



"BRING THEE HITHER TO ME"

The Woman's Auxiliary asks for the prayers of the Church on the Festival of the Transfiguration of Christ (August 6), the Auxiliary's "Altar Day."

The following resolution was unanimously adopted at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, St. John's Church, Los Angeles, May 24, 1898, and endorsed the following day by the Diocesan Convention, with the addition that where practicable the offerings be devoted to the General Fund of the Woman's Auxiliary, viz.:

Resolved, That we set apart the Feast of the Epiphany for an Auxiliary Day, and that, as members of the Auxiliary, we consider it not only a privilege but a duty to attend the services held on that day in the parish to which we belong; and further,

Resolved, That should the appointment of this day meet with the approbation of the clergymen of the Diocese, they be requested to offer, at the celebration of the Holy Eucharist on the Feast of the Epiphany, special prayers for the work of the Auxiliary.

The Prayer for the Woman's Auxiliary

O Almighty Father, Who didst vouchsafe to Thy chosen ones on the mount the comforting vision of the glory that shall be revealed, to strengthen and cheer them in their Apostolic work, we beseech Thee to be with Thy servants, the members of the Woman's Auxiliary of this Diocese, in all their efforts for the spread of the Kingdom of Thy dear Son. Grant that to many hearts may go the call of opportunity to serve Thee in this work, in the bearing of others' burdens and the fulfillment of the law of Christ. In what they think and do, enable them to hear the voice of Thy Son to guide and strengthen them. And in all the means of grace in Thy Church, and more especially in the Holy Communion at Thy Altars, help them to see Him Who is invisible, that in their aims and difficulties and trials they may have the abiding faith that all things are possible to them that believe. We ask this for the merits of Him Who came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, Thy Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. Amen.

O Lord, our Heavenly Father, we pray Thee to send forth more laborers into Thy harvest, and to grant them Thy special grace for every need. Guard and guide the workers in the field, and draw us into closer fellowship with them. Dispose the hearts of all women everywhere to give gladly as Thou hast given to them. Accept, from grateful hearts, our United Thank Offering of prayer and gifts and joyful service; and bless it to the coming of Thy Kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.





Minutes of the Forty-Third Annual Meeting of the Diocesan Woman's Auxiliary

The Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles held its forty-third annual meeting on Tuesday, January 24th, 1939, at St. Paul's Cathedral. Preceeding the regular session, there was a celebration of the Holy Communion at 9:30, with the Rt. Rev. W. Bertrand Stevens as Celebrant, assisted by the Rt. Rev. Robert Gooden, Dean F. Eric Bloy, Rev. W. C. Havermale and Rev. Alexander Campbell.

Miss Anne Patton declared the meeting open at 10:30 and Dean Bloy led in the opening prayers and gave a word of greeting. Miss Mamie Voight welcomed us on behalf of the women's organizations of the Cathedral.

Reports of the Convocational Vice-Presidents were given by Mrs. Thomas Fleming Jr., Mrs. C. W. Petit, Mrs. W. L. Van Schaick and Miss Marjorie Boulton.

Mrs. Robison in speaking for the United Thank Offering, said our Diocese was second in the whole United States in the amount of the offering this first year of the Triennium. The Treasurer's report was read and accepted on motion.

Miss Rebekah Hibbard spoke on the progress of the campaign for funds for St. Margaret's House at Berkeley, \$3,099 having been received to date from this Diocese. Bishop Stevens asked to make a report of his disposition of the Discretionary Fund. These reports were all accepted on motion.

Bishop Gooden spoke of his appreciation of the work of the Woman's Auxiliary.

The Branches made their pledges for the coming year during Roll Call to which 616 women responded, 520 from 75 Branches in the Los Angeles Convocation, 39 from 8 San Bernardino Branches, 32 from 12 Branches in San Diego and 25 from Santa Barbara Convocation.

Miss Margaret Hibbard gave the report of the Nominating Committee and offered the name of Mrs. C. J. O'Connor for Treasurer for the ensuing three years. There were no nominations from the floor, and the Secretary was instructed to cast the ballot.

Miss Patton paid loving tribute to Mrs. Emily Laslett, whose wonderful work as Educational Secretary will always be remembered, and whose passing saddened the hearts of all Auxiliary women in the Diocese. The President spoke with regret of losing from the Board Mrs. Thomas Fleming Jr., Miss Marjorie Boulton and Mrs. Roy Strong, and complimented them on their splendid work. She introduced Mrs. Phillip White, new Vice-President for the San Bernardino Convocation, Mrs. Clifford Hine for the Los Angeles Convocation, and Miss Gertrude Hovey to be Directress of the Altar Department. She then presented Mrs. Clarence Parlour who takes up the work of Educational Secretary, and Mrs. J. Mason Reeves Jr., new Recording Secretary.

Mrs. W. Bertrand Stevens told of the Trailer Chapel being provided by the Daughters of the King, to be known as "St. Christopher's Chapel," a small model of which was on display. She referred to the demonstration of Church Unity in the work of the University Religious Conference, and the need for well-trained young people who are able to speak with sure knowledge on the tenets of their Faith.

Miss Patton offered a Resolution to amend Section 7 of the By-Laws by striking out the last word "her" and adding the words "Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles," making the last clause read, "and all checks made out to the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles." This was seconded and carried.

Mrs. Coombs read two amendments presented by the Diocesan Board to be voted on next year at the Annual meeting. The first, an amendment to Section 5 of the Constitution, "Resolved that the sentence of Sec. 5 of the Constitution of the Woman's Auxiliary regarding the election of Vice-Presidents of the several Convocations be changed to read as follows, 'The Vice-Presidents of the several Convocations shall be elected for a term of three years at the Convocational meeting preceeding the Annual meeting, and may not hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms, the Vice-Presidents of the Los Angeles and San Diego Convocations to be elected the year following the Triennial, the San Bernardino Vice-President to be elected the year of the Triennial, and the Santa Barbara Vice-President to be elected the year preceeding the Triennial. All elections to be by ballot'." The second resolution, an amendment to Section 7 of the Constitution regarding the appointment of Department Chairmen, to be changed to read: "the Department Chairmen shall be appointed for a term of three years and may not be appointed to the same Department for more than two consecutive terms."

A Memorial Resolution on the death of Emily Mary Laslett was offered by Mrs. Scott Quintin, who moved its adoption. This was carried by a rising vote.

After the noon-day prayers the meeting adjourned for the luncheon hour.

The afternoon meeting convened at two o'clock. Bishop Stevens spoke in appreciation of the work of the Auxiliary, and gave a resume of the work carried on for Church Unity since the Conferences at Oxford and Edinburgh.

Mrs. Scott Quintin, Vice-President-at-Large, then took the chair while Miss Patton gave her annual address, in which she stressed the desire to learn, on the part of Church women, as being the fundamental step toward effective work for the extension of Christ's Kingdom.

Miss Rebekah Hibbard moved that letters of greeting be sent to Honorary members of the Diocesan Board who were not able to be present at the meeting. Seconded and carried.

Mrs. Spencer Smith moved a vote of thanks to the retiring Vice-President of the Los Angeles Convocation and the Directress of the Altar Department, which was unanimously carried.

Mrs. Scott Quintin moved a vote of thanks to Dean Bloy and all Cathedral workers for their help in arranging for the meeting. Motion carried.

Miss Patton introduced Dr. Frederick S. Fleming of Trinity Church, New York City, who gave a challenging talk on "The Church in the City." Mrs. Isabel Rose was the second speaker, her subject being, "Present Day Problems in India." She emphasized the great need of taking, not Christianity, but Christ, to our missionary fields.

The offering was then taken.

Bishop Stevens dismissed the meeting with the Benediction.

Tea was served in the Cathedral House.




Report of the Vice-President of the Los Angeles Convocation

a Garden Conference and Luncheon held in Mrs. William Frenayes' garden in Coronado on July 7th, when Miss Edna Beardsley, Assistant Executive Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary came with Miss Patton and Miss Hibbard and gave a splendid talk on the purpose of our work for Christ.

A quiet Day of Prayer was observed by the branches on Armistice Day.

The Vice-President has visited eleven of the twenty branches, even going as far as All Saints at Brawley, and is happy to report new branches at Leucadia and Brawley, and the re-organization of St. Mark's Branch at San Diego.

Splendid work has been done by the Convocation Secretaries, Mrs. Morris H. Brunt, Miss Maude Merryweather, Miss Sarah Coleman Brock, and Mrs. Ruel Liggett.

The Convocation has sustained a great loss in the death on January 19th of Mrs. Nassau Stephens who has been our Convocational Secretary for the past four years.

We are grateful that Mrs. Lloyd R. Gray will take over the work of Convocational Secretary.

Closer ties between us and more earnest work together have marked the work of the past year.

We look forward to further work for Christ in the San Diego Convocation.

Annual Report of the Supply Department

The following is a very brief summary of the work of the Supply Department for the year 1938. During the Lenten season boxes were sent to the following missions: St. Elizabeth's Mission, Ketchikan, Alaska; Rosebud Indian Mission, Mission, South Dakota; Jane Ivinson Memorial Hall, Laramie, Wyoming; Sherwood Hall, Laramie, Wyoming; St. Philip's Junior College, San Antonio, Texas; St. Mark's, Nenana, Alaska, and St. Barnabas Hospital, Osaka, Japan.

The total value of the boxes was \$5,021.30. 111 branches of the Diocese contributed to the boxes.


To this must be added a great deal of second hand clothing. This is a very important part of the lenten box work on which no adequate value can be placed.

During Advent we sent three personal boxes to Missionaries, a suit of clothing to an Indian Catichist, Christmas checks to two women Missionaries. At the request of Bishop Stevens we sent Christmas checks to 42 of our own Diocesan Missionaries. The total value of the Advent work was \$1,355.39.

The total work of the Supply Department for 1938 was \$6,376.69. Of this amount the Girls Friendly contributed \$200.00.

Report of the Social Service Department of the Woman's Auxiliary

January 1st, 1938 to December 31st, 1938

The report of the Social Service Department will be in a different form this year as the reports from the branches are not all available and so it is impossible to give an accurate report of branch activities. However the branches have been increasingly active in assuming their responsibility and a report will be made at a later date.

Two important phases of the Department's work were sadly neglected during 1938. Conferences and Educational Material, these we hope to emphasize during 1939.

\$3,551.72 was contributed towards the work of the S. S. Department through the Diocesan Treasurer during 1938, by branches and interested individuals. Of this amount \$3,260.40 was used for Food, Milk, Medicine and cash relief. The balance for other things as the need arose. There was a balance on hand January first of \$49.32.

On August tenth a garden party was given by the Department at "Pickfair" through the courtesy of Miss Mary Pickford and the sum of \$703.48 was cleared.

1939 is a Legislative year in California. Many bills are being introduced that vitally affect the lives of all our people. It is our responsibility to learn as much as we can and to help our legislators vote for the best legislation possible. Why not add this study to the work of your Social Service Committee?


The National Church recognizes that we cannot do a real job of Christian living without a Community background and is recommending a series of six pamphlets for study. "How Can the Church Christianize Its Community?" is the question. The pamphlets are grouped as the Church in Urban America. A letter regarding these pamphlets will be sent to all branch presidents and their S. S. secretaries in urban communities immediately after Convention.

Five men and eleven women have been found employment during the part year.

Report of the Woman's Auxiliary Memorial Bed 1938

1938 was a banner year for the W. A. Memorial Bed fund. For the first time in ten years the Diocesan Treasurer of the Woman's Auxiliary has been able to make two payments of \$500.00 each, towards the endowment fund in 18 months. This increase of \$1,000.00 gives the W. A. the use of a room in the Good Samaritan Hospital for 144 days during 1939.

The Diocesan Board feels that this is the time to reiterate that this is your fund, for the use of all Auxiliary members, who are in need of such service, and should not be confined to those people living in and around Los Angeles. Any Branch desiring the use of the room for one of its members should communicate with the Social Service Secretary, who will make the necessary arrangements if room is available.

Naturally the hospital cannot include the services of a doctor. However, when necessary, everything is done to help interest a physician in the patient.

During 1938, 108 days of service were given totaling \$622.75.

Thanks to the Woman's Auxiliary Memorial Book and gifts from Branches to the Fund this invaluable, constructive service is increasing each year. Let's make 1939 another banner year.



Church Symbolism—The Rev. Douglas Stuart.


Art in Religion—Bishop Stevens.



President's Address

1939

Bishop Stevens, Bishop Gooden, Officers and Members of the Woman's Auxiliary, Diocese of Los Angeles:

Last year I called your attention to the importance of the Oxford and Edinburgh Conferences. This year you have just heard Bishop Stevens tell what has followed. That was an epoch making time in 1937, and we as Christians must realize its full importance. This Christmas at Madras, India, Christians from all over the world gathered together in conference. In March their delegates will be here in Los Angeles to report. I hope that many of us will be able to hear those reports. We have today the duty of showing that our faith means something, that our zeal is real, and as the Presiding Bishop says, our Missionary vision and responsibility enters into all phases of our life.

Sorrow and loss have come to us in 1938, Emily Mary Laslett, our loved head of the Education Department died the end of November after an illness of a few months. She was one of those rare souls who have in their eyes the light which shines I know in the eyes of saints. She gave to us without reserve. We shall miss her more than I can say. But it is our duty to go forward with greater zeal because of her, and to cooperate with

her successor in every way we can. Mrs. Clarence Parlour is now head of the Educational Department, and a fine and efficient one she will make. She will lead you and help you, but you must first help yourselves. You must want to learn, and I can say with entire truth that learning will increase your interest in the work of the Church 100 per cent.

Two other former officers have died during this year. Miss Helen Griffith Magill and Miss Grace Grosvenor Wotkyns. Miss Magill was the Diocesan President from 1921 to 1927 and a number of the National Board from 1922 to 1928. She was a truly devoted leader and brought home to us that we are part of the National Organization. Miss Wotkyns was the sister-in-law of Mrs. B. M. Wotkyns, our first supply secretary.

Miss Wotkyns was herself a pioneer in church work and was one of those to found the Auxiliary at All Saints Church, Pasadena. She was also on the Diocesan Board as correspondent for the Los Angeles Churchman from 1909 to 1916. We owe much to these women who gave us our start and pointed the way.

There are changes on the Board, Mrs. Thomas Fleming Jr. completed her term as convocational vice-president, and Mrs. C. C. Hine was elected to that office. We are very sorry to lose Mrs. Fleming from the Board. She has been a splendid officer and has built up the Los Angeles convocation with its district meetings and by visiting individual branches, and leaves a strong and growing organization. Mrs. Fleming however, is not giving up church activity, only changing. She has just been made a member of the board at Brent House, Chicago, which cares for Oriental students under the National Executive Board. Mrs. Hine has been such an efficient recording secretary that the convocation is to be much congratulated on having her as its new vice-president. Mrs. J. Mason Reeves Jr. is taking Mrs. Hine's place as recording secretary and welcome her to the Board.

Miss Marjorie Boulton of the San Bernardino Convocation also completed her term as vice-president, and they have elected Mrs. Phillip White to succeed her. We welcome Mrs. White, but we shall miss Miss Boulton's presence and excellent council. She was wonderfully faithful in coming to our monthly meetings.

The other change is in the Altar Department. Mrs. Roy Strong felt that she must resign as its head. We are all very sorry to lose her. She has built up a fine department and she has trained an excellent assistant, so in turning the department over to Miss Gertrude Hovey we need not fear that it will lose any of its effectiveness.

At Las Vegas last spring the Provincial Auxiliary elected Mrs. W. L.

Van Schaick of La Jolla its president. The whole Diocese of Los Angeles may well be proud to have her. I hope this will make us all more conscious of our relation to the province. The two dioceses, Los Angeles and California, are the big sisters of the province and as such we should in every way try to help with the work.

Once more let me urge upon you the importance of keeping in touch with the whole program of the Woman's Auxiliary. This can be done in several ways. When possible have a representative from your branch at the monthly diocesan meetings, and have that representative definitely feel the responsibility of bringing back the report of what was said and done. Then every branch should have the Los Angeles Churchman and have one of its members review the news items. In this way you keep informed as to what is happening in the diocese. Lastly, every branch should take the Spirit of Missions and have a report on its news. It is your trade journal and through it you keep in touch with the whole church. Any branch which does these three things will be well informed, and well informed women are interested. I do hope you will all try it.

The world is in turmoil. We enter 1939 with misgivings, but we should face the future with courage, for are we not Christians? If we are sincere in that faith our lives should reflect it. Let us make the work of the Women of the Church stand out in shining enthusiasm. Let us be real followers of the Master.

CONSTITUTION

1. This organization shall be called, THE LOS ANGELES DIOCESAN BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE NATIONAL COUNCIL.
2. The object of this organization is: To advance the devotional life of the women of the Church, and to support the work of the National Council in all its Departments.
3. Membership shall be open to any woman in the Diocese of Los Angeles, who is willing to help further the object of this Auxiliary.
4. The officers shall consist of: a President, a Vice-President-at-Large, a Vice-President for each Convocation, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer.
5. Officers shall be elected as follows: The President and Recording Secretary at the Annual Diocesan Meeting the year of the Triennial. The Vice-President-at-Large and the Corresponding Secretary at the Annual Diocesan Meeting the year following the Triennial. The Treasurer at the Annual Diocesan Meeting the year preceding the Triennial. These officers shall be elected for a term of three years, and may not hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms. The Vice-Presidents of the several Convocations shall be elected for a term of two years at the Convocational Auxiliary meeting preceding the Annual Diocesan Meeting. All elections shall be by ballot.
6. The Executive Committee shall consist of: The President, the Vice-President-at-Large, the Recording Secretary, the Corresponding Secretary and the Treasurer.
7. All Departments of the Auxiliary shall correspond to those in the National Council. The Chairman of each Department shall superintend the work of her department in consultation with the Executive Committee. The Department Chairmen shall be appointed annually by the Executive Committee.
8. The Diocesan Board shall consist of: The Executive Committee, the Convocational Vice-Presidents, and the Chairmen of all Departments.
9. Any member of the National Executive Board, and any Provincial officer of the Eighth Province, residing in the Diocese shall be a member of the Diocesan Board.

10. A Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary may be formed in any Parish or Mission with the consent of the rector or clergyman in charge, by notifying the Convocational Vice-President.

11. The Annual Meeting shall be held at the time of the Diocesan Convention, and monthly Diocesan Meetings on such dates and in such places as the President may appoint. General meetings may be arranged by the Vice-Presidents in their respective Convocations.

12. An Annual Quiet Day shall be held during the Season of Advent.

13. A vacancy in any Diocesan office occurring between elections, such office shall be filled by the Executive committee.



B Y - L A W S

1. The duty of the President shall be to preside at the meetings of the Diocesan Auxiliary, and have general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop. The Vice-President-at-Large shall act for the President in her absence, and assist her in her work.

2. The duties of the Convocational Vice-Presidents shall be to preside at the general meetings held in their Convocations, to organize all new branches, and to cooperate with the President in the supervision of the work of the Diocesan Auxiliary.

3. The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to correspond with all Branches in the Diocese, to receive their reports, and to prepare the Annual Report.

4. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of meetings, to keep a record of such meetings and to prepare an abstract of the minutes for the Annual Report.

5. The duty of the Treasurer shall be to keep an account of all money received and expended and to make a report at the Annual Diocesan Meeting.

6. All requests for information or supplies from Parish Branches shall be made to Diocesan officers or Chairmen of Departments and not to National Headquarters.

7. Each Branch of the Auxiliary to be in good standing shall pay an annual pledge according to its ability to the following Diocesan Funds: General Working Fund, Bishop's Discretionary Fund and the Altar Fund. These pledges and all other money, with the exception of the United Thank Offering, shall be sent through the Diocesan Treasurer, and all checks made out to the Woman's Auxiliary, Diocese of Los Angeles.

8. All money collected by the Branches for the United Thank Offering Fund shall be sent to the Diocesan United Thank Offering Treasurer and by her to the Diocesan Auxiliary Treasurer.

9. At the Annual Diocesan Meeting only those Branches in good standing shall have a vote, and each Branch shall have but one vote.

10. A Nominating Committee shall be appointed each year by the Bishop, at least six months before the Annual Diocesan Meeting, and shall consist of a Chairman and one member from each Convocation. Nominations may be made from the floor at the time of the Annual Diocesan Meeting provided that the consent of the nominee has been previously obtained.

11. Delegates to the Triennial and to the Woman's Auxiliary of the Provincial Synod shall be appointed by the President, with the consent of the Executive Committee.

12. The Constitution and By-Laws must be read in every Branch at its Annual Meeting.

13. The Constitution may be amended by a motion made at the Annual Diocesan Meeting and voted on the following year. The By-Laws may be amended at any Annual Diocesan Meeting by a two-thirds vote of Branches present and voting, provided the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing to the Branches sixty days before the meeting.

RESOLVED—That in the death of Helen Griffith Magill
the Diocese of Los Angeles, the Province of the Pacific,
and the National Church have lost a most distinguished
member.

A native of Cincinnati, Ohio, Miss Magill made Pasadena her home in 1900, and for thirty-eight years was a devoted member of All Saints' Parish and of the Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, where she held the offices of Vice-President for the Los Angeles Convocation, Educational Secretary, and from 1921 to 1927 that of Diocesan President. In 1922 she was elected Provincial Representative on the National Executive Board of the Woman's Auxiliary, holding that high office until 1928.

In spite of the honors conferred upon her, Miss Magill possessed the humility of spirit that goes with great souls. Quiet, unassuming, without "fuss or favor," she carried on her work with directness, practical vision and with that rare gift of the Holy Spirit, Wisdom. She never thought of herself as important but always cheerful, humorous, utterly sincere she went among us, endearing herself to us all, and building the Auxiliary in this Diocese on a sure and sound foundation.

A loyal and intelligent Churchwoman, a woman of culture and travel, she gave of her very best to the Church she loved so dearly and of which she had such a wide vision. We, her friends and followers, "rise up and call her blessed."

RESOLVED—That the going on of Emily Mary Laselett to a fuller and more satisfying life the Woman's Auxiliary has lost the visible presence of one whose life was consecrated to the cause of Christ.

During her 10 years as Diocesan Educational Secretary she brought to the upbuilding of the Department her rich knowledge of the Bible and of the church, her understanding of educational problems and her never failing enthusiasm.

The classes which she held in many parishes throughout the Dioceses were a source of inspiration to teh many who attended. Less widely known perhaps was her keen sense of humor, her enlarged vision and courage which she was able to impart to those who came to her with their individual problems.

We bless to Thy Holy Name Thy servant departed this life in faith and fear, grant her continual growth in Thy love and service, and give us grace to follow her good example.
