PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT.

The second year's work of the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions is now laid before you, and the statements of the Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer show that our Branch, though so young, has made a satisfactory growth in interest in the work of Missions; and there is reason to believe that each parish that has joined in the work has done willingly all it was able to do; and with that will to do, if the love of Christ be in us, the power to accomplish more will certainly be given. It matters not how small the effort is, if there be only a beginning to do for some weaker parish than our own, or for some struggling mission; for St. Paul, in his Second Epistle to the Corinthians xiii. 12, writes: "If there be first a willing mind it is accepted, according to that a man hath and not according to that he hath not." If each individual in each parish would carry out that loving Apostolic advice how the hearts would be cheered and the hands lifted up of every Missionary who has gone forth to preach the Gospel at home and abroad. Is it not our plain duty as Christians to strive to carry it out? We have the weak, the indifferent, the unbelievers at our doors, in our Diocese, in our great country and in Foreign lands, that we will have to render an account of. Dare any earnest Christian man or woman live and act as if it were no concern of their's that Christ's last command to His disciples and followers is obeyed or not?

Our first duty is to respond heartily to every appeal of our individual Church for Diocesan Missions, but not as the Woman's Auxiliary; it will not therefore be amiss to state again the work that the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions agreed to coöperate in:

1. The increase of the funds of the Board.
2. The circulation of Missionary publications.
3. The education of Missionaries.
4. The making, collecting and distributing of articles of clothing for Missionaries and their families.
5. The education of Missionaries' children.

And the following extract from a recent sermon by the Rev. Dr. Pitkin of Michigan will explain still more clearly the line of work which each branch as a corporate part of the whole is to follow. He says: "The Woman's Auxiliary was formed by the General Missionary Board; it was formed to be auxiliary to that; it must be *general* and not Diocesan. Loyalty demands fidelity to its own head and to the body of which it forms a part. It must not sink itself into a merely Diocesan instrument. As the Parochial society should not narrow itself down to its Parish, so the Diocesan body should not be so occupied with the work within the limits of the Diocese as to forget its relation to the whole Church, with its associated Dioceses covering the whole land."

As an Auxiliary to the Board of Missions the work is not to raise money for Church debts or for the decoration of Churches, or to supply colored stoles or vestments; each Church is expected to do its own work in that line. But it is pledged to strive to make the lives easier of God's servants who are struggling to do their Master's work under great privations, and to assist in placing sufficient funds, through mite boxes or donations, in the hands of the Board of Missions, that it may be enabled to increase their present very small stipends, which are not sufficient to support them properly. Think of it: if 1 cent a day only is laid by for missions at the end of the year it amounts to \$3.65; if 100 members of a congregation would each give that small amount it would reach the sum of \$365. How many churches contribute that amount when a collection for Missionary purposes is taken up? For what the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary has accomplished in the past two years our thanks are largely due the Rev. Dr. McKim, who presided at the first meeting and urged our organization, directing and advising how the work was to be carried on. It is therefore with sincere sorrow and regret we learn that he now meets with us for the last time. But knowing him as we do, we believe the best way to manifest our gratitude will be to go on with greater energy and unity of purpose in the work, until every parish is represented as belonging to the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

The name of this Society shall be the "Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

ARTICLE II.

The object of this Society shall be, by means of union and systematic efforts to diffuse Missionary intelligence, to increase Missionary activity among women of the Diocese, to unite previously existing Societies, and to encourage the formation of Societies where there are none.

ARTICLE III.

All baptized women belonging to the Diocese who desire to be members of this Society shall be so regarded upon the payment of twenty-five cents per annum.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this Society shall be a President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary and a Board of Managers.

ARTICLE V.

The President shall call meetings together and preside over them.

ARTICLE VI.

The Vice-President shall preside over meetings during the absence of the President.

ARTICLE VII.

The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to prepare

an annual report for circulation in the Diocese, and to conduct the correspondence of the Association, especially that with the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary and with the Parochial Branches, and to keep a fair record of all Missionary-box reports.

ARTICLE VIII.

The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of the meetings, and to keep a record of such meetings.

ARTICLE IX.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all moneys contributed for the work of the Association; to pay all drafts upon the funds and to prepare a report for each general meeting.

ARTICLE X.

The duty of the Managers shall be to increase, especially in their own localities, a Missionary spirit, by arousing the Societies to greater efforts in working for Missionaries, in raising money for the cause, and by diffusing intelligence concerning the past and present Missionary work of the Church. The Managers are authorized to hold meetings at such time and places as they please, in their own locality.

ARTICLE XI.

All Societies who desire it will be considered members of this Auxiliary, and will send their report of money collected and work done to the Treasurer. Also, delegates from all such Societies will be expected at the general meetings.

ARTICLE XII.

There shall be at least two general meetings of the Society in each year, at such place and time as shall be designated by the President and Board of Managers.

ARTICLE XIII.

Special meetings may be called by the President at the request of three of the officers or Managers.

ARTICLE XIV.

The Board of Managers shall consist of one member from each parochial Missionary Society in connection with this Branch of the Auxiliary.

The President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Corresponding and Recording Secretaries shall be ex-officio members of the Board of Managers. Five shall constitute a quorum for business.
