expenses \$213.28. In the Epiphany Season \$75.00 was raised through the Province, as a Memorial Fund to Mrs. Baxter, and sent as a gift to Miss Melvin who has bought herself a much needed typewriter.

Last Spring I tendered my resignation as Chairman of this Committee to the Woman's Auxiliary meeting at the Synod, in Seattle, and in September my successor, Miss L. G. Freeland of Marysville, California, in the Missionary District of the San Joaquin was appointed. Since October 1st, she has been carrying on the work and I beg you all to help her in the future, as you have helped me in the past. She is tremendously interested in Braille, and is working hard to increase our library and also to find more and more readers for the Braille books. So when she writes to you for funds, or help of any kind, I hope you will realize that without you she cannot keep on, or increase the scope of her department.

I thank you deeply for your past help. I give this work up with real regret, but owing to the fact that I expect to spend more and more time in New England each year, I feel unable to carry on this important piece of work.

President's Address

Bishop Stevens, Bishop Gooden, Officers and Members of the Woman's Auxiliary, Diocese of Los Angeles:

In reviewing this year just past, it seems to me that certain events stand out with startling clearness. The two great conferences at Oxford and Edinburgh, The General Convention, and the Woman's Auxiliary Triennial in Cincinnati. But often of late I have wondered how much they mean to the average Branch of the Auxiliary, has the president made it her responsibility to see that each member at least knows that these things have taken place, and at least some of the significance attached to them. If she has failed in this, then to a large extent these wonderful highlights which have been offered to us have been dimmed and their usefulness and inspiration curtailed. This is a very important question, and should be asked by each Branch, and if they have failed then now is the time to make the correction. For not until we follow the events of our Church as a whole are we accomplishing our work as a Branch of the National Woman's Auxiliary.

As we enter this year of 1938, we must say good-bye to old friends and welcome new ones. One who leaves the Board this year is Mrs. Malpas, who for nine years has been our very splendid Corresponding Secretary. To her care and efficiency we owe the fine Annuals, which are after all the history of this Diocese. They are a big work, and demand infinite care. The Diocese owes her a big debt, and the Board feels for her, great admiration and loyal friendship. Mrs. Coombs, whom you elected this morning is very welcome to us and we are happy to have her on our Board. Another one whose resignation we accept with deep regret, is our good will Ambassador, Mrs. F. A. Habersham. She has contributed a unique gift to the Church with her moving pictures, and we shall all miss her cheery smile. But in this Diocese she will always be glad to show her pictures when you may so desire, so we do not really lose her. Mrs. B. W. Vallat the head of The Church Periodical Club finds it necessary to resign, and we are loath to have her go. The Executive Committee has not yet filled her place. The Convocation of Santa Barbara has elected a new Vice-President for their Convocation, and we welcome Mrs. Charles E. Petit of Ventura, Mrs. R. McClelland Brady the former vice-president will be greatly missed by us all, and we are happy that she has moved nearer so we can still see a great deal of her, as Mr. and Mrs. Brady are now living in Burbank.

In the death of Mrs. J. J. Hunker the Diocese of Los Angeles lost a lovely Christian character, and many of us lost a very dear and close friend. Her name is being placed in the Book of Remembrance as a slight expression of the Board's love and respect.

This past year has in the world been one of great anxiety, and there are wars and rumors of wars, but at home here in our Diocese we have gone forward in a deepening sense of our spiritual obligations, and I am happy to know that there are more prayer groups and more corporate Communion and that an increased interest is shown in study. These are all healthy signs, and then we are growing up in a material sense also. This is shown by our Treasurers' reports. In 1934 our total cash receipts were \$9,057.59 while in 1937 our receipts were \$15,845.11 showing a gain during four years of \$6,787.50. This is a proof of our expansion, and our widening interests. However it is also a responsibility, and we must be careful that we use our opportunities wisely, that we keep a forward look, and we do not drop into complacency.

At the Triennial in Cincinnati the moving spirit was a world outlook and a missionary consciousness, and a desire for unity with our Christian brothers in all Christian lands and churches. Christians standing together against a rising tide of paganism and indifference. Can we claim to be part of "A glorious band, the chosen few, on whom the Spirit came". Are we willing to be real soldiers of the Cross, and dare not count the cost? Unless our Churchmanship can mean more than merely acquiescing, we are not really doing our part as members of this great Fellowship of Women, which is the Woman's Auxiliary.

During the past three years we in the Diocese of Los Angeles have enjoyed the privilege of having one of the four women on the National Council, one of us, Miss Rebekah L. Hibbard. At the Triennial, she did not allow her name to be brought up for re-election. It was very fine of her to do this un-selfish thing, but we lose by it and it makes us all feel very sad.

Now as your president, let me thank you one and all for your splendid co-operation in our work, and our hopes, let us face the future with high ideals and without fear and let us never forget our aim, to bring the World to Christ.

During the past year the Diocesan Auxiliary has held five Diocesan meetings, which have been well attended. We have had interesting speakers on a varied assortment of subjects. In November we had the honor of hearing Bishop Stevens, tell of the wonderful Conferences which were held in Oxford and Edinburgh.

We also had our Diocesan Quiet Day the early part of Advent, and the Rev. Mr. Glazebrook of La Jolla had the meditations, which were unusually fine and for which we are very grateful. As this was Triennial year, we had five delegates and five alternates go to Cincinnati, and I as their President was very proud of my delegation.

The United Thank Offering from this Diocese was over \$20,000.00 for the three years, this is the largest offering we have ever made.

Our Educational department has functioned wonderfully well, and there are more study classes, and more prayer groups than ever before.

The Supply Department sent to Mission Stations in money and materials \$6,033.79 and for our own Diocesan Missions over \$900.00.

The Altar Department has had a splendid year, and the embroidery classes have proved of great value to the members of Branch altar guilds. We sent some red hangings to a church in South America, as our part of the work for the National Altar Guild of which we are a member. Mrs. Roy Strong made these hangings herself and we were justly proud of them.

The Social Service has had a busy year on a restricted budget, and has gotten jobs for people, made contacts, placed people with the proper agencies, and supplied money where necessary.

The Woman's Auxiliary Memorial Bed has had its endowment added to by the use of the Book of Remembrance, where people have had their friends names inscribed in the book rather than having sent flowers to the funeral. This is a wonderful charity and one which should have wide publicity, that we have a bed in the Good Samaritan Hospital which we can use for any person who needs it.

Mrs. F. C. Malpas who for nine years, has been our very efficient corresponding secretary, goes out of office this year. We are very grateful to her for her faithful service on the Board, and shall greatly miss her. Mrs. St. Elmo L. Coombs, has been elected in her place, and we welcome her and know that she will prove a very worthy successor.

Other changes are the resignations of Mrs. F. A. Habersham, and Mrs. B. W. Vallat, of the Church Periodical Club, and Mrs. E. C. Barrett, who was Mrs. Riddell's assistant in Social Service. We hate to see them leave us, but we know that we have their continued interest.

In going over our books for the past four years I was impressed by our growth. In 1934 the Woman's Auxiliary received in cash \$9,057.59 while in 1937 we received \$15,845.11 showing a gain in cash receipts of \$6,787.52. While this shows only material increase it is nevertheless indicative of our larger field of work, and shows that we are truly going forward.

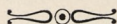

CONSTITUTION

1. This organization shall be called, THE LOS ANGELES DIOCESAN BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE NATIONAL COUNCIL.

2. The object of this organization is: To advance the devotional life of the women of the Church, and to support the work of the National Council in all its Departments.

3. Membership shall be open to any woman in the Diocese of Los Angeles, who is willing to help further the object of this Auxiliary.

4. The officers shall consist of: a President, a Vice-President-at-Large, a Vice-President for each Convocation, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer.

5. Officers shall be elected as follows: The President and Recording Secretary at the Annual Diocesan Meeting the year of the Triennial. The Vice-President-at-Large and the Corresponding Secretary at the Annual Diocesan Meeting the year following the Triennial. The Treasurer at the Annual Diocesan Meeting the year preceding the Triennial. These officers shall be elected for a term of three years, and may not hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms. The Vice-Presidents of the several Convocations shall be elected for a term of two years at the Convocational Auxiliary meeting preceding the Annual Diocesan Meeting. All elections shall be by ballot.

6. The Executive Committee shall consist of: The President, the Vice-President-at-Large, the Recording Secretary, the Corresponding Secretary and the Treasurer.

7. All Departments of the Auxiliary shall correspond to those in the National Council. The Chairman of each Department shall superintend the work of her department in consultation with the Executive Committee. The Department Chairmen shall be appointed annually by the Executive Committee.

8. The Diocesan Board shall consist of: The Executive Committee, the Convocational Vice-Presidents, and the Chairmen of all Departments.

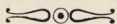
9. Any member of the National Executive Board, and any Provincial officer of the Eighth Province, residing in the Diocese shall be a member of the Diocesan Board.

10. A Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary may be formed in any Parish or Mission with the consent of the rector or clergyman in charge, by notifying the Convocational Vice-President.

11. The Annual Meeting shall be held at the time of the Diocesan Convention, and monthly Diocesan Meetings on such dates and in such places as the President may appoint. General meetings may be arranged by the Vice-Presidents in their respective Convocations.

12. An Annual Quiet Day shall be held during the Season of Advent.

13. A vacancy in any Diocesan office occurring between elections, such office shall be filled by the Executive committee.



BY - L A W S

1. The duty of the President shall be to preside at the meetings of the Diocesan Auxiliary, and have general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop. The Vice-President-at-Large shall act for the President in her absence, and assist her in her work.

2. The duties of the Convocational Vice-Presidents shall be to preside at the general meetings held in their Convocations, to organize all new branches, and to cooperate with the President in the supervision of the work of the Diocesan Auxiliary.

3. The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to correspond with all Branches in the Diocese, to receive their reports, and to prepare the Annual Report.

4. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of meetings, to keep a record of such meetings and to prepare an abstract of the minutes for the Annual Report.

5. The duty of the Treasurer shall be to keep an account of all money received and expended and to make a report at the Annual Diocesan Meeting.

6. All requests for information or supplies from Parish Branches shall be made to Diocesan officers or Chairmen of Departments and not to National Headquarters.

7. Each Branch of the Auxiliary to be in good standing shall pay an annual pledge according to its ability to the following Diocesan Funds: General Working Fund, Bishop's Discretionary Fund and the Altar Fund. These pledges and all other money, with the exception of the United Thank Offering, shall be sent through the Diocesan Treasurer, and all checks made out to her.

8. All money collected by the Branches for the United Thank Offering Fund shall be sent to the Diocesan United Thank Offering Treasurer and by her to the Diocesan Auxiliary Treasurer.

9. At the Annual Diocesan Meeting only those Branches in good standing shall have a vote, and each Branch shall have but one vote.

10. A Nominating Committee shall be appointed each year by the Bishop, at least six months before the Annual Diocesan Meeting, and shall consist of a Chairman and one member from each Convocation. Nominations may be made from the floor at the time of the Annual Diocesan Meeting provided that the consent of the nominee has been previously obtained.

11. Delegates to the Triennial and to the Woman's Auxiliary of the Provincial Synod shall be appointed by the President, with the consent of the Executive Committee.

12. The Constitution and By-Laws must be read in every Branch at its Annual Meeting.

13. The Constitution may be amended by a motion made at the Annual Diocesan Meeting and voted on the following year. The By-Laws may be amended at any Annual Diocesan Meeting by a two-thirds vote of Branches present and voting, provided the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing to the Branches sixty days before the meeting.

ELEANOR PETERSON HUNKER

Diocesan Recording Secretary — 1923 to 1929

Born March 23rd, 1869

Died December 5th, 1937

RESOLVED—That in the death of Eleanor Peterson Hunker, Diocesan Recording Secretary from 1923 to 1929, the Woman's Auxiliary has lost a devoted member and the Diocese a warm and generous friend.

During her six years as Recording Secretary, Mrs. Hunker endeared herself to everyone with whom she came in contact by her graciousness and charm of manner. Always conscientious in her work she added to all she did that indefinable touch of personality that made working with her a pleasure. A woman of refinement and culture she gave freely of her time and substance to the work of the Master. With her, religion was the natural expression of a simple and profound faith and she put into practice what she so firmly believed. She will be greatly missed in her parish, in the Diocese, and by a host of friends whose lives have been enriched through hers.
